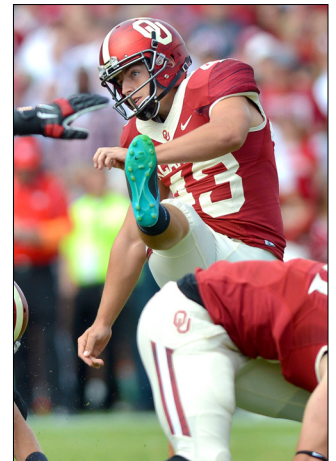

OPENING KICK

- ▶ Oklahoma (4-1, 1-1) plays its first Big 12 true road game of the season when it takes on Kansas State (3-2, 0-2) on Saturday at 2:30 p.m. CT in Manhattan, Kan. The game will be televised by ABC (full national broadcast).
- ▶ OU (eight) and K-State (two) have combined for 10 Big 12 championships in the league's first 19 years (they shared the 2012 crown).
- ▶ Oklahoma's 72 all-time wins against Kansas State are tied for its second most among all opponents (84 vs. Oklahoma State; also 72 vs. Iowa State and Kansas).
- ▶ The Sooners are 5-0 under **Bob Stoops** in Manhattan (won all five by double digits). The visiting team has won the last four meetings in the OU-KSU series.
- ▶ The Sooners are coming off a 24-17 loss against Texas on Saturday in Dallas. Oklahoma, which never led, registered 21 first downs to UT's 20, but was outgained 368 yards to 278 on the day. One week after forcing five turnovers against West Virginia, OU did not force any against the Longhorns.
- ▶ Kansas State, which went 9-4 (7-2 Big 12) last season and lost 40-35 to UCLA in the Alamo Bowl, is off to a 3-2 start this year with wins against South Dakota (34-0), at UTSA (30-3) and versus Louisiana Tech (39-33 in triple overtime), and losses at Oklahoma State (36-34) and to No. 2 TCU (52-45).
- ▶ Under Stoops, the Sooners are 15-1 in the game after they play Texas (only loss was last year to Kansas State) and is 6-0 after a loss to Texas.
- ▶ Oklahoma is 40-6 since the start of the 2010 season against teams unranked in the AP Top 25 Poll.



True freshman Austin Seibert owns the OU record for consecutive field goal attempts made to start a career (eight). He also ranks fourth in the Big 12 with his 43.8-yard punting average. Opponents have begun drives inside their own 20-yard line following 13 of his 28 punts.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- ▶ Oklahoma has not lost back-to-back regular season games since Oct. 2 and 9, 1999, **Bob Stoops'** debut season. OU has won 34 consecutive regular season games following a regular season loss.
- ▶ OU owns a 72-19-4 (.779) all-time record and a 9-5 (.643) Big 12-era mark against Kansas State, the highest winning percentages by a Wildcats' opponent among current Big 12 programs. In fact, no other current Big 12 program has a winning record against K-State since the league began in 1996.
- ▶ An assistant coach on **Bill Snyder's** first seven K-State teams (1989-1995), Stoops served as the defensive backs coach his first two years in Manhattan before serving the final five as co-defensive coordinator. The Wildcats failed to go to a bowl game the first four years of the Snyder/Stoops pairing (18-26 record), but did each of the last three years (28-6 record). Stoops played at Iowa from 1979-82 under head coach **Hayden Fry**, and that staff featured Snyder as offensive coordinator each of those seasons. Stoops left K-State following the 1995 season to become assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Florida.
- ▶ Snyder and Stoops rank second and third among active FBS coaches in career wins at their current school. Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** ranks first (234 in 29th year), Snyder is second (190 in 24th year) and Stoops is third (172 in 17th year).

MAYFIELD IN THE RANKINGS

Junior quarterback **Baker Mayfield**, in his first year of competition with the Sooners, ranks near the top of several offensive categories both in the Big 12 and nationally.

► Since the start of the 2009 season, the Sooners are 11-1 against teams they lost to the previous season. The only back-to-back losses they sustained to one opponent during the stretch came to Baylor in 2013 and 2014. OU lost to Kansas State at home in 2012 but responded for a 41-31 road win over the Wildcats in 2013.

