Sooners Seek to Extend Winning Streak to Six Games, Travel For In-State Contest at Tulsa

- OU is coming off a 48-16 home win vs. Louisiana Tech (8/30), while Tulsa posted a 38-31 home victory vs. Tulane (8/28).
- Oklahoma has won five straight dating back to 2013, while Tulsa aspires to start 2-0 for the first time since 2009.
- OU is seeking a six-game victory string for the first time since rattling off 11 consecutive wins (11/13/10 - 10/16/11).
- The Sooners are 18-7-1 all-time vs. Tulsa, winning seven straight and 12 of the last 13 meetings dating back to 1979.
- OU is 7-0 against Tulsa under Bob Stoops, winning by an average margin of 37.3 points (47.3-10.0 ppg). OU has shut out the Golden Hurricane in three of those seven meetings (58-0 in 2001, 37-0 in 2002 and 45-0 in 2009).
- Oklahoma is 19-1 (.950) in its last 20 games vs. unranked foes and is 12-3 (.800) under Stoops in its opening road game.
- Tulsa is 0-9 against AP Top 10 squads since Stoops' arrival at OU with five of those losses coming vs. the Sooners.
- Oklahoma is 44-6 (.880) in September games under Stoops and 43-0 in games when scoring 50+ points. The Sooners' 51-20 win vs. Tulsa (9/14/13) marked OU's highest point tally of 2013, while posting a season-best 607 yards.
- OU's 62-21 win at Tulsa (9/21/07) marked its second-highest road scoring tally under Stoops (66 at Texas A&M - 11/8/08).

Oklahoma Continues Trend of Starting Fast & Finishing Strong Under Stoops, Defense Continues to Thrive

- Oklahoma (43 games) owns the second-longest active victory streak in the nation when leading at halftime, trailing only Oregon (61). The Sooners held a 31-3 halftime edge vs. Louisiana Tech (8/30).
- The Sooners ranked ninth in the nation in 2013, owning a +132 scoring margin (274-142) in the second and fourth quarters.
- OU has won 19 consecutive games when scoring 30+ points and has registered 48 straight wins when scoring 40+ points.
- OU has won 32 straight games when permitting 21 points or fewer dating back to 65-10 victory vs. Texas A&M (11/14/09).
- Tulsa has not scored more than 21 points in its seven meetings with OU during Stoops' tenure, averaging 10.0 ppg.
- Tulsa has lost 19 straight when scoring 21 points or fewer dating back to 2006, going 0-6 in such games in 2013.
- Tulsa's 38-31 win to open 2014 snapped a nine-game losing streak when the club had permitted 30 points or more.
- OU's defense went 5-15 (33.3%) on third down last week. OU ranked second in the Big 12 on third at 33.7% (60-178) in 2013.

Hunnicutt Has Been Clutch, Takeaway Stats to Watch, Alexander Brothers to Square Off

- K Michael Hunnicutt has drilled nine straight FG attempts dating back to a 48-10 win vs. Iowa State (11/16/13). Hunnicutt has 363 career points, needing 28 more to bypass RB DeMarco Murray (390) for the OU career scoring record.
- The Sooners have registered at least one INT (8 total) during their five-game winning streak. Dating back to 2010, OU is 33-3 (.917) in games when the defense picks off a pass. CB Zack Sanchez has three INTs in his last four games.
- Oklahoma has gone +7 (12 takes/5 gives) in turnovers during its five-game winning streak dating back to 2013.
- In his first career start at QB vs. Tulsa (9/14/13), Blake Bell went 27-37 for 413 yards with four TDs. Bell currently serves as Oklahoma's starting TE and is seeking his first reception. He owns 24 career rushing TDs and has thrown 12 TD passes.
- OU has numerous Tulsa-area players on its roster, including LB Dominique Alexander (Booker T. Washington HS). His brother, Derrick, Jr., is a redshirt defensive end for the Golden Hurricane.
- Last week, G Tyler Evans made his first start since the Insight Bowl vs. Iowa (12/31/11), returning from two ACL injuries.

