OPENING KICK

► No. 6/5 Oklahoma plays its second home game to open 2018 when it hosts UCLA on Saturday at noon CT at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The contest will be televised nationally by FOX with **Gus Johnson, Joel Klatt** and **Jenny Taft** announcing.

► Saturday's game will mark the fifth meeting between Oklahoma and UCLA, with the Sooners leading the series 3-1 (2-0 in Norman). It's the first game of a two-year home-and-home series, with the Bruins scheduled to host OU at the Rose Bowl on Sept. 14, 2019.

► OU head coach **Lincoln Riley** turned 35 on Wednesday. He is the second-youngest head coach in the FBS.

► The Sooners are 31-4 overall and 20-2 at home as the No. 6 team in the AP poll. Their last game with a No. 6 ranking was a 24-19 home loss to No. 15 Kansas State in 2012. Against unranked opponents, OU is 23-1 (15-0 at home) as the AP's No. 6 squad.

► OU is coming off a 63-14 home win over Florida Atlantic on Saturday in a game that saw the Sooners lead 42-0 at halftime and 56-0 until the final minute of the third quarter. The victory snapped FAU's 10-game winning streak. In less than a half of play, quarterback **Kyler Murray** completed 9-of-11 passes for 209 yards and two TDs. The OU defense limited the Owls to 324 yards (4.4 per play) one year after FAU averaged 498.4 yards per game. The Sooners averaged 10.5 yards per play on the day.

► UCLA dropped its first game of the **Chip Kelly** head-coaching era with its 26-17 home defeat to Cincinnati on Saturday. The Bruins, who led 10-0 after the first quarter, lost starting quarterback and Michigan graduate transfer **Wilton Speight** to injury in the second quarter. UCLA held Cincinnati to 304 yards, but managed just 306 itself.

► The Bruins have started 0-2 just once in the past 20 years (2010).

► The Sooners have scored at least 30 points in 24 of their last 25 games (29 in the other). They have won 23 of those 25.

FIVE KEY STORYLINES

► Oklahoma has consistently featured several Californians on its roster, and this season is no different. Nine Sooners on the 2018 roster hail from the Golden State. Of those, eight saw action in Saturday's opener against Florida Atlantic, and four started the contest. The starters were senior right guard **Dru Samia** (Sacramento), sophomore tight end **Grant Calcaterra** (Rancho Santa Margarita), redshirt senior **Curtis Bolton** (Murrieta) and freshman defensive back



In less than one half of work against Florida Atlantic, quarterback **Kyler Murray** completed 9 of 11 pass attempts for 209 yards and two TDs. His 301.4 passing efficiency rating was more than 18 points higher than Baker Mayfield's career best. Murray led Oklahoma to a 42-0 halftime lead as the Sooners outgained the Owls 408 yards to 133 in the first 30 minutes. OU averaged 12.8 yards per play before half to FAU's 3.4.

PREVIOUSLY VS. UCLA

Oklahoma has won three of the four meetings against UCLA. All four games have been decided by at least 17 points (26.8 average).

Brendan Radley-Hiles (Inglewood). Players who also saw the field were freshman running back **T.J. Pledger** (Pacoima), redshirt junior defensive tackle **Dillon Faamatau** (Norwalk), junior linebacker **Ca-
 leb Kelley** (Fresno) and redshirt sophomore safety **Jordan Parker** (Pittsburg). Sophomore offensive lineman **David Swaby** (Los Angeles) is a redshirt candidate. Starting junior receiver **Marquise Brown** played one season of junior college ball at College of the Canyons (located in Santa Clarita) in 2016.

► Oklahoma holds a 65-32-3 (.665) all-time record against current members of the Pac-12 Conference. The bulk of the matchups occurred against former conference foe Colorado, against which the Sooners are 40-17-2 (.695) all-time.

