OPENING KICK

► No. 15/14 Oklahoma starts its 2015 Big 12 season when it hosts No. 23/21 West Virginia on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT. The game will be televised by FS1.

► The Sooners, who are coming off a bye week, posted a 52-38 home win over Tulsa two weeks ago. OU racked up 773 yards of total offense (its most in 27 years and fourth most in program history). QB **Baker Mayfield** registered a school-record 572 yards of total offense (most by an FBS player this season) and was named Big 12 Co-Offensive Player of the Week, the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback of the Week and the Manning Award Quarterback of the Week.

► West Virginia, which went 7-6 last season and lost to Texas A&M (45-37) in the Liberty Bowl, is off to a 3-0 start with victories over Georgia Southern (44-0), Liberty (41-17) and Maryland (45-6), all at home.

► Oklahoma is 13-3 (.813) in Big 12 openers under **Bob Stoops**. The Sooners are 14-2 under Stoops in their first Big 12 home game of a season.

► This marks the third straight season OU and West Virginia will have opened Big 12 play against each other (the Sooners won each of the last two openers).

► OU is 16-4 (.800) all-time at home under Stoops against AP-ranked teams. Two of the losses came last season (Kansas State and Baylor).

► The Sooners are 92-8 (.920) at home under Stoops with all 100 of those games sellouts. OU has outscored its foes by an average of 42-15 in those contests.



Junior quarterback Baker Mayfield set the OU single-game record with 572 yards of total offense against Tulsa, the most by an FBS player this season. He accounted for six touchdowns (four passing) to tie the school record.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

► Oklahoma owns a 5-2 all-time record against West Virginia and is 3-0 against the Mountaineers since they joined the Big 12 (the average score in those three games has been 37-30). The Sooners are 3-1 against WVU in Norman. Last year in Morgantown, freshman **Samaje Perine** rushed for 242 yards and four touchdowns in OU's 45-33 win. Oklahoma ran for 301 yards (6.5 per carry) while holding WVU to 137 (3.4 per carry).

► Oklahoma is 13-2 at home under **Bob Stoops** following a bye week. The only losses came to Kansas State (24-19) in 2012 and Oklahoma State (38-35 in OT) in 2014. The Sooners are 19-7 overall under Stoops after a bye.

► Saturday's game will pit an OU passing attack that puts up 371.0 passing yards and 3.3 passing TDs per game against a WVU defense that has allowed a Big 12-low 154.0 passing yards per game and just two passing TDs in three outings. The Sooners are completing 66.4 percent of their pass attempts while the Mountaineers are allowing opponents to complete just 45.1 percent of their throws.

► Junior QB **Baker Mayfield** ranks second among FBS players in points responsible for per game (28.0), third in total offense per game (400.3), fourth in passing TDs per game (3.33) and seventh in passing yards per game (354.0). According to ESPN Stats and Info, Mayfield is the first FBS player since at least 2000 with three or more passing TDs and one or more rushing TD in each of his team's first three games of a season.

OU 5-2 ALL-TIME VS. WVU

► By a comfortable margin, the Sooners own the best home winning percentage (.920) since the start of the Stoops era in 1999 of any Power Five program. Ohio State ranks second (.878), TCU third (.842), Oregon fourth (.841) and LSU fifth (.841). West Virginia's lone win in Norman came in 1982 (41-27).

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER TULSA

► In head coach **Bob Stoops'** 100th home game at Oklahoma, the Sooners turned in one of the top offensive performances in school history en route to a 52-38 win over Tulsa two weeks ago. OU's 773 total yards were its fourth most in school history and most in 27 years (see chart to right).

► Junior quarterback **Baker Mayfield** accounted for a program-record-tying six touchdowns and smashed the previous OU record for total offense with 572 yards. He threw for a career-high 487 yards (fourth most in school history; career-high-tying four TDs) and rushed for a career-high 85 yards (career-high two TDs). He was 32 for 38 through the air, and his 226.6 pass efficiency rating was the highest by a Sooner with more than 30 attempts in a game.

► Tulsa also was impressive offensively with 603 total yards. The 1,376 combined yards were the second most in an OU game ever (surpassed only by the 1,440 yards in the Sooners' 50-49 win at West Virginia in 2012).