"POWER TRIO" PROPELS GROUND GAME

- The running back trio of Keith Ford (9-51, 2 TDs), Alex Ross (11-36, 2 TDs) & Samaje Perine (13-77, 1 TD) helped OU tally 183 rush yards vs. Louisiana Tech (8/30).
- The Sooners had a +129-yard rushing differential in their opener (183-54) after outgaining their foes by an average margin of 86.3 rushing ypg in 2013.
- Oklahoma averaged 223.9 rushing ypg in 2013, its best mark since 1991 (251.1 ypg).
- OU produced five rushing TDs in its opener, the club's most since posting six ground TDs vs. Texas (10/13/12).

WELCOME TO THE SOONER STATE

- Under Stoops, OU is 19-3 (.864) against in-state schools (12-3 vs. OSU, 7-0 vs. Tulsa), going 8-2 on the road.
- The Sooners own a 95-7 (.931) overall record in games played in the state of Oklahoma during Stoops' tenure, including a streak of 10 straight wins dating back to 2012.
- OU went 4-1 in 11 a.m. kickoff games in 2013, posting wins vs. Tulsa, Iowa State, Kansas St. and Oklahoma St.

Louisiana Tech Leftovers

- Oklahoma's 48-16 win over Louisiana Tech (8/30) pushed OU to 92-22-6 all-time in season openers (15-2 under Bob Stoops). The Sooners have won five straight season openers, the team's longest streak since winning seven in a row from 1998-04.
- Oklahoma is 49-9-5 all-time in home openers, including a 15-1 mark under Stoops.
- It was the first meeting between Oklahoma and Louisiana Tech. OU is now 20-0 against teams currently in Conference-USA.
- OU is 6-0 under Stoops in the month of August, outscoring teams 254-48.
- Oklahoma outscored Louisiana Tech, 21-0, in the first quarter. It was the first time OU scored that many points in an opening quarter since doing so at Baylor (11/20/10).
- The Sooners were a perfect 4-4 on fourth downs against the Bulldogs. That's the most fourth-down conversions in a game by OU since going 4-5 at Texas Tech (11/19/05).

Fresh Faces Take the Field for OU

- Nineteen Sooners made their debuts in the season opener, including eight true freshmen (FB Dimitri Flowers, RB Samaje Perine, WRs Jeffery Mead and Michiah Quick, OL Jonathan Alvarez, S Steven Parker, CB Jordan Thomas and LS Welsey Horky), six redshirt freshmen (WRs K.J. Young and Jordan Smallwood, DE D.J. Ward and DTs Charles Walker and Matthew Romar, LB Ogonnima Okoronkwo), two redshirt sophomores (RB Daniel Brooks and OL Sam Grant), one junior (LB Devante Bond), one redshirt junior (OL Josiah St. John) and one senior (DL David Driskill).
- In addition, four Sooners made their first career start: Flowers, running back Alex Ross, linebacker Jordan Evans and safety Ahmad Thomas.

OU Tough To Beat When Ahead At Half

- Oklahoma has won 43 consecutive games when leading at halftime, the second-longest active streak in the nation behind Oregon (61 games).
- Three of the nation's six-longest such active streaks belong to Big 12 teams.

- During their five-game win streak the Sooners have outscored their opponents by a combined 215-112 margin, good for an average score of 43.0 to 22.4.
- Oklahoma passers have boasted at 2.3 TD-to-INT ratio, while opponents have an 0.9 TD-to-INT mark.
- OU's defense has registered 18.0 sacks in the streak, while the OU O-line has surrendered just two in the same span.

Head Coach Bob Stoops



The winningest coach in OU history, Bob Stoops owns the singular distinction of being the only college head

coach to lead his squad to victory in every BCS bowl game and the BCS National Championship Game.

Quantifying the lasting impact that Stoops has made on Oklahoma is the easy part. No head coach in the Sooners' illustrious history has produced more victories than Stoops (161), who surpassed Barry Switzer in 2013. That OU coaching lineage of 100-game winners also includes the iconic Bud Wilkinson and Bennie Owen.

