

## The Game

Oklahoma goes in search of its third consecutive victory this Saturday, and attempts a sweep of the Big 12 North portion of its schedule, when it travels to Nebraska. It is OU's first visit to Lincoln since 2001. The Huskers look to rebound from last week's 41-24 loss at Missouri.

■ After this meeting, OU and UNL will not see each other again in the regular season until 2008 due to the Big 12's schedule rotation.

■ This is just the second true road game of the season for Oklahoma, which played neutral field games against Texas and Kansas. The other road contest was against UCLA at the Rose Bowl. This will be the Sooners' first game on an artificial surface this season. Their only other road game this season also will be played on plastic at Texas Tech.

■ OU Heisman winners Billy Sims and Steve Owens are scheduled to be in attendance as is legendary Sooner coach Barry Switzer.

**Series Notes:** The home team has won four straight in this series ... Oklahoma has lost its last six games in Lincoln dating back to a 17-7 victory in 1987 ... Memorial Stadium in Lincoln is one of only two Big 12 venues at which Bob Stoops does not yet have a win. The other is Darrell K. Royal - Texas Memorial Stadium in Austin, but Stoops has never coached a game there since OU and Texas meet annually in Dallas.

## The Coaches

**Oklahoma:** Bob Stoops (Iowa '83), now in his seventh season with the Sooners, is 71-15 overall. He is 3-3 in bowls, 3-2 in January bowls, 2-2 in BCS games, 47-9 vs. the Big 12, 25-6 vs. the Big 12 South, 22-3 vs. the Big 12 North, 3-1 in the Big 12 title game, 25-6 vs. non-conference opponents, 39-2 at home, 20-7 on the road, 12-6 on neutral fields, 21-6 vs. ranked opponents and 2-1 vs. Nebraska.

**Nebraska:** Bill Callahan (Illinois Benedictine '78) is 10-8 in his second season at Nebraska. He is 0-1 against Oklahoma.

## The Program

### Weekly Media Luncheon

Each Tuesday during the season OU hosts a media luncheon inside the Kerr McGee Stadium Club (east side) at Gaylord Family. The luncheon begins at 11:15 a.m., with comments from the head coach of OU's opponent that week (by speaker phone if the coach is available). Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., and OU head coach Bob Stoops steps to the podium at 12 p.m. A limited number of Sooner players are on hand for interviews.

### Credentials

Requests for credentials are taken online. To receive the link to the web site, e-mail Kenny Mossman at krossman@ou.edu. Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest. Media attending games will have passes scanned and must show government issued photo identification upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential will be voided.

### Practice

Practices are open to photographers for the first 15 minutes Monday-Wednesday. Photographers are required to inform the media relations office when they plan to attend and must stay in out-of-bounds areas at all times. No other portion of the practices are open to public or media.

- **Players:** All interviews with players will take place at the media luncheon or after practice on Monday and Tuesday. Media should request players at least 24 hours in advance. Those who attend the media luncheon are not available after Tuesday's practice.

### This Week's Opponent

- Nebraska has matched its win total from last season with five.
- The Huskers rank No. 4 nationally in net punting (40.39) and No. 9 in rushing defense (95.29). Terrance Nunn ranks No. 2 nationally in punt returns (22.42), Sam Koch No. 9 punter (44.64) and Jordon Congdon tied for No. 10 in FG (1.71/game) with OU's Garrett Hartley and four others.

### The Last Meeting

Oklahoma won 30-3 over Nebraska last season in Norman ...

- A record crowd of 84,916 saw 23 Sooners in their final game on Owen Field.
- Jason White connected on 29-of-35 passes for 383 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions. During the game, he set an OU record with 18 consecutive completions.
- Travis Wilson established career highs with nine receptions for 135 yards.
- OU nearly posted a shutout, but the Huskers got a 39-yard field goal on the games final play.

