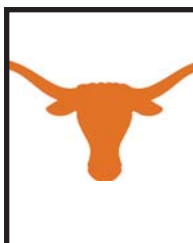

## PLAYER TO WATCH

LB **Keenan Clayton**, a starting safety in first two games of 2006, has seen a resurgence in his career at strong side backer. The junior ranks No. 3 on the team in tackles with 40, and is tied for the top spot in tackles for loss with six and in fumbles forced with two. He also has a pair of quarterback sacks. Last Saturday at Baylor, Clayton notched a career-high 14 tackles. Prior to this season, his tackle best was four.



## THE GAME

Oklahoma and Texas enter the 103rd renewal of the AT&T Red River Rivalry with 5-0 marks. Both are 1-0 after impressive league road wins last Saturday. OU rocked Baylor, 49-17, while Texas dominated Colorado, 38-14.

## THE SERIES

Texas leads the all-time series 57-40-5. Since the Big 12 formed for the 1996 season, Oklahoma has won seven games to the Longhorns' five.

## THE COACHES

**Oklahoma:** Bob Stoops (Iowa '83) is 102-22 in his 10th season with the Sooners. He is 66-13 vs. the Big 12, 36-9 vs. the Big 12 South, 28-4 vs. the Big 12 North, 5-1 in the Big 12 title game, 36-9 vs. non-conference opponents, 57-2 at home, 29-11 on the road, 16-9 on neutral fields, 29-11 vs. ranked opponents, 4-5 in bowls, 3-4 in January Bowls and 2-4 in BCS games. He is 6-3 against Texas.  
**Texas:** Mack Brown (Florida State '74) is 108-25 in his 11th season at Texas. He is 4-6 vs. Oklahoma.

## THE PROGRAM

Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 784-295-53. The Sooners own seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000). OU has 41 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 24 victories (No. 4 nationally). Oklahoma has won 41 conference titles. Since WWII, OU is the most successful program with 549 victories. The school has produced 144 All-Americans and four Heisman Trophy winners. With 30, 10-win seasons, OU leads the nation. Oklahoma's best decade for total victories came in the 1970's when the Sooners were 102-13-3 (.877). In the 2000's, OU is 95-17-0 (.848).

**WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON**

Each Tuesday during the season OU hosts a media luncheon inside the Kerr McGee Stadium Club (east side) at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The luncheon begins at 11:15 a.m., with comments from the head coach of OU's opponent that week (by speaker phone if the coach is available). Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., and OU head coach Bob Stoops steps to the podium at 12:05 p.m. A limited number of Sooner players are on hand for interviews.

**CREDENTIALS**

Requests for credentials are accepted online. To receive the link to the web site, e-mail Kenny Mossman at [kmossman@ou.edu](mailto:kmossman@ou.edu). Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest. Media attending games will have passes scanned and must show government issued photo identification upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential will be voided.

The University of Oklahoma Athletics Media Relations office has opened a media-only website to assist in covering Sooner sports. **PRACTICE**

All practice sessions are closed to media and public unless otherwise posted. On days when post-practice interviews are conducted, media should gather outside the practice site 10-15 minutes before the workout is complete. Requests for interviews will be recorded at that time and members of the athletics media relations staff will escort media into the practice facility at the appropriate time.

- Post-Game: The OU locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Bob Stoops and several Sooner players will be brought to designated areas. After home games, the interview area is the Switzer Center's Red Room, located under the south end zone grandstand.

**MORE ON THE OU-TEXAS SERIES**

Played in the venerable Cotton Bowl, this game takes place during the State Fair of Texas. The two teams played six games in Dallas from 1912-1919, then settled there in 1929 ...

■ This marks the 80th consecutive year that the game as taken place in Dallas, which, according to Mapquest.com, is 189.9 miles from Norman, 196.7 miles from Austin.

■ The school that wins this game takes home the Golden Hat Trophy, which resides each year with the winner. The Governor's Cup also stays with the winner, but is in the possession of the state's highest elected official.