Stoops has led the Sooners to a school-record 15 consecutive bowl berths and eight Big 12 titles. Even though he didn't arrive in Norman until the Big 12 was three years old, the Youngstown, Ohio, native has already coached the program to more than twice as many championships as any other school in the league with eight.

Putting Stoops' accomplishments and remarkable consistency in the proper national perspective isn't difficult. No team from a BCS conference owns more victories or a better winning percentage than Oklahoma (160-39, .804) since he took over the Sooners' fortunes. No school can claim more BCS berths since 2000 than Oklahoma's nine. Only three schools can boast longer active streaks of consecutive bowl berths.

This 30-year coaching veteran completed his winning BCS bowl cycle as Oklahoma registered a 45-31 victory over No. 3 Alabama in the 80th Allstate Sugar Bowl. That victory vaulted the Sooners to the No. 6 spot in the final AP Poll. Dating back to the 2000 campaign, no team boasts more AP Top 10 finishes than Oklahoma (9).

Among teams from BCS conferences only Alabama (72) and Oregon (67) have more wins than Oklahoma (63) over the past six seasons, a tribute to Stoops and his talented staff. Stoops, Nick Saban (Alabama) and Les Miles (LSU) are the only

three FBS coaches that have guided their their schools to 10 or more victories each of the past four campaigns, a remarkable feat in today's college football landscape.

Only Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer (1987) and Troy's Larry Blakeney (1991) have been at their posts longer. Add it all up, and it's easy to see why ESPN the Magazine named Oklahoma the top college football program of the BCS era in 2012. Among active FBS coaches, only Urban Meyer owns a better winning percentage at .837 (128-25).

During his remarkable run, Stoops has picked up 17 coach of the year citations, including eight on the national level (only five coaches nationally have won more conference coach of the year awards). Under Stoops' direction, the Sooners have posted 12 seasons with 10 or more wins in his 15 years at OU, a total that no FBS program can top dating back to 1999.

Prior to his arrival at Oklahoma, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record and hadn't produced double-digit victories since 1987. OU has also registered 10 seasons with 11 or more wins since the start of the 2000 campaign, a figure that leads the nation over that span. Stoops reached 100 victories faster than any coach in college football history. In fact, only five coaches needed fewer games to reach the 150-win plateau than Stoops (187 games). That list reads like a who's who of the game's coaching elite: Switzer (180 games), Fielding Yost (180), Gil Doobie (180), Joe Paterno (184) and Tom Osborne (186).

Stoops' OU squads have frequently risen to the occasion against the nation's toughest teams. The Sooners are 50-23 (.685) against AP Top 25 foes during his tenure with 13 wins against AP Top 10 squads and 10 victories against top-five teams.

Since the start of the 21st century, Oklahoma has been the standbearer of success among BCS conference schools in 11 major categories. Over the past 14 seasons, OU leads all those schools in victories (153), winning percentage (.818), total touchdowns (881), turnover differential (+108), takeaways (410) and

third-down conversions (1,230). Impressive totals, indeed.

Conference supremacy has also been a trademark of Stoops' tenure in Norman. In addition to eight Big 12 trophies, no Big 12 squad owns more regular season conference wins (99) or victories against AP Top 25 foes (50) than Oklahoma dating back to 1999. Over the past four years, the Sooners' 27 Big 12 wins and 14 victories against ranked foes remain the top mark in the conference, as well.

But Stoops has long insisted that players win games, not coaches. However, it's hard to argue with the consistent level of top-flight talent Stoops and his staff have attracted to Oklahoma. Two Heisman winners and five Heisman finalists have been characteristic of the offensive playmakers who have signed with the Sooners. If you want opulent offense, look no further than Owen Field. Stoops' 2008 team was the first to score 60 or more points in five straight games en route to scoring an NCAA single-season record with 716 points.