### Ties With This Week's Opponent

- Nebraska quarterback Zac Taylor is a native of Norman, Okla., (Norman HS) and the son of Sherwood Taylor, formerly a standout out DB for Oklahoma. The elder Taylor lettered with the Sooners from 1977-79. OU won two of three meetings with the Huskers during that stretch, but lost in its only trip to Lincoln, 17-14, in '78.
- Nebraska defensive line coach John Blake was Oklahoma's head coach from 1996-98. He played at OU from 1979-82 and graduated in 1986.
- Nebraska offensive coordinator Jay Norvell was on the OU staff for one month during the off-season in 2002, but never coached a practice or game with the Sooners. He left to join the coaching staff with the Oakland Raiders.

### Oklahoma's Most Recent Game

Oklahoma dominated statistically in its win over Baylor last week, but a string of miscues opened the door for the Bears, and the Sooners needed two overtimes to secure a 37-30 victory ...

- OU had whopping advantages in first downs (28-12), rushing yards (205-68), total yards (474-291) and time of possession (41:40-18:20).
- It was just the second overtime game in school history, the first in Norman. OU is now 2-0 all-time in overtime games including a victory over Texas in 1996 (30-27).
- OU got the game-winner on a 21-yard pass from redshirt freshman Rhett Bomar to true freshman Juaquin Inglesias. It was Inglesias' only reception of the game. The Sooner quarterback was roughed on the throw and the penalty pushed the Bears back to the 40 for their next and final possession.
- Two injuries and a suspension claimed OU's top three running backs, but the Sooners still managed 205 yards on the ground. Fourth-stringer Jacob Gutierrez ran for 173 on 30 attempts, while Allen Patrick, a converted defense back, got another 49 on 15 tries. Gutierrez had 14 rushes going into the game and Patrick had two.
- Oklahoma entered the game with just 13 second-quarter points on the season, but put up 24 in the second frame against the Bears. It was the best scoring period of the year for OU.
- DE C.J. Ah You had five tackles, two fumbles forced (both of which were recovered by Oklahoma) and a sack on an attempted two-point conversion by Baylor.
- K Garrett Hartley was good on a career-high three field goals (3-of-3) with makes from 32, 25 and 39 yards. The latter of those knotted the score at the end of the first overtime and forced the second extra period. Hartley also converted all three point after touchdown kicks and booted four touchbacks. He was named the SBC Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.
- OU miscues kept it close ... The Sooners had an interception returned to their six, which BU converted to a touchdown, and lost two fumbles, one at the Baylor 18 with 2:39 remaining. The Sooners led 27-19 and were driving towards a game-icing score, but Baylor converted a 55-yard touchdown pass and two-point conversion to force overtime. Earlier in the fourth quarter, Oklahoma had the ball 2nd-and-goal from the Baylor one, but incurred a procedure penalty and had to settle for a field goal. The special teams suffered a rare breakdown when Baylor returned a kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown.

### North Country

Oklahoma has won its last 11 regular season games against the Big 12 North Division. That dates back to the Sooners' last trip to Nebraska in 2001 when the Huskers prevailed, 20-10.

■ The 11 straight does not include a loss to Kansas State in the 2003 Big 12 title game. Sandwiched around that setback, the Sooners won the Big 12 crown with a pair of victories against North Division champion Colorado in 2002 and 2004.

### Injury Bug Bites

Oklahoma players have combined to miss 30 full games this season due to injury. There are another four who missed partial games (more than half of the game). Through seven games last season, OU players had combined to miss just 11 games due to injury.

### Fourth Down Fun

OU has converted 6-of-9 fourth-down tries including their last four in a row. Two of those last four came on faked kicks (punt vs. Texas, FG vs. Kansas). Sooner opponents are 2-of-8 on fourth down. Under Stoops, OU is 65-of-112 (58%) on fourth down; the opponents are 49-of-132 (37%).

### Sooners Taking a Different Position

Paul Thompson's move from QB (he's still the No. 2) to WR and Allen Patrick's change from DB to RB continues a venture that has been successful under Bob Stoops -- players changing positions. Here is a look at some of the more successful moves over the last seven seasons ...

### Sooners Eclipse Three Million in Attendance Under Stoops

Oklahoma has sold out all 41 home games of Bob Stoops' tenure and during the Tulsa game the total attendance for that period exceeded three million. The total stands at 3,227,865. OU has exceeded its listed capacity of 82,112 in 16 straight games.