■ Overall: Texas leads, 57-40-5; At Dallas: Texas leads 45-36-5; At Norman: Texas leads, 3-1; At Austin: Texas leads, 7-2-1; At Oklahoma City: The series is tied 1-1. OU's Widest Margin of Victory: 65-13 in 2003; Texas' Widest Margin of Victory: 40-7 in 1941.

■ This marks the 58th time that at least one of the teams has entered this game with a national ranking, the 34th time that both were ranked.

■ The lower-rated team has prevailed 15 times.

■ This is the eighth time that the Sooners have brought the No. 1-ranking into the game. The only time they failed to protect that ranking was in 1963 when the No. 2-ranked Longhorns won, 28-7.

■ Oklahoma enters its match-up with Texas with an unbeaten, untied mark for the 44th time, the 21st time with at least three games played. There have been 23 times in which both teams entered the game unbeaten and untied (including 1902 when the game was Texas' season-opener). The record in those games is 11-11-1.

■ By winning percentage, these Texas is No. 3 all-time at 825-316-33 (.717) and Oklahoma is No. 4 at 784-295-53 (.710). Oklahoma has the most win in the 2000's with 95. Texas is No. 3 with 90.

**WHAT'S NEW AT THE COTTON BOWL?**

The 2008 renovations, totalling some \$50 million, include the expansion of the seating capacity of the stadium from 76,000 to 92,200, mostly through the complete encircling of the second deck, new media and VIP facilities, a new scoreboard and video screen, updated restrooms and concession areas, lighting, utility and sound upgrades and the replacement of all the stadium's seats.

■ This game will probably produce the largest crowd ever to see an Oklahoma game. The current high is 88,119 for the 1977 game at Ohio State. The Sooners won that one, 29-28. The current record for the largest crowd to see Oklahoma on a neutral field is 86,848 at the 2003 Rose Bowl. The Sooners prevailed in that game over, 34-14, over Washington State.

■ The record for the largest crowd to see the OU-Texas game is 79,587, for the 2004 game won by Oklahoma, 12-0.

**TIES WITH THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT**

■ Texas head coach Mack Brown was OU's offensive coordinator in 1984.

■ Oklahoma assistant defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach Bobby Jack Wright was on the Texas staff as an assistant coach from 1986-97.

**LAST YEAR'S GAME**

A pair of freshmen played key roles as No. 10 Oklahoma defeated No. 19 Texas, 28-21. In an oddity, both teams entered the game on losses, both upsets, for the first time since 1999 ...

■ The Sooners never trailed, but needed a 35-yard pass from Sam Bradford to Malcolm Kelly with 10:42 remaining to break a 21-21 tie and get the win. Oklahoma never led by more than seven and the game was tied three times.

■ Bradford, playing in his first OU-Texas game, completed 21-of-32 passes for 244 yards with three touchdowns, 0 interceptions.

■ Another freshman, RB DeMarco Murray, rushed 17 times for 128 yards, including an electrifying 65-yard touchdown run.

■ TE Jermaine Gresham caught two passes for eight yards, but both of those receptions went for touchdowns, one from seven yards and another from one.

■ DE Auston English logged a pair of sacks to lead the defense. The top tackler for OU was Nic Harris with 8.

■ Oklahoma had 414 total yards, including 244 through the air. Texas amassed 385 total with 324 through the air.

**OKLAHOMA'S MOST RECENT GAME**

- OU won its Big 12 opener at Baylor, 49-17, last Saturday ...
- Oklahoma scored on its first four possessions and to take a 28-0 lead after one quarter. That equaled the second-highest point total ever scored by an OU team in Big 12 play.
  - The first six Oklahoma touchdowns were scored by six different players.
  - Sam Bradford completed 23-of-31 passes for 372 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed for a TD (1 yard).
  - Oklahoma established season highs in plays (92), total yards (594), rushes (58), first downs (32) and rushing touchdowns (5, tied).
  - Juaquin Iglesias got his fifth career 100-yard game with six grabs for 133 yards and one touchdown.
  - DeMarco Murray rushed 26 times for 96 yards and a pair of touchdowns.
  - Oklahoma rushed 58 times and had only one negative yard.
  - LBs Keenan Clayton and Ryan Reynolds both had 14 tackles for a defense that held BU 17 points and 160 total yards under its averages.
  - Oklahoma ran its all-time record against Baylor to 18-0, 9-0 at Waco.