► Oklahoma led 31-10 and was driving with less than two minutes left in the second quarter before a fumble at the Tulsa 20-yard line gave the Golden Hurricane the ball. TU scored a touchdown with 13 seconds left in the half, recovered an on-side kick and scored another TD on a Hail Mary with one second remaining to make it a 31-24 game at halftime.

► Sophomore running back **Samaje Perine**, who led the Big 12 last year with his 1,713 rushing yards and 21 rushing TDs, ran for a season-high 152 yards. He registered his second rushing TD of the season (also has a receiving TD this year).

► Nine Sooners caught a pass. Senior receiver **Sterling Shepard** hauled in 8 passes for a season-high 144 yards. It was his ninth career game of at least 100 yards receiving, tying him for third in OU history with **Malcolm Kelly**.

► Redshirt-freshman receiver **Mark Andrews** caught three passes (two for TDs) for a career-high 87 yards.

► Junior safety **Hatari Byrd** registered a career-high 15 tackles (had 25 career tackles entering the game), the most by a Sooner this season and the most by an OU defensive back since 2010.

SCOUTING WEST VIRGINIA

► West Virginia has outscored Georgia Southern, Liberty and Maryland by an average score of 43-8, with all three games played in Morgantown. The Mountaineers have scored at least 41 points in each contest and have not given up a first-half point.

► WVU ranks fifth in the Big 12 in total offense (543.3 yards per game), third in rushing yards per game (220.3), fifth in passing yards per game (323.0) and second in pass efficiency rating (184.3).

► The Mountaineers' defense has been stellar, leading the country in points allowed (7.7 per game) and turnover margin (+3.0 per game), and ranking first in the Big 12 in passing yards allowed (154.0 per game), pass efficiency rating (78.5), interceptions (3.0 per game), opponent first downs (15.0 per game) and opponent third down conversion rate (28.6 percent). It also ranks second in the league total yards allowed (307.3 per game) and fourth in rushing yards allowed (153.3 per game).

► Junior quarterback **Skyler Howard** ranks fifth in the Big 12 with his 334.7 total yards per game (sixth with 305.3 passing yards per contest). He is 58 for 84 through the air (69.0 percent) with nine TDs and one interception.

► Junior running back **Wendell Smallwood** is averaging 110.3 rushing yards per game (ranks third in Big 12) and has run for four TDs. Sophomore wide receiver **Shelton Gibson** is averaging 109.7 receiving yards per contest (ranks third). He is averaging 27.4 yards per catch to lead the league.

► Senior safety **Karl Joseph** ranks first nationally with his 1.3 interceptions per game (four in three outings) and has a fumble recovery. He had three picks in the season opener against Georgia Southern. Joseph ranks second on the team in tackles (15), behind senior linebacker **Nick Kwiatkoski's** 18 (3.5 tackles for loss).

► WVU is 11-16 in Big 12 Conference games since joining the league prior to the 2012 season (5-4 last year).

► **Dana Holgorsen** (Iowa Wesleyan, '93) is in his fifth season as a head coach, all at West Virginia. He owns a 31-23 record. He also served as an assistant coach at fellow Big 12 programs Texas Tech (2000-07) and Oklahoma State (2010). He and OU offensive coordinator **Lincoln Riley** were on the same offensive staff at Texas Tech (2003-07).

LAST YEAR IN MORGANTOWN

► Freshman running back **Samaje Perine** rushed for 242 yards and four touchdowns to lead No. 4 Oklahoma to a 45-33 win over West Virginia in the Big 12 opener for both teams. He became the first Sooner to surpass 200 rushing yards since **DeMarco Murray** in 2010. Perine got the bulk of the carries in place of **Keith Ford**, who missed the game due to injury.

► **Alex Ross** returned a kickoff 100 yards and quarterback **Trevor Knight** caught a 4-yard pass from receiver **Durrone Neal** on a trick play for the Sooners' other two TDs. Knight finished 16 of 29 for 205 passing yards and one interception, while receiver **Sterling Shepard** caught six passes for a team-high 101 yards.

► OU trailed 24-17 until Ross' kickoff return with 1:08 left in the second quarter knotted the game. The Sooners outscored WVU 14-3 in the third quarter and 7-6 in the fourth.

► Linebackers **Jordan Evans**, **Eric Striker** and **Dominique Alexander** led the Sooners with 11, 8 and 8 tackles, respectively. Striker logged a pair of tackles for loss, including a sack.

