OPENING KICK

- ▶ No. 3/3 Oklahoma begins its 122nd season of varsity football when it faces No. 15/13 Houston on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT in the AdvocaCare Texas Kickoff. The game will mark the start of OU's 18th season under head coach **Bob Stoops**.
- ▶ The Sooners are looking for their 14th season of at least 10 wins under Stoops. Oklahoma is the only FBS program to rack up 13 seasons of double-digit victories since 2000.
- ▶ Oklahoma is 93-22-6 all-time in season openers (15-2 under Stoops).
- ▶ OU has won five straight season openers, its longest streak since winning seven in a row from 1998 through 2004.
- ▶ The last time Oklahoma opened the season against a team ranked as highly as No. 15 came in 1986 when No. 1 OU beat No. 4 UCLA 38-3 in Norman.
- ▶ In games where both teams are ranked 15th or better, Oklahoma is 30-15 (.667) under Stoops, including 21-6 (.778) when it is the higher ranked team.
- ▶ This marks just the second time under Stoops that Oklahoma is opening the season against a ranked team. The other occasion was in 2009 when the No. 3 Sooners lost 14-13 to No. 20 BYU in Arlington, Texas. Sooners QB **Sam Bradford**, who won the Heisman Trophy the previous year, missed the second half with a shoulder injury.
- ▶ The Sooners are 49-6 (.891) in September under Stoops, outscoring teams by an average of 42 to 17. OU has won nine straight September games and 19 of its last 20 dating back to 2009.



Bob Stoops has won more games in his first 17 years as a head coach (179) than anyone in major college football history (see below). He has also won Big 12 championships more times (nine) than he has not.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- ▶ Oklahoma (11-2) and Houston (13-1) posted the best combined 2015 record (24-3) of any two teams that will meet in week one this season. The matchup will be the only one on opening weekend that features two teams ranked in the top 10 of last year's final AP poll (OU fifth, Houston eighth), and one of two between teams ranked in the top 15 of this year's preseason AP poll (No. 4 Florida State vs. No. 11 Ole Miss is the other).
- ▶ This is just the fourth time in its history that OU has opened the season at a neutral site, and the second under Stoops (2009 vs. BYU in Arlington, Texas). The only other such games came in 1896 when OU opened against Norman High (won 12-0) and in 1898 when OU opened against Arkansas City (won 5-0). Both games took place in Oklahoma City.
- ▶ Oklahoma has 42 Texans on its roster, including 10 from the surrounding Houston metro area: RB **Rodney Anderson** (Katy; Horn HS), RB **Najee Bissoon** (Humble; Summer Creek HS), QB **Reece Clark** (Cyprus; Cypress Woods HS), OL **Christian**

OU defensive line coach **Calvin Thibodeaux** also hails from Houston (Westbury HS) and was a defensive graduate assistant at Houston from 2008-09.

▶ A distinguished litany of Oklahoma Football alumni were products of the Houston area. The list of OU All-Americans who hailed from that area include the likes of RB **Greg Pruitt** (Houston; 1970-72), RB **Joe Washington** (Port Arthur; 1972-75), DE **Darrell Reed** (Cypress; 1984-87), DE **Cedric Jones** (Houston; 1992-95) and RB **Quentin Griffin** (Humble; 1999-2002).

▶ Oklahoma is 2-0 all-time against Houston, including 1-0 under head coach **Bob Stoops** and 1-0 at neutral sites. The teams first met in the 1981 Sun Bowl when OU won 40-14 in El Paso, Texas. The teams met again in Norman in September 2004 with OU winning 63-13 (more details below).

SOONERS AND NRG STADIUM

The last time the Sooners played in Houston was also the lone time they played at NRG Stadium (then named Reliant Stadium). In 2002, No. 8 OU beat 12th-ranked Colorado 29-7 in the Big 12 Championship Game, outgaining the Buffaloes 401 yards to 193 and registering 25 first downs to CU's nine. Quarterback **Nate Hybl** was 14 for 25 for 114 yards with two touchdown passes, while **Quentin Griffin** led OU's ground charge with 188 yards and two TDs on 29 carries (6.5 yards per rush). The victory propelled the Sooners to their lone Rose Bowl appearance, a game they won 34-14 over seventh-ranked Washington State.

