The Match-Up

- Oklahoma begins its 118th season of football against UTEP out of Conference USA. The game is OU's first season opener away from Norman since facing BYU at Cowboys Stadium (9/5/09). The Sooners have not played a road season opener since playing at Tulsa (8/30/02).
- Oklahoma has not lost a season opener on the road since 1968 and is 13-0 in road openers in that time.
- OU and UTEP have opened a season once before, when the Sooners defeated the Miners, 55-14, (9/2/00) on their way to the 2000 national championship.
- Oklahoma's win over UTEP in 2000 initiated a 20-game winning streak.
- OU is playing its first season opener outside the state of Oklahoma since playing at Syracuse (9/3/94).
- Oklahoma has played on Sept. 1 just two other times in school history - a 79-10 win vs. North Texas (9/1/2007) in the season opener and a 44-3 triumph at Air Force (9/1/2001).
- The Sooners defeated Tulsa, 47-14, in last season's opener (9/3/11).

The Series

- The game marks the third time OU and UTEP have met, with the Sooners holding a 2-0 advantage following wins in 2000 (55-14) and 2002 (68-0).
- This is the first time the two teams have played in El Paso, though OU has previously played three bowl games at the Sun Bowl (1981 Sun Bowl, 1993 John Hancock Bowl, 2009 Sun Bowl).

What to Watch

- Oklahoma opens the season ranked No. 4 in both the *USA Today* Coaches' Poll and the Associated Press Poll.
- Senior quarterback Landry Jones comes into the game with a 29-8 (.784) record as a starter. He is four wins away from passing Steve Davis (32, 1973-75) to become the winningest QB in Oklahoma history. Jones currently sits atop the OU career record books in passing yards, completions, attempts, touchdown passes and starts.
- OU has an 8-4 non-conference road record under Stoops and has won four of its last five. The Sooners have won 10 straight non-conference games and have a 49-12 overall record under Stoops outside the Big 12.
- Oklahoma is 29-11 under Bob Stoops on the road vs. unranked teams.
- The Sooners are 7-3 under Bob Stoops in September road games.
- Under Bob Stoops (1999-11), the Sooners are ranked in the top 10 in 35 different categories among FBS schools.

THE PROGRAM

- Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 821-307-53 (.718) in 117 seasons.
- Since WWII, OU leads the nation with 577 victories.
- The Sooners have captured seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000).
- OU has 45 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 27 bowl victories (No. 4 nationally) and an all-time record of 27-17-1 (.611).
- OU has 43 conference championships, including seven Big 12 titles overall (no other school has more than three).
- Oklahoma is the only program in FBS history to have four coaches with 100 or more wins.
- OU has 153 All-Americans and 73 consensus All-Americans, including NCAA career receptions leader Ryan Broyles in 2011.
- Under Stoops, OU has had 33 All-Americans, including 23 consensus. Of the 33 players, 15 were on offense, 16 on defense and two on special teams representing 14 different positions.
- Oklahoma boasts five Heisman winners. Sooners have also won the Bednarik (1), Butkus (4), Camp (4), Lombardi (3), Maxwell (2), Nagurski (2), O'Brien (3), Outland (5), Tatupu (1), Thorpe (3) and Unitas (1).
- OU leads the nation with 33 seasons in which the program has won 10 or more games.
- Sooner teams have gone undefeated 14 times in program history, the first in 1896 and the latest in 2000.
- Oklahoma's 47-game win streak from 1953-57 is still the NCAA D-I record.
- Oklahoma has had 102 Academic All-Big 12 honorees under Stoops.
- The Sooners have gone 77-3 at home in Stoops' 13 seasons. In all, Oklahoma has won 81 percent of its home games since Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial opened in 1923.
- Oklahoma has played in front of 80 consecutive home sellouts - every game of Stoops' tenure.
- Including the seven Sooners picked in the 2012 NFL Draft, OU has had 357 players picked all-time in the draft.
- Oklahoma has 42 first-round picks, including three No. 1 overall selections.
- In 2010, Sooners were chosen with three of the first four picks in the draft, with QB Sam Bradford at No. 1, DT Gerald McCoy at No. 3 and OT Trent Williams at No. 4.
- Bob Stoops' career average of 10.7 wins per year is tops among active FBS head coaches with at least 10 years of experience.
- Stoops is the only active head coach on the FBS level to have reached a bowl game in each of his first 13 seasons. Georgia's Mark Richt (11) comes in second.
- Of the 13 bowls, eight have been BCS bowl games and four have been for the BCS title.
- Stoops' 10 double-digit win seasons in his first 13 as a head coach are unmatched among active FBS coaches. He joins Richt and BYU's Bronco Mendenhall as the only active coaches with five such seasons in their first seven years.