► West Virginia quarterback **Clint Trickett** was 25 for 41 through the air for 376 yards and two TDs, but threw a pair of interceptions and lost a fumble. Wide receiver **Kevin White** caught 10 passes for 173 yards and a score.

► WVU outgained OU 513 yards to 510, but committed three turnovers to the Sooners' one.

HOME IS WHERE THE "W" IS

- ▶ Oklahoma is 448-105-22 (.798) all-time at home and 376-84-15 (.807) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.
- ▶ The Sooners are 92-8 at home under **Bob Stoops** and have outscored their opponents 4,183-1,545 (42-15 average) in those games. Included were a school record 39-game home winning streak and a pair of 19-game strings.
- ▶ With the win over Tulsa two weeks ago, OU improved its home non-conference record under Stoops to 40-2 (.952) and has outscored those opponents by an average margin of 45-14. The Sooners' only two home non-conference losses came to TCU in 2005 (17-10) and Notre Dame in 2012 (30-13).

SOONERS START QUEST FOR NINTH BIG 12 TITLE

- ▶ Oklahoma's performance in the Big 12 Conference since **Bob Stoops** took over as head coach in 1999 has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won eight Big 12 titles in Stoops' first 16 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.
- ▶ Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed eight league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each) and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).
- ▶ OU owns a league-best 104-28 (.788) record in regular season Big 12 games since the Stoops era began. Texas ranks second with a 97-36 (.729) record during the same span and Kansas State ranks third with a 75-57 (.568) mark. See the complete list in the chart to the upper right.
- ▶ During Stoops' OU tenure, the Sooners have racked up a Big 12-leading 36.8 points per game. During the same span, Texas Tech ranks second among other current Big 12 programs by averaging 35.7 points and is followed by TCU (35.2), Texas (35.1), West Virginia (34.0), Oklahoma State (33.8), Kansas State (33.4), Baylor (28.2), Kansas (24.4) and Iowa State (23.1).

MAYFIELD'S HOT START

- ▶ Junior quarterback **Baker Mayfield** is off to a strong start in his first year of competition with the Sooners. A former walk-on at Texas Tech who transferred to Oklahoma (also as a walk-on) without talking to OU coaches after being named Big 12 Offensive Freshman of the Year as a Red Raider, Mayfield ranks second among FBS players in points responsible for per game (28.0), third in total offense per game (400.3), fourth in passing TDs per game (3.33) and seventh in passing yards per game (354.0).
- ▶ According to ESPN Stats and Info, Mayfield, who is now on scholarship, is the first FBS player since at least 2000 with three or more passing TDs and one or more rushing TD in each of his team's first three games of a season.

- ▶ Mayfield is tied with **Josh Heupel** for most total TDs (14) in the first three games of an OU career. He has passed for 10 scores and run for four (see chart above).
- ▶ Mayfield has already been added to the Heisman Trophy conversation, ranking fifth in ESPN's voting after week three.
- ▶ Mayfield set the OU single-game record for total offense (572 yards) against Tulsa last game and tied the school record by accounting for six TDs (four passing, two rushing). His 487 passing yards stand as the fourth most in OU single-game history. He was 32 for 38 passing, and his 226.6 pass efficiency rating was the highest by a Sooner with more than 30 attempts in a game.
- ▶ At then-No. 23 Tennessee in the season's second game, Mayfield engineered a comeback from a 17-0 deficit by leading the Sooners to TDs on their final four possessions for a 31-24 double-overtime victory in front of 102,455 fans (the most to ever see an OU game).
- ▶ In his first game as a Sooner, Mayfield set the OU record for passing yards in a season opener (388) in a 41-3 win over Akron.

RB PERINE RETURNING TO FORM

- ▶ After averaging 55.5 rushing yards per game (3.3 yards per carry) in OU's first two contests this year, sophomore running back **Samaje Perine** is coming off a 152-yard performance on the ground against Tulsa (6.9 yards per carry).
- ▶ Last year, Perine became the first freshman in Big 12 history to lead the league in rushing, averaging 131.8 yards per game. That average ranked him eighth nationally.
- ▶ The 1,713 net rushing yards for Perine were sixth most by a freshman in FBS history and second most in Big 12 and OU freshman annals, behind **Adrian Peterson's** 1,925 yards in 2004. Perine's total was fifth highest in a season in OU annals.

