## OPENING KICK

► No. 7/5 Oklahoma begins its 124th season of varsity football, and second under head coach **Lincoln Riley**, when it hosts Florida Atlantic on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The game will be televised nationally by FOX with **Gus Johnson**, **Joel Klatt** and **Jenny Taft** announcing.

► Saturday's game will mark the first-ever meeting between OU and FAU.

► Oklahoma is 94-23-6 all-time in season openers and 76-15-4 in home openers at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, which opened in 1923. OU has won 12 straight home openers (last such loss was a 17-10 defeat vs. TCU in 2005).

► The Sooners are 23-2 all-time as the No. 7 team in the AP poll and have won their last seven games when holding that ranking. The last time OU was ranked No. 7 in the AP poll was for the 2017 opener against UTEP (a 56-7 victory). Its two losses as the No. 7 team came to No. 9 Boise State (43-42 in OT) in the 2007 Fiesta Bowl and to unranked TCU (17-10 in Norman) in the 2005 opener.

► Oklahoma is looking to register its 16th season of at least 10 wins since the start of the 2000 campaign. The Sooners are the only FBS program to rack up 15 seasons of double-digit victories since 2000. OU also leads all FBS programs with its 38 all-time 10-plus-win seasons.

► OU is coming off a 12-2 season in which it won its third straight Big 12 championship and made its second College Football Playoff appearance in the last three years. The Sooners, who finished No. 3 in the final AP and coaches' polls, became the first program to ever produce three unanimous All-Americans on offense in one season (tight end **Mark Andrews**, offensive lineman **Orlando Brown** and quarterback **Baker Mayfield**). Defensive end/linebacker **Ogbonnia Okoronkwo** was also a first-team All-American by the Walter Camp Football Foundation.

► After starting the 2017 season 1-3, Florida Atlantic won its last 10 games and claimed the Conference USA title with an 8-0 league mark. The Owls, who own the nation's second-longest active winning streak, beat Akron 50-3 in the Boca Raton Bowl.

► OU is the only program to win three straight Big 12 titles, and has done so twice (2006-08 and 2015-17). The last FBS program to win four straight outright league titles was Florida (1993-96).

► The Sooners have scored at least 30 points in 23 of their last 24 games (29 in the other). They have won 22 of those 24.



Lincoln Riley set the record for wins by an Oklahoma rookie head coach last season by leading the Sooners to a 12-2 mark. OU won its third straight Big 12 title and advanced to its second College Football Playoff appearance since he arrived in 2015 as the program's offensive coordinator.

**FIVE KEY STORYLINES**

► Saturday's game will mark the first for Oklahoma since 2014 without **Baker Mayfield** as its quarterback. Over the last three seasons with Mayfield under center, the Sooners have gone 34-6 (.850), won three Big 12 titles and made two College Football Playoff appearances. Mayfield finished fourth in Heisman Trophy voting in 2015, third in 2016 and became OU's sixth Heisman winner in 2017 before becoming the No. 1 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft. Redshirt junior **Kyler Murray** will replace Mayfield for the season opener. The game will actually mark Murray's second start for the Sooners, as he got the nod in OU's home finale against West Virginia last season when Mayfield was suspended for the opening series.

► Oklahoma is 21-0 all-time against teams currently in Conference USA. It owns 7-0 marks against North Texas and Rice and a 4-0 record against UTEP. OU has also registered wins over Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee and UAB.

► Oklahoma has won more Big 12 championships over the last 19 years (11) than it has lost home games. OU is 106-10 (.914) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season, with all 116 of those games sellouts. It is the best home winning percentage among Power Five schools over the last 19 seasons (Ohio State is next at .881). OU has outscored its opponents by an average of 42-16 in those games.

► **Shane Beamer** will make his Oklahoma coaching debut Saturday after joining the OU staff in January. The Sooners' assistant head coach for offense is in charge of the team's tight ends and H-backs, and is also assisting with special teams. The son of former Murray State and Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer, he was Georgia's special teams coordinator and tight ends coach the last two seasons. He's also coached at Virginia Tech, South Carolina and Mississippi State, and was a graduate assistant at Tennessee and Georgia Tech. Also working his first game as a Sooner will be defensive specialist **Bob Diaco**, who arrived at OU in March after serving as defensive coordinator at Nebraska last year. Diaco was head coach at Connecticut (2014-16) and defensive coordinator at Notre Dame (2010-13) and Cincinnati (2009).

► Saturday's game will mark the first of five OU games in the month of September. The Sooners have played five September games in only one other season – 2007 (went 4-1). This year also marks just the third in school history in which OU has four September home games on its schedule (1995 [3-1] and 2000 [4-0]).

