Sooners Start Season With Shutout, Open Big 12 Conference Schedule vs. West Virginia

- OU is coming off a 34-0 win vs. ULM (8/31), the Sooners' 14th shutout under Bob Stoops and the team's first since a 52-0 win vs. Iowa State (10/16/10). Oklahoma and Wisconsin (45-0 vs. UMass) posted the only Week 1 shutouts.
- West Virginia is coming off a 24-17 home win vs. FCS opponent William & Mary (8/31).
- Stoops became the sixth-fastest college football coach to reach 150 victories. Among modern-era coaches, only Barry Switzer (180), Joe Paterno (184) and Tom Osborne (186) needed fewer contests to reach the 150-win plateau.
- This week's game is the earliest conference game on the calendar in OU history. The previous early mark came when OU posted a 41-10 win vs. Baylor (9/18/99) in the second week of Stoops' first season.
- OU has won eight straight Big 12 games dating back to last season, the Sooners' third-longest Big 12 regular season win streak. Oklahoma won 17 straight from 2003-05 and 13 straight from 2000-01.
- OU has outscored those eight Big 12 foes by an average margin of 44.8 to 27.0 ppg during that eight-game stretch.

Sooners to Host Mountaineers For First Time Since 1982

- OU is 3-2 all-time vs. WVU. The Mountaineers won 41-27 in their most recent visit to Norman (9/11/82).
- QB Landry Jones threw a five-yard TD pass to WR Kenny Stills with 0:24 remaining to give OU a 50-49 win at WVU (11/17/12) in the first Big 12 meeting between the schools. Jones set an OU record with 554 passing yards and 6 TDs.
- OU (82-662) and WVU (82-778) combined for 164 plays, 1,440 net offensive yards and 99 points in last year's meeting.
- OU is 82-5 (.943) at home under Stoops, going 47-3 (.940) vs. Big 12 foes and 35-2 (.946) in September.
- Oklahoma is 11-3 (.786) in Big 12 openers under Stoops: 7-1 at home, 3-1 away and 1-1 at neutral sites.

Old-Fashioned Oklahoma Football

- OU (305) outgained ULM (38) by a 267-yard rushing margin. OU is 14-0 with 300+ rushing yards under Stoops and owns a 55-1 mark since 1999 when racking up 200 or more rushing yards, including 27 straight wins.
- The Sooners are 72-6 (.923) with a 100-yard rusher under Stoops. QB Trevor Knight ran for 103 yards vs. ULM (8/31), the most rushing yards by an OU signal caller since QB Jason White had 117 rushing yards at Kansas (10/13/01).
- OU is 74-1 under Stoops at home when scoring 30+ points. WVU was 1-2 in 2012 on the road when allowing 30+.
- Oklahoma's defense forced six three-and-outs and one INT vs. ULM (8/31), limiting the Warhawks to 166 total yards.
- Last week, K Nick Hodgson booted seven kickoffs for touchbacks, K Michael Hunnicutt was 2-2 on FGs and P Jed Barnett averaged 43.6 yards on seven punts with four inside the 20 and a long of 54 yards.

THE TEAMS AT A GLANCE



OKLAHOMA Sooners

The 15th season of the Bob Stoops era at Oklahoma started on a resounding note as a 34-0 win over ULM (8/31) gave Stoops the 150th win of his career. Now 150-37 mark at OU, he is only eight wins shy of eclipsing Barry Switzer for the most victories in school history. OU is 14-1 in openers under Stoops.

Offense

Led by redshirt freshman quarterback Trevor Knight and his 103 yards, OU pounded out 305 rushing yards in the win over the Warhawks (8/31). He was one of five players to gain at least 20 yards, joining Damien Williams (16-66), Brennan Clay (8-43), Roy Finch (4-42) and Keith Ford (4-20). In addition, Jalen Saunders got two touchdown passes in the victory, while Trey Metoyer caught the third of Knight's three throwing strikes.