THE TEAMS AT A GLANCE



OKLAHOMA Sooners

Although OU returns 12 players on offense and 12 players on defense with a combined 339 career starts, it lost

serious star power in its small 2011 senior class which combined for 271 starts among 12 players on offense and defense.

Offense

The Oklahoma offense returns the most seasoned quarterback in school history in Landry Jones (37 career starts), who had 4,463 yards, 29 TDs and a 343.3 ypg average in 2011. Several receivers, including Kenny Stills (61 recs., 849 yds, 8 TDs) and newcomer Trey Metoyer will step in for the loss of NCAA receptions leader Ryan Broyles. The backfield will be led by Dominique Whaley (627 yds, 9 TDs), who was OU's leading rusher from a year ago, though he suffered a season-ending ankle injury in the team's seventh game. Despite injuries, the offensive line also returns a load of experience in the trenches.

Defense

Mike Stoops returns to OU as the defensive coordinator, building a defense on aggression and speed after the Sooners lost four standouts to the 2012 NFL Draft. The senior duo of David King (31 tackles, 4 TFLs) and RJ Washington (16 tackles, 5.0 sacks) will hold the defensive line while Corey Nelson (59 tackles, 8.5 TFLs) will anchor the linebackers. The backfield will return five full or part-time starters led by Demontre Hurst (55 tackles, 11 PBUs), Tony Jefferson (74 tackles, 7.5 TFLs, 4 INTs) and last year's leading tackler, Aaron Colvin (84 tackles).

Special Teams

Sophomore Michael Hunnicutt, a Groza Award candidate, returns at kicker after tying the OU record for field goals in 2011 with 21 makes. Senior punter Tress Way, who has 58 career punts of 50+ yards, also returns.



UTEP Miners

Coming off a 5-7 record last season after taking fifth in the Conference USA west division, UTEP returns 13 starters,

including seven on offense, four on defense and two on special teams.

Offense

Of the 16 players who registered a reception in 2011, eight return this year, including the Miners' top two receivers, Michael Edwards and Jordan Leslie. Edwards had 50 catches for 657 yards and three touchdowns in 2012, while Leslie averaged a team-best 14.3 yards per catch and had 30 receptions for 430 yards. Also on offense, UTEP has three tight ends returning, including Kevin Perry, Eric Tomlinson and Craig Wenrick, who combined for 391 receiving yards last season. The Miners will have to replace lost personnel in the running game, returning just 12 percent of last year's rushing yards.

Defense

Safety DeShawn Grayson and linebacker Josh Fely will lead the UTEP defense after totaling 67 and 61 tackles, respectively, last season. Defensive lineman Horace Miller, who led the team a year ago with five sacks, also returns to what should be a strong defensive line along with Germard Reed and Greg Watkins.

Special Teams

A 2011 semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, punter Ian Campbell returns after being ranked third nationally with a 46.1 net average, and he has had 18 punts of over 50 yards. A freshman last season, kicker Steven Valadez averaged 65.5 yards per kickoff and had a 46-yard field goal in 2011.