**SCOUTING FLORIDA ATLANTIC**

► Florida Atlantic is led by second-year head coach **Lane Kiffin**, who guided the Owls to an 11-3 record, the Conference USA championship and a victory in the Boca Raton Bowl in 2017. He has compiled a 46-24 mark and is in his seventh season as a collegiate head coach.

► The Owls, who received votes in both the 2018 preseason AP (No. 30 overall) and coaches (No. 33) polls, won their first C-USA Championship in 2017 with a perfect 8-0 league record, followed by a 41-17 defeat of North Texas in the championship game. Eight players earned all-conference honors, including seven on the first team.

► FAU returns 11 starters on offense and five on defense, including the preseason C-USA Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in junior running back **Devin Singletary** and senior linebacker **Azeez Al-Shaair**. The Owls were picked by the league's head coaches to repeat as C-USA East Division Champs in 2018.

► Singletary, a third-team Associated Press All-American in 2017 and the C-USA MVP, rushed for 1,920 yards and 32 touchdowns and caught 19 passes for 198 yards and a score. He led the nation in scoring as well as in rushing and total touchdowns last year. Al-Shaair paced the Owls with 147 total tackles last year, including 11.0 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks. He ranked fifth in the country in total tackles.

► Singletary and Al-Shaair are joined on the Preseason All-Conference USA Team by senior offensive lineman **Reggie Bain**, junior tight end **Harrison Bryant** and senior defensive backs **Jalen Young** and **Shelton Lewis**. Bain caught 32 passes for 408 yards and five touchdowns in 2017. Young totaled 77 tackles and had seven interceptions last year while Lewis finished with 47 stops, four interceptions and eight pass breakups. Sophomore receiver **Willie Wright** led the Owls with 56 catches for 657 yards and six touchdowns in 2017.

► FAU began playing football in 2001 under then-head coach **Howard Schnellenberger**, who went 5-5-1 in 1995 in his only season as Oklahoma's head coach. The Owls posted a 58-74 record in seven seasons under Schnellenberger. The Owls own an 87-119 (.422) all-time record.

**WELCOME BACK**

► Oklahoma returns 12 players (not including specialists) who started at least five games last year (six on each side of the ball). Eleven of those 12 started at least seven games and 10 started at least eight contests. OU also welcomes back **Austin Seibert**, who handled all of the Sooners' place-kicking, punting and kickoff duties the last two seasons, and was OU's punter and place-kicker in 2015 as a freshman.

► The six returning offensive starters are redshirt junior running back **Rodney Anderson** (started last seven games), junior receiver **Marquise "Hollywood" Brown** (eight starts), redshirt junior tackle **Bobby Evans** (14 starts), sophomore receiver **CeeDee Lamb** (13 starts) and senior guards **Ben Powers** and **Dru Samia** (12 starts each).

► Returning defensive starters are junior defensive end **Amani Bledsoe** (started eight games, including last six), junior linebacker **Caleb Kelly** (13 starts), junior cornerback **Parnell Motley** (13 starts), sophomore linebacker **Kenneth Murray** (14 starts), sophomore cornerback **Tre Norwood** (started last five games) and redshirt junior defensive tackle **Marquise Overton** (made nine starts, including the last seven games).

**YARDS-PER-PLAY LEADERS**

OU led the nation with its 8.3 yards per play last year (the previous single-season school record was 7.6 in 1971). That was the second-highest figure in FBS history. The Sooners averaged at least 6.6 yards per play in every game last year and at least 9.0 yards per play in five outings. OU's 12.0 yards per play vs. West Virginia set a program record.

**LEAGUE-HIGH SEVEN SOONERS ON PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12 TEAM**

► A league-high seven OU players, representing eight spots, were named to the 2018 Preseason All-Big 12 Football Team that was announced in July and chosen by media representatives who cover the league.

► The Sooners' eight overall selections were three more than the team with the next most (West Virginia). OU also boasted six offensive picks, twice as many the Mountaineers, who had the second most.

► With 1,161 yards on the ground last year, redshirt junior running back **Rodney Anderson** is the Big 12's second-leading returning rusher. In his first full season, the 2017 second-team All-Big 12 selection started OU's final seven games and led the Sooners with 18 total touchdowns on the year. Beginning with OU's Oct. 21 game at Kansas State, he led all Power Five players the rest of the year (eight games) with 1,333 yards from scrimmage (166.6 average) and 16 total TDs. He found the end zone four times on two occasions (vs. TCU and West Virginia) and concluded the season with a 201-yard rushing effort and two TDs against Georgia in the College Football Playoff at the Rose Bowl.