Defense

With several new faces, the OU defense pitched the team's first shutout since 2010 in the 34-0 win. Linebacker Corey Nelson led the way with eight tackles and 2.0 tackles for loss, while defensive back Julian Wilson recorded his first career interception. The Warhawks' offense was limited to just 38 yards rushing and 128 yards passing.

Special Teams

The special teams unit was solid in all phases for OU against ULM. Michael Hunnicutt was 2-2 on field goals, while Nick Hodgson put all seven of his kickoffs through the end zone for touchbacks. In his OU debut, Jed Barnett averaged 43.6 yards on seven punts with four landing inside the 20-yard line. Jalen Saunders returned four punts for 55 yards, including a 45-yarder.



West Virginia Mountaineers

West Virginia won its 10th straight season opener, but had to do it in come-from-behind fashion in a 24-17 victory against William & Mary (8/31). The Mountaineers trailed the Tribe at the half, 17-7, but used a 17-0 effort in the second half to get the win.

Offense

Having graduated QB Geno Smith, who led the nation with 42 touchdown passes a year ago and top wide receivers Tavon Austin and Stedman Bailey, the WVU offense is looking for a new identity in 2013. Paul Millard finished with 237 yards and a score on 19-of-25 passing against William & Mary, while Houston transfer Charles Sims gained 120 yards on the ground and scored once in his Mountaineer debut.

Defense

A year ago, West Virginia finished with the 108th ranked defense in the country, but the unit limited the Tribe to 309 yards of total offense in the season-opening win. Linebacker Nick Kwiatkoski led the Mountaineers with a career-high seven tackles, while safety Darwin Cook added an interception.

Special Teams

Kicker Josh Lambert went 1-2 on field goals in the season opener, converting from 22 yards but missing on a 55-yarder. Nick O'Toole had a strong performance, averaging 50.6 yards on five punts, including a long of 60 yards. The return game did not have much opportunity to make an impact as only one punt was returned for one yard, while two kick returns resulted in 42 total yards.

THE HEAD COACHES



**Bob Stoops
Oklahoma**

Bob Stoops has registered 150 career wins, needing only eight more to pass Barry Switzer (157) for the most victories in Oklahoma history, meaning the Sooners' head coach is poised to attain another historic milestone in 2013.

The only head coach to reach all four BCS games and the BCS National Championship Game, Stoops has guided the Sooners to four appearances in a national title contest, claiming college football's crown in 2000. Of Stoops' 14 bowl appearances with the Sooners, eight of those games have been of the BCS variety.

Along the way, he has picked up 17 coach of the year citations, including eight on the national level (only five coaches nationally have won more conference coach of the year awards), and watched five assistant coaches move into Football Bowl Subdivision head coaching positions.

From 1999-2012, no team from a BCS conference owned more victories or a better winning percentage than Oklahoma (149-37, .801). Under his direction, OU is one of two FBS schools with 11 seasons of at least 10 wins since 2000.

Among schools from BCS conferences, only Alabama (61) and Oregon (56) have compiled more victories over the past five seasons than Oklahoma (52), while only LSU and Stanford can join those three schools in boasting 10 or more victories in each of the past three campaigns.

Two Heisman winners and five Heisman finalists have been characteristic of the talent Stoops and his staff have attracted. The offenses have been among the best in college football history (the 2008 team was the first to score 60 or more points in five straight games en route to scoring an NCAA record 716 points).

The defense has been stingy and is the only program to produce two players who won the Thorpe and Nagurski Awards in the same season.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at Iowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry, working through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at Kansas State (1991-95).

Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. It was with the Gators, and a national championship team in 1996, that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.



**Dana Holgorsen
West Virginia**

Dana Holgorsen is in his third season as a head coach at the collegiate level (18-9), all of which have come at the helm of West Virginia.

Holgorsen led the Mountaineers through their first season in the Big 12 last year, going 7-6 overall and 2-5 in league play. The season culminated in trip to the Pinstripe Bowl where WVU lost to Syracuse, 38-14.