RECAPPING SATURDAY'S LOSS VS. TEXAS (STATISTICAL RECAP ON PAGE 30)

- No. 10/9 Oklahoma was looking for its fifth win against Texas in the last six years but never led in a 24-17 setback at Cotton Bowl Stadium on Saturday in Dallas. The Sooners were outgained by 90 yards on the day (368 to a season-low 278) and failed to force a turnover while committing one that led to seven points.
- Junior quarterback **Baker Mayfield** completed 20 of his 28 pass attempts for 211 yards and a touchdown (no interceptions), but was sacked six times for a loss of 45 yards. He was 14 for 16 for 166 yards in the second half. On non-sack plays, Mayfield rushed for 40 yards on 12 carries on the day. His 71.4-percent completion rate was his second best of the season.
- The Sooners held Texas to just 55 yards passing on 12 attempts, but were outgained 338-117 on the ground. **Samaje Perine** led OU in rushing yards for the fifth time in five games, but was limited to 36 yards on 10 carries.
- **Sterling Shepard** recorded game highs of six catches and 95 receiving yards. His 50-yard third-quarter reception set up OU's first touchdown, a **Dimitri Flowers** two-yard catch. It was the first career touchdown for Flowers, a sophomore H-back.
- **Jordan Evans** paced OU in tackles for the first time this season with a game-high 11 stops. **Eric Striker** recorded 2.0 sacks for the second straight game to give him 20.0 for his career, most in school history among linebackers and ninth most overall.
- Texas went up 7-0 with 7:52 left in the first quarter and scored another touchdown with 5:37 remaining in the period after a fumble by OU's **Alex Ross** on a kickoff return. The Sooners cut the deficit to seven points on two occasions (17-10 and 24-17).
- True freshman **Austin Seibert** made his lone field goal attempt, making him 8 for 8 on the season. That is the most field goal makes without a miss to start a career in OU history.

SCOUTING KANSAS STATE

- Kansas State enters Saturday's contest riding a two-game losing streak, and both of the heart-breaking variety. Two weeks ago, the Wildcats lost 36-34 on a last-second field goal at Oklahoma State. This past Saturday, they held a 35-17 halftime advantage against No. 2 TCU before falling 52-45 at home (TCU scored a touchdown with 1:10 left in the fourth quarter for the final points).
- Both of K-State's losses came when leading at halftime. Entering the OSU game, the Wildcats had won 49 straight contests when ahead at the half (was nation's longest such streak).
- K-State ranks sixth in the Big 12 in scoring offense (36.4 ppg) and eighth in total offense (370.0 ypg), while ranking fifth in scoring defense (24.8 ppg) and sixth in total defense (395.8 ypg). It has been outgained by 25.8 yards a contest.
- The Wildcats lead the Big 12 in kickoff return yards per attempt (26.4) and in time of possession (34:02 per game).
- Junior quarterback **Joe Hubener** has started the last four games and averages 165.4 passing yards and 44.8 rushing yards per outing. He has completed 47.7 percent of his passes, with two interceptions and four TDs. He ranks third nationally with his 15.9 yards per completion. Hubener has also scored six rushing TDs (no other Wildcat has scored more than three). Four of those scores on the ground came against TCU when he rushed for 111 yards on 26 carries.
- Redshirt freshman running back **Justin Silmon**, from Tulsa, Okla. (Union High School), averages a team-high 56.4 rushing yards per game. Junior wide receiver **Deante Burton** leads the team with his 15 catches and 44.4 receiving yards per contest.
- Junior defensive back **Donnie Starks** and sophomore linebacker **Elijah Lee** pace the Wildcats with their 6.0 tackles per game. Senior defensive end **Marquel Bryant** leads the squad with 3.0 sacks on the year.
- Senior defensive back **Morgan Burns** leads the Big 12 and ranks third nationally with his 33.7 yards per kickoff return. He returned the opening kickoff of the season 100 yards against South Dakota. Senior kicker **Jack Cantele** is 8 for 9 on his field goal attempts (long of 44).
- **Bill Snyder** (William Jewel, '63) is in his 24th season as a head coach, all at Kansas State (190-96-1 record). His teams won Big 12 titles in 2003 (beat Oklahoma in championship game) and 2012 (shared with OU with 8-1 league record).