SCOUTING HOUSTON

▶ Houston is in its second season under head coach **Tom Herman**. Winner of the 2014 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach while at Ohio State (Buckeyes' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach), Herman led the Cougars to a 13-1 record last season and to their first New Year's bowl game in 30 years. UH claimed the American Athletic Conference championship with a home win over No. 20 Temple in the league title game and then capped the year with a 38-24 win over No. 9 Florida State in the Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl.

▶ Houston returns 23 full or part-time starters from its 13-1 squad from a year ago that ranked in the top five nationally in average scoring margin (+19.7) and turnover margin (+21), including team leaders in scoring, total offense, rushing, passing, field goals, kick returns, sacks and forced fumbles.

▶ Houston ranked 10th in scoring offense last year (40.4 points per game) and 20th in scoring defense (20.7 points per game), making it the only team in the nation to be ranked in the top 10 in scoring offense and top 25 in scoring defense.

▶ The Cougars controlled the line of scrimmage last year, as evidenced by their 235.8 rushing yards per game (ranked 13th nationally) and opponents' 108.9 rushing yards per contest (eighth nationally).

▶ The 2015 Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award recipient, QB **Greg Ward Jr.** rushed for 1,108 yards and 21 touchdowns while also passing for 2,828 yards and 17 scores. He completed 67.2 percent of his passes and threw just six interceptions in 345 attempts.

▶ On defense, Houston will be led by OLB **Steven Taylor**, who logged 10 sacks a year ago to lead the AAC and rank fifth nationally among linebackers. He also recorded 18.5 tackles for loss, 92 total tackles and three interceptions.

SERIES WITH THE COUGARS

▶ Oklahoma has met Houston two times and came away with wins on both occasions. In the first meeting on Dec. 26, 1981, **Barry Switzer's** Sooners posted an easier-than-anticipated 40-14 Sun Bowl victory in El Paso, Texas. MVP **Darrell Shepard**, who began his career at Houston, scored two touchdowns against his former team. OU scored 30 fourth-quarter points to turn a close contest into a rout. Freshman **Fred Sims** rolled up 181 yards rushing in the game after running for 179 during the regular season.

▶ The second meeting — a 63-13 OU win — occurred in Norman on Sept. 11, 2004. **Jason White** threw for 257 yards and two touchdowns on 14-of-18 passing, while **Antonio Perkins** tied the NCAA record with his eighth career punt return for a score. Following a 3-yard touchdown run by Jackie Battle on Houston's opening drive, No. 2-ranked OU scored TDs on each of its first seven possessions to take a 49-7 halftime lead. **Adrian Peterson** ran for 117 yards and two scores on the day, while **Mark Clayton** caught five passes (all third-down conversions) for 122 yards and **Travis Wilson** added a pair of TD catches.

LOOKING BACK AT 2015

▶ Oklahoma finished the 2015 campaign with an 11-2 record, an outright Big 12 title (8-1 league mark) and a berth in the College Football Playoff (lost to No. 1-ranked Clemson as the No. 4 seed after holding a halftime lead). The 11 wins tied as OU's most in the last five years and resulted in a No. 5 ranking in the final AP poll.

▶ The Sooners led the country in average scoring margin (+21.5) and boasted the second-best combined ranking (32) in scoring offense and scoring defense among Power 5 teams. They finished the year ranked No. 4 in scoring offense (43.5 ppg) and No. 28 in scoring defense (22.0 ppg). Ohio State had a combined ranking of 30 (No. 28 in scoring offense, No. 2 in scoring defense) to lead Power 5 programs.

▶ Oklahoma is the highest scoring football program of all-time, and only two Sooner teams ever averaged more points than their 43.5 per game last season. OU accounted for more than 500 yards of offense in each of the final seven regular season games, and three of the top five single-game yardage totals of the 17-year **Bob Stoops** era were recorded last year (including the top figure of 773 vs. Tulsa).

▶ In the season's first six games, Oklahoma averaged 158.8 rushing yards on 3.8 yards per carry. Over the last six regular season outings, the Sooners averaged 311.2 rushing yards on 6.4 yards per attempt (most per carry in the nation during the stretch).

Meanwhile, OU allowed only 128.8 rushing yards (3.5 yards per carry) over those final six games.

► The Sooners held eight of their nine Big 12 opponents to yardage totals below what they were averaging at the time of competition against OU. The nine league opponents combined to average 491 yards as they prepared to face the Sooners, but averaged a combined 347 yards (-144) against OU.