► Junior receiver **Marquise Brown** burst onto the scene in 2017 following one year of junior college. The blazing-fast wideout started eight of his 13 games last year and caught 57 passes for a team-high 1,095 yards (eighth most in single-season school history) and seven touchdowns to earn honorable mention All-Big 12 honors. Brown set the school record for receiving yards in a game when he caught nine passes for 265 yards (29.4 average) and two scores in a win at Oklahoma State. In July, NFL.com listed Brown as the No. 1 college wide receiver to watch.

► **Grant Calcaterra** played behind unanimous All-American and Mackey Award winner Mark Andrews last season, but still made a mark as a true freshman. The athletic tight end saw action in all 14 games and made 10 catches for 162 yards (16.2 average), three of them for touchdowns.

► A two-time honorable mention All-Big 12 selection, redshirt junior **Bobby Evans** has played in 26 games at right tackle the last two seasons and started all of those. He is a strong contender to replace unanimous All-American **Orlando Brown** at left tackle in 2018.

► Senior **Ben Powers** earned second-team All-Big 12 honors from the AP in 2016 and from the league's head coaches in 2017. He has played in 25 games at left and right guard the last two seasons (primarily left guard), and has made 22 starts.

► **Austin Seibert** made the preseason all-league team as both a kicker and punter. The senior, who needs just 90 points to become OU's all-time leading scorer (and 133 points to tie the all-time FBS scoring record among kickers [he scored 132 last year]), was a second-team All-Big 12 pick as a kicker last year after making 17 of his 21 field goal attempts (81.0 percent) and all 81 of his PATs. Included was a stretch of 12 consecutive field goal makes from Oct. 14 to Dec. 2. As a punter, he earned honorable mention all-conference acclaim last season and second-team honors in 2015. Seibert ranks first in OU history in career PATs made (223), third in career scoring (361) and PAT percentage (.982), fourth in career field goal percentage (.767) and fifth in career field goals made (46) and career punting average (41.8).

► Freshman **Brendan Radley-Hiles** was named Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year. An early enrollee who went through OU spring practice, he was a U.S. Army All-American as a senior last year at IMG Academy, earned five-star status by Rivals and was its No. 17 overall recruit and No. 2 cornerback. He intercepted five passes last season and forced two fumbles.

**MURRAY GETS THE CALL AT QB**

► After a competitive battle during August camp, head coach **Lincoln Riley** announced last Wednesday that redshirt junior **Kyler Murray** will be OU's starting quarterback for the season opener against Florida Atlantic and that redshirt sophomore **Austin Kendall** will be his backup.

► A 5-10, 195-pounder from Allen, Texas, Murray was the backup last season to **Baker Mayfield**, who won OU's sixth Heisman Trophy as the Sooners claimed their third straight Big 12 title and made the College Football Playoff for the second time in three years.

► Amazingly, Murray was more efficient as a passer last season than was Mayfield — the man who holds the top two single-season passing efficiency ratings in major college football history. Murray completed 18 of his 21 throws for 359 yards and three touchdowns without an interception in seven games in 2017. He boasted an eye-popping 276.5 efficiency rating to Mayfield's record-setting 198.9 mark, but didn't have near enough pass attempts to qualify in the category.

► Murray also ran 14 times for 142 yards (10.1 average). Included was a 66-yard dash on the first play of the game against West Virginia in OU's home finale.

► Murray started his collegiate career at Texas A&M, where he played in eight games and made three starts in 2015. He was a consensus five-star recruit out of Allen High School and was named 2014 national high school player of the year by *Parade*, *Gatorade*, *MaxPreps* and *USA Today*. Murray went 43-0 as a high school starter and earned state titles each of his last three years.

► Also a standout on the diamond, Murray played center field for **Skip Johnson's** OU baseball team and was a first-round pick (No. 9 overall) by the Oakland A's in June's Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. He was the only Big 12 player picked in the first round of the 2018 draft and he signed in mid-June. Murray hit .296 with 10 home runs, 13 doubles, 47 RBIs and 10 stolen bases in 51 games (50 starts). He finished the year with a slash line of .296/.398/.556.

**RECAPPING A MEMORABLE 2017**

► **Lincoln Riley's** debut year as Oklahoma head coach was a banner one, as the Sooners posted a 12-2 record, went 8-1 in Big 12 play, won a third straight conference title (beat TCU 41-17 in the Big 12 Championship Game), qualified for their second College Football Playoff in three years (were the No. 2 seed), finished No. 3 in both major national polls, set multiple school offensive records and produced four first-team All-Americans in tight end **Mark Andrews** (unanimous), offensive tackle **Orlando Brown** (unanimous), quarterback **Baker Mayfield** (unanimous) and defensive end/linebacker **Ogbonnia Okoronkwo**. Mayfield, in a landslide vote, also became OU's sixth Heisman Trophy winner and was the No. 1 overall pick in the NFL Draft by the Cleveland Browns.