### Oklahoma Picks Up Win. No. 750

The win over Tulsa was the 750th all-time for Oklahoma. The Sooners' all-time record now stands 753-288-53. OU is one of just eight schools with 750 victories. With 1,094 games played, the Sooners are just seven away from 1,100. Nineteen other schools have played 1,100 games.

### OU Brand Among the Nation's Most Popular

The Collegiate Licensing Company has announced its top-selling entities for the most recent fiscal year and the OU brand ranks No. 5, the highest ranking ever for the Sooners. North Carolina topped the list followed by Michigan, Texas, Georgia and Oklahoma. A portion of the proceeds from the Sooner marks benefit an endowment for Bizzell Library on the OU campus.

### Early Games Illustrate Changing of the Guard

A game-by-game look at the youth and change on this year's team ...

#### The TCU Game

- Seven defensive players made their first career start.
- Thirteen freshmen (eight true, five redshirt) played.
- The starting offensive players in last season's finale had a combined 301 starts. The offensive starters in the '05 opener had a combined 130. The offensive line that started in the Orange Bowl last season at 188 career starts compared to just 68 for the group that started this year's opener.

#### The Tulsa Game

- Eighteen first-year players saw action. Of those, 16 were freshmen, including 10 true.
- Four of the five starting offensive linemen were in their first game at that particular position. Only Chris Bush, who had two previous starts at right guard (one in '03 and another in '04) was in a spot he had previously held. The offensive line that started against TU had a combined 41 career starts, down some 27 from the opener.

- Three freshmen linemen played, including RT Brannon Braxton in his first career start.

- CB D.J. Wolfe led OU with 12 tackles. At the same time last year he was a reserve RB.

- OU's leading rusher and receiver was a sophomore (Adrian Peterson), the QB was a redshirt freshman (Rhett Bomar), the P was a sophomore (Cody Freeby), the K was a sophomore (Garrett Hartley), the leading tackle was a sophomore (D.J. Wolfe) and three of the four sacks were made by players who either weren't here last season or were playing offense in 2004.

#### The UCLA Game

- Three true freshmen started in the game in RT Brannon Braxton, WR Malcolm Kelly and SS Reggie Smith. To put that in perspective, only four true freshmen even *played* for OU all of 2004.

- Of the 15 players who had statistics on offense or in returns, 10 have at least two years of eligibility remaining, as did the leading tacklers Demarrio Pleasant and Darien Williams (both had 10), both of whom are sophomores.

#### The Kansas State Game

- Four true freshmen started, including both safeties -- Reggie Smith (FS) and Nic Harris (SS). Harris responded with seven tackles and one sack in his first career start. Smith had an interception and a 14-yard return.

- In the third quarter, the Sooners faced a third-and-seven at their own 19. The offense came out in a three-receiver set and all three were true freshmen -- Malcolm Kelly, Manuel Johnson and Juaquin Iglesias. Rhett Bomar, a redshirt freshman himself, hit Iglesias for 18 yards.

#### The Texas Game

- For the second straight game five freshmen were in the starting line-up, including three true frosh. RG J.D. Quinn, a redshirt freshman, made his first career start after Chris Bush moved over to the center spot to spell ailing Chris Chester, a senior.

- Quinn was one of three offensive players making a first career start, sort of. Paul Thompson, a junior, started this year's opener at quarterback, but made his first-ever start at WR against Texas. Sophomore RB Jacob Gutierrez lined up in the slot on the first play to earn his first start.

#### The Kansas Game

- OU's lone offensive touchdown was scored by true freshman Malcolm Kelly on a 25-yard pass from RS freshman Rhett Bomar. The Sooners' other TD was scored by sophomore CB D.J. Wolfe, who played RB last season. WR Juaquin Iglesias became the eighth freshman to start a game this season, the fifth true freshman to do so.

#### The Baylor Game

- Six players missed the game (five due to injury and one due to suspension). Of that six, five were seniors. The game-winner in the second overtime was a 21-yard pass from redshirt freshman Rhett Bomar to true freshman Juaquin Iglesias.

- With its top three running backs sidelined, fourth-string back Jacob Gutierrez, a sophomore, rushed for 173 yards. His back-up was converted DB Allen Patrick, who gained 49 on 15 tries.