► Over the last seven games of the regular season (all wins), OU outscored its opponents by 228 points (an average of 32.6) and outgained them by an average of 251.8 yards.

► Oklahoma led the Big 12 with nine first-team all-conference selections (five offensive and four defensive) and landed six more on the second team. Three more were honorable mention All-Big 12 picks. Stoops was named Big 12 Coach of the Year for the fifth time, quarterback **Baker Mayfield** was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year and wide receiver **Dede Westbrook** was named Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year.

► Mayfield (Burlsworth Trophy) and center **Ty Darlington** (William V. Campbell Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy and Bobby Bowden Award) were national award winners. First-year OU offensive coordinator **Lincoln Riley** was named the Broyles Award winner.

WELCOME BACK

► Not including specialists, the Sooners return 13 players who started at least five games last year (seven on offense, six on defense). Eleven other position players who started at least one game a year ago are also back. OU returns its placekicker, punter and both long snappers, as well.

► OU returns its statistical leaders in passing yards (**Baker Mayfield**), rushing yards (**Samaje Perine**), total offense (Mayfield), all-purpose yards (Perine) and scoring (**Austin Seibert**). Four of the program's top five rushers are back in the fold (including the top three), as are 13 of the 17 players who caught at least one pass last year.

PREVIEWING OU'S OFFENSE

► Oklahoma welcomes back the bulk of its offensive statistical production from 2015, returning 92.1 percent of its total offense, 92.4 percent of its passing yards, 91.7 percent of its rushing yards, 53.6 percent of its receiving yards and 81.3 percent of its scoring. The offense is under the direction of second-year coordinator **Lincoln Riley**, winner of the 2015 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach.

► Redshirt-junior **Baker Mayfield** is back under center after a stellar first season in Norman. The Texas Tech transfer finished fourth in Heisman Trophy voting and was named national player of the year by Sporting News after completing 68.1 percent of his passes for 3,700 yards and 36 touchdowns against only seven interceptions. He ranked third nationally in passing efficiency rating (173.3), third in yards per pass attempt (9.37), fourth in completion percentage, sixth in points responsible for (258) and sixth in passing TDs.

► Two-time All-Big 12 First Team performer **Samaje Perine** headlines a rushing attack that returns 31 of OU's 32 touchdowns on the ground from 2015. Now a junior, Perine ran for 1,349 yards (103.8 per game) and a Big 12-high 16 scores last year. His nifty 6.0 yards per carry weren't even tops on the team. That honor went to **Joe Mixon**, who rushed for 6.7 yards per attempt. Mixon, a sophomore this year, netted 753 rushing yards (57.9 per game), ran for seven TDs and caught four more. Mayfield was no slouch with his legs, either, totaling 405 rushing yards (31.2 per contest) and seven scores on the year. Senior **Daniel Brooks** (150 yards; 5.4 per carry) also returns. Redshirt freshman **Rodney Anderson**, who missed the final 11 games last year due to a leg injury, was recently ruled out for the 2016 season with a neck injury.

► OU has to replace two of its top three receivers in **Sterling Shepard**, an ESPN first-team All-American last year, and **Durron Neal**. Shepard finished his career ranked second in OU history in receptions (233) and receiving yards (3,482), and third in touchdown receptions (26) and 100-yard receiving games (12). Last year he led the Sooners with 86 catches for 1,288 yards (99.1 per game) and 11 touchdowns. Neal ranked third on the squad with 44 catches and 559 yards (43.0 per game). Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year **Dede Westbrook** is the prime candidate to step into the leading role in 2016, ranking second on the team last year in receptions (46) and yards (743; 57.2 average). Now a senior, he caught four touchdown passes. Sophomore **Mark Andrews** is also expected to be targeted more often after a strong opening year that saw him score seven TDs on his 19 receptions.

► The Sooners return three of their starting offensive linemen from last year, but the two they lost (**Ty Darlington** and **Nila Kasitati**) earned All-Big 12 First Team honors last season. **Orlando Brown** (Sporting News freshman All-American; 13 starts) and **Dru Samia** (nine starts), both freshmen last year, were the starters at left and right tackle, respectively. Also back is junior **Jonathan Alvarez**, who started 10 games (nine at left guard) and has moved to center.