In his first season in 2011, the Mountaineer program finished with an overall record of 10-3, earned its sixth BIG EAST Conference championship since 2003, seventh overall, and was awarded the league's BCS Bowl bid for the third time. Holgorsen became the only West Virginia head coach to win a conference championship or win 10 games in his first year.

The first-year head coach of the year honoree by the Football Writers Association of America was one of seven first-year head coaches to lead his program to a BCS Bowl game, was one of three to win the game and the only first-year WVU head coach to win a BCS Bowl game.

The Mountaineers' 10 wins in 2011 tied for the fourth-most wins by a first-year head coach among NCAA I-A coaches. Holgorsen also became the fourth West Virginia head coach to lead his squad to a bowl appearance and earn a win in the game in his first year as a head coach.

WVU finished No. 6 nationally in passing offense, No. 13 in scoring offense and No. 15 in total offense. The Mountaineer offense ranked No. 67 in total offense in 2010, the year before Holgorsen arrived, and he took it to No. 15 in 2011.

Before coming to Morgantown, Holgorsen spent the 2010 season as the offensive coordinator at Oklahoma State. He was a finalist for the 2010 Broyles Award, given to the nation's top assistant football coach, and also named the rivals.com Offensive Coordinator of the Year.

Prior to OSU, Holgorsen was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Houston. During his two-year tenure with the Cougars, his offenses once again put up explosive numbers, accounting for 563 yards of total offense per game, passing for 433.7 yards per game and totaling more than 42.2 points per game.

Before his two-year stint with the Cougars, Holgorsen was a member of the coaching staff at Texas Tech from 2000-07, serving as the inside receivers coach from 2000-04, before being elevated to co-offensive coordinator in 2005 and offensive coordinator in 2006-07.

Morgantown, W. Va. - Landry Jones' 5-yard touchdown pass to Kenny Stills with 24 seconds left lifted No. 13 Oklahoma to a 50-49 win over West Virginia. Jones finished with 554 yards passing to break his own school record. His six TD passes tied another mark he holds.

Stills finished with 10 catches for 91 yards and four scores. His 7-yard TD grab with 4:10 left gave the lead back to the Sooners at 44-43, only to have Bailey cap a three-play, 92-yard drive with a 40-yard TD grab with 2:53 left, his third of the quarter.

That was plenty of time for the Sooners, who took over at their 46 after Brennan Clay's long kickoff return. Jones hit Justin Brown with a 36-yard pass. A 10-yarder to Brown put the ball at the West Virginia 14. On fourth-and-3 at the 5, Jones changed the play at the line and found Stills on a slant for the go-ahead score.

- OU is 5-0 under head coach Bob Stoops in the month of August, outscoring those foes by a combined 206-32 margin. OU is 5-1 overall in August games.

- During Bob Stoops' tenure at OU, six of his assistant coaches have gone on to become head coaches at other FBS programs.
- Four former Stoops' assistants are now head coaches: Mike Leach (Washington State), Bo Pelini (Nebraska), Kevin Sumlin (Texas A&M) and Kevin Wilson (Indiana).
- Mike Stoops returned to Oklahoma in 2012 as the defensive coordinator after a seven-year stint as head coach at Arizona.
- Two current assistants played for Oklahoma, including Cale Gundy (1990-93) and Josh Heupel (1999-00).
- OU's coaches have a cumulative 48 years on the sidelines in Norman and 209 years experience total.
- The OU staff has been involved in 148 bowl games, with 133 coming as coaches and 15 as players.
- Heupel is the offensive playcaller from the press box. All other assistant coaches are on the field during the game.

- It was the first shutout by OU in a season opener since a 37-0 win over Tulsa (8/30/02).
- OU forced six three-and-outs. Of ULM's 15 drives, 11 were four plays or fewer and none went for more than eight plays.
- OU allowed nine first downs, the fewest since the Sooners allowed nine in last year's home opener vs. Florida A&M (9/8/12). ULM had zero first downs rushing.
- OU held ULM QB Kolton Browning, the preseason Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Year, to 128 yards passing and no touchdowns. Browning totaled 131 yards of total offense vs. OU after averaging 295 yards last season.
- OU held ULM to 38 rushing yards, the lowest total by an OU opponent since Texas (10/8/11) had 36 yards. No Warhawk had more than nine yards rushing on the night.