► The Sooners' offense picked up Saturday where it left off last year when it set several single-season school records. Behind Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback **Baker Mayfield**, Oklahoma led the nation in 2017 in total offense (579.6 ypg; school record), yards per play (8.3; school record), passing efficiency rating (202.7; FBS record) and completion percentage (.714). Against Florida Atlantic, OU exceeded all of those figures. It gained 650 yards, averaged 10.5 yards per play and registered a week-one-best 247.6 pass efficiency mark and a .826 completion percentage (19 of 23).

► Oklahoma has won more Big 12 championships over the last 19 years (11) than it has lost home games. OU is 107-10 (.915) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season, with all 117 of those games sellouts. It is the best home winning percentage among Power Five schools over the last 19-plus seasons (Ohio State is next at .882). OU has outscored its opponents by an average of 42-16 in those games.

► Saturday's game will mark the second of five OU contests in the month of September. The Sooners have played five September games in only one other season — 2007 (went 4-1). This year also marks just the third in school history in which OU has four September home games on its schedule (1995 [3-1] and 2000 [4-0]).

RECAPPING SATURDAY'S WIN OVER FAU

► In its most lopsided season opener since 2008, Oklahoma registered a 63-14 home win over a Florida Atlantic program that won its first 10 games last year and was No. 30 in this year's preseason AP poll and No. 33 in the preseason coaches poll. The Sooners, who led 42-0 at halftime, didn't allow a point until 55 seconds were left in the third quarter. Many of OU's starters didn't play in the second half.

► Oklahoma's nine touchdowns (five rushing, three passing and one special teams), were its most in a season opener since racking up 11 TDs against North Texas to begin the 2007 campaign. Its 63 points were its most in any home game since beating Texas Tech 63-27 in 2015.

► OU was one of just four Power Five teams on opening week to register at least 300 passing yards (334) and at least 300 rushing yards (316). It was the sixth time it accomplished the feat since **Lincoln Riley** arrived in Norman in 2015 as the Sooners' play caller.

► In OU's first game since 2014 without quarterback **Baker Mayfield**, **Kyler Murray** completed 9-of-11 pass attempts for 209 yards and two touchdowns (no interceptions) for a gaudy 301.4 passing efficiency rating. Mayfield, who set single-season FBS records for efficiency each of the last two years (196.4 and 198.9), never produced a rating higher than 283 in a game. Murray also ran for 23 yards on four carries before exiting the game for good late in the second quarter.

► Murray's touchdown throws both went for 65 yards, the first to then-walk-on receiver **Lee Morris** (he was placed on scholarship Monday) and the second to **Marquise Brown**. Morris' reception was the third of his career and all have resulted in a TD (two from Murray). After redshirting last year due to injury, **A.D. Miller** made his third career touchdown catch, a six-yarder from **Austin Kendall**. Kendall finished 8-of-10 passing for 88 yards and one TD before leaving the game in the fourth quarter due to injury.

► Running back **Rodney Anderson** led OU's potent ground charge that averaged 8.1 yards per carry. Anderson rushed just five times but amassed 100 yards and scored on jaunts of 30 and 65 yards. His last carry came with 13:07 left in the second quarter. **Trey Sermon** (69 yards on nine carries) and **Kennedy Brooks** (51 yards on four carries) also scored TDs. **T.J. Pledger** ran seven times for 38 yards. It was the first collegiate game for Brooks and Pledger.

► On special teams, Morris registered OU's first blocked punt since 2013. **Curtis Bolton**, who was named Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week, fell on the ball in the end zone for the program's first blocked punt TD since 2002.

► Receiver **Drake Stoops**, son of OU's all-time wins leader (190) **Bob Stoops**, made two catches for 16 yards. He is believed to be the first true freshman walk-on in program history to register a catch in a season-opening game.

SCOUTING UCLA

► UCLA is led by first-year head coach **Chip Kelly**, who most recently served as the head coach of the San Francisco 49ers (2016) and the Philadelphia Eagles (2013-15). Kelly compiled a collegiate record of 46-7 in four years as head coach at Oregon (2009-12). He guided Oregon to four BCS bowl appearances, including the 2010 BCS National Championship Game, Rose Bowls in the 2009 and 2011 seasons, and the Fiesta Bowl in the 2012 season.

