SOONERS

The Game

Oklahoma (No. 10/10) and Florida State (No. 14 ESPN/Coaches and No. 18 AP) open a two-game series that concludes next season at Tallahassee. This is a rematch of the 2000 National Championship game won by OU, 13-2, at the Orange Bowl in Miami, Fla.

The Series

Oklahoma owns a 4-1 lead and has won the last four in a row. The Seminoles won the first meeting, a Gator Bowl clash on Jan. 2, 1965, at Jacksonville. With the exception of a 1976 game in Norman, a 24-9 Sooner win, every game has been a bowl. The last three were played in Miami.

The Coaches

- Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (Iowa '83) is 118-29 in his 12th season. He is 77-17 vs. the Big 12, 42-12 vs. the Big 12 South, 35-5 vs. the Big 12 North, 6-1 in the Big 12 title game, 41-12 vs. non-conference opponents, 67-2 at home, 33-14 on the road, 18-13 on neutral fields, 35-15 vs. ranked opponents, 5-6 in bowls, 1-0 vs. Florida State State.
- Florida State: Jimbo Fisher (Salem College '89) is 1-0 in his first season as the Seminoles' head coach.

The Program

- Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 800-302-53 in 115 seasons. Since WWII, OU leads the nation with 561 victories.
- The Sooners have captured seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000).
- OU has 43 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 25 bowl victories (No. 4 nationally).
- Oklahoma has 42 conference championships, including three of the last four Big 12 crowns and six overall (no other league member has more than three).
- OU has produced 150 All-Americans and five Heisman Trophy winners. Sooners have also won the Bednarik (1), Butkus (4), Walter Camp (4), Lombardi (3), Maxwell (2), Nagurski (2), O'Brien (3), (Outland (5), Tatupu (1), Thorpe (3) and Unitas (1) Awards.

The luncheon begins at 11:15 a.m. Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., and OU head coach Bob Stoops steps to the podium at 12:05 p.m. A limited number of players are on hand for interviews.

CREDENTIALS

Requests for credentials are accepted online. To receive the link to the web site, e-mail Kenny Mossman at kmossm@ou.edu. Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest. Media must show government issued photo identification upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential is void.

PRACTICE

All practice sessions are closed to media and public unless otherwise posted. On days when post-practice interviews are conducted, media should gather outside the practice site 10-15 minutes before the workout is complete. Requests for interviews will be recorded at that time and members of the athletics communications staff will escort media into the practice facility at the appropriate time.

INTERVIEWS

All interview requests should be submitted to the OU Athletic Communications Office ...

- Head Coach Bob Stoops will do general interviews following practice on Monday.
- Assistant Coaches: The coaches are available after the Monday-Wednesday practices (coordinators who appear at the Tuesday luncheon are not available that day).
- Players: All interviews with players will take place at the media luncheon or after practice on Monday and Tuesday. Media should request players at least 24 hours in advance. Those who attend the media luncheon are not available after Tuesday's practice.
- Post-Game: The OU locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Bob Stoops and several Sooner players will be brought to designated areas. After home games, the interview area is the Switzer Center's Red Room, located under the south end zone grandstand.

TIES WITH THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

• Oklahoma Head Coach Bob Stoops and Florida State Defensive Coordinator Mark Stoops are brothers. All of the four Stoops brothers are coaches. Mike is the head coach at Arizona and Ron is an assistant coach at Cardinal Mooney HS in Youngstown, Ohio, the alma mater and hometown for the Stoops brothers. Their late father, Ron, Sr., was an assistant coach at Cardinal Mooney, too. There are six Stoops children. Their mother, Evelyn (goes by Dee Dee), still resides in Youngstown.

HE AIN'T HEAVY

- There are three games this season that will pit brother coaching against brother and two of them involve Oklahoma. OU Head Coach Bob Stoops faces his brother Mark, Florida State's Defensive Coordinator, this week. The Sooners' final regular season game will feature running backs coach Cale Gundy against his brother, Oklahoma State Head Coach Mike Gundy.
- The other college game with a brotherly match-up this season is the North Carolina-William and Mary game. UNC's Offensive Coordinator is John Shoop. His brother, Bob, is William and Mary's defensive coordinator.

OKLAHOMA'S MOST RECENT GAME

Oklahoma defeated Utah State, 31-24, in Norman last Saturday night. It was the season opener for both teams.