- The Sooners matched a season high by playing 10 true freshmen.

## About the Sooner Offense

- Under Bob Stoops, OU has produced its career leader in passing and receiving, while also turning out the fourth-leading rusher in school history and the school record holder for single season rushing yards.
- Oklahoma has scored at least one touchdown in 87 consecutive games dating back to Nov. 7, 1998.
- Under Stoops, OU has rushed for 200 yards 25 times, including 20 over the last four seasons.
- Also under Stoops, OU has 88 TDs of 25+ yards and 202 scoring drives that lasted less than two minutes.

## Peterson Goes Over 2,000 Yards

Soph RB Adrian Peterson crossed over the 2,000 yard mark for his career vs. Tulsa, when he bolted for 220 against the Golden Hurricane. Peterson now has 2,327 yards for his career ...

■ Peterson has been slowed by bad ankle in the last four games (did not play vs. Baylor). Three weeks ago against Kansas State he had 51 yards through one quarter and a half when he left the game with an ankle injury. He had a 22-yard TD run before retiring. Two weeks he had just three carries for 10 yards against Texas, the last week he had five totes for -4 yards while playing in the first half only against Kansas.

■ The Tulsa game was the fourth 200-yard game (his fourth-highest total) and his fourth three-touchdown game. His 32 carries tied for his third-highest total, but with two receptions, the 34 touches ranked second. He had 36 touches (all rushes) against Kansas State last season.

■ Last season, Peterson carried 339 times for 1,925 yards. His attempts ranked No. 1 in the nation, while his net yards was No. 3.

■ During the off-season he had surgery on his left shoulder, which precluded his participation in spring practice.

■ Peterson set a single season rushing record at OU in 2004, surpassing the previous best of 1,896 yards by Billy Sims in 1978.

■ Peterson eclipsed Ron Dayne's (1,863) NCAA single season mark for a freshman. Peterson set other NCAA freshman standards for consecutive 100-yard games (nine) and 100-yard games (11).

He tied (Emmitt Smith, Florida, 1987 and Marshall Faulk, San Diego State, 1991) the record for reaching 1,000 yards the fastest by a frosh by doing so in the seventh game.

■ Peterson averaged 164.0 yards vs. the four ranked foes in 2004.

■ He gained 100 yards in 11 of 13 games as a frosh and has done so in 12 of 19 games during his career.

■ He had the highest finish in the Heisman voting ever by a freshman (second) and was the first freshman to be named a finalist for the Doak Walker Award. He also was a finalist for the Maxwell.

## Two X 2,000

With Kejuan Jones (2,199) and Adrian Peterson (2,323) both over 2,000 career rushing yards, it marks the first time since 1987 that OU has two backs over that figure on the same roster. Lydell Carr finished with 2,910 and Jamelle Holieway with 2,713 that year. It also happened in 1986 when Carr and Spencer Tillman both eclipsed 2,000.

■ It's also interesting to note that both Jones and Peterson figure to continue their respective ascensions up the career rushing touchdown list at OU. Jones is tied at No. 7 with Steve Davis with 34. Peterson has 21. He needs just nine to crack the top 15.

## Rushing Game Revival

In the last two games, OU's ground game has found its groove even in the absence of All-American Adrian Peterson ...

■ Against Kansas, the Sooners wound up with 96 rushing yards for the game, but that was due mostly to sacks. Donta Hickson (18-59) and Kejuan Jones (16-51) both eclipsed 50 yards while splitting the reps. A case could be made that one back might have made it over the century mark.

■ The following week against Baylor, OU got 205 yards on the ground against Baylor for its third 200-yard performance of the season.

■ Jacob Gutierrez went for 173 on yards on 30 carries against Baylor. Prior to that game, the soph's career numbers (all this season) were 14 rushes for 73 yards.

### Bomar Sooner

A look at RS QB Rhett Bomar, who came off the bench in the opener, but has since been the starter ...