► The Bruins dropped their season opener on Saturday at home to Cincinnati, 26-17. UCLA totaled 306 yards of offense (144 rushing, 162 passing) while holding UC to 304 total yards. The Bruins converted 6-of-15 third downs while holding the Bearcats to 5-of-18 on third downs. Cincinnati held a 34:21-25:39 advantage in possession time.

► The Bruins were led by freshman running back **Kazmeir Allen**, who ran five times for 103 yards, including a 74-yard

OU MAKES BIG GAINS...LITERALLY

Oklahoma led the nation with its 8.3 yards per play last year (the previous single-season school record was 7.6 in 1971). That was the second-highest figure in FBS history. The Sooners averaged at least 6.6 yards per play in every game last year and at least 9.0 yards per play in five outings. OU's 12.0 yards per play vs. West Virginia set a program record.

OU continued its efficient ways in Saturday's season opener against Florida Atlantic, averaging 10.5 yards per play.

third-quarter touchdown. Freshman quarterback **Dorian Thompson-Robinson** replaced an injured **Wilton Speight** in the second quarter and completed 15-of-25 passes for 117 yards. Speight, a grad transfer from Michigan, was 8-for-12 passing for 45 yards before exiting. Ten Bruins caught a pass in the game, led by junior receiver **Theo Howard's** five catches for 52 yards. Safety **Adarius Pickett** led the team with 15 tackles.

► UCLA has one of the youngest teams in the country. According to the school, the Bruins' roster has the fourth-highest percentage of underclassmen in the country (71.7 percent) and the third-lowest number of upperclassmen (30).

► UCLA, which went 6-7 and lost to Kansas State in the Cactus Bowl last season, returned five starters on offense and seven starters on defense this year. The Bruins did return their top three rushers, six of their top nine receivers and three of their top five tacklers. **Bolu Olorunfunmi**, the team's leading returning rusher, ran for 565 yards and five touchdowns last season. Howard, who has a catch in 17 straight games dating back to the 2016 season, tallied 56 receptions, 594 yards and four TDs last year. Pickett led the team with 85 tackles and recorded an interception in 2017.

SERIES WITH THE BRUINS

► Oklahoma owns a 3-1 series lead against UCLA and is 2-0 in Norman. The Sooners have outscored the Bruins 97-27 in the two meetings at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, winning both games as the nation's No. 1-ranked team.

► In the 1986 season opener in Norman, **Barry Switzer's** defending national champions handed **Terry Donahue** and the No. 4 Bruins a 38-3 loss thanks to stellar defense. The Sooners intercepted quarterback **Matt Stevens** (now UCLA's game day radio analyst) a school-record-tying five times and permitted just 34 rushing yards on 24 carries. Behind QB **Jamelle Holieway**, OU's wishbone attack racked up 470 rushing yards. It was UCLA's worst season-opening loss in 56 years.

► In the 2003 meeting in Norman, **Bob Stoops' Sooners** only gained 354 yards offensively, but that's because they only ran 60 plays. They used an NCAA-record three punt return TDs by **Antonio Perkins** to register a 59-24 victory over the unranked Bruins, led by first-year head coach **Karl Dorrell**. Perkins, who scored on returns of 65, 74 and 84 yards, is still the outright FBS single-game record holder for punt return TDs and punt return yards (277).

► No. 23 Oklahoma also notched a 34-14 win at No. 19 UCLA in 1990 under head coach **Gary Gibbs** thanks to a suffocating defensive effort. The Sooners held the Bruins to just 203 yards, or 3.6 per play, while registering four interceptions and five sacks. On the ground alone, it limited UCLA to 28 yards on 27 rushes. The season-opening game marked the first in the career of OU quarterback **Cale Gundy**, a freshman who saw action in a reserve role. Gundy, who is OU's co-offensive coordinator, inside receivers coach and director of recruiting, is in his 20th season on the Sooners' coaching staff. He finished his playing career as the Sooners' all-time leading passer.