**OKLAHOMA IS NO. 1 AT BEING NO. 1**

- By moving to the top spot in this week's poll, Oklahoma has now been ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press' Top 25 more weeks, 97, than any other program in college football history. Notre Dame is second on that list at 95. Ohio State is next with 93 followed by USC at 90.
- The Sooners have played 77 games while carrying the No. 1 ranking. Their record in those games is 70-7, including a 9-4 mark on neutral fields.

**WASHINGTON VICTORY WAS NO. 100 FOR STOOPS**

- Oklahoma's 55-14 victory at Washington on Sept. 13, represented an historic milestone of 100 victories for Sooner head coach Bob Stoops ...
- Stoops became the eighth-fastest coach to 100 victories in NCAA history by doing so in 122 games, the same number it took for former OU head coach Barry Switzer to hit the mark. Another OU great, Bud Wilkinson, picked up his 100th victory in game 111. He is No. 3 on the list.
  - Oklahoma is the only school in NCAA history to produce four, 100-win coaches. The others are Bennie Owen (122-54-165 from 1905-26), Wilkinson (145-29-4 from 1947-63) and Switzer (157-29-4 from 1973-88).
  - Stoops is only the second coach in NCAA history, and the first in the modern era, to win 100 games in his first 10 seasons. His victory total, regardless of what it is at season's end, will rank No. 2 in NCAA history for 10 seasons. Penn's George Woodruff holds the mark at 124 wins. His 10th season was 1901. Switzer is third on that list at 98.
  - Stoops is one of three coaches with an average of 10 victories per season with at least 10 seasons of coaching. The others were Tom Osborne (255 in 25 seasons at Nebraska) and George Woodruff (142 in 12 seasons, mostly at Penn).
  - Stoops' teams are 102-22 with one national title and five league crowns in 10 seasons (9+). In the 10 years before he arrived in Norman, the OU football fortunes had taken a rare dip. The program was 61-50-3 with no championships and only three bowl trips.

**STOOPS' TREE REACHES FIVE**

Bob Stoops celebrated his 48th birthday Sept. 9, but despite his relative youth, he currently has the most extensive coaching tree in all of college football (current FBS coaches hired from current school). Five current FBS head coaches were hired from his Oklahoma staff ...

**THE SOONERS BRIEFLY**

- OU was No. 4 in both of preseason polls. It marked the 10th straight season that was ranked in the first AP poll.
- Oklahoma was tabbed for a first-place finish in the Big 12's South Division in a preseason polling of league media. Defensive end Auston English was named the league's preseason defensive player of the year.
- There are 27 players on this team with previous starting experience. There were 34 in 2007, 10 in 2006.
- Last season, OU was 11-3 overall, 6-2 in the Big 12. The Sooners won their fifth Big 12 crown (second straight) and 41st league title overall before advancing to the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.
- Three players from the '07 team left early for the NFL: WR Malcolm Kelly (Redskins), LB Curtis Lofton (Falcons) and DB Reggie Smith (49ers).

**OU AND THE BIG 12**

- OU's all-time Big 12 regular season record is 69-28, 74-29 if counting title games. Stoops is 61-12 in the regular season, 66-13 counting all. Before he arrived, OU's Big 12 mark was 8-16.
- Oklahoma has won five Big 12 titles. That's more than double any other league member.

**HOME FIELD HONCHOS**

Bob Stoops' teams are 57-2 at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium and have won their last 21 in a row there (longest current home field winning streak in the nation), and 41 of their last 42. The current streak is the longest under Stoops, who has twice coached the Sooners to 19 straight wins at home, and is tied for second-longest in school history. The top mark at Oklahoma was 25, a string that ended in 1953. A streak of 21 ended in 1975 and another of 20 ended in 1957.