There has been no lack of game-changing defensive performers on the roster, either. Oklahoma is the only program to produce two players who won the Thorpe and Nagurski Awards in the same season. Sizzling special teams performers have been part of the equation, as well. Over the past three seasons alone the Sooners have registered six touchdowns and three safeties in the kicking game.

The son of a longtime high school coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at Iowa under Hayden Fry, who gave him his coaching start in 1983. He would later play a key role in one of the most impressive turnarounds in college football history on Bill Snyder's staff at Kansas State from 1989-95. Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. It was with the Gators, and a national championship team in 1996, that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession. His hiring at Oklahoma was one for the ages.

NORMAN, Okla. - In his first career start, Blake Bell passed for 413 yards and four touchdowns in his first start for No. 14 Oklahoma and the Sooners beat Tulsa 51-20. Bell posted the highest passing yardage total by any Oklahoma quarterback making his first start in addition to four touchdowns on 27 of 37 passing, all career highs.

Sterling Shepard caught eight passes for 123 yards and two touchdowns - all career highs - and Jaz Reynolds had 109 yards receiving and one score for Oklahoma.

- OU ranked second in the Big 12 and was 18th among FBS squads at 33.7% (60-178) in 2013.
- Oklahoma led the Big 12 and was tied for 10th in the nation, permitting 60 third-down conversions.
- The Sooners led the Big 12, yielding an average of 17.9 first downs per game.
- OU finished second in the Big 12 and tied for 19th in the FBS by allowing 233 first downs.

Big 12 Conference Domination

- Oklahoma has won eight Big 12 Conference titles (2000, 02, 04, 06, 07, 08, 10, 12), twice as many as the next program in the league (Texas).
- Since 2000, Oklahoma is 94-21 (.817) in Big 12 play, the best mark in the conference. Texas is next with an 86-29 (.748) record.
- Since 2000, among BCS conference teams OU has the best league winning percentage, with the next-best records at Ohio State, which has an 90-22 (.804) record, followed by Texas.

About the Offense

- Under Stoops, OU has produced career leaders in passing, receiving, total offense and all-purpose yards, four top-10 career rushers and season record holders in rushing, passing, total offense and receiving yards.
- Stoops' teams have set over 65 school records.
- OU has scored in 202 straight games (11/7/98).
- Since Stoops' arrival, Oklahoma has scored 7,319 points - an average of 36.8 per game.
- OU is the highest-scoring team in history with 32,909 points in 1,207 games, while Nebraska is next with 31,793 points in 1,261 games.

Knight as the Starter

- In six games as a starter, QB Trevor Knight has completed over 58 percent of his passes, throwing 10 TDs and six INTs, averaging 11.3 yards per completion.
- In the 2014 opener against Louisiana Tech (8/30), Knight became the 25th player in OU history to go over 1,000 career passing yards.
- Knight set personal bests for completions (32), attempts (44), passing yards (348) and passing touchdowns (4) in the Sugar Bowl (1/2/14).
- The completions marked the most in Sugar Bowl history, while the TD figured tied the Sugar Bowl record and set an OU bowl game record.
- At K-State (11/23), he completed 14 passes for 171 passing yards and a TD. He also ran a career-high 14 times for 82 yards and another TD.
- Knight started for OU against ULM (8/31/13), becoming the first freshman to get the nod in a season opener since Sam Bradford started in a 79-10 win vs. North Texas (9/1/07).
- Knight was the 14th freshman QB overall to start a game at Oklahoma, and the fourth to start a season opener.

- Against ULM, Knight ran 13 times for 103 yards and was 11-28 passing for 86 yards and 3 TDs.
- Knight became the second QB under Stoops to run for 100 yards, joining Jason White who had 117 yards on 12 rushes at Kansas (10/13/01).
- Knight was the first OU freshman QB to rush for 100 yards since Steven Collins had 135 yards vs. Kansas State (11/11/89).
- Knight was the 10th player and third QB in OU history to rush for 100+ yards in a career debut.
- Knight's three TD passes tied Sam Bradford for the most by an OU freshman QB in a debut.