Here are some more 2017 accomplishments:

► Oklahoma set single-season school records for total offense (579.6 ypg; led FBS), yards per play (8.3; second all-time in FBS), passing yards per game (361.8), passing efficiency rating (202.7; FBS record) and completion percentage (.714; led FBS), and led the FBS in first downs (361). OU also ranked third nationally in scoring offense (45.1 ppg) and passing offense (361.8 ypg), and paced the Big 12 in rushing offense (217.8 ypg).

► The Sooners' 12 wins were tied for the second most in program history.

► OU became the first school to ever produce three unanimous offensive All-Americans in one season (Andrews, Brown and Mayfield).

► In addition to delivering OU's sixth Heisman Trophy to Norman, Mayfield won the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award. He was also named the AP and Sporting News Player of the Year. Andrews won OU's first Mackey Award.

► Joining Mayfield as NFL Draft picks were Brown (third round, 83rd overall to Baltimore), Andrews (third round, 86th overall to Baltimore) and Okoronkwo (fifth round, 160th overall to Los Angeles Rams). OU and LSU are the only programs with at least four players selected in each of the last 11 NFL Drafts.

► The Sooners led the league with six first-team All-Big 12 selections, and four OU players earned individual all-league awards. Mayfield was Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, Brown was Big 12 Offensive Lineman of the Year, Okoronkwo was Co-Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and **Kenneth Murray** was Co-Big 12 Defensive Freshman of the Year.

► Murray was named a freshman All-American by the Football Writers Association of America and USA Today, while **CeeDee Lamb** picked up the same honor from ESPN.

► Co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach **Bill Bedenbaugh** was one of five finalists for the Frank Broyles Award (presented to the nation's best assistant coach).

**RILEY'S FAST START**

► The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, **Lincoln Riley** became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. The previous record for wins by a first-year OU head coach was 10 by **Chuck Fairbanks** in 1967 and **Barry Switzer** in 1973. Switzer holds the Sooners' record for most wins in his first two seasons as head coach (21 in 1973-74). Riley, who turns 35 on Sept. 5, needs nine wins in 2018 to tie the mark. He is the second-youngest FBS head coach entering this season.

**OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY**

► Oklahoma has a legitimate claim as the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley called plays as the program's offensive coordinator and continues to as head coach.

► The Sooners have posted a 34-6 (.850) record since Riley's OU debut (25-2 in Big 12 play). That record is fourth best in the country since the start of 2015. Only Alabama (41-3), Clemson (40-4) and Ohio State (35-5) have better records during that span.

► Since the start of the 2015 season, OU ranks first nationally in passing efficiency rating (187.7; next closest is 163.7), completion percentage (69.4), points per game (44.2) and total offense (555.5) and is sixth in passing offense (330.1; fifth in Power Five) and 18th in rushing offense (225.4; ninth in Power 5).

► In 40 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 29 times, including in 19 of the last 24 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 14 occasions and gone over 700 yards four times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 35 of 40 games during the Riley regime, at least 40 points 26 times, at least 50 points 15 times and at least 60 points five times.

► Four of OU's top five single-game total offense yardage figures since 2000, and six of the top nine have come over the last 38 games (1,854 at Texas Tech in 2016; 2,785 at Oklahoma State in 2017; 3,773 vs. Tulsa in 2015; 5,710 at Kansas in 2015; 7,684 vs. Iowa State in 2015; 9,676 vs. UTEP in 2017).

**ANOTHER STRONG NON-CONFERENCE SLATE**

► The Sooners' 2018 non-conference schedule figures to be a challenging one despite the fact that all three games will be played in Norman. Florida Atlantic (11-3), UCLA (6-7) and Army (10-3) combined for a 27-13 (.675) record last season, and all three played in a bowl game (Florida Atlantic and Army won).

**IRON SHARPENS IRON**

► UCLA is under the direction of first-year head coach **Chip Kelly**, who led Oregon to a 46-7 record (33-3 in conference play) and three Pac-10/12 titles (2009-11) before coaching four years in the NFL with the Philadelphia Eagles and San Francisco 49ers.

► Army, which led the FBS last year with its 362.3 rushing yards per game, won eight of its last nine contests, including its Armed Forces Bowl matchup against San Diego State, 42-35.