THE HEAD COACHES



Bob Stoops Oklahoma

Last season, Oklahoma registered its 10th 10-win season under Stoops. In 2010 Oklahoma won its seventh Big 12 title, all of which have come under the current head coach. Stoops didn't arrive

at OU until the Big 12 was three years old, but already he has coached the program to more than twice as many championships as any other school in the league.

Stoops won a national crown in 2000, just his second season in Norman, and has led the Sooners to a school-record 13 consecutive bowl games, including seven of the BCS variety.

Along the way, he has picked up 17 coach of the year citations, including eight on the national level (only five coaches nationally have won more conference coach of the year awards), and watched five assistant coaches move into Football Bowl Subdivision head coaching positions.

Stoops can claim 139 victories (he reached 100 victories faster than any coach in college football history) and has a 44-18 mark against opponents ranked among the Associated Press top 25.

Two Heisman winners and five Heisman finalists have been characteristic of the talent Stoops and his staff have attracted. The offenses have been among the best in college football history (the 2008 team was the first to score 60 or more points in five straight games en route to scoring an NCAA record 716 points).

The defense has been stingy and is the only program to produce two players who won the Thorpe and Nagurski Awards in the same season.

Stoops has been characterized as a grounded family man, big-game coach, relentless recruiter, strong leader and a person with uncommon perspective.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at Iowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry, working through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at Kansas State (1991-95). There he played a key role in one of the most impressive turnarounds in college football history while serving on Bill Snyder's staff.

Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. It was with the Gators, and a national championship team in 1996, that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.



Mike Price UTEP

The 1997 National Coach of the Year, Mike Price is entering his ninth season at the helm of the UTEP football program. Overall Price is in his 31st year as a collegiate head coach, including

previous stops at Weber State and Washington State. With 174 victories, Price is the sixth-winningest active head coach in the NCAA's Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS).

Price has been the head coach for 11 bowl teams, including Washington State at the Rose Bowl in 1997 and 2002. Price has once again worked his magic at UTEP, resurrecting a program that had suffered through three straight two-win seasons and engineering bowl appearances in 2004, 2005 and 2010.

Price is only the second coach to lead UTEP to three bowl bids, joining Mike Brumbelow who directed the Miners to the Sun Bowl in 1954, 1955 and 1957.

Price has posted 45 wins at UTEP, third in school annals and one behind Brumbelow (46). The Price era has produced UTEP's all-time leader for passing yards (Trevor Vittatoe), total offensive yards (Vittatoe), receiving yards (Johnnie Lee Higgins, Jr.), all-purpose yards (Howard Jackson) and the single-season rushing champion (Donald Buckram).

In the first two seasons under Price, the Miners racked up 16 wins and appeared in back-to-back bowl games for the first time in 50 years, while earning rankings in both top-25 polls late in the season.

Price was the head coach at Washington State University from 1989-02. During his stint with the Cougars he compiled an 83-78 record, with three 10-win seasons and five bowl appearances. Price's 2002 unit was the Pac-10 co-champion with a 7-1 mark and met Oklahoma in the Rose Bowl.

He was the head coach at Weber State from 1981-88, registering a 46-44 record.

Price orchestrated four winning seasons at Weber State, including a 10-3 campaign in 1987. The Wildcats were Big Sky Conference co-champions that year and reached the quarterfinals of the I-AA playoffs.

He previously was an assistant coach at Washington State (graduate assistant, 1969-70 and running backs, 1974-77), Missouri (quarterbacks and receivers, 1978-80) and Puget Sound (offensive coordinator, 1971-73). He coached in three bowl games as an assistant (1978 Liberty, 1979 Hall of Fame, 1980 Liberty).

NORMAN - Oklahoma got several big plays on both sides of the ball, including two interception returns for touchdowns, in a 68-0 victory over UTEP that included a 51-minute weather delay.

Antwone Savage raced for a 56-yard touchdown on the game's second play.