**MARQUEE MATCHUPS AWAIT OKLAHOMA ON FUTURE SCHEDULES**

Non-conference games on future schedules include at Miami (Fla.) in 2009, at Florida State (2011), Notre Dame (2012), at Notre Dame (2013), Tennessee (2014), at Tennessee (2015), Ohio State (2016), at Ohio State (2017) and LSU in 2018 and 2019. Under Stoops, OU already played Louisville, Notre Dame, North Carolina, Alabama (twice), UCLA (twice), Oregon (twice), Washington (twice), South Florida and Miami (Fla.) in regular season contests.

**NEW VIDEO BOARD IN DEBUT SEASON AT NORMAN**

The board measures 113.5 feet wide by 32.5 feet tall (3,689 square feet). The previous video board space on the south end board was 36 X 21 (756 square feet). It is thought that the new board is the fourth-largest in the nation.

- The 16mm High Definition board was purchased at a cost \$4.5 million.
- The project included a new sound system, the extension of the ribbon boards on the upper decks and a new Sooner Vision high definition control room, which carried a price tag of \$2 million.

**STOOPS ERA YIELDING RECORD-SETTING ATTENDANCE NUMBERS**

Oklahoma has drawn 4,753,383 fans for Bob Stoops' 59 home games (started in 1999) ...

- All 59 have been sold out and the Sooners have prevailed 57 times.
- Last year's average home attendance of 84,858 was the largest in school history. The top eight seasons for OU home attendance have come on Stoops' watch.
- The crowd of 85,357 for the '07 Miami game was the largest to see a sporting event in the state of Oklahoma.
- OU has exceeded its listed capacity of 82,112 in 33 consecutive games.
- Oklahoma has played before sellout crowds in 103 of Stoops' 124 games. A total of 9,143,052, or an average of 73,734, has seen those games.

## ABOUT THE OFFENSE

■ Under Stoops, Oklahoma has produced its career leader in passing and receiving, while turning out the No. 3- and No. 4-ranked rusher in school history and the school record holder for single-season rushing, passing and receiving yards. Of the 81 basic offensive records at OU, 50 have been set on Stoops' watch.

- OU scored at least one TD in every game dating to Nov. 7, 1998.
- OU rushed for 200 yards 37 times under Stoops, 31 in the last five years.
- Also under Stoops, OU has 129 touchdowns of 25-plus yards and 256 scoring drives that took less than two minutes.

## SINCE SAM

OU has played 19 games since Sam Bradford was named the starting QB. He missed nearly all of the Texas Tech game last season due to injury (out during second series). Here is a look at OU's offensive production in those other 18 games, in which the team has a record of 16-2, a Big 12 title and BCS Bowl appearance ...

- The Sooners averaged 39.2 points per game and eclipsed 50 points eight times.
- He averaged 3.1 touchdown passes/game, while completing 343-of-487 passes (.704) with 54 TDs and 11 INT.
- Oklahoma averaged 416.7 yards total yards per game.
- He threw for 300+ yards six times and 400+ once in an offense that also averaged 190.1 rushing yards.
- Threw multiple TDs in 16 games with five each against Miami (Fla.), Texas A&M, Cincinnati and Washington.

## IGLESIAS PILES UP YARDS

WR Juaquin Iglesias is one of the top all-around performers ever to wear a Sooner uniform ...

- His career total of 3,394 all purpose yards is 13th on the career list at Oklahoma.
- Iglesias has the nation's fifth-longest streak for receptions in consecutive games with 37. He trails Rice's Jarrett Dillard (41) and UNLV's Casey Flair (40).

## TOUCHDOWNS GERMANE TO JERMAINE

Jermaine Gresham needs one TD reception to set a new mark for OU tight ends. He has, including four in '08.

- Gresham is striking from longer distance in 2008. Last season, he averaged 13.8 yards per touchdown catch, but that figure has ballooned to 29.5 this season.