- ▶ Perine, who bench presses 440 pounds, tied for second in OU history with three 200-yard rushing games last year. He was one of six players, and the only freshman, to have three 200-yard games in 2014.
- ▶ Perine's 21 rushing touchdowns were the most ever in a season by a Big 12 freshman. He led the Big 12 in the category and the total ranked as the fourth most in a season by a Sooner.

► Against Kansas (11/22/14), Perine amassed an FBS-record 427 rushing yards and five touchdowns on 34 carries. The yardage ranked seventh all-time in NCAA history for all levels and divisions.

WR SHEPARD CLIMBING THE CHARTS

► Coming off a game against Tulsa in which he recorded season highs in receptions (8) and receiving yards (144), senior receiver **Sterling Shepard** is rapidly ascending several OU career charts.

► A 2014 first-team All-Big 12 selection by the league's coaches, Shepard ranks seventh at OU in career receptions (165), is tied for seventh in career TD receptions (17), ranks fifth in career receiving yards (2,480) and is tied for third in career 100-yard receiving games (9).

► Shepard was held to three catches for 68 yards in the season opener before grabbing seven balls for 74 yards and two touchdowns in the win at Tennessee. The scores came with 40 seconds left in the fourth quarter and in double-overtime.

► Last year, Shepard totaled 911 receiving yards in OU's first seven games (130.1 average) before getting hurt on OU's first play from scrimmage at Iowa State. He missed the next game and was limited the rest of the season after returning.

► Shepard, who shares the OU single-game record with 15 catches (last year vs. Kansas State), wears the same jersey number as his late father, Derrick, who was also a Sooner receiver (1983-86).

YOUTH IS SERVED ON O-LINE

► OU entered the year charged with the task of replacing three of five starters from an offensive line unit that led the nation by surrendering only nine sacks in 2014 and that paved the way for a rushing attack that led the Big 12 with 261.2 yards a contest. Gone are LT **Tyrus Thompson** (Minnesota Vikings, 6th round), LG **Adam Shead** and RT **Daryl Williams** (Carolina Panthers, 4th round). Returning starters are senior C **Ty Darlington** (15 career starts) and senior RG **Nila Kasitati** (14 career starts).

► Three OU offensive linemen made their first career starts against Akron in the opener and two of those three played in their first career games.

► For the first time in school history in the game against Akron, OU started two freshmen at tackle. Redshirt freshman **Orlando Brown** started at left tackle and true freshman **Dru Samia** started on the right side. They became the ninth and 10th freshmen to start at tackle in OU history.

► Also making his first career start against Akron was sophomore left guard **Jonathan Alvarez**. Alvarez played in one game last season and that was the opener against Louisiana Tech (saw very limited action in the contest).

► Senior **Josiah St. John** replaced Samia in the starting lineup against Tennessee and Tulsa.

► In OU's last game against Tulsa, Darlington did not play and Kasitati played sparingly, both due to injury. Alvarez took Darlington's place at center and senior **Derek Farniok** started in Alvarez's place at left guard. The unit was commended by the coaching staff after the game, and understandably so. The Sooners amassed 773 total yards (their most since 1988), including a season-high 286 rushing yards.

RILEY RETURNS TO BIG 12 AS OU'S OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

► **Lincoln Riley** made his OU debut as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach vs. Akron, the same day he turned 32. From Muleshoe, Texas, Riley is no stranger to the Big 12, having played quarterback at Texas Tech under **Mike Leach** and then serving seven years on the TCU staff (the Red Raiders played in bowl games all seven years and won five).

► Riley has OU ranked eighth nationally in passing offense (371.0 yards per game), 10th in total offense (553.3 yards per game) and 23rd in yards per completion (14.1). The Sooners' 773 total yards against Tulsa rank as the fourth most by an FBS team this season and the fourth most in school history.

► Riley came to Norman with the reputation as one of the brightest young coaches in the college game. He spent the last five seasons at East Carolina, where the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual records with their up-tempo, spread offensive scheme. His five squads own the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four positions for total offense in a season.

► Last season, ECU ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 yards per game) and ranked fifth in total offense (533.0 yards per game).

► The Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense in 2014. By comparison, OU has not reached that figure since recording 7,670 yards of total offense in 2008.

► Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

MIKE STOOPS GUIDES DEFENSE

- ▶ Oklahoma associate head coach and defensive coordinator **Mike Stoops** is in his fourth season on the staff after previously guiding the OU 'D' from 1999-03.
- ▶ Last year's Oklahoma defense ranked fourth nationally by allowing only 3.02 yards per carry. It was the lowest opponent average since OU permitted 2.80 yards per rush in 2009.
- ▶ Stoops' defenses have posted six shutouts, including five in his first stint in Norman.
- ▶ In his first OU stint, four of his five units finished No. 7 or better nationally in scoring defense and in the top 10 for total defense.
- ▶ From 2000-03, Stoops' defenses finished in the top 25 in pass defense and rush defense each year and in pass efficiency defense and turnovers twice.
- ▶ Stoops is the only coach to have an athlete win both the Nagurski and Thorpe awards in the same season, and it happened twice (**Roy Williams** in 2001 and **Derrick Strait** in 2003).

EXPERIENCED INSIDE LINEBACKERS

- ▶ The Sooners return an experienced core of inside linebackers, with three players in the group each tallying more than 90 tackles in a season.
- ▶ **Dominique Alexander** and **Jordan Evans**, who each started all 13 games last year, paced OU with 107 and 93 tackles, respectively, as sophomores. Alexander leads the Big 12 this season with his 10.7 tackles per game.
- ▶ Alexander was a second-team All-Big 12 selection by the Associated Press last year and was on preseason watch lists this season for the Butkus, Nagurski and Rotary Lombardi Awards. Evans, an Academic All-Big 12 First Team honoree, is the son of **Scott Evans**, a three-time All-Big Eight defensive tackle for the Sooners (1988-90).
- ▶ Senior **Frank Shannon**, who was not enrolled at OU last year, led the Sooners with 92 tackles in 2013. He started all 13 games and was an honorable mention All-Big 12 choice.
- ▶ The Alexander/Evans/Shannon trio has combined for 484 career tackles.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

- ▶ Oklahoma has spent more weeks ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll (101) all-time than any other program. Additionally, OU's 389 weeks in the AP's top five are more than any other school. The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.
- ▶ During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (609) and a better winning percentage (.762) than any other program.
- ▶ OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 33,471 points (in 1,223 games). Nebraska ranks second with 32,196 points (in 1,306 games).
- ▶ No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 35. In addition, OU's 21 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.
- ▶ Since **Bob Stoops'** arrival in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (171) and points scored (7,916).
- ▶ Only Alabama (9) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

SOONERS AND THE NFL

- ▶ As of Sept. 7, 34 former Sooners are on an NFL roster, most of any Big 12 program.
- ▶ Since **Bob Stoops'** arrival in 1999, 75 Sooners have been selected in the NFL Draft.
- ▶ In the last five seasons, 27 Sooners have been taken in the NFL Draft (the Big 12 school with the next highest total is Baylor with 17). Those 27 picks are the fifth most of any school over the last five years. Only Alabama (37), Florida State (37), LSU (33) and Georgia (28) have had more.
- ▶ OU has had at least four players selected in every NFL Draft since 2008. LSU is the only other school that can make that claim.
- ▶ Fifteen Sooners have been taken in the NFL Draft first round in the last five years. No other Big 12 school has had more than nine in that same span.

EXTRA POINTS

- ▶ In its two home games, OU is averaging 656.0 yards of total offense and 463.0 passing yards. Quarterback **Baker Mayfield** is 55 for 71 through the air for a 77.5-percent completion rate and is averaging 435.0 passing yards and 3.5 passing TDs.
- ▶ The Sooners have outscored Akron (24-0), Tennessee (14-0) and Tulsa (21-14) by a combined 59-14 margin in the third and fourth quarters. OU has outgained its first three foes 773 yards to 372 in those two periods.
- ▶ OU is the only Big 12 team to beat a ranked opponent this season (won 31-24 in double overtime at then-No. 23/23 Tennessee). The Sooners are going for their second victory against a ranked foe when they take on No. 23/21 West Virginia on Saturday.
- ▶ Senior **Eric Striker** is OU's all-time leader in sacks among linebackers (16.0).
- ▶ The Sooners lead the Big 12 in net punting with their 44.4-yard average. True freshman **Austin Seibert** ranks third in the league with his 45.8 yards per punt. Seibert doubles as OU's placekicker and has made all four of his field goal tries and all 16 of his point-after attempts.
- ▶ OU is 50-26 (.658) against AP Top 25 teams in the 2000s, good for the second most wins nationally (LSU is 55-31 [.640]).
- ▶ The Sooners are looking for their 13th season of at least 10 wins under **Bob Stoops**. Oklahoma is the only FBS program to rack up 12 seasons of double-digit victories since 2000.
- ▶ Oklahoma was ranked No. 19 in both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches top 25 preseason polls, its lowest ranking in both polls to start a year since its national championship season of 2000. OU started at No. 19 in both polls that year, as well.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project will bowl in the south end of the facility and is slated to be completed in time for the 2016 season.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998) and its existing figure of 82,112 (2003).
- In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