- The Sooners led 21-0, before the upstart Aggies notched 17 unanswered points. The lead then ballooned to 31-17 before USU tacked on another score. OU downed the ball inside the Utah State 10 twice while time expired.
- It was the 800th win for the Oklahoma program. OU became just the seventh school to reach that figure.
- The attendance of 85,151 was the largest for an OU home opener.
- RB DeMarco Murray rushed 35 times for 218 yards and two touchdowns. The carries and yards were career highs. The yardage figure was 90 more than his previous best and the most ever by an Oklahoma player in a home opener. He notched a long run of 63 yards, which accounted for Oklahoma's fourth touchdown.
- Ryan Broyles caught nine passes for 142 yards and two touchdowns. It was the junior's seventh multiple TD game. It also was his eighth 100-yard receiving game, which places him just one behind Malcolm Kelly for second place on the OU career list. Broyles' yardage total was the most ever by an OU player in a season opener.
- Eight true freshman played. SS Tony Jefferson and WR Kenny Stills became the first true freshmen to start an opener since DT Tommie Harris in 2001.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH

- OU has 69 straight sellouts, one shy of the school record.
- The last 99 Oklahoma games have been on TV. This game will represent the 100th in a row to be televised.
- OU has won its last 31 home games, the longest current streak in the nation.

DURING THIS HOME STREAK

A look at data during the 31-game home field winning streak. It began on 9/1/05 with a 31-15 win over Tulsa ...

- The Sooners outscored their opponents by nearly 1,000 points -- 1,393-464, an average score of 45.4 to 14.9.
- OU scored 50+ pts., 11 times, 60+ five and a high of 79 vs. North Texas in '07 opener, Sam Bradford's first game.
- The low OU scoring total was 24 points twice.
- Oklahoma's defense has posted four shutouts during the streak and held the foe to single digits eight times.
- QBs: R. Bomar, P. Thompson, S. Bradford, L. Jones.
- Eighteen Sooners were taken in the NFL Draft.

LAST SEASON IN REVIEW

Oklahoma finished the season with an 8-5 mark, 5-3 in the Big 12, good for third place in the South Division. The Sooners earned a spot in the 76th Brut Sun Bowl where they knocked off Stanford, 31-27.

- All-American Total Jumps to 150: Oklahoma added two All-Americans to its staggering total in defensive tackle Gerald McCoy and offensive tackle Trent Williams, both of whom were consensus picks. The Sooner program has averaged 1.3 All-Americans per year since its inception, which actually predates All-America teams.
- Sooners Played Second Most Difficult Schedule: Based on its opponents’ record, OU played the second-most difficult schedule. The Oklahoma foes were a combined 82-52. Only Mississippi State faced a tougher slate.
- OU lost 26 starting assignments to injuries. Two were returning All-Americans -- QB Sam Bradford (Heisman winner) and TE Jermaine Gresham.
- The group that was lost included four All-Big 12 performers, four seniors and two captains. OU used 10 different starters in the offensive line and had 10 different o-line combinations.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2010

Twenty-three full or part-time position starters return. Among those players returning are last season’s leaders in passing yards (Landry Jones), receiving yards (Ryan Broyles), tackles (Travis Lewis) and interceptions (Quinton Carter), and the No. 2 rusher (DeMarco Murray).

- The 12 opponents on the 2010 schedule combined for a record of 90-64 in 2009 and nine played in bowl games.

NON-CONS

Bob Stoops’ teams are 41-12 against non-conference opponents, 35-6 in regular season non-league games and 28-1 on Owen Field.

OKLAHOMA AND THE AP POLL

Oklahoma is ranked No. 7 in the first Associated Press poll. Here is a look at OU’s history in the poll, which began in 1938 ...

- Oklahoma has appeared in the AP poll in 63 of its 75 seasons of existence (84%). There have been 1,006 polls released and OU has appeared in 689 of those (68%).
- The Sooners were in the preseason top 25 for the 52nd time.