## THREE-HEADED RUNNING GAME

Aside from Allen Patrick's 1,009 rushing yards last season, reserves Chris Brown (611 yards) and DeMarco Murray (764 yards) combined for 1,375. Murray scored 13 TDs, Brown nine. In '08, Murray, the starter, has 85 carries for 431 yards and five touchdowns. Brown and Mossis Madu have a combined 119 tries for 499 yards and nine TDs.

- In the opener, Brown became the 66th player in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a career. Murray became the 67th during the game at Washington.

## THE LINE ON THE LINE

At 6-5 (77.1 inches) and 302.8 pounds averaged on the two-deep, this is one of the biggest offensive lines in OU history. During the Stoops era this is the third-heaviest line. Last year's was the heaviest line at 316.6. By height, this is the third-tallest line under Stoops. The 2002 and 2003 lines both measured 77.2 inches.

- This line (two-deep) has combined for 160 starts, 230 games played.
- C Jon Cooper has the most plays this season among the line with 341. He's also tops in knockdowns with 55. Phil Loadholt has the highest overall grade for the season at 86% and he had the single-game high with 90% against Cincinnati. Loadholt has the top ground grade at 82% and is tied for the top pass grade with Cooper at 92%. The top single-game knockdown figure was 15 by Cooper at Washington.

## ONE-LINERS

- The Sooners are No. 1 in the nation in Red Zone Scoring (24-24) with 23 touchdowns and one field goal.
- OU ranks No. 4 nationally with 49.60 point/game, but the highest Sooner in individual scoring ranks No. 85th.
- Oklahoma's 19 touchdown passes have gone to six different receivers.
- OU has completed passes to 16 different receivers, which ranks No. 3 nationally.
- Sam Bradford had logged career-high passing yardage in three straight games before settling for 372 vs. Baylor.

## FIRST TO 30,000 POINTS

By points, Oklahoma is the highest scoring program in the history of college football.

In 1,132 games, the Sooners have scored **30,025** points, an average of **26.5** per game.

Chasing the Sooners are Michigan with 29,427 points in 1,198 games and Nebraska with 29,248 in 1,194.

**ABOUT THE SOONER DEFENSE**

- OU forced at least one turnover in 109 of Bob Stoops' 124 games and has at least one interception in 80 of the last 108; multiple picks in 34 of the last 79 outings.
- Oklahoma has nine shutouts under its current head coach. Opponents scored less than seven points 30 times and less than 14 in 57 games.

**SACK EXCHANGE RATE GOOD**

Over the last two seasons, Oklahoma's defense has 44 (2.3/game) sacks while allowing only 18 (0.9/game). This season, that ratio is 17:5.

**WEAK BREAK**

A lot of attention was focused on the weakside linebacker spot during the preseason, but Travis Lewis has answered some of those questions in the early going. The redshirt freshman is second on the team with 41 tackles, 12 of which came against Cincinnati. He had 4.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks in that game. The 12 tackles vs. UC rank No. 7 for a freshman at OU. The record of 19 was set by Brian Bosworth against Nebraska in 1984.

- Bosworth also has the freshman season tackle record at 133 followed by Darrell Reed with 90 and Kevin Murphy with 87. Reed and Murphy were defensive ends.
- Among linebackers, Lewis is already one of the best freshmen in Sooner history by tackles. Bosworth had his 133 followed by Rocky Calmus with 55, Chris Justice with 47 and then Dante Jones and Lewis with 41. Both Bosworth (twice) and Calmus won the Butkus Award as the nation's top linebacker.

**DEFENSIVE MISCELLANY**

- Oklahoma ranks No. 8 nationally for third-down defense. Opponents have converted just 21-of-76 for 27.6%.
- Oklahoma is No. 14 in the nation in Red Zone Defense with opponents scoring on just 9-of-14 trips. Four of those nine scores came in the form of field goals.

**TAKEAWAYS A GROUP PROJECT**

In 2008, several Oklahoma players have gotten in on taking the ball away from the opponents ...