Shepard Matching Father's Marks

- WR Sterling Shepard's late father, Derrick Shepard, lettered at OU from 1983-86. He finished with 76 catches for 1,237 yards and eight TDs. In just over two seasons, Sterling has passed all of those totals.

- In the 2014 opener against Louisiana Tech (8/30), Sterling became the 19th player in OU history to record 100 or more career receptions. He also passed his late father, Derrick, for 22nd on the OU career receiving yards list.
- At Oklahoma State (12/7/13), Shepard recorded the third 100-yard game of his career when he caught seven passes for 112 yards.
- Shepard finished with five catches for 43 yards against Texas Tech (10/26/13) to become the 31st player in OU history with 1,000 receiving yards.
- Shepard has a pair of multi-touchdown games in his career, with both coming last year against Tulsa (9/14/13) and Kansas (10/19/13).
- Against Tulsa, Shepard finished with a career-high eight catches for a career-best 123 yards.

Young Tailback Trio Looks Promising

- In the season opener, sophomores Keith Ford and Alex Ross combined with freshmen Samaje Perine and Dimitri Flowers to give OU a young, promising backfield.
- Ross finished with 11 carries for 36 yards and two scores to easily pass his previous career highs of two carries for 11 yards set against Iowa State (11/16/13). The touchdowns were the first of his career. Ross also caught the first two passes of his career for 31 yards.
- Ross also excelled on special teams, returning his first career kickoff 80 yards. It was the longest kick return by an OU player since Roy Finch's 100-yard score against Kansas (10/20/12).
- Ford enjoyed the first multi-touchdown game of his career, finishing with 51 yards on nine carries. In addition, he recorded the first receptions of his career and ended with a team-high 65 yards on four catches.
- Perine, in his OU debut, rushed for a game-high 77 yards and one touchdown on 13 carries.
- Flowers, also making his OU debut, started and caught three passes for 24 yards.

Mike Stoops Guides Defense

- OU associate head coach and defensive coordinator Mike Stoops is in his third season on the coaching staff after previously guiding the OU 'D' from 1999-03.
- Stoops' defenses have posted six shutouts, including five in his first stint in Norman.
- In his first stint at OU, four of Stoops' five defenses finished No. 7 or better nationally in scoring defense and top 10 for total defense.
- From 2000-03, Stoops' defenses also finished in the top 25 in pass defense and rush defense every season and in pass efficiency defense and turnovers forced twice.
- In addition, Stoops is the only coach to have an athlete win both the Nagurski and Thorpe awards in the same season, doing so twice with Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003.

Defensive TDs at 48 in Stoops Era

- OU has 48 defensive TDs under Bob Stoops.
- The defense has scored at least one TD in all of Stoops' 15 seasons, including five in 2013 which ties with 2007, 2001 and 2000 seasons for the most in the Stoops era.

More About the Defense

- OU has forced at least one turnover in 173 of 200 games over the last 16 seasons - 86.5% of games played in that span.
- The Sooners defense has at least one interception in 73.5% of its games (147 of 200) under Stoops.

- With two field goals against Louisiana Tech (8/30), Hunnicutt has 21 multi-field goal games in his career, extending his own school record.
- Hunnicutt, who has made nine in a row dating back to last season, is now 64-74 (.865) for his career on field goals.

Block Party

- Oklahoma recorded a blocked field goal and a blocked extra point in the season-opening win over Louisiana Tech (8/30).
- Zack Sanchez's blocked field goal in the first quarter was the first by an OU player since Brodney Pool did it against Oregon (9/18/04).
- In the fourth quarter, Matt Dimon blocked an extra point. The last Sooner to do that was Jordan Wade at Kansas (10/19/13). Dimon also blocked a punt in that game against the Jayhawks.