Nate Hybl threw for 278 yards and two touchdowns and Quentin Griffin had 108 yards rushing and two TDs as Oklahoma (3-0) won by its widest margin since a 73-3 victory over New Mexico State in 1989.

Play was stopped late in the first quarter with Oklahoma leading 14-0. After the break, which allowed thunderstorms to pass through, the Sooners scored 24 second-quarter points and kept on rolling.

The Miners (1-2) were shut out for the first time since 1996, a streak of 61 games.

TEMPE, Ariz. -- It wasn't always pretty, but Oklahoma grinded out a win, closing out a difficult year that included the death of a teammate and failed national title aspirations.

Blake Bell ran for his third touchdown in the closing seconds and Oklahoma (No. 14 BCS, No. 19 AP) survived a late rally, not to mention the crashing camera, to beat Iowa 31-14 in the Insight Bowl on Friday night.

Oklahoma (10-3) didn't get a particularly great game from quarterback Landry Jones and wasn't effective on the ground, either. Once considered national-title contenders, the Sooners held off the gritty Hawkeyes, capping a painful year that started with the death of linebacker Austin Box in the offseason.

Jones threw for 161 yards with a touchdown and an interception, and Bell put the game away with a 21-yard touchdown run with 45 seconds left.

Iowa (7-6) fell into a 21-0 hole before rallying behind two touchdown passes from James Vandenberg.

About the Offense

- Under Bob Stoops, OU has produced career leaders in passing, receiving, total offense and all-purpose yards, four top 10 career rushers and season record holders in rushing, passing, total offense and receiving yards.
- Stoops-led Sooner teams have set 66 offensive school records.
- OU has scored in 175 consecutive games since 11/7/98.
- Since Stoops' arrival, OU has scored 6,396 points - an average of 492 points per season and 37 per game.
- Oklahoma is the highest scoring college program in history. In 1,182 games, the Sooners have scored 31,951 points. Michigan is next at 30,799 points in 1,245 games.

Oklahoma 0

Oklahoma has racked up 300 yards or more of total offense in 35 straight regular season contests dating back to early 2009. Against No. 10 Kansas State in 2011, OU totaled 690 yards, the eighth-most in team history and the highest total during that span.

Throwing Streak

Dating back to last year's win against Missouri, Landry Jones has thrown for 250 or more yards in 10 consecutive regular season games, including a program-record 505-yard outing vs. Kansas State last October. In all, four of the top seven single-game highs in passing yards came in 2011 with Jones at the helm.

Pass It Around

The Sooners had the No. 5 passing offense last season, giving OU its fourth-straight year in the top 11 in that category. OU has finished No. 3 twice (2008, 2010) and No. 11 (2009) recently.

Ikard Front and Center

An Outland and Lombardi Trophy candidate, senior lineman Gabe Ikard takes over at center for the Sooners on the offensive line in 2012. Last season, Ikard

continued Oklahoma's streak of All-Big 12 offensive lineman by being named a first-team selection. Ikard was also named a third-team All-American by both the Associated Press and Yahoo! Sports.

In addition to his play on the field, Ikard was also named an Academic All-American for his work in the classroom, the fourth Sooner in the last four years to earn that honor.

Doing it All

Junior fullback Trey Millard had a breakout year in 2011 while covering the entire field on both offense and special teams. The Columbia, Mo., native is one of two Sooners on the current roster named All-Big 12 and Academic All-District last year after rushing for 169 yards on 24 carries for a 7.0 average and two touchdowns. Coming out of the backfield, Millard also added 13 receptions for 127 yards and a TD through the air. Millard even led the Sooners on special teams by notching a team-high 14 tackles in coverage.

Wide Open

Junior Kenny Stills will anchor the Sooner receiving corps after registering 1,635 yards, 122 receptions and 13 TDs in just two seasons. Second-team All-Big 12 last season, Stills is in the top 11 in three different OU career categories, including receptions, receiving yards and receiving TDs (see p. 8). Among active players in the NCAA, Stills ranks No. 6 in receiving yards per game (65.9), tied for No. 13 in TD receptions, No. 19 in receptions and No. 21 in receiving yards.