- Five different players have forced a fumble.
- Three players have fumble recoveries, although FS Lendy Holmes and CB Brian Jackson each have two.
- The four interceptions thus far by the Sooners have been made by four different players.

**HE'S NEW, SORTA**

First-year Sooner Mike Balogun was born Sept. 28, 1983, and is 24 years old. Former OU players C.J. Ah You (2006) and Billy Sims (1979) were 24 during their senior seasons. Players of that age were typical after WWII. Since that time, the oldest Sooner football player was DL Dick Passo, who was 26 when he played in 1968.

**PUSH 'EM BACK**

Oklahoma has 42 tackles for 175 yards in losses compared to just 25 for 85 by the Sooner opponents.

**MORE THAN RUN STOPPERS**

Defensive ends and blitzers tend to be associated with the sack, but the Sooner interior has played a role in that statistic too. OU's four-man defensive tackle rotation has a combined total of 16.0 career sacks, and a DT has been credited with a full or have sack in three of three of the first four games.

**ABOUT THE SOONER SPECIAL TEAMS**

Oklahoma's special teams under Bob Stoops ...

- There have been 25 special teams TDs, including 19 in the last 67 regular season games. Those 19 came via five different kinds of plays -- 10 punt returns, two faked field goals, two blocked punts, four kickoff returns and a faked punt. Special teams also own one safety in that span.
- In total, OU has returned eight kickoffs and 14 punts for touchdowns on Stoops' watch (since 1999).
- The Sooners have blocked 21 kicks.

- The Sooners had 19 kickoff returns that covered at least 30 yards.
- Four different players had a return of more than 35 yards.
- All five players who returned kicks last season averaged at least 24 yards.
- DeMarco Murray ran 81 yards for a touchdown against Tulsa on the second kickoff return of his college career. His first came earlier in that same game. He then went for 91 yards and a touchdown against Baylor.

**KNALL EMERGES AT PUNTER**

Mike Knall won the starting job in the 10th game (vs. Baylor) of the 2007 season and held it for the remainder of the season. Prior to that time he had been used mostly in short-yardage situations as the pooch punter ...

- True to his pooch-punting past, Knall has put eight of his 23 kicks this season inside the 20. For his career, 17 of 58 boots have been downed inside the 20.

**FRESHMAN KICKER**

Redshirt freshman Jimmy Stevens is the team's placekicker. He is the first freshman to tackle that chore since Garrett Hartley did so in the Baylor game of 2004 (Nov. 20). Steven has been called upon for only one field goal this season, a 36-yarder that he converted against Cincinnati.

- Stevens has been victimized by a Sooner offense that is 24-of-24 in the Red Zone. He is just 1-of-1 on field goal attempts this season. The record for fewest FGs in a season at OU is zero on multiple occasions, most recently in 1962. There have been 10 seasons with single digit attempts, most recently eight in 1988.

**HOLD IT**

WR Carter Whitson, a walk-on, takes over as the team's holder. The sophomore played most of his high school career at Shawnee, Okla., before spending his senior season at Broken Arrow HS. He was a quarterback during his prep days. Whitson was the holder at Shawnee during his sophomore season.

- With redshirt freshman Jimmy Stevens at kicker, Whitson at holder and James Winchester as the long snapper, all three ball-handlers on placements are new this season.
- Freshman long snapper James Winchester is the son of former Sooner Mike Winchester, who lettered as a punter from 1984-86. Carolyn Winchester, a senior member of the OU women's basketball team, is James' sister.

History is one tough customer at Oklahoma. The tradition, so rich and so long-standing, is as daunting as it is impressive. To be among the best at Oklahoma is to be among the best in college football.

Such dramatics are lost on Bob Stoops. The Sooner head coach befriended the would-be albatross of OU's successful past from his first day on campus and remains steadfastly focused on tomorrow and the championship it holds.

It falls then to the observers and experts of the game to define Stoops' impact. Rarely have the pundits had it so easy.