Knight Wins in Sooners' Debut

- QB Trevor Knight started for OU against ULM (8/31), becoming the first freshman to get the nod in a season opener since Sam Bradford started in a 79-10 win vs. North Texas (9/1/07).
- Knight is the 14th freshman QB overall to start a game at Oklahoma, and the fourth to start a season opener. OU freshman QBs are 4-0 all-time in season openers.
- Against ULM, Knight ran 13 times for 103 yards and was 11-28 passing for 86 yards and 3 TDs.
- Knight becomes just the second QB in the Stoops era to run for 100+ yards, joining Jason White who rushed for 117 yards on 12 carries at Kansas (10/13/01).
- Knight is the first OU freshman QB to rush for 100 yards since Steven Collins had 135 yards vs. Kansas State (11/11/89).
- Knight's 103 rushing yards are the second-most by an OU QB in his first-career start, just behind Steve Davis's 110 yards vs. Baylor (9/15/73).
- Knight is the 10th player and third QB in Sooner history to rush for 100+ yards in a career debut.
- Knight threw his first-career TD pass on a 12-yard throw to Jalen Saunders at the 11:15 mark in the second quarter. He became the second OU freshman QB to throw a TD pass in a season opener, joining Bradford in 2007.
- Knight's three TD passes tied Sam Bradford for the most by an OU freshman QB in a career debut.
- Oklahoma QBs (Trevor Knight – 5, Blake Bell – 1) combined for six runs of 10+ yards vs. ULM (8/31). OU QBs had four runs of 10+ yards during the entire 2012 season.

OU Seeks Ninth Straight Big 12 Win

- With Oklahoma kicking off the Big 12 schedule against West Virginia (9/7), the Sooners are looking to extend their eight-game conference winning streak dating back to last season.

- Also vs. ND, he set the OU record for receptions in a quarter with eight in the first quarter. The previous record was seven, shared by Eddie Hinton (once) and Ryan Broyles (three times).
- Saunders' 181 yards was the eighth-highest total by an OU player in school history and the most since Ryan Broyles' school record of 217 yards against Kansas in 2011.
- Saunders transferred to OU after two seasons at Fresno State. He was a first-team All-WAC pick in 2011 after finishing with 1,065 yards and a conference-best 12 TD receptions on 50 catches.

Williams Passes 1,000 Career Yards

- Senior running back Damien Williams rushed for 66 yards on 16 carries against ULM (8/31) to go over the 1,000 yard mark for his career.
- He became the 69th Sooner to do so, and he now has 1,012 yards in his career.
- Averaging 72.8 rushing yards per game in 2012, Williams finished fifth in the Big 12, while his 11 rushing touchdowns tied for the team lead.
- Williams enjoyed four 100-yard games during the 2012 season, including 167 yards on 22 carries against Texas (10/13).
- The 167 rushing yards were the most by an OU player since Demarco Murray ran for 208 yards against Utah State (9/4/10).
- Williams' 95-yard touchdown rush against UT was the third longest in school history, trailing only Jeff Frazier (North Texas, 11/23/95) and Buck McPhail (Kansas State, 11/3/51).

- It was the longest rush in Red River Rivalry history and the fourth-longest offensive play in OU history. It tied for the third-longest rush in the FBS last year.
- Williams scored on runs of 65, 89 and 95-yards this year. The only other FBS player with 3 or more rushing TDs of 65+ yards was Northern Illinois' Jordan Lynch, also with three.
- After finishing with 10 carries for 103 yards and a touchdown at UTEP (9/1/12) in his OU debut, Williams gained 156 rushing yards and four touchdowns against Florida A&M (9/8/12).
- Williams was the first Sooner to score at least one touchdown in each of the first two games of his career since Ryan Broyles did so against Chattanooga (9/6/08) and Cincinnati (9/13/08).
- Williams was the first Sooner to register 100-yard rushing games in each of the first two games of his OU career since Adrian Peterson rushed for 100 yards against Bowling Green (9/4/04) and 117 against Houston (9/11/04).
- Williams had the first back-to-back 100-yard rushing games for OU since DeMarco Murray did so against Texas (115 yards, 10/2/10) and Iowa State (112 yards, 10/16/10).