STOOPS ERA YIELDING RECORD-SETTING ATTENDANCE

- Oklahoma has drawn 5,433,549 fans for Bob Stoops’ 69 home games (started in 1999) and all have been sold out.
- The Sooners are 67-2 on Owen Field under Stoops and have won 31 straight, a school record and the nation’s longest current streak.
 - The current string of sellouts is tied for the longest in school history, equaling a string of 69 from 1971-84.
 - The average home attendance of 85,075 in 2008 was a school record. The top nine seasons for football attendance at Oklahoma came on Stoops’ watch.
 - The largest home crowd in school history was 85,646, on hand for the 2008 OU-Texas Tech game.
 - Oklahoma has exceeded its listed seating capacity of 82,112 at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium in 43 consecutive home games.
 - Oklahoma has played before sellout crowds in 120 of the 147 games (home, away, neutral) since Stoops became the head coach. During that time, a total of 10,636,439 (average of 72,356) have watched the Sooners. .

ABOUT THE OFFENSE

- Under Stoops, OU produced career leaders in passing and receiving, its No. 3 and No. 5 career rushers and season record holders in rushing, passing and receiving yards.
- Some 57 offensive records have been set in Stoops' tenure at Oklahoma.
- OU has scored in every game dating back to Nov. 7, 1998.
- OU has rushed for 200 yards 44 times under Stoops, 38 in the last six years.
- Also under Stoops, OU has 148 touchdowns of 25+ yards and 301 scoring drives of 2:00 or less.
- OU is the highest scoring program in college football history. In 1,155 games, the Sooners have scored 30,947 points. Michigan has 29,970 points in 1,214 games and Nebraska 29,947 in 1,220.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE IN 2009

- In a year during which injuries played such a key role, the offense bore most of the brunt. Of the 11 players who started the season opener, only five started the finale. One of those five, Trent Williams, started the opener at left tackle, but was in the center role for the bowl game. His position change and the absence of three others were due to injuries.
- During the season, Chris Brown and DeMarco Murray became just the sixth running back tandem in school history to exceed 2,000 career rushing yards while playing on the same roster. Brown completed his eligibility in '09. That duo became the first to share a roster spot and exceed 40 career touchdowns. Both had 45 at the end of last season. OU's string of seasons with a 1,000-yard rusher ended at five, but that was due to substitution patterns. Brown (749) and Murray (705) combined for 1,454 yards.

BY LAND OR AIR, MURRAY LETHAL

With 41 receptions last season, DeMarco Murray had the third-best season ever for a Sooner back (he had none in the 2010 opener). For his career, Murray has 86 receptions for 977 yards. That yardage figure ranks No. 2 for an OU running back behind 1,337 by Quentin Griffin from 1999-02. Over his career, Murray has averaged 27 receiving yards per game so at that pace he would need at least 13 games to eclipse Griffin's mark. Griffin also has the receptions mark for backs at 169 and Murray is holding down the No. 2 spot.

- Murray does lead all Oklahoma backs in touchdown receptions with eight.
- Not to be lost is Murray's rushing prowess. He needs 231 yards to crack perhaps OU's most prestigious top-10 list, the career rushing category. Despite a pair of Heisman-winning quarterbacks during the same era, three of the backs currently on that list played under Bob Stoops -- Adrian Peterson, Quentin Griffin and Chris Bown.

BROYLES' BREAKOUT SEASON

Ryan Broyles finished last season with 86 receptions for 1,120 yards and 15 touchdowns.

- He set school records for receptions in a season, receptions in a game (13 vs. Stanford), touchdown receptions in a season (15, tied) and receptions per game (6.61).
- His Sun Bowl effort -- 13 receptions, 156 yards, three touchdowns -- was record-setting. The TD total set an OU bowl and Sun Bowl mark. The receptions total was an OU bowl record and the second-highest total in the 76-year history of the Sun Bowl.
- Broyles' 23 career TD receptions is tied for No. 3 all-time at OU with Malcolm Kelly (2005-07).
- With 102 points, he became the first WR to lead OU in scoring (stats tracked for 72 seasons).

KEEPING UP WITH JONES

Landry Jones led the nation's freshmen quarterbacks in passing yards (3,198) and touchdown passes (26) last season. His yardage figure also was an Oklahoma freshman record, surpassing the 3,121 by Sam Bradford in 2007.

- Jones set a school record for touchdown passes in a game with six against Tulsa.