Under Stoops, Oklahoma has won 102 games (102-22), nine bowl games, six of the BCS variety, had one string of 88 consecutive appearances in the AP poll and captured five Big 12 crowns (the next highest total in the league is two). His 2000 team won the national championship. On a playing field leveled by scholarship limits and parity, this era stares down the Oklahoma standard and does not blink.

The achievement dulls the memory of what Stoops inherited. When he arrived in Norman, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record, four from bowl play. Those atypical days of angst are so forgotten now that they might as well be mentioned with the land rush and dust bowl.

Stoop, born Sept. 9, 1960, has been characterized as a grounded family man, brilliant big-game coach, relentless recruiter, disciplined leader and a person with uncommon perspective.

His success emanates from a disciplined style true to his roots in the Steel Valley of Ohio, but he is far from inflexible. The principles to which he holds are the tried and true axioms of the sport . . . mixed with cutting edge strategy and an appreciation for the calculated risk.

During his time, OU has produced record-setting passers and receivers, five 1,000-yard rushers,

suffocating defense and special teams units that rank among the most dynamic in the land. Every facet has been impacted.

His players have snagged 16 national awards, including the 2003 Heisman Trophy won by Jason White. There have been more than 60 academic honorees, 62 All-Big 12 players, 24 All-Americans and 36 NFL draft choices.

Stoops has won a total of 10 national coach of the year awards and has been Big 12 Coach of the year three times.

This is one of the finest coaches in the history of one of college football's most storied traditions.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at Iowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive



coordinator at Kansas State (1991-95) during Bill Snyder's rein.

With the Wildcats, he played a key role in an impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances. Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. In 1996, he was part of a national championship team. It was with the Gators that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.

Stoops, who is widely known for countless hours of charitable work, most of which is directed towards children, graduated from Iowa in 1983 with a degree in marketing. He and his wife, Carol, have three children: daughter, Mackenzie, and twin sons, Drake and Isaac.

SEATTLE, Wash. -- Playing before a national television audience on ESPN, Oklahoma overwhelmed Washington in every facet to claim a 55-14 victory.

Just one week earlier, the Huskies had dropped a heart-breaking 28-27 verdict to No. 15 BYU.

The Sooners established a physical running game early to set up the pinpoint passing of quarterback Sam Bradford. Both Chris Brown (107) and DeMarco Murray (100) hit the 100-yard mark on the ground, while Bradford completed 18-of-21 passes for 304 yards with five touchdowns and no interceptions.

The Oklahoma defense was equally dominant, shutting out the Huskies until the 5:37 mark of the third period. Prior to that play, OU had amassed a 41-0 lead.

CB Brian Jackson led the defensive unit with two fumble recoveries, one fumble forced and five tackles.

At the end of the day, Oklahoma had 591 total yards with 274 on the ground and 317 through the air. UW finished with 336 yards, 95 in the fourth quarter.

The contest was the first ever played by OU in the state of Washington.

**NO. 2 OKLAHOMA 35, NO. 23/24 TCU 10**

NORMAN, Okla. -- Sam Bradford threw for a career-high 411 yards and Manuel Johnson set an Oklahoma record with 206 receiving yards as the No. 2-ranked Sooners sprinted past TCU, 35-10.

The Horned Frogs loaded up against the run, and limited OU to just 25 yards on 36 attempts, but opened themselves up to a flurry of big passing plays.

After finding Juaquin Iglesias for a 24-yard touchdown on OU's first possession, Bradford threw three straight TDs to Johnson on plays covering 76, 55 and 63 yards. Johnson became just the second player in school history to record three scoring plays of 55+ yards in one game (tying Antonio Perkins).

Oklahoma shredded the nation's No. 1-ranked defense for 436 total yards and Bradford threw at least four touchdown passes in a third consecutive game.

Meanwhile, the Sooner defense stymied a TCU team that was averaging 43.0 points per game by forcing four turnovers, two fumbles and two interceptions. The Horned Frogs did not get a touchdown until the fourth quarter.

The victory extended Oklahoma's home winning streak to 21 games, a figure that tied the second longest home streak in school history.