Sooners Add Alternate Uniforms

- Oklahoma Football and official OU Athletics apparel sponsor Nike unveiled new additions to the school's uniform repertoire for use beginning in 2014. These alternative jersey-pants-helmet combinations were inspired by the rich heritage of the state of Oklahoma and the Sooners' storied football history. These new uniforms will occasionally supplement the iconic OU home and road uniforms the team has sported since the 1960s.
- The alternative white helmet pays homage to Bud Wilkinson's squads that captured national titles in 1950, 1955 and 1956. Those Oklahoma teams wore white headgear with a signature crimson stripe from crown to base. The latest version of this helmet concept includes a similar crimson stripe (embedded with a wood-grained pattern), as well as the addition of an officially-sized OU logo on each side.
- The modified version of Oklahoma's iconic crimson helmet also features an enlarged interlocking OU above each earhole with the distinctive wood-grained design embedded into the protective outer shell. Never previously utilized on a football helmet, this touch of timber provides a tangible link to the weathered texture of the Sooner Schooner, a Conestoga reminiscent of the pioneer mode of travel.

- In his 16th year as head coach at Oklahoma, Bob Stoops has worked the entire time with President David Boren and Director of Athletics Joe Castiglione.
- It's the longest active pairing between an FBS president, athletics director and head football coach.

Best Program of the BCS Era

The Sept. 17, 2012, "Franchise Issue" of *ESPN The Magazine* sought to find the best program in the BCS era. Sooners fans will be pleased with the results as Oklahoma was chosen as the No. 1 team.

ESPN the Magazine created three major categories of FBS success (on-field success, off-field success, traditions of success), then split them into nine factors (see below). Oklahoma ranked near the top in almost every category:

- Strength of Schedule (No. 1) - Average strength of schedule since 2003.
- Stadium Edge (No. 2) - *SportsNation* poll results for game-day experience; home win percentage; differential between home and road win percentages.
- Title Track (No. 2) - National titles [since 1936, emphasizing BCS era]; BCS bowl bids and wins; league titles; years in final AP Top 25 poll and AP top 10.
- Head Coach (No. 3) - Tenure [CFB and NFL]; winning percentage; average turnover margin and average penalties per game [all since 2001].
- Player Success (No. 7) - NFL draft picks [weighted by round]; Heisman winners [all].
- Recruiting (No. 10) - Total ESPN 150 signees [since 2007].
- Football Revenue (No. 12) - 2010 figures, per U.S. Department of Education.
- Academics (No. 33) - *US News and World Report* ranking in 2012; Academic Progress Rate in 2010-11.
- NCAA Violations (Grade: B) - Grade based on severity of sanctions since 1998.



- Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 843-312-53 (.720) in 119 seasons.
- Since WWII, OU leads the nation with 597 victories.
- The Sooners have captured seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000).
- OU has 47 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 28 bowl victories (No. 3 nationally) and an all-time record of 28-18-1 (.606).
- OU has 44 conference championships, including eight Big 12 titles overall (no other school has more than three).
- Oklahoma is the only program in FBS history to have four coaches with 100 or more wins.
- With a 69-13 win over Florida A&M (9/8/12), Oklahoma became the first program in college football history to break the 32,000-mark in all-time points scored. No program has scored more points than OU.
- OU has 154 All-Americans and 73 consensus All-Americans, including NCAA career receptions leader Ryan Broyles in 2011.
- Under Stoops, OU has had 33 All-Americans, including 23 consensus. Of the 33 players, 15 were on offense, 16 on defense and two on special teams spanning 14 different positions.
- Oklahoma boasts five Heisman winners. Sooners have also won the Bednarik (1), Butkus (4), Camp (4), Lombardi (3), Maxwell (2), Nagurski (2), O'Brien (3), Outland (5), Tatupu (1), Thorpe (3), Unitas (1) and Wuerffel (1).
- Sooner teams have gone undefeated 14 times in program history, the latest being in 2000.
- Oklahoma's 47-game win streak from 1953-57 is still the NCAA D-I record.
- Oklahoma has had 116 Academic All-Big 12 honorees under Stoops.
- The Sooners have gone 88-5 at home in Stoops' 16 seasons. In all, Oklahoma has won 81 percent of its home games since Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial opened in 1923.
- Oklahoma has played in front of 93 consecutive home sellouts - every game of Stoops' tenure.
- Including the four Sooners picked in the 2014 NFL Draft, OU has had 367 players picked all-time in the draft.
- Oklahoma has 43 first-round picks, including three No. 1 overall selections.
- In 2010, Sooners were chosen with three of the first four picks in the draft, with QB Sam Bradford at No. 1, DT Gerald McCoy at No. 3 and OT Trent Williams at No. 4.
- Bob Stoops' career average of 10.7 wins per year (entering 2014) is tops among active FBS head coaches with at least 10 years of experience.
- Stoops is the only active head coach on the FBS level to have reached a bowl game in each of his first 15 seasons. Georgia's Mark Richt (14) comes in second.
- Of the 15 bowls, nine have been BCS bowl games and four have been for the BCS title.
- Oklahoma is one of six programs to be ranked in each of the final 32 BCS Rankings, joining Alabama, LSU, Oregon, South Carolina and Stanford.