**GOING FOR BIG 12 FOUR-PEAT**

► If Oklahoma wins the 2018 Big 12 title, it will mark the program's fourth straight league crown. The last time the Sooners won four consecutive conference championships was 1984-87 under head coach Barry Switzer.

► OU is the only program to win three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► The last Power Five program to win four straight outright league titles was Florida from 1993 through 1996.

**RARE SEVEN HOME GAMES**

► Oklahoma will play seven home games this year for the first time since 2007, as all three of its non-conference contests will be held at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The Sooners have played six home games each of the past 10 years and in 13 of the last 14.

► OU will be the visiting team just four times in 2018, as it will be the designated home squad for the Red River Showdown against Texas at the Cotton Bowl in Dallas on Oct. 6.

**OU BOASTS NATION'S LONGEST ROAD WINNING STREAK**

► The Sooners have won 16 straight true road games, good for the longest active streak in the country and the second longest in school history (OU won 24 in a row from 1953 to 1958). Wisconsin (nine) is the only other program that owns an active streak longer than six games.

► The Sooners' last true road loss came more than three years ago (37-33 at TCU on Oct. 4, 2014). During the 16-game streak, the Sooners have outscored opponents 784-436 (49-27 average) and have outgained them 9,267 yards to 6,611 (587-413 average). Seven of the 16 wins have come against top-25 teams.

► OU has also won a record 14 straight Big 12 road games, breaking the previous league mark of 13 consecutive road wins by Texas from 2003 to 2006. Since Lincoln Riley's arrival in Norman prior to the 2015 season, the Sooners are 14-0 in true road games (12-0 in true Big 12 road contests).

**SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA**

► OU's performance in the Big 12 Conference this millennium has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won 10 Big 12 titles in the last 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 11 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

► OU is 124-27 (.821) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 21 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 103-48) and 38 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 86-65).

**COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST**

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (640) than any other program. Only Boise State owns a better winning percentage (.772; played 449 fewer games) during that span than OU (.766).

► OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 35,116 points (in 1,260 games).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 38. In addition, OU's 24 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach Bob Stoops arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (202) and points scored (9,547).

► Only Ohio State (105) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101). OU's 406 weeks in the AP's top five are most of any school (Alabama next with 382 and Ohio State third with 363). The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.

► Only Ohio State (608) has more all-time top-10 AP poll appearances than OU (573).

► Only Alabama (10) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

**EXTRA POINTS**

► Oklahoma committed just 13 turnovers last year (six interceptions and seven fumbles lost), or less than one per game. That was good for the second-lowest total in program history (11 in 2008).

► The Sooners have won 25 of their last 26 games against Big 12 Conference opponents. Fifteen of those 25 victories have been by at least 15 points (seven by at least 35 points).

► Oklahoma, Alabama and Clemson have all finished in the final AP top 5 each of the past three seasons.

# GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

## OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).
- In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

## RECENT RENOVATION

- The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turf, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.
- A significantly larger and more more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

# LINCOLN RILEY

**SECOND SEASON AS HEAD COACH • SET OU RECORD FOR WINS IN A DEBUT SEASON (12) IN 2017  
DIRECTED SOONERS TO 2017 BIG 12 TITLE AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF NO. 2 SEED  
WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH**

**A**fter presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley did in his first year at the helm was lead the Sooners to their 11th Big 12 title, a No. 2 seed in the College Football Playoff and a No. 3 final ranking in the AP and coaches polls.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. The previous record for wins by a first-year OU head coach was 10 by Chuck Fairbanks in 1967 and Barry Switzer in 1973. The next highest figure is eight.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing a balanced — and explosive — OU offense the last three seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in passing efficiency rating (187.7; next closest mark is 163.7), completion percentage (69.4), points per game (44.2) and total offense (555.5), and ranks sixth in passing offense (330.1; fifth in Power 5) and 18th in rushing offense (225.4; ninth in Power 5). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 34-6 (.850) record since Riley arrived in Norman (25-2 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Alabama (41-3), Clemson (40-4) and Ohio State (35-5) having better records during that span.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have been abundant under Riley's tutelage. Quarterback Baker Mayfield became OU's sixth Heisman Trophy winner in 2017 after finishing third in 2016 voting and fourth in 2015. Mayfield also won the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award, and was named AP Player of the Year. All-America wide receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Four Sooners earned first-team All-America honors in 2017: Mayfield, Andrews, left tackle Orlando Brown and defensive end/linebacker Ogbonnia Okoronkwo. Running back Joe Mixon finished second nationally and set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

Already overseeing Mayfield's record-setting career, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.