SAM WAS EFFICIENT

Sam Bradford, the No. 1 pick in the 2010 NFL Draft, finished his career as the NCAA leader in career passing efficiency. His rating was 175.62, which broke the mark of 168.89 held by Boise State's Ryan Dinwiddie (2000-03). Bradford led the NCAA in pass efficiency in each of his two full seasons of eligibility to become just the fourth player to lead that statistic in two straight years.

GOOD SIGN ON THE LINE

The injury problem on OU's offensive line became so significant last season that only eight scholarship linemen were available for the Sun Bowl with two players appearing twice on the five-position depth chart. Only six linemen saw action in the game, including converted tight end Eric Mensik in just his second game at tackle and All-America tackle Trent Williams (now the Washington Redskins' starting left tackle) playing center for the first time.

- Entering the 2010 season, there are 16 scholarship offensive linemen on the Sooner roster with no repeats on the two-deep.
- The current depth chart features just two seniors and the only senior starter is Mensik at right tackle. Despite the relative youth of the line, the current two-deep includes players who have combined to play in 96 games.

ABOUT THE SOONER DEFENSE

- OU has forced at least one turnover in 130 of Bob Stoops' 147 games and has at least one interception in 96 of the last 127 with multiple picks in 47 of the last 98 outings.
- Oklahoma has 11 shutouts under its current head coach. Opponents failed to score more than seven points 32 times and scored less than 14 in 60 games.

WEAK FREAK

Weakside linebacker Travis Lewis has led Oklahoma in tackles in each of his first two seasons. His 109 last season were 21 more than any other player on the team.

- Lewis, with 265 tackles, has positioned himself to make a run at the prestigious career top-10 tackle list at Oklahoma. The record is held by the late Daryl Hunt at 530. The No. 10 spot belongs to Lee Roy Selmon at 335, 74 ahead of Lewis. Lewis has averaged 12.0 tackles per game during his career, which would put him on pace to move ahead of Selmon in game seven.
- Tracking down big names is nothing new for Lewis. As a freshman in 2007, he racked up 144 tackles to break Brian Bosworth's Oklahoma freshman record of 133.
- In 27 career games played, Lewis has 10 or more tackles 11 times.

THE REAL BEAL

Defensive end Jeremy Beal looks like a candidate to become Oklahoma's first Ted Hendricks Award winner. He had one sack and two tackles for loss in the opener.

- Last season, Beal ranked No. 14 nationally in tackles for loss (1.46 per game/19 total) and No. 16 in sacks (0.8 per game and 11 total).
- His 11 sacks last season rank No. 4 for a season at OU.
- Beal is the only player in school history to notch two, three-sack games in the same year. He had three each against Tulsa and Miami last season.
- The senior ranks No. 5 at Oklahoma for sacks in a career with 21.5. He is creeping up on the top-10 list for tackles for loss. He has 40, which ties Darrell Reed, Tony Casillas and Lee Roy Selmon for the No. 9 spot.

Q TIPS

Quinton Carter has emerged as one of the top defensive backs in the nation. The safety had seven tackles and an interception in game one.

- In 2009, he had 88 tackles, which ranked No. 2 on the team, to go with four interceptions, a figure that tied for the Oklahoma lead.
- Carter, who saw spot duty in his first two seasons, started all 13 games in 2009 when his tackle total for the season more than doubled the 37 he registered as a freshman and sophomore combined.
- Has 19 special teams tackles over the last two seasons and all 19 were solo.

TAYLOR MADE

DT Adrian Taylor was out for much of the preseason recovering from a dislocated ankle suffered in the Sun Bowl. His string of 27 consecutive starts ended in the opener, but he did get snaps as a reserve (no statistics). It's worth noting that he had 37 total tackles last season, three more than NFL No. 3 overall pick Gerald McCoy, his running mate for the previous two seasons.


CORNER CONVERSATION

Oklahoma is replacing both starting corners from last season. Brian Jackson completed his eligibility while Dominique Franks came out after his junior season. Both scored touchdowns for OU last season, Jackson on a 52-yard fumble recovery against Texas A&M and Franks on an 85-yard interception return at Kansas. It was one of three defensive TDs Franks scored during his career.

- The game one starters were Jamell Fleming at boundary corner and Demontre Hurst at field corner. Fleming had a team-high 10 tackles and an interception, while Hurst had one tackle and one interception, which he returned 49 yards. The pair tied for No. 3 on last year's team in special teams tackles with 9 each.
- The pair has combined for 42 games played at Oklahoma -- 28 by Fleming and 14 by Hurst.