The Belldozer

With three TD runs against Iowa in the season finale, sophomore quarterback Blake Bell was named the Insight Bowl Offensive MVP. Bell broke the Oklahoma record for rushing TDs by a freshman quarterback with 13 in 2011.

OU Sets Annual Donation Record

The University of Oklahoma Athletics Department has already received nearly \$21 million in Sooner Club annual donations to date in 2012. That record-setting figure represents part of an eight-percent increase in annual donations to OU Athletics over the past two years. At present, the Sooner Club has more than 10,600 members, who have contributed to this record amount.

OU football home games against Notre Dame and Oklahoma State are sold out for 2012, and based on returned tickets from opposing teams, less than 200 tickets per game are still available for OU's home opener with Florida A&M, as well as each of the club's conference games against Baylor, Kansas and Kansas State.

Back to the Future

- OU associate head coach and defensive coordinator Mike Stoops is back on the Sooner coaching staff after previously guiding the OU defense from 1999-03.
- In his first stint in Norman, four of Stoops' five defenses finished No. 7 or better nationally in scoring defense and in the top 10 for total defense.
- From 2000-03, Stoops' defenses also finished in the top 25 in pass defense and rush defense every season and in pass efficiency defense and turnovers forced twice.
- In addition, Stoops is the only coach to have an athlete win both the Nagurski and Thorpe awards in the same season, doing so twice with Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003.

About the Defense

- Oklahoma has ranked in the top 16 in the nation in total defense eight of the last 11 years.
- OU has forced at least one turnover in 151 of 173 games over the last 13 seasons - 87% of games played in that span.
- The Sooner defense has at least one interception in 74% of its games (111 of 151) over the last 12 years.
- Oklahoma has 13 shutouts under Bob Stoops.
- Under Stoops, the Oklahoma defense has surrendered an average of just 18 points per game.
- The defense has allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game in five of the last 11 seasons.

Stopping on 3rd

- The Oklahoma defense posted the No. 5 third down defense in the nation in 2011, allowing just 60 conversions in 196 attempts (30.6%).
- In home games, no team was better in the category than OU's 20.2% mark.
- The Sooners have consistently been at the top of the rankings in third-down defense, ranking No. 11 two seasons ago and No. 3 in 2009.

Defensive TDs at 42 in Stoops Era

- With a school-record three defensive touchdowns against Texas in 2011, Oklahoma now has 42 in Bob Stoops' 13 seasons.
- Thirteen of those touchdowns came via a fumble return.
- The defense has scored at least one touchdown in all of Stoops' 13 seasons, including four in 2011.
- The four defensive scores last season were one shy of the most in Stoops' tenure. OU had five touchdowns on defense in 2007, 2001 and 2000.

Nelson Leads Sack Squad

- Big 12 honorable mention Corey Nelson will start his second year at linebacker after finishing No. 9 in the Big 12 with 5.5 sacks, the third-best mark among conference linebackers, in 2011.
- The Sooners' 40 total sacks last season ranked No. 9 in the nation and second in the Big 12, resulting in a total loss of 288 yards for OU opponents.
- Interestingly, 31 sacks came during road games, the highest total of any program last year.
- Of the 13 players who contributed to that total, 10 return.
- Oklahoma's eight sacks vs. Texas (10/8/11) matched the school single-game record set against Baylor (10/20/01). Five different Sooners recorded a sack against the Longhorns.

Safety in the Secondary

- A Nagurski, Thorpe, Bednarik and Walter Camp watch lister, junior Tony Jefferson looks to add on to a 2011 campaign in which he totaled 74 tackles, 7.5 TFL, 4.5 sacks and four INT.
- Senior Demontre Hurst was named to the Bednarik and Nagurski Award watch lists after earning second-team All-Big 12 last year, notching a team-high 11 pass breakups and a 55-yard INT for TD vs. Texas.
- Junior Aaron Colvin returns in 2012 after registering a team-high 84 tackles (14th most in the Big 12) last season as a first-year starter at strong safety. Fifty-eight of those tackles came unassisted with Colvin posting a career-high 13 total tackles vs. Texas Tech (10/22/11).