► UCLA's lone win in the series came in the most recent meeting, a 41-24 outcome in 2005 in Pasadena. The unranked Bruins turned three OU lost fumbles into 17 points, and held **Adrian Peterson** to 58 yards on 23 carries as the No. 21 Sooners fell to 1-2 on the year.

LEAGUE-HIGH SEVEN SOONERS ON PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12 TEAM

► A league-high seven OU players, representing eight spots, were named to the 2018 Preseason All-Big 12 Football Team that was announced in July and chosen by media representatives who cover the league. The Sooners' eight overall selections were three more than the team with the next most (West Virginia). OU also boasted six offensive picks, twice as many the Mountaineers, who had the second most.

► Junior running back **Rodney Anderson**, junior wide receiver **Marquise Brown**, sophomore tight end **Grant Calcuterra**, junior offensive lineman **Bobby Evans**, senior offensive lineman **Ben Powers** and senior kicker/punter **Austin Seibert** were among the 29 players named to the all-league squad by position. Freshman defensive back **Brendan Radley-Hiles** was named Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year.

MURRAY GETS THE CALL AT QB

► After a competitive battle during August camp, head coach **Lincoln Riley** announced Aug. 22 that redshirt junior **Kyler Murray** would be OU's starting quarterback for the season opener against Florida Atlantic and that redshirt sophomore **Austin Kendall** would be his backup.

► A 5-10, 195-pounder from Allen, Texas, Murray was the backup last season to **Baker Mayfield**, who won OU's sixth Heisman Trophy as the Sooners claimed their third straight Big 12 title and made the College Football Playoff for the second time in three years.

► Amazingly, Murray was more efficient as a passer last season than was Mayfield — the man who holds the top two single-season passing efficiency ratings in major college football history. Murray completed 18 of his 21 throws for 359 yards and three touchdowns without an interception in seven games in 2017. He boasted an eye-popping 276.5 efficiency rating to Mayfield's record-setting 198.9 mark, but didn't have near enough pass attempts to qualify in the category.

► Murray also ran 14 times for 142 yards (10.1 average) in 2017. Included was a 66-yard dash on the first play of the game against West Virginia in OU's home finale.

► Murray started his collegiate career at Texas A&M, where he played in eight games and made three starts in 2015. He was a consensus five-star recruit out of Allen High School and was named 2014 national high school player of the year by *Parade*, Gatorade, MaxPreps and *USA Today*. Murray went 43-0 as a high school starter and earned state titles each of his last three years.

► Also a standout on the diamond, Murray played center field for **Skip Johnson's** OU baseball team and was a first-round pick (No. 9 overall) by the Oakland A's in June's Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. He was the only Big 12 player picked in the first round of the 2018 draft and he signed in mid-June. Murray hit .296 with 10 home runs, 13 doubles, 47 RBIs and 10 stolen bases in 51 games (50 starts). He finished the year with a slash line of .296/.398/.556.

RECAPPING A MEMORABLE 2017

► **Lincoln Riley's** debut year as Oklahoma head coach was a banner one, as the Sooners posted a 12-2 record, went 8-1 in Big 12 play, won a third straight conference title (beat TCU 41-17 in the Big 12 Championship Game), qualified for their second College Football Playoff in three years (were the No. 2 seed), finished No. 3 in both major national polls, set multiple school offensive records and produced four first-team All-Americans in tight end **Mark Andrews** (unanimous), offensive tackle **Orlando Brown** (unanimous), quarterback **Baker Mayfield** (unanimous) and defensive end/linebacker **Ogbonnia Okoronkwo**. Mayfield, in a landslide vote, also became OU's sixth Heisman Trophy winner and was the No. 1 overall pick in the NFL Draft by the Cleveland Browns.

Here are some more 2017 accomplishments:

► Oklahoma set single-season school records for total offense (579.6 ypg; led FBS), yards per play (8.3; second all-time in FBS), passing yards per game (361.8), passing efficiency rating (202.7; FBS record) and completion percentage (.714; led FBS), and led the FBS in first downs (361). OU also ranked third nationally in scoring offense (45.1 ppg) and passing offense (361.8 ypg), and paced the Big 12 in rushing offense (217.8 ypg).