DEFENSIVE MISCELLANY

- Oklahoma had three shutouts last season, its best total since getting five in 1986.
- Sooner opponents scored just 20 first-quarter points in 2009, an average of 1.5/game.
- In 13 games, the 2009 Sooner defense played against eight of the top 50 scoring teams and seven of the top 40 total offenses.

ABOUT THE SOONER SPECIAL TEAMS

Oklahoma's special teams under Bob Stoops ...

• There have been 27 special teams touchdowns, including 21 in the last 78 regular season games. Those 21 came via five different kinds of plays -- 12 punt returns, two faked field goals, two blocked punts, four kickoff returns and a faked punt. Special teams also own one safety in that span.

• Oklahoma has returned eight kickoffs and 16 punts for touchdowns.

• The Sooners have blocked 24 kicks.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS

Information on returns during the Stoops era ...

• Kickoff Returns -- 94 returns of 25 yards or more with eight touchdowns.

• Punt Returns -- 60 returns of 15 or more yards with 16 touchdowns.

• Interception Returns -- 82 returns of 10 or more yards with 21 touchdowns.

• Fumble Returns -- six returns of 15 or more yards with eight touchdowns.

OU PUNT RETURNS SUCCESSFUL

Oklahoma ranked No. 3 nationally last season in punt returns (16.26), a figure that also coincided with Ryan Broyles' individual ranking (15.87).

• The team average was the best at Oklahoma since 1974 when the average return went for 16.4 yards. What makes the average even more impressive is the fact that OU ranked No. 2 in the Big 12 last season in punt return attempts at 43, just one behind Nebraska's 44.

• For the second straight year, Broyles returned a punt for a touchdown, this time an 87-yarder against Oklahoma State.

• When Broyles was shelved by an injury, Dominique Franks returned 11 punts for an average of 17.0.

A LOW RANKING THEY'LL TAKE

Last season, thanks to a defense that allowed just 34 scoring plays (2.6/game), Oklahoma tied for last in the Big 12 in kickoff return attempts with just 33.

COVER TEAM A STONE WALL

As good as Oklahoma was at returning punts, the same could not be said of the Sooner opponents. The Sooner foes ran back just 17 punts for a paltry 30 yards. That 1.76-yard average ranked No. 2 nationally.

• Oklahoma was No. 5 in net punting nationally at 40.3 yards per kick.

• The longest punt return OU surrendered last season was 19 yards, which occurred on just one occasion. No other punt return during the season exceeded six yards.

• In the 2010 opener, Utah State returned one punt for zero yards.



P Tress Way

WAY GOOD AT PUNTER

P Tress Way had arguably the best season ever for an OU punter in 2009, and was just a redshirt freshman. He punted 61 times for an average of 45.7 yards with 22 of 50+ yards and 17 inside the 20.

• Way's average ranked No. 1 in the Big 12 and No. 3 nationally. It also was the second-best average in OU history, the best by a punter with at least 35 attempts.

• He averaged a school-record 58.8 yards on six punts against Oklahoma State, including one 74-yarder.

• Way's 22 kicks of 50 or more yards last season positions him to make a run at the career mark. Jeff Ferguson (1998-01) set that record with 52. Ferguson was an All-American and Ray Guy finalist in 2001.

• In this year's opener, he averaged 46.6 yards on six kicks, including an 85-yarder, the third-longest punt in school history and the longest since 1970.

KICKER BY COMMITTEE

That was the case last season when three different players took a turn. Bob Stoops named sophomore Patrick O'Hara the starting kicker for this season.

• O'Hara wrapped up 2009 as the kicker. He had never played football before kicking in the Texas A&M game. He made 6-of-9 field goals.

• Jimmy Stevens began the season in the job, making 11-of-13 field goals.

• Tress Way went 1-of-6, although it should be noted that four of his attempts were from beyond 40 yards.

• OU attempted 28 field goals last season, 15 more than in 2008 and the most since the 2001 team tried 30.

NEW FACES IN KEY PLACES

The Sooners will have new players handling kickoff and holding chores. Way will handle the kickoffs, while the holding duties go to John Nimmo. Nimmo is a senior quarterback from Ponca City, Okla. He has been a regular golf partner with Sam Bradford.