Clay Nears 1,000 Yards of His Own

- Senior RB Brennan Clay entered the 2013 season with 912 career rushing yards.
- After gaining 43 yards and a touchdown on eight carries against ULM (8/31), Clay sits just 45 yards away from becoming the 70th player in Sooners history to eclipse the 1,000-yard mark.
- Last year he scored the game-winning touchdown in overtime on an 18-yard run to give OU a 51-48 victory over Oklahoma State (11/24/12).
- Clay ran for a TD and had his first career TD grab against Baylor (11/10/12). It was the second multi-TD game of his career, as he rushed for two TDs against Florida A&M (9/8/12).
- With an injury to starting RB Damien Williams, Clay got his first start of the season at Iowa State (11/3/12). He responded by setting career highs in both rushes (24) and rushing yards (157). It was the first 100-yard game of his career.

Millard is the Man

- Senior fullback Trey Millard may be the most versatile performer on the Sooners' roster.
- He had a breakout game against Texas (10/13/12), finishing with five receptions for 119 yards and a touchdown, easily surpassing his previous career highs of three receptions and 39 receiving yards.
- Millard had a 73-yard reception, the longest pass play by an OU player in Red River Rivalry history, surpassing Buddy Leake's 65-yarder in 1953. It was also the seventh-longest pass play by a Sooner running back in OU history.

About the Defense

- OU has forced at least one turnover in 163 of 187 games over the last 15 seasons - 87.2% of games played in that span.
- The Sooner defense has at least one interception in 73.3% of its games (137 of 187) under Stoops.
- Under Stoops, the OU defense has given up an average of just 18.8 points per game.

Stoops Guides Defense

- OU associate head coach and defensive coordinator Mike Stoops is back for his second season on the coaching staff after previously guiding the OU 'D' from 1999-03.
- With the shutout in the 2013 opener over ULM, Stoops' defenses have posted six shutouts, including five in his first stint in Norman.
- In his first stint at OU, four of Stoops' five defenses finished No. 7 or better nationally in scoring defense and top 10 for total defense.
- From 2000-03, Stoops' defenses also finished in the top 25 in pass defense and rush defense every season and in pass efficiency defense and turnovers forced twice.
- In addition, Stoops is the only coach to have an athlete win both the Nagurski and Thorpe awards in the same season, doing so twice with Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003.

Colvin Leading at Corner

- Senior Aaron Colvin finds his name littered on the preseason watch lists: Bednarik, Lott IMPACT, Nagurski and Thorpe. He was also named a preseason Second-Team All-American and preseason All-Big 12 First Team honoree by Phil Steele.
- An All-Big 12 First Team selection by AP and the coaches in 2012, Colvin led the team with 11 pass breakups, finished second on the squad with four interceptions and was third on the team with 61 tackles (47 solo).

- The Owasso, Okla., native has played in 39 career games (26 starts) with the Sooners. He opened all 13 games at cornerback for OU in 2012 after starting 12 games at safety in 2011.
- He owns 179 career tackles (126 solo), 10.0 tackles for loss, four interceptions, 2.5 sacks, two fumble recoveries and 20 pass breakups.

Defensive TDs at 43 in Stoops Era

- Oklahoma has recorded 43 defensive touchdowns under Bob Stoops.
- Thirteen of those TDs have come via fumble return.
- The defense has scored at least one touchdown in all of Stoops' 14 seasons.

About the Special Teams

Oklahoma's special teams under Bob Stoops ...