LAST YEAR VS. THE WILDCATS

- **Michael Hunnicutt** missed a late 19-yard field goal try as No. 14 Kansas State edged No. 11 Oklahoma 31-30 in Norman. Trailing by a point in the fourth quarter, OU drove to the K-State 1-yard line but couldn't punch the ball in. Hunnicutt then missed the short field goal that would have put the Sooners ahead with 3:53 remaining. The Wildcats took possession and ran out the clock. Hunnicutt also missed a 32-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter and had an extra-point attempt blocked in the fourth.
- Oklahoma outgained K-State in total yards, 533-385, and in first downs, 30-17. But in addition to their kicking game troubles, the Sooners threw a pair of interceptions (one by a receiver on a trick play at the KSU 17-yard line) while the Wildcats committed no turnovers.
- OU quarterback **Trevor Knight** was 26 for 32 passing for 318 yards with one interception and three touchdowns. His second-quarter interception was returned five yards for a touchdown by **Danzel McDaniel**.
- **Sterling Shepard** racked up a career-high 197 receiving yards and tied a school record with 15 catches, one of them a 47-yard TD grab. Running back **Samaje Perine** ran for 89 yards and a score on 24 carries.
- K-State quarterback **Jake Waters** was 15 for 23 through the air for 225 yards and two touchdowns, one of them for 62 yards to **Glenn Gronkowski**. He ran for 51 yards and a score on 10 carries. **Tyler Lockett** led the Wildcats with 86 receiving yards on six catches, one for a TD.
- OU ran 23 more plays from scrimmage than K-State (78-55).

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

► Oklahoma's performance in the Big 12 Conference since **Bob Stoops** took over as head coach in 1999 has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won eight Big 12 titles in Stoops' first 16 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

- ▶ Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed eight league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each) and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).
- ▶ OU owns a league-best 105-29 (.784) record in regular season Big 12 games since the Stoops era began. Texas ranks second with a 98-37 (.726) record during the same span, TCU is third (17-13; .567) and Kansas State fourth (75-59; .564). See the complete list in the chart to the right.
- ▶ During Stoops' OU tenure, the Sooners have racked up a Big 12-leading 36.8 points per game. During the same span, Texas Tech ranks second among other current Big 12 programs by averaging 35.8 points and is followed by Texas (34.9), Oklahoma State (33.8), Kansas State (33.5), TCU (33.4), West Virginia (30.9), Baylor (28.5), Kansas (24.2) and Iowa State (23.2).

MAYFIELD'S HOT START

▶ Junior quarterback **Baker Mayfield** is off to a strong start in his first year of competition with the Sooners. A former walk-on at Texas Tech who transferred to Oklahoma (also as a walk-on) without talking to OU coaches after being named Big 12 Offensive Freshman of the Year as a Red Raider, Mayfield ranks fifth among FBS players in points responsible for per game (21.6), eighth in total offense per game (345.2), ninth in passing TDs per game (2.80) and 10th in passing yards per game (318.6).

▶ Mayfield ranks second behind **Josh Heupel** for most total TDs (18) in the first five games of an OU career. He has passed for 14 scores and run for four. He also ranks second behind Heupel with his 1,593 passing yards through five games (see chart to the right).

▶ Mayfield has thrown for at least one touchdown in all five games and passed for at least three scores in each of the first four.

▶ Two weeks ago against a West Virginia defense that allowed just 7.7 points, 154.0 passing yards and 0.7 touchdown passes per game entering the day, Mayfield threw for 320 yards and three scores in a 44-24 win.

▶ Mayfield set the OU single-game record for total offense (572 yards; most by an FBS player this year) against Tulsa three games ago and tied the school record by accounting for six TDs (four passing, two rushing). His 487 passing yards stand as the fourth most in OU single-game history. He was 32 for 38 through the air, and his 226.6 pass efficiency rating was the highest by a Sooner with more than 30 attempts in a game.

▶ At then-No. 23 Tennessee in the season's second game, Mayfield engineered a comeback from a 17-0 deficit by leading the Sooners to TDs on their final four possessions for a 31-24 double-overtime victory in front of 102,455 fans (the most to ever see an OU game).

▶ In his first game as a Sooner, Mayfield set the OU record for passing yards in a season opener (388) in a 41-3 win over Akron.

PERINE ACHIEVES REMARKABLE FEAT

▶ Only six Sooners during the 16-plus-year **Bob Stoops** era have rushed for 2,000 career yards, and current sophomore **Samaje Perine** did it faster than any of the other five. He reached the mark two games ago against West Virginia in only 326 career carries, faster than current NFL stars **DeMarco Murray** (342 carries) and **Adrian Peterson** (365). For his career, Perine is averaging a stout 6.0 yards per rush.