- He had a string of 73 throws without an interception snapped against Texas when one of his tosses bounced off a Sooner receiver into the hands of a Longhorn defender.
- Over the last two games, he is 40-of-73 for 475 yards. He has two TD and four interceptions during that stretch, although one of the picks was a hail Mary at the end of regulation vs. Baylor.
- In a two-game stretch vs. UCLA and Kansas St., he was 32-of-51 for 380 yards with one TD and no INT.
- He has rushed for a touchdown in two games. Prior to leading OU in rushing with 67 yards on eight carries against Kansas State, he rushed 13 times for 28 at UCLA. In those two games, he had 21 totes for 95 yards, an average of 4.5 yards per attempt.
- He has eight rushes of more than 10 yards with a long of 42 vs. K-State. He had a 28 yarder vs. TCU.

### Rushing QB Returns at Oklahoma

Only twice during the last two seasons (2003, 2004) did a starting Sooner quarterback have rushes of 10 or more yards. Jason White picked up 10 yards against Texas in 2003 and then had a 12-yard jaunt against USC last season. White finished in positive rushing numbers just five times over those two seasons (once in '03 and four times in '04). Bomar has had a positive rushing number in five of eight games to date. That's impressive considering he has thrown 175 passes and been sacked 18 times. In White's defense, before being slowed by two knee surgeries, he was a dangerous runner. He rushed 12 times for 117 yards at Kansas in the 2001 game. Two weeks later he suffered the first of two knee injuries during a game at Nebraska.

- That 2001 Kansas game stood as the most recent time that a Sooner quarterback had led the team in rushing for a game until Bomar's 67 yards topped OU in this year's Kansas State tilt.
- Bomar rushed for touchdowns in back-to-back games (UCLA and Kansas State), a first at OU since Nate Hybl did it against Air Force and North Texas in 2001. He since got another against Baylor.

### Four Touchdown Passes, but ...

While it's true that Oklahoma has just four touchdown passes this season, the air game has played a significant role in other OU trips to the end zone ...

#### The UCLA Game

- Bomar completed passes of 10 and 18 yards to the Bruin 16 before running to the end zone from there.

#### The Kansas State Game

- Bomar hit Finley on a 17-yard throw to the KSU three. Kejuan Jones score on the next play.
- Bomar hit Travis Wilson on a 24-yard play o the Wildcat four. Jones scored two plays later.

### Young But Catching On

The receiving corps is another place where Oklahoma's youthfulness manifests itself. Seven of the 15 players with a catch this season have at least two years of eligibility remaining after this season.

- The four touchdown throws have gone to a sophomore (two) and a true freshman (two).
- Seven of those with a catch either weren't on the active roster in '04 or were playing a different position.

### Geez, Mr. Wilson

Travis Wilson is just one reception away from 100 for his career, eight receptions away from OU's career top 10 and 107 yards away from OU's career top 10 ...

- In the opener, Wilson led OU with five receptions for 52 yards. Seventeen of those yards after the catch.
- He had seven catches for 103 yards at UCLA. He also rushed twice for 61 yards, including a 56-yard TD.
- Against Kansas State, he caught five passes for 68 yards and returned one kickoff for 34.
- Wilson logged 30 receptions for 345 yards and five touchdowns over his first two seasons before erupting in his junior campaign with 50 catches for 660 yards and the 11 scores.

### Versatility in the Trenches

The Oklahoma offensive linemen have played a number of positions during the respective careers ...

- **LG Davin Joseph** has 28 starts at right guard, three at left tackle and one at left guard.
- **RG Chris Bush** has five starts at left guard, five at right guard and three at center. Bush has three starts at right guard and two at center *this season*.
- **C Chris Chester** has one start at RG, three at C. He's the only offensive lineman on the team with a touchdown. That came on a fake field goal at Missouri in 2002 when he played TE and caught a pass.
- **OT Chris Messner** started the 2003 Alabama game at left tackle, then got the nod at right tackle in this year's season opener.

### About the Sooner Defense

■ OU has forced at least one turnover in 76 of Bob Stoops' 86 games and has at least one interception in 55 of the last 73 games. OU has multiple picks in 18 of its last 45 outings.

■ Opponents completed 50% or more of their passes in less than half of their games against Stoops-coached teams -- 41 times in 86 games.

■ Foes scored less than 14 points in 48 of the games.