- There have been 30 special teams touchdowns.
- Those 29 have come via five different kinds of plays -- punt returns, fake field goals, blocked punts, kickoff returns and a fake punt. Special teams also owns four safeties in that span.
- Oklahoma has returned eight kickoffs and 18 punts for touchdowns and has blocked 28 kicks.

Many Happy Returns

- Kickoff Returns -- 119 returns of 25 yards or more with eight touchdowns.
- Punt Returns -- 75 returns of 15 or more yards with 18 touchdowns.

Hunnicuttt Through the Uprights

- Kicker Mike Hunnicutt hit field goals of 41 and 35 yards in the second quarter against ULM (8/31) and is now 40 of 47 (.851) for his career.
- It was the 12th multi-field goal game of Hunnicutt's career.

- As Bob Stoops enters his 15th year as head coach at Oklahoma, he has worked the entire time with President David Boren and Director of Athletics Joe Castiglione.
- It's the longest active pairing between an FBS president, athletics director and head football coach.

Best Program of the BCS Era

The Sept. 17, 2012, "Franchise Issue" of *ESPN The Magazine* sought to find the best program in the BCS era. Sooners fans will be pleased with the results as Oklahoma was chosen as the No. 1 team.



Top 5 Programs of the BCS Era

ESPN the Magazine created three major categories of FBS success (on-field success, off-field success, traditions of success), then split them into nine factors (see below). Oklahoma ranked near the top in almost every category:

- Strength of Schedule (No. 1) - Average strength of schedule since 2003.
- Stadium Edge (No. 2) - *SportsNation* poll results for game-day experience; home win percentage; differential between home and road win percentages.
- Title Track (No. 2) - National titles [since 1936, emphasizing BCS era]; BCS bowl bids and wins; league titles; years in final AP Top 25 poll and AP top 10.
- Head Coach (No. 3) - Tenure [CFB and NFL]; winning percentage; average turnover margin and average penalties per game [all since 2001].
- Player Success (No. 7) - NFL draft picks [weighted by round]; Heisman winners [all].
- Recruiting (No. 10) - Total ESPN 150 signees [since 2007].
- Football Revenue (No. 12) - 2010 figures, per U.S. Department of Education.
- Academics (No. 33) - *US News and World Report* ranking in 2012; Academic Progress Rate in 2010-11.
- NCAA Violations (Grade: B) - Grade based on severity of sanctions since 1998.



THE PROGRAM

- Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 832-310-53 (.718) in 119 seasons.
- Since WWII, OU leads the nation with 588 victories.
- The Sooners have captured seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000).
- OU has 46 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 27 bowl victories (No. 4 nationally) and an all-time record of 27-18-1 (.598).
- OU has 44 conference championships, including eight Big 12 titles overall (no other school has more than three).
- Oklahoma is the only program in FBS history to have four coaches with 100 or more wins.
- With a 69-13 win over Florida A&M (9/8/12), Oklahoma became the first program in college football history to break the 32,000-mark in all-time points scored. No program has scored more points than OU.
- OU has 153 All-Americans and 73 consensus All-Americans, including NCAA career receptions leader Ryan Broyles in 2011.
- Under Stoops, OU has had 33 All-Americans, including 23 consensus. Of the 33 players, 15 were on offense, 16 on defense and two on special teams spanning 14 different positions.
- Oklahoma boasts five Heisman winners. Sooners have also won the Bednarik (1), Butkus (4), Camp (4), Lombardi (3), Maxwell (2), Nagurski (2), O'Brien (3), Outland (5), Tatupu (1), Thorpe (3) and Unitas (1).
- Sooner teams have gone undefeated 14 times in program history, the latest being in 2000.
- Oklahoma's 47-game win streak from 1953-57 is still the NCAA D-I record.
- Oklahoma has had 116 Academic All-Big 12 honorees under Stoops.
- The Sooners have gone 82-5 at home in Stoops' 15 seasons. In all, Oklahoma has won 81 percent of its home games since Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial opened in 1923.
- Oklahoma has played in front of 87 consecutive home sellouts - every game of Stoops' tenure.
- Including the six Sooners picked in the 2013 NFL Draft, OU has had 363 players picked all-time in the draft.
- Oklahoma has 43 first-round picks, including three No. 1 overall selections.
- In 2010, Sooners were chosen with three of the first four picks in the draft, with QB Sam Bradford at No. 1, DT Gerald McCoy at No. 3 and OT Trent Williams at No. 4.
- Bob Stoops' career average of 10.6 wins per year is tops among active FBS head coaches with at least 10 years of experience.
- Stoops is the only active head coach on the FBS level to have reached a bowl game in each of his first 14 seasons. Georgia's Mark Richt (12) comes in second.
- Of the 14 bowls, eight have been BCS bowl games and four have been for the BCS title.