PREVIEWING OU'S DEFENSE

► OU has more to replace on defense than it does on offense, returning 55.5 percent of its tackle production, 43.9 percent of its tackles for loss, 47.5 percent of its sacks, 50.0 percent of its interceptions and 57.1 percent of its fumble recoveries. Under the tutelage of coordinator **Mike Stoops**, last year's unit led the Big 12 in total defense (364.5 ypg), scoring defense (22.0 ppg), passing defense (202.8 ypg), pass efficiency defense (108.5) and sacks (3.08 per game). OU also finished second in the league in rushing defense (161.7 ypg) and interceptions (1.5 per game).

► Four of the five starters gone from last year earned All-Big 12 First Team honors (LB **Dominique Alexander**, CB **Zack Sanchez**, LB **Eric Striker** and DE **Charles Tapper**). Three of OU's returning defensive starters earned All-Big 12 Second Team acclaim (senior LB **Jordan Evans**, senior S **Ahmad Thomas** and junior CB **Jordan Thomas**).

► OU took its biggest hit at linebacker with the departures of Alexander (team-high 103 tackles), Striker (67 tackles, team highs of 19.0 tackles for loss and 7.5 sacks) and **Devante Bond** (43 tackles, 7.0 tackles for loss).

► Evans is OU's top returnee in tackles (ranked second on team with 83), while Ahmad Thomas (75) and junior S **Steven Parker** (60) ranked third and fifth on the squad. Jordan Thomas registered five interceptions last year to lead returning players, and junior DL **Charles Walker** recorded 10.0 tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks to pace the returnees.

PREVIEWING OU'S SPECIAL TEAMS

► **Austin Seibert** locked up both the kicking and punting duties a year ago as true freshman and was rock solid for OU in both roles. He punted 57 times for an average of 42.0 yards, with 11 going longer than 50 yards, to earn All-Big 12 Second Team honors. Seibert was an expert in hang time and placement, as he forced 30 fair catches and had 23 punts downed inside the 20-yard line. OU led the nation by allowing just 1.1 yards per punt return on the season. As a placekicker, he made 18 of 23 field goal attempts and 70 of 72 PATs. Seibert could also add kickoffs to his list of duties after the graduation of **Nick Hodgson**.

► Oklahoma must replace one of its best kick returners in program history with the departure of **Alex Ross** to Missouri as a graduate transfer. Ross was a second-team All-American two years ago when he averaged 31.2 yards per return and scored two touchdowns. He had a key 90-yard return in OU's Big 12-title-clinching win at Oklahoma State last season. Favorites to occupy that role include running backs **Joe Mixon** and **Daniel Brooks**. Both are explosive athletes who can make game-changing plays in the return game, but are also veterans who can be trusted to secure the football.

► The Sooners' punt return position is also up for grabs with the graduation of **Sterling Shepard**. Shepard was responsible for 19 of the team's 22 returns last year. Mixon and **Jarvis Baxter** each logged one return last season and are the leading candidates to assume the role on a more full-time basis in 2016.

THIBODEAUX HIRED AS DEFENSIVE LINE COACH

Bob Stoops looked to one of his former players to fill a vacant defensive line coach position last winter. He hired former OU All-Big 12 defensive end **Calvin Thibodeaux** on Feb. 24, replacing Diron Reynolds.

Thibodeaux (pronounced TIB-uh-doe) returns to OU after serving the last five seasons as an assistant coach at Kansas (2015; defensive line), Tulsa (2012-14; defensive tackles) and Dartmouth (2011; defensive line). He was also the defensive line coach at Navarro Junior College in 2010 and served as a defensive graduate assistant at Houston during the 2008 and '09 seasons.

Thibodeaux played at OU from the 2002 through 2006 seasons, helping the Sooners win three Big 12 championships and make appearances in the Rose, Sugar (BCS Championship), Orange (BCS Championship), Holiday and Fiesta Bowls, respectively. He was limited to five games due to injury in 2004 and received a medical hardship. He finished his OU career with 90 tackles, 28.5 tackles for loss and 13.0 sacks. He was a second-team All-Big 12 pick in 2005, logging 44 tackles, 17 tackles for loss and a league-high 10.0 sacks, sixth most in school history.

"It's a dream come true," said Thibodeaux of returning to OU. "To have this opportunity is special. It's home, I know the culture, I know what the expectations are. It's truly a blessing."

BEDENBAUGH, COOKS PROMOTED

Assistant coaches **Bill Bedenbaugh** and **Kerry Cooks** were promoted to assistant coordinator positions by head coach **Bob Stoops** in July. Bedenbaugh (pronounced BEE-din-bo) is now assistant offensive coordinator and offensive line coach, while Cooks is now assistant defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach. Stoops said the title changes will not affect the Sooners' play-calling responsibilities of associate head coach and defensive coordinator **Mike Stoops** and offensive coordinator **Lincoln Riley**.