Home Dominance Under Stoops

Records

- The Sooners are 88-5 on Owen Field under Stoops.
- OU is 77-5 when ranked and 11-0 when unranked at home.
- Oklahoma is 37-2 in non-conference games at home under Stoops and 51-3 in Big 12 games.
- OU is 53-0 under Stoops when scoring 40 points or more at home and 39-0 at home when allowing 10 points or fewer.
- There have been 37 seasons in which the Sooners have gone undefeated at home, including 11 of Stoops' campaigns: 1999-00, 2002-04, 2006-10, 2013.

Streaks

- Oklahoma has wins over top 10 teams including No. 1 Nebraska (2000), No. 2 Texas Tech (2008), No. 9 Iowa State (2002) and No. 10 Texas Tech (2013) during that time.
- From 2005-11, Oklahoma won 39 straight home games, a stadium record. The streak was the fifth-longest home win streak in the modern football era.
- Under Stoops, OU won its first 17 home games stretching almost over his first three seasons from 1999-01.
- The Sooners also had a 19-game streak under Stoops from 2002-04.

Margin of Victory

- The Sooners have posted 11 shutouts against incoming opponents, including three against Big 12 foes.
- Oklahoma's biggest wins are a 77-0 defeat of Texas A&M (11/8/03) and a 68-0 win over UTEP (9/14/02).
- OU's average margin of victory at home has been 20 points or higher six of the past seven seasons and 11 of 15 seasons under Stoops.
- OU's five losses at home in the last 15 seasons have come by a combined 35 points, an average of 7.0 points per game.
- Only two games have gone into overtime, a 37-30 win vs. Baylor (10/22/05) and a 51-48 triumph over Oklahoma State (11/24/12).

Attendance Lately

- OU's average attendance in 2013 was 103.2% of Memorial Stadium's official capacity, a figure that ranked seventh nationally behind Oregon (106.8), Kansas State (105.8), Texas A&M (105.5), Navy (104.7), Nebraska (104.4) and Appalachian State (103.5).
- In 2013, Oklahoma ranked No. 13 nationally in average attendance at 84,722.

Record-Setting Attendance

- Oklahoma has drawn 7,132,497 fans for Bob Stoops' 93 home games (started in 1999) and all have been sold out.
- The current string of sellouts is the longest in school history, eclipsing a mark of 69 from 1971-84.
- A school-record 86,031 fans witnessed Oklahoma's home game against Notre Dame (10/27/12). It was the largest crowd ever to witness a sporting event in the state of Oklahoma.
- In 2012, Oklahoma fans set a record for average season attendance at 85,243. That broke the mark of 85,161 that was set in 2011.
- OU has exceeded the seating capacity of 82,112 at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium in 58 straight games.
- The top 10 seasons for home attendance at Oklahoma have been during Stoops' tenure as head coach.
- Of the top 10 crowds at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, all have come in the past seven years.

Home Winning Percentage

Since the start of the 1999 season, Bob Stoops' first at OU, Oklahoma leads major conference teams in home winning percentage at .946, going 88-5 over that span.