CURRENT RENOVATION

- The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project will be constructed entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- The first phase of the building project will be completed prior to the 2016 season and will focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect will result in completing the south end zone seating bowl, a feature that will initially increase seating capacity to more than 84,000 seats.
- The seating bowl will feature an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure will feature 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility will be a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They will each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- The new building will allow for all student-athlete services to be moved to the ground floor. That space will include a new locker room, strength and conditioning room, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building will house all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room will nearly triple in size to 26,600 square feet and include a 70-yard indoor turfed speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also will grow substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

WINNING LEGACY

- ▶ Bob Stoops is the winningest coach in Oklahoma history with a 171-44 overall record. He ranks third at OU with his .795 career winning percentage.
- ▶ Won more games in his first 16 years than any college coach.
- ▶ Reached 100 wins in 122 games (tied for ninth fastest all-time pace).
- ▶ Has led the Sooners to a school-record 16 consecutive bowl berths.
- ▶ Since he took over at OU in 1999, has coached Sooners to more wins than any other Power Five program has accumulated during that time span.
- ▶ Has directed the Sooners to the second highest winning percentage of any Power Five program since 1999, trailing only Ohio State.
- ▶ Is the only coach in the BCS era to win a national championship and every BCS bowl game (Fiesta, Orange, Rose, Sugar).
- ▶ Under his direction, Oklahoma is one of only nine Power Five programs to average 10 wins per year over the last five seasons.

- ▶ Owns a 92-8 home record, which included a school-record 39-game winning streak (ninth longest in college football history) and two 19-game strings.
- ▶ The Sooners are a combined 22-10 under Stoops against their two biggest rivals (10-6 against Texas and a 12-4 vs. Oklahoma State).

CONFERENCE SUPREMACY

- ▶ Stoops has coached OU to eight Big 12 championships, more than twice as many as any other school (Texas is next with three).
- ▶ Owns a 53-15 overall mark the last five-plus years and a 32-12 league record, both of which are the best of any Big 12 team during that span.
- ▶ Has guided the Sooners to more wins against AP Top 25 teams than any Big 12 team over the last five years. OU is the only program in the conference to own a winning record in such games (15-11).

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

- ▶ Stoops has produced 34 first-team All-Americans, two AP Players of the Year and 78 NFL Draft picks as OU's head coach.
- ▶ Stoops has coached two Heisman Trophy winners (Jason White in 2003 and Sam Bradford in 2008) and five Heisman finalists.
- ▶ Under his guidance, OU became the first program to produce two players who claimed the Thorpe and Nagurski Awards in the same season (Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003).
- ▶ Two different Sooners have claimed the following honors since he took over at OU: Nagurski Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait), Thorpe Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait) and Butkus Award (Rocky Calmus, Teddy Lehman).
- ▶ At least one of his OU players has earned each one of these accolades: the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Walter Camp Award, Maxwell Award, Untas Award, Outland Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy and the Mosi Tatupu Award.

QUARTERBACKS

6 BAKER MAYFIELD (JR.)

- ▶ Racked up 572 yards of total offense against Tulsa (9/19) to set the school single-game record. That total was also the seventh-most by a player in Big 12 history.
- ▶ Passed for a career-high 487 yards (fourth most in school history) and rushed for a career-high 85 yards against Tulsa (9/19) to earn co-Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- ▶ Tied a career high with four TD passes against Tulsa (9/19) and set a career high with two TD runs.
- ▶ His 226.60 passing efficiency (Tulsa, 9/19) stands as the highest mark by a Sooner with more than 30 attempts in a game.