FRANK ALEXANDER • DE • 84

Started the last three games of 2009 ... has nine total starts, but is the preseason No. 1 at this position for the first time in his career ... sat out the Utah State game with an ankle injury.

JEREMY BEAL • DE • 44

Candidate for several post-season honors ... spread his 11 sacks over seven games last season ... Moved into fifth place in OU career sacks with a sack against Utah State giving him 21.5 for his career.

AUSTIN BOX • LB • 12

Incurred a back injury and missed the season opener against Utah State.

CORY BRANDON • OT • 70

Saw action in 13 games last season with seven starts.

RYAN BROYLES • SL • 85

Big-play potential and both receiver and punt returner ... will have a shot at breaking all of OU's receiving records ... has one reception in 27 consecutive games, the seventh-longest streak among active players ... hauled in nine receptions for 142 yards and two TDs against Utah State, his seventh career multiple TD game.

BRANDON CALEB • WR • 8

OU's most physical receiver after the catch.

JERMIE CALHOUN • RB • 23

Put together solid spring and fall camps ... ranked No. 3 for OU last season in rushing attempts with 45.

QUINTON CARTER • FS • 20

Thorpe Award candidate and one of the team's most active community servants ... picked off fifth career pass against Utah State.

BRENNAN CLAY • RB • 21

True freshman listed as one of starting kick returners ... had one return for 22 yards vs. Utah State.

TYLER EVANS • OG • 75

Starter at right guard, he's up 36 pounds since arriving as a freshman.

JAMELL FLEMING • CB • 32

Athletic player who is in his first season at a starting role ... first career interception and first career double-digit tackle game (10) against Utah State.

TREY FRANKS • WR • 9

True freshman, expected to provide depth at kick returner ... had one return for 17 yards vs. Utah State.

STEPHEN GOOD • OG • 77

Already has 21 games played at Oklahoma, including eight starts.

BEN HABERN • C • 61

Missed the last two games last season with a dislocated ankle, but was one of the Big 12's standout freshmen.

DEMONTRE HURST • CB • 19

First-year starter at corner ... played extensively on special teams last season ... picked off first career pass against Utah State.

JOSEPH IBILOYE • LB • 5

Originally a safety, he has moved to outside linebacker.

TONY JEFFERSON • DB • 1

True freshman who earned first career start against Utah State as a fifth defensive back ... finished game with four tackles.

CAMERON KENNEY • WR • 6

Lone junior college transfer on the two-deep on either side of the ball ... saw action as a kick returner against Utah State for the first time in OU career.

DAVID KING • DE • 90

Earned first career start against Utah State and responded with first career sack and four total tackles.

TRAVIS LEWIS • LB • 28

Figures to be a frontrunner for All-America honors and could vie for OU's fifth Butkus Award ... led linebacking crew with eight tackles against Utah State.

RONNELL LEWIS • LB • 56

Saw most of his action on special teams as a freshman, but figures to see more plays from scrimmage in 2010 ... rotated at both linebacker and defensive end against Utah State.

MOSSIS MADU • RB • 17

Spent some time at receiver last season, but his back at his original position, running back.

STACY MCGEE • DT • 92

Practiced in the offensive line late last season when the ranks were thinned by injury, but has always been viewed as a defensive lineman with outstanding potential ... eclipsed his previous career tackle total with three stops against Utah State.

TREY MILLARD • FB • 33

True freshman is Sooners top player at fullback ... had three carries for 16 yards against Utah State.

DEJUAN MILLER • WR • 24

Made 25 of his 38 receptions over the final six games of last season.

DEMARCO MURRAY • RB • 7

Healthier than at any point over the past two seasons, he rates as one of the best run-catch combos in OU history ... Career high 218 rushing yards against Utah State on a career high 35 carries ... Has multiple rushing touchdowns in 14 games ... Owns 10 100-yard rushing performances.

JONATHAN NELSON • SS • 4

Has an interception in four of the last six games.

PATRICK O'HARA • K • 43

Named the starting kicker on Tuesday after appearing in four games in 2009 ... hit seventh career field goal with a 32-yard kick against Utah State.

Originally from the United Kingdom, he missed last season after suffering a knee injury the previous spring ... has tremendous instincts despite a relatively late introduction to the game.