▶ Last year, Perine became the first freshman in Big 12 history to lead the league in rushing, averaging 131.8 yards per game. That average ranked him eighth nationally.

▶ The 1,713 net rushing yards for Perine were sixth most by a freshman in FBS history and second most in Big 12 and OU freshman annals, behind **Adrian Peterson's** 1,925 yards in 2004. Perine's total was fifth highest in a season in OU annals.

▶ Perine, who bench presses 440 pounds, tied for second in OU history with three 200-yard rushing games last year. He was one of six players, and the only freshman, to have three 200-yard games in 2014.

▶ Perine's 21 rushing touchdowns last year were the most ever in a season by a Big 12 freshman. He led the Big 12 in the category and the total ranked as the fourth most in a season by a Sooner.

▶ Against Kansas (11/22/14), Perine amassed an FBS-record 427 rushing yards and five touchdowns on 34 carries. The yardage ranked seventh all-time in NCAA history for all levels and divisions.

SHEPARD CLIMBING RECEIVING CHARTS

▶ Senior receiver **Sterling Shepard** is rapidly ascending several OU career charts. A 2014 first-team All-Big 12 selection by the league's coaches, Shepard is tied for third in career 100-yard receiving games (9) and ranks fourth in career receiving yards (2,610), fifth in career receptions (173) and seventh in career TD receptions (18).

▶ Shepard was held to three catches for 68 yards in the season opener before grabbing seven balls for 74 yards and two touchdowns in the win at Tennessee. The scores came with 40 seconds left in the fourth quarter and in double-overtime. He added

a 28-yard TD catch vs. West Virginia and registered game highs of six receptions and 95 receiving yards against Texas the last two outings.

- Last year, Shepard totaled 911 receiving yards in OU's first seven games (130.1 average) before getting hurt on OU's first play from scrimmage at Iowa State. He missed the next game and was limited the rest of the season after returning.
- Shepard, who shares the OU single-game record with 15 catches (last year vs. Kansas State), wears the same jersey number (3) as his late father, Derrick, who was also a Sooner receiver (1983-86).

SENSATIONAL SEIBERT

- **Austin Seibert** is the only FBS true freshman to handle his team's placekicking and punting duties, and he's been stellar through five games.
- Seibert, from Belleville, Ill., is the first kicker in OU history to make each of his first eight field goal tries. He has also made all 23 of his point-after attempts.
- Seibert ranks fourth among Big 12 kickers and ranks sixth among all league players with his 9.4 points per game.
- Seibert ranks fourth in the Big 12 with his 43.8-yard punting average. Eight of his 28 punts have gone 50 yards or more, and 13 have been downed inside the 20-yard line (only one touchback).

YOUTH IS SERVED ON O-LINE

- OU entered the year charged with the task of replacing three of five starters from an offensive line unit that led the nation by surrendering only nine sacks in 2014 and that paved the way for a rushing attack that led the Big 12 with 261.2 yards a contest. Gone are LT **Tyrus Thompson** (Minnesota Vikings, 6th round), LG **Adam Shead** and RT **Daryl Williams** (Carolina Panthers, 4th round). Returning starters are senior C **Ty Darlington** (15 career starts) and senior RG **Nila Kasitati** (14 career starts).
- Three OU offensive linemen made their first career starts against Akron in the opener and two of those three played in their first career games.

► For the first time in school history in the game against Akron, OU started two freshmen at tackle. Redshirt freshman **Orlando Brown** started at left tackle and true freshman **Dru Samia** started on the right side. They became the ninth and 10th freshmen to start at tackle in OU history.

► Also making his first career start against Akron was sophomore left guard **Jonathan Alvarez**. Alvarez played in one game last season and that was the opener against Louisiana Tech (saw very limited action in the contest).

► Senior **Josiah St. John** (no previous career starts) replaced Samia in the starting lineup the last four games.

► Three games ago against Tulsa, Darlington did not play and Kasitati played sparingly, both due to injury. Alvarez took Darlington's place at center and senior **Derek Farniok** (one previous career start) started in Alvarez's place at left guard. The unit was commended by the coaching staff after the game, and understandably so. The Sooners amassed 773 total yards (their most since 1988), including a season-high 286 rushing yards.

► Darlington and Kasitati were back in the lineup for the West Virginia and Texas contests, and Farniok has started three straight games at left guard.