"Bill and Kerry have done an excellent job helping develop our offense and defense," said Stoops. "I wanted to recognize their significant contributions and help facilitate their advancement in this profession. They are deserving."

PERINE ON PACE TO SHATTER OU CAREER RUSHING RECORD

► After a stellar season that saw a continuation of his bruising, powerful style, RB **Samaje Perine** picked up third-team All-America honors last year and was selected to the All-Big 12 First Team. The Pflugerville, Texas, product racked up 1,713 rushing yards as a freshman (6.5 per carry) and 1,349 more as a sophomore last season (6.0 per carry), to give him 3,062 for his career. That means Perine already ranks 10th in Oklahoma history with 3,062 career rushing yards and is just 1,056 yards shy of **Billy Sims'** school record of 4,118 yards.

► Perine's 1,713 net rushing yards in 2014 were sixth most by a freshman in FBS history and second most in Big 12 and OU freshman annals, behind **Adrian Peterson's** 1,925 yards in 2004. Perine's total was fifth highest in a season in OU history, and he became the first freshman lead the Big 12 in rushing yards per game (131.8). Against Kansas that season, Perine amassed an

FBS-record 427 rushing yards and five touchdowns on 34 carries. The record still stands.

► Only six Sooners during the 17-year **Bob Stoops** era have rushed for 2,000 career yards and only four have gotten to 3,000, and Perine reached both benchmarks faster than any of them. He reached the 2,000-yard mark Oct. 3 last year against West Virginia in only 326 career carries, faster than current NFL stars **DeMarco Murray** (342) and Peterson (365). He got to 3,000 yards Nov. 28 at Oklahoma State on his 472nd carry, bettering Peterson's mark of 550 carries. For his career, Perine is averaging a stout 6.3 yards per rush.

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

► Oklahoma's performance in the Big 12 Conference since **Bob Stoops** took over as head coach in 1999 has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won nine Big 12 titles in Stoops' 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed nine league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

► OU owns a league-best 112-29 (.794) record in regular season Big 12 games during the Stoops era. Texas ranks second with a 101-40 (.716) record and is followed by TCU (21-15; .583), Kansas State (78-63; .553), Oklahoma State (76-65; .539), Texas Tech (71-70; .504), West Virginia (15-21; .417), Baylor (47-94; .333), Iowa State (41-100; .291) and Kansas (32-109; .227).

OU NO. 2 IN AP'S ALL-TIME RANKING

► The Associated Press unveiled its all-time top-25 on Aug. 2 and the Sooners were slotted in the No. 2 spot behind Ohio State. According to the AP, its formula for determining its all-time ranking counted poll appearances (one point) to mark consistency, No. 1 rankings (one point) to acknowledge elite programs, and gave a bonus for AP championships (10 points). Ohio State, which has five national titles, accumulated 1,112 points while Oklahoma, which has won seven national championships, racked up 1,055 points. Joining the Sooners and Buckeyes in the top 10 were Notre Dame (1,042 points), Alabama (933), Southern California (974), Nebraska (901), Michigan (894), Texas (822), Florida State (714) and Florida (674).

► Oklahoma hosts Ohio State on Sept. 17. It will mark the third meeting between the programs and first since 1983.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (617) and a better winning percentage (.762) than any other program.

► OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 33,913 points (in 1,233 games).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 36. In addition, OU's 22 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since **Bob Stoops'** arrival in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (179) and points scored (8,341).

► Only Ohio State (105) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101). OU's 391 weeks in the AP's top five are more than any other school. The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.

► Only Alabama (9) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

► The Sooners are 3-3-1 all-time in the city of Houston. Wins came against Rice in 1938 (7-6) and 1979 (63-21), and versus Colorado in 2002 (29-7 in Big 12 Championship Game). Losses came against Texas A&M in 1912 (28-6), Texas in 1913 (14-6) and SMU in 1968 (28-27 in Bluebonnet Bowl). OU and Alabama tied in the 1970 Bluebonnet Bowl (24-24).

► Saturday's game will feature the past two Broyles Award (nation's top assistant coach) winners in OU offensive coordinator **Lincoln Riley** and Houston head coach **Tom Herman**. Riley won the honor last year and Herman in 2014 while offensive coordinator at Ohio State.