■ OU has eight shutouts under its current coach. During that same period, the opponents failed to score more than seven points 26 times.

### This Corps Living Up to Standard at Linebacker U.

With four Butkus winners (Brian Bosworth - 1984-85, Rocky Calmus (2001) and Teddy Lehman (2003), no school has won the honor more than OU. This year, Clint Ingram (SLB), Zach Latimer (MLB) and Rufus Alexander (WLB) are living up to the tradition. Ingram and Alexander were on the Watch List for this year's Butkus award ...

**Ingram**, who missed the UCLA game with an injury, has three interceptions this season. Against TCU he returned a pick 23 yards and against Tulsa he went 48 yards for a touchdown.

■ In his career, he has three INT, two fumbles caused, two fumbles recovered (vs. Texas last season, he caused and recovered a fumble on the same play) and five PBU in 17 starts.

■ His two sacks came vs. Kansas State and Texas.

**Latimer** made his first career start against TCU. The junior responded with 15 tackles, including 11 that were solo. Latimer entered the game with 12 career tackles.

■ He got 12 stops against Texas and is the team's second-leading tackler with 51.

**Alexander** is the team's top tackler with 58.

■ He had seven TFL in his career heading into the Tulsa game then logged four vs. TU. He got three more against Kansas

■ He has 134 career tackles and eclipsed the century mark with six at UCLA.

■ He has four pass break-ups, one interception, one fumble forced and one fumble recovery.

### Dvoracek On Pace to Eclipse His Previous Best

DT Dusty Dvoracek is back after being dismissed from the 2004 squad and is now a team captain. He is a former All-Big 12 performer and CoSIDA Academic All-District selection. In 2003, he was credited with 40 tackles, including seven sacks and 16 TFL. All three of those numbers were tops on an OU interior line that included Tommie Harris, the Lombardi Award winner and a first-round draft choice of the Chicago Bears.

■ Dvoracek is on pace to eclipse his 2003 numbers.

With 26 tackles through five games, he's on pace for 48. With 10 tTFL, he's on pace for 18.

■ Ranks No. 7 nationally and No. 1 among DT's with 11 tackles for loss.

■ He had four tackles at UCLA, three for loss. He logged a 10-yard sack despite the fact that the Bruin lineman was flagged for holding him on the play. He came back with three more TFL and another sack against Kansas.

■ With a 3.4 GPA he also will be a candidate for Academic All-America honors.

### Freshman Rarity Happened Just Once Before

OU started two true freshmen at the safety spots in two games this season -- SS Reggie Smith and FS Nic Harris. The only other time two true freshmen started in the OU secondary was the 1981 season at the Sun Bowl vs. Houston. S Keith Stanberry got his only start of the year and CB Elbert Watts got his seventh.

### Which End is Up?

OU is minus half of its anticipated two-deep at DE. Larry Birdine was lost during the August drills with a torn left biceps. John Williams suffered a torn left ACL against TCU. Both will miss the rest of the season.

## Rushing 'D'

Oklahoma is No. 6 nationally in rushing defense (79.2 yards) despite the fact that the Sooners have played four of the top 51 rushing teams, including No. 5 Texas.

## Casillas' Neighborhood

Dusty Dvoracek now has 37 career tackles for loss, good for No. 8 on OU's all-time linemen list. He's only three behind Tony Casillas, Lee Roy Selmon and Darrell Reed.

- There have been 22 special teams TDs, including 15 in the last 44 regular season games. Those 15 came via five different kinds of plays -- nine punt returns, two faked field goals, a blocked punt, a kickoff return and a faked punt. The special teams also own one safety.
- OU has returned five kickoffs and 13 punts for touchdowns.
- The Sooners have blocked 18 kicks.
- In this year's opener, OU did not block a kick or return one for a TD, but did get a big play when Jason Carter tackled the TCU punter. The Sooners converted the play into a field goal.
- Against Kansas State, Jacob Gutierrez tipped a punt that traveled just eight yards.
- Against Texas, OU faked a punt with J.D. Runnels rushing to gain a first down.
- Against Kansas, the Sooners faked an extra point with H Cody Freeby completing a pitch pass to Russell Dennison for a first down.