RILEY RETURNS TO BIG 12 AS OU'S OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

► **Lincoln Riley** made his OU debut as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach vs. Akron, the same day he turned 32. From Muleshoe, Texas, Riley is no stranger to the Big 12, having played quarterback at Texas Tech under **Mike Leach** and then serving seven years on the TCU staff (the Red Raiders played in bowl games all seven years and won five).

► Riley has OU ranked 14th nationally in passing offense (328.8 yards per game), 22nd in total offense (473.0 yards per game) and 13th in yards per completion (14.6). The Sooners' 773 total yards against Tulsa rank as the fifth most by an FBS team this season and the fourth most in school history.

► Riley came to Norman with the reputation as one of the brightest young coaches in the college game. He spent the last five seasons at East Carolina, where the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual records with their up-tempo, spread offensive scheme. His five squads own the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four positions for total offense in a season.

► Last season, ECU ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 yards per game) and ranked fifth in total offense (533.0 yards per game).

► The Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense in 2014. By comparison, OU has not reached that figure since recording 7,670 yards of total offense in 2008.

► Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

MIKE STOOPS GUIDES DEFENSE

- ▶ Oklahoma associate head coach and defensive coordinator **Mike Stoops** is in his fourth season on the staff after previously guiding the OU 'D' from 1999-03.
- ▶ Last year's Oklahoma defense ranked fourth nationally by allowing only 3.02 yards per carry. It was the lowest opponent average since OU permitted 2.80 yards per rush in 2009.
- ▶ Stoops' defenses have posted six shutouts, including five in his first stint in Norman.
- ▶ In his first OU stint, four of his five units finished No. 7 or better nationally in scoring defense and in the top 10 for total defense.
- ▶ From 2000-03, Stoops' defenses finished in the top 25 in pass defense and rush defense each year and in pass efficiency defense and turnovers twice.
- ▶ Stoops is the only coach to have an athlete win both the Nagurski and Thorpe awards in the same season, and it happened twice (**Roy Williams** in 2001 and **Derrick Strait** in 2003).

EXPERIENCED INSIDE LINEBACKERS

- ▶ The Sooners return an experienced core of inside linebackers, with three players in the group each tallying more than 90 tackles in a season.
- ▶ **Dominique Alexander** and **Jordan Evans**, who each started all 13 games last year, paced OU with 107 and 93 tackles, respectively, as sophomores. Alexander ranks second in the Big 12 this season with his 9.6 tackles per game while Evans ranks fifth with 8.6 per outing.
- ▶ Alexander was a second-team All-Big 12 selection by the Associated Press last year and was on preseason watch lists this season for the Butkus, Nagurski and Rotary Lombardi Awards. Evans, an Academic All-Big 12 First Team honoree, is the son of **Scott Evans**, a three-time All-Big Eight defensive tackle for the Sooners (1988-90).
- ▶ Senior **Frank Shannon**, who was not enrolled at OU last year, led the Sooners with 92 tackles in 2013. He started all 13 games and was an honorable mention All-Big 12 choice.
- ▶ The Alexander/Evans/Shannon trio has combined for 520 career tackles.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

- ▶ During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (610) and a better winning percentage (.762) than any other program.
- ▶ OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 33,532 points (in 1,225 games). Nebraska ranks second with 32,230 points (in 1,308 games).
- ▶ No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 35. In addition, OU's 21 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.
- ▶ Since **Bob Stoops'** arrival in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (172) and points scored (7,977).
- ▶ Only Ohio State (102) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101). OU's 389 weeks in the AP's top five are more than any other school. The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.
- ▶ Only Alabama (9) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