► **James** and **Gina Mayfield**, the parents of Oklahoma QB **Baker Mayfield**, are University of Houston graduates. James was on the football team (1966-69) as a quarterback and punter.

► OU is 64-10-2 (.855) all-time as the No. 3 team in the AP poll, including 13-7 (.650) under **Bob Stoops**.

► Oklahoma is 132-76-5 (.631) all-time in AP Top-25 matchups, including 50-23 (.685) under Stoops. When OU is the higher ranked team in such matchups, the Sooners are 99-37-3 (.723) all-time and 39-12 (.765) under Stoops.

► The Sooners are 106-93 (.533) all-time vs. top-15 teams, and 35-18 (.717) under Stoops. They are 5-6 (.455) all-time specifically vs. the No. 15 team.

► In the 17-year **Bob Stoops** era, no team has more AP top-five appearances than Oklahoma's 122. Alabama (114) is next and is followed by Ohio State (98), USC (86) and Florida (82) and Texas (82).

► Last year's Sooners posted the No. 1, No. 3 and No. 5 yardage totals of the Stoops era (773 vs. Tulsa, 710 at Kansas and 684 vs. Iowa State).

► Oklahoma racked up more than 500 yards of offense in each of the last seven regular season games last year. In fact, the Sooners surpassed the 600-yard mark in three consecutive games (vs. Texas Tech, at Kansas, vs. Iowa State) for only the third time in the program's storied history (first time since 1971).

► Oklahoma is 4-2 all-time in overtime games. Under Stoops it is 3-2.

► In the last six seasons, 31 Sooners have been taken in the NFL Draft (the Big 12 school with the next highest total is Baylor with 23). Those 31 picks are the eighth most of any school over the last six years. Only Alabama (44), Florida State (39), LSU (38), Ohio State (35), Clemson (33), Florida (33) and Georgia (33) have had more.

► OU has had at least four players selected in every NFL Draft since 2008. LSU is the only other school that can make that claim.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and improved the .

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).
- In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

CURRENT RENOVATION

- The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project is being carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- The first phase of the building project will be completed prior to next week's home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They will each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- The new building will allow for all student-athlete services to be moved to the ground floor. That space, to be completed in spring 2017, will include a new locker room, strength and conditioning room, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building will house all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room will nearly triple in size to 26,600 square feet and include a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also will grow substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

- ▶ Under his direction, Oklahoma is one of only five Power Five programs to average 10 wins per year over the last 10 seasons.
- ▶ Has 13 seasons of 10 or more wins, the most of any FBS coach since 2000.
- ▶ Oklahoma is 55-28 (.663) vs. AP Top 25 teams in the Stoops era. The win percentage is the best in the country during the span.
- ▶ In the Stoops era, no program has more AP top-five appearances than OU's 122. Alabama (114) is next, followed by Ohio State (99), USC (86) and Florida (82) and Texas (82).
- ▶ Owns a 96-8 home record, which included a school-record 39-game winning streak (ninth longest in college football history) and two 19-game strings.
- ▶ OU is a combined 23-11 under Stoops against their two biggest rivals (13-4 vs. Oklahoma State and 10-7 against Texas).

CONFERENCE SUPREMACY

- ▶ Stoops has coached OU to nine Big 12 championships. No other program has won more than two Big 12 titles in his 17 seasons.
- ▶ Owns a 61-17 overall mark the last six years and a 40-13 league record, both of which are the best of any Big 12 team during that span.
- ▶ Has guided the Sooners to more wins against AP Top 25 teams than any Big 12 program since 2010. OU is the only program in the conference with a winning record in such games (19-12).

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

- ▶ Stoops has produced 36 first-team All-Americans, two AP Players of the Year and 79 NFL Draft picks as OU's head coach.
- ▶ Stoops has coached two Heisman Trophy winners (Jason White in 2003 and Sam Bradford in 2008) and five Heisman finalists.
- ▶ Two different Sooners have claimed the following honors since he took over at OU: Nagurski Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait), Thorpe Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait) and Butkus Award (Rocky Calmus, Teddy Lehman).
- ▶ At least one of his OU players has earned each one of these accolades: the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Walter Camp Award, Maxwell Award, Unitas Award, Outland Trophy, Burlsworth Trophy, Campbell Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy and the Mosi Tatupu Award.