- The streak was the fifth-longest home win streak in the modern football era. OU has been sold out at home for every game of the Stoops era, a school-record of 86 consecutive games.
- Under Stoops, OU won its first 17 home games stretching almost over his first three seasons from 1999-01.
- The Sooners also had a 19-game streak under Stoops from 2002-04.

Margin of Victory

- The Sooners have posted 11 shutouts against incoming opponents, including three against Big 12 foes.
- Oklahoma's biggest wins are a 77-0 defeat of Texas A&M (11/8/03) and a 68-0 win over UTEP (9/14/02).
- OU's average margin of victory at home has been 22 points or higher six of the past seven seasons and 11 of 14 seasons under Stoops.
- OU's five losses at home in the last 14 seasons have come by a combined 35 points, an average of 7.0 points per game.
- Only two games have gone into overtime, a 37-30 win vs. Baylor (10/22/05) and a 51-48 triumph over Oklahoma State (11/24/12).

Attendance Lately

- OU's average attendance in 2012 was 103.8% of Memorial Stadium's official capacity.
- Only Oregon (106.5), Nebraska (105.5) and Texas A&M (105.4) had higher percentages than the Sooners.
- In 2012, Oklahoma ranked No. 13 nationally in average attendance at 85,243.

Record-Setting Attendance

- Oklahoma has drawn 6,624,011 fans for Bob Stoops' 87 home games (started in 1999) and all have been sold out.
- The current string of sellouts is the longest in school history, eclipsing a mark of 69 from 1971-84.
- A school-record 86,031 fans witnessed Oklahoma's home game against Notre Dame (10/27/12), the largest crowd ever to witness a sporting event in the state of Oklahoma.
- In 2012, Oklahoma fans set a record for average season attendance at 85,243. That broke the mark of 85,161 that was set last season.
- OU has exceeded the seating capacity of 82,112 at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium in 54 straight games.
- The top 10 seasons for home attendance at Oklahoma have been during Stoops' tenure as head coach.
- Of the top 10 crowds at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, all have come in the past six years.

Home Winning Percentage

Since the start of the 1999 season, Bob Stoops' first season at OU, Oklahoma is second nationally in home winning percentage at .943, holding a record of 82-5 over that span.

NORMAN, Okla. -- Trevor Knight rushed for 103 yards on 13 carries and threw three touchdown passes -- two to Jalen Saunders -- in his first start, and No. 16 Oklahoma beat ULM 34-0.

Oklahoma gave coach Bob Stoops his 150th career win, putting him seven behind Barry Switzer on the Sooners' career coaching wins list. Oklahoma is 5-0 under Stoops in August games and 14-1 in home openers.

The shutout was the 14th under Stoops and the first in a season opener since doing it in a 37-0 win vs. Tulsa (8/30/02).

Knight became the first Oklahoma quarterback to rush for 100 or more yards in a game since Jason White had 117 yards rushing against Kansas on Oct. 13, 2001. A redshirt freshman, Knight was the fourth freshman quarterback to start a season for Oklahoma in modern times, joining Steve Collins (1989), Eric Moore (1995) and Sam Bradford (2007).

ULM upset then-No. 8 Arkansas on the road to open the 2012 season, but the Warhawks didn't get untracked offensively against a revamped Oklahoma defense. The Warhawks crossed midfield only twice and recorded only nine first downs and 166 yards of offense.