- ▶ Oklahoma is 9-2 all-time when ranked No. 19 in the AP poll. The Sooners have won their last seven games under the circumstance and have outscored their opponents 277-75 in those seven victories (average of 39.6 to 10.7).
- ▶ Big 12 Conference teams have registered three wins against top-25 teams (at the time of competition) this season and OU owns two of them (31-24 at No. 23/23 Tennessee in double overtime and 44-24 vs. No. 23/21 West Virginia).
- ▶ OU is 51-26 (.662) against AP Top 25 teams in the 2000s, good for the second most wins nationally (LSU is 55-31 [.640]).
- ▶ With 20.0 career sacks (4.5 this season to rank fourth in Big 12), **Eric Striker** is OU's all-time leader in the category among linebackers. He has 6.0 more than second-place **Rocky Calmus** (1998-01).
- ▶ In its three home games, OU is averaging 579.7 yards of total offense and 415.3 passing yards. Quarterback **Baker Mayfield** is 69 for 96 through the air for a 71.9-percent completion rate and is averaging 396.7 passing yards and 3.3 passing TDs per game.
- ▶ OU is 4-2 all-time in overtime games. Under head coach **Bob Stoops** they are 3-2.
- ▶ The Sooners are looking for their 13th season of at least 10 wins under Stoops. Oklahoma is the only FBS program to rack up 12 seasons of double-digit victories since 2000.
- ▶ Oklahoma was ranked No. 19 in both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches top 25 preseason polls, its lowest ranking in both polls to start a year since its national championship season of 2000. OU started at No. 19 in both polls that year, as well.
- ▶ In the last five seasons, 27 Sooners have been taken in the NFL Draft (the Big 12 school with the next highest total is Baylor with 17). Those 27 picks are the fifth most of any school over the last five years. Only Alabama (37), Florida State (37), LSU (33) and Georgia (28) have had more.
- ▶ OU has had at least four players selected in every NFL Draft since 2008. LSU is the only other school that can make that claim.
- ▶ Fifteen Sooners have been taken in the NFL Draft first round in the last five years. No other Big 12 school has had more than nine in that same span.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project will bowl in the south end of the facility and is slated to be completed in time for the 2016 season.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998) and its existing figure of 82,112 (2003).
- In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

CURRENT RENOVATION

- The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project will be constructed entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- The first phase of the building project will be completed prior to the 2016 season and will focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect will result in completing the south end zone seating bowl, a feature that will initially increase seating capacity to more than 84,000 seats.
- The seating bowl will feature an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure will feature 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility will be a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They will each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- The new building will allow for all student-athlete services to be moved to the ground floor. That space will include a new locker room, strength and conditioning room, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building will house all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room will nearly triple in size to 26,600 square feet and include a 70-yard indoor turfed speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also will grow substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

WINNING LEGACY

- ▶ Bob Stoops is the winningest coach in Oklahoma history with a 172-45 overall record. He ranks third at OU with his .793 career winning percentage.
- ▶ Won more games in his first 16 years than any college coach.
- ▶ Reached 100 wins in 122 games (tied for ninth fastest all-time pace).
- ▶ Has led the Sooners to a school-record 16 consecutive bowl berths.
- ▶ Since he took over at OU in 1999, has coached Sooners to more wins than any other Power Five program has accumulated during that time span.
- ▶ Has directed the Sooners to the second highest winning percentage of any Power Five program since 1999, trailing only Ohio State.
- ▶ Is the only coach in the BCS era to win a national championship and every BCS bowl game (Fiesta, Orange, Rose, Sugar).
- ▶ Under his direction, Oklahoma is one of only nine Power Five programs to average 10 wins per year over the last five seasons.
- ▶ Has 12 seasons of 10 or more wins, the most of any FBS coach since 2000.
- ▶ Has led OU to a 51-26 record against AP Top 25 foes since 2000.
- ▶ Owns a 93-8 home record, which included a school-record 39-game winning streak (ninth longest in college football history) and two 19-game strings.
- ▶ The Sooners are a combined 22-11 under Stoops against their two biggest rivals (10-7 against Texas and a 12-4 vs. Oklahoma State).

CONFERENCE SUPREMACY

- ▶ Stoops has coached OU to eight Big 12 championships, more than twice as many as any other school (Texas is next with three).
- ▶ Owns a 54-16 overall mark the last five-plus years and a 33-13 league record, both of which are the best of any Big 12 team during that span.
- ▶ Has guided the Sooners to more wins against AP Top 25 teams than any Big 12 team over the last five years. OU is the only program in the conference to own a winning record in such games (16-11).

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

- ▶ Stoops has produced 34 first-team All-Americans, two AP Players of the Year and 78 NFL Draft picks as OU's head coach.
- ▶ Stoops has coached two Heisman Trophy winners (Jason White in 2003 and Sam Bradford in 2008) and five Heisman finalists.
- ▶ Under his guidance, OU became the first program to produce two players who claimed the Thorpe and Nagurski Awards in the same season (Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003).
- ▶ Two different Sooners have claimed the following honors since he took over at OU: Nagurski Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait), Thorpe Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait) and Butkus Award (Rocky Calmus, Teddy Lehman).
- ▶ At least one of his OU players has earned each one of these accolades: the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Walter Camp Award, Maxwell Award, Uinitas Award, Outland Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy and the Mosi Tatupu Award.