Senior Four

After losing both Frank Alexander and Ronnell Lewis to the NFL Draft, the defensive line currently boasts four seniors, all of whom have seen significant playing time - totaling 44 career starts and 140 career games played altogether. The following lists each players career totals:

- Those 29 have come via five different kinds of plays -- punt returns, fake field goals, blocked punts, kickoff returns and a fake punt. Special teams also owns four safeties in that span.
- Oklahoma has returned six kickoffs and 14 punts for touchdowns.
- Oklahoma has blocked 28 kicks.

Many Happy Returns

Information on returns during the Stoops era ...

- Kickoff Returns -- 105 returns of 25 yards or more with eight touchdowns.
- Punt Returns -- 66 returns of 15 or more yards with 16 touchdowns.
- Interception Returns -- 90 returns of 10 or more yards with 24 touchdowns.
- Fumble Returns -- 8 returns of 15 or more yards with 12 touchdowns.

Way Good at Punter

- Tress Way ranks No. 2 among active punters in the NCAA with 8,648 total punt yards.
- Way also ranks No. 5 among active punters in the NCAA with a 43.9 yards per punt average.
- His career average currently ranks No. 1 in OU history with a season left to play, just ahead of Jeff Ferguson (1998-01) at 42.5 ypp.
- Way has 58 punts of 50+ yards in his career to set the OU program record. Ferguson previously held the record with 52.
- Way's 58.8 average against Oklahoma State on 11/28/09 is the highest in a game in program history.
- In 2011, Way has played a central role in field position with 34 of 63 punts downed inside the 20. Only six of Way's punts resulted in a touchback.
- In 2010, Way had 19 boots of 50+ yards with 18 inside the 20 and an average of 44.0 yards on 73 kicks. His average ranked No. 20 nationally, but he had more attempts than anyone ahead of him on that list.

Hunnicut Through the Uprights

Returning kicker Michael Hunnicutt came into the starting role as a freshman last season. Despite not playing in two games...

- Hunnicutt made 21 field goals, tying the OU single-season record set by Tim Duncan in 2001.
- The total also tied him for the 13th-most conversions in the nation in 2011.
- His 118 total points (21 FG, 55 XP) ranked No. 10 on the OU season scoring list.
- Hunnicutt broke the OU freshman field goal record (16, Trey DiCarlo, 2002) and tied the OU freshman scoring record (Jimmy Stevens, 2008).
- Hunnicutt became the first kicker in OU history to hit four field goals in two different games (Kansas, 10/15/11; Iowa State, 11/26/11).
- Among kickers who made 20 or more field goals last season, Hunnicutt ranked No. 5 with an 87.5 (21-of-24) conversion percentage.
- Hunnicutt tied with two other kickers for the most field goals made between 20-29 yards with 11.
- He made a 53-yard field goal at Kansas State (10/29/11), which tied for the longest kick under Bob Stoops. Garrett Hartley also hit a 53-yarder vs. Utah State on 9/15/07.

New Returners

- Oklahoma lost one of the the program's all-time best punt returners, Ryan Broyles (2008-11), to the NFL's Detroit Lions. Broyles finished his career No. 3 in OU history with 1,187 punt return yards.
- Kenny Stills had 38 yards on eight returns as the only other Sooner with at least one return in 2011.
- Senior transfer Justin Brown comes to OU after garnering 8.1 yards per punt return at Penn State in 2011, returning 27 punts for 220 yards. For his career, Brown has 338 yards on 49 returns.
- Oklahoma returns its top four returners (Franks, Finch, Whaley, Clay) from last season. Those four players combined to average 22.3 yards per return in 2011.