## Many Happy Returns

## Sooners Get a Freeby

Sophomore Cody Freeby, is in his first season at Oklahoma's punter.

- The left-footer also is the holder for Garrett Hartley's placements.
- In his first game, Freeby averaged 38.3 yards on eight punts with three downed inside the 20 and no touchbacks. Only one of his punts was returned and that one went for 10 yards.
- Against Tulsa, when he averaged 50.0 yards on five kicks, his 70-yarder was the first by a Sooner to cover that distance since Jeff Ferguson got off 71-yarder at Air Force in 2001.
- At UCLA, he averaged 45.6 yards on five punts and allowed the then-nation's leading returner, Maurice Drew, just one attempt for five yards.
- Against Kansas State, only two of his six boots were returned for a total of two yards.
- In the Texas game, he scooped up a bad snap and unleashed a 55-yard punt. It was one of two 50-yarders he had in the game.
- Against Baylor, he averaged 41.7 yardson six punts with one downed at the three and another at the one.

## Sooners Have Hart-ley

Garrett Hartley, Oklahoma's kicker, has been especially impressive with his kickoffs ...

- Hartley has 22 full kickoffs (does not include squibs) and his average is 64.0 yards with 18 touchbacks. That means the ball lands or is caught at the one yardline. He had five touchbacks against KSU, three more against Texas (on four kicks). Opponents average 14.6 yards/return.
- His 52-yard field goal against Texas was the longest ever by a Sooner against the Longhorns and was a career-best for Hartley.
- He made all three field goal attempts against Baylor include a 39-yarder at the end of the first OT to force the decisive second extra period when OU got the win.

## Rice Trumps all the Streaks

Jacob Rice, the long-snapper and a former standout TE and DE at Norman High, trumps all the starts and games played streaks. The senior has been a starter in all 47 career games.

## Dennison a Special Teams Stud

History is one tough customer at Oklahoma. The tradition, so rich and so long-standing, is as daunting as it is impressive. To be among the best at Oklahoma is to be among the best in college football.

Such dramatics are lost on Bob Stoops. The Sooner head coach befriended the would-be albatross of OU's successful past from his first day on campus and remains steadfastly focused on tomorrow and the championship it holds.

It falls then to the observers and experts of the game to define Stoops' impact. Rarely have the pundits had it so easy.

Under Stoops, Oklahoma has won 71 games (71-15), spent 69 consecutive weeks in the national rankings, played in six bowl games, four of the BCS variety, and captured three Big 12 crowns. His 2000 team won the national championship. On a playing field leveled by scholarship limits and parity, this era stares down the Oklahoma standard and does not blink.

The achievement dulls the memory of what Stoops inherited. When he arrived in Norman, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record, four from bowl play. Those atypical days of angst are so forgotten now that they might as well be mentioned with the land rush and dust bowl.

Stoops has been characterized as a grounded family man, brilliant big-game coach, relentless recruiter, disciplined leader and a person with uncommon perspective. His success emanates from a disciplined style true to his roots in the Steel Valley of Ohio, but he is far from inflexible. The principles to which he holds are the tried and true axioms of the sport ... mixed with cutting edge strategy and an appreciation for the calculated risk.

During his time, OU has produced record-setting passers and receivers, two 1,000-yard rushers, suffocating defense and special teams

units that rank among the most dynamic in the land. Every facet has been impacted.

His players have snagged 16 national awards, including the 2003 Heisman Trophy won by Jason White. There have been 49 academic honorees, 43 All-Big 12 players, 21 All-Americans and 13 NFL draft choices.

Stoops has won a total of 10 national coach

of the year awards and has been Big 12 Coach of the year in three of his six campaigns in Norman.

This is one of the finest coaches in the history of one of college football's most storied traditions.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at Iowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at Kansas State



(1991-95).

With the Wildcats, he played a key role in their impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances. Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. In 1996, he was part of a national championship team. It was with the Gators that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.

Stoops, who was born Sept. 9, 1960, in Youngstown, Ohio, graduated from Iowa in 1983 with a degree in marketing. He and his wife, Carol, have three children: daughter, Mackenzie, and twin sons, Drake and Isaac.