PLAYER CAPSULES

QUARTERBACKS

6 BAKER MAYFIELD (JR.)

- ▶ Averaging 318.6 passing yards per game (66.3% completion rate) and 26.6 rushing yards.
- ▶ Has accounted for 18 touchdowns (14 passing, 4 rushing) through first 5 games, 1 shy of OU record (Josh Heupel had 19 in 1999; 18 passing, 1 rushing).
- ▶ Was 14 for 25 for 320 yards passing with 3 touchdowns against a West Virginia defense (10/3) that entered the game allowing a Big 12-low 154.0 passing yards per game.
- ▶ Threw 3 or more TDs in each of the Sooners' first 4 games (1 against Texas).
- ▶ Has topped 300 yards passing in 3 of his 5 games as a Sooner.
- ▶ Amassed 572 yards of total offense vs. Tulsa (9/19) to set the OU single-game record. That total was the most by an FBS player this year and seventh most by a player in Big 12 history.
- ▶ Passed for a career-high 487 yards (fourth most in school history) and rushed for a career-high 85 yards against Tulsa to earn co-Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- ▶ Tied a career high with 4 TD passes against Tulsa and set a career high with 2 TD runs.
- ▶ His 226.60 passing efficiency against Tulsa stands as the highest mark ever by a Sooner with more than 30 attempts in a game.
- ▶ Against Tulsa, became one of 6 players in school history to account for 6 touchdowns in game. He joined Landry Jones (twice), Josh Heupel (twice), Quentin Griffin, Sam Bradford and Trevor Knight.
- ▶ Led a comeback from a 17-point deficit at Tennessee (9/12); recorded 3 passing TDs and added another on the ground, all in the 4th quarter and 2 overtime periods.
- ▶ Set the OU record for passing yards in a season opener with 388 against Akron (9/5/15).
- ▶ Became one of just 5 Sooners to throw for more than 300 yards in their OU debut, joining Blake Bell (2013), Sam Bradford (2007), Josh Heupel (1999) and Jason White.
- ▶ Named OU's starting quarterback on Aug. 24.
- ▶ Transferred from Texas Tech after 2013 season and sat out last year (lost a year of eligibility in the intraleague transfer).
- ▶ Played in 8 games (7 starts) for Texas Tech in 2013 as a freshman, completing 218 of 340 passes for 2,315 yards with 12 TDs and 9 INTs.
- ▶ Named the Big 12 Offensive Freshman of the Year in 2013 and an honorable mention freshman All-American by College Football News.
- ▶ Threw for 413 yards with 4 TDs, while adding a rushing score in his collegiate debut, a 41-23 victory at SMU (8/30/12). He was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week.

9 TREVOR KNIGHT (RS-JR.)

- ▶ Only action this season came in fourth quarter in opening 41-3 win over Akron.
- ▶ Owns an 11-4 record as OU's starter.
- ▶ In 18 career games, has thrown for 3,119 passing yards and 23 TDs and 4 300-yard games. Also has 784 rushing yards with 7 TDs and a receiving TD.
- ▶ Recorded career highs in rushing yards (146) and rushing TDs (3) on 16 carries and also added 3 passing TDs at ISU (11/1/14) in 2014, earning Big 12 Player of the Week honors.
- ▶ Named 2014 Sugar Bowl MVP vs. Alabama (1/2/14). Completed a Sugar Bowl-record 32 passes setting career highs with 348 yards and four TDs (1/2/14).
- ▶ His 4 passing TDs were an OU bowl record and tied the Sugar Bowl record.
- ▶ Fraternal twin brother, Connor, is a TE and long snapper for the Sooners.

14 CODY THOMAS (RS-SO.)

- ▶ Owns a 2-1 record as OU's starter (has not played this season).
- ▶ Helped OU to a 44-7 win over Kansas (11/22/14).
- ▶ Made first career start at Texas Tech (11/5/14), recording career highs in pass yards (133), completions (10), pass TDs (1), rush yards (103), rush attempts (8) and rush TDs (1).

RUNNING BACKS

32 SAMAJE PERINE (SO.)

- ▶ Averaging team-high 72.8 yards per game and has 3 rushing and 1 receiving TD.
- ▶ Rushed for 65 yards against West Virginia (10/3) to give him 2,041 for his career. Reached 2,000 yards on 326 carries, getting there in fewer attempts than any player in the Stoops era.