► The Sooners' 12 wins were tied for the second most in program history.

► OU became the first school to ever produce three unanimous offensive All-Americans in one season (Andrews, Brown and Mayfield).

► In addition to delivering OU's sixth Heisman Trophy to Norman, Mayfield won the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award. He was also named the AP and Sporting News Player of the Year. Andrews won OU's first Mackey Award.

► Joining Mayfield as NFL Draft picks were Brown (third round, 83rd overall to Baltimore), Andrews (third round, 86th overall to Baltimore) and Okoronkwo (fifth round, 160th overall to Los Angeles Rams). OU and LSU are the only programs with at least four players selected in each of the last 11 NFL Drafts.

► The Sooners led the league with six first-team All-Big 12 selections, and four OU players earned individual all-league awards. Mayfield was Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, Brown was Big 12 Offensive Lineman of the Year, Okoronkwo was Co-Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and **Kenneth Murray** was Co-Big 12 Defensive Freshman of the Year.

► Murray was named a freshman All-American by the Football Writers Association of America and *USA Today*, while **CeeDee Lamb** picked up the same honor from ESPN.

► Co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach **Bill Bedenbaugh** was one of five finalists for the Frank Broyles Award (presented to the nation's best assistant coach).

RILEY'S FAST START

► The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, **Lincoln Riley** became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. The previous record for wins by a first-year OU head coach was 10 by **Chuck Fairbanks** in 1967 and **Barry Switzer** in 1973. Switzer holds the Sooners' record for most wins in his first two seasons as head coach (21 in 1973-74). Riley, who turns 35 this Wednesday, needs nine wins in 2018 to tie the mark. He was the second-youngest FBS head coach entering this season.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY

► Oklahoma has a legitimate claim as the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley called plays as the program's offensive coordinator and continues to as head coach.

► The Sooners have posted a 35-6 (.854) record since Riley's OU debut (25-2 in Big 12 play). That record is fourth best in the country since the start of 2015. Only Alabama (42-3), Clemson (41-4) and Ohio State (36-5) have better records during that span.

► Since the start of the 2015 season, OU ranks first nationally in passing efficiency rating (188.8; next closest is 163.7), completion percentage (69.7), yards per pass attempt (10.6), points per game (44.7), total offense (557.8) and touchdowns from scrimmage (231), and is fifth in passing offense (330.2) and 17th in rushing offense (227.6; ninth in Power Five).

► In 41 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 30 times, including in 20 of the last 25 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 15 occasions and gone over 700 yards four times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 36 of 41 games during the Riley regime, at least 40 points 27 times, at least 50 points 16 times and at least 60 points six times.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

► Four of OU's top five single-game total offense figures since 2000, and six of the top nine have come over the last 39 games (1. 854 at Texas Tech in 2016; 2. 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017; 3. 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015; 5. 710 at Kansas in 2015; 7. 684 vs. Iowa State in 2015; 9. 676 vs. UTEP in 2017).

GOING FOR BIG 12 FOUR-PEAT

► If Oklahoma wins the 2018 Big 12 title, it will mark the program's fourth straight league crown. The last time the Sooners won four consecutive conference championships was 1984-87 under head coach **Barry Switzer**.

► Oklahoma is the only program to win three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► The last Power Five program to win four straight outright league titles was Florida from 1993 through 1996.

RARE SEVEN HOME GAMES

► Oklahoma will play seven home games this year for the first time since 2007, as all three of its non-conference contests are being held at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The Sooners have played six home games each of the past 10 years and in 13 of the last 14.

► OU will be the visiting team just four times in 2018, as it will be the designated home squad for the Red River Showdown against Texas at the Cotton Bowl in Dallas on Oct. 6.

OU OWNS NATION'S LONGEST ROAD WINNING STREAK

► Oklahoma's Sept. 15 game will be at Iowa State. The Sooners have won 16 straight true road games, good for the longest active streak in the country and the second longest in school history (OU won 24 in a row from 1953 to 1958). Wisconsin (nine) is the only other program that owns an active streak longer than six games.

► The Sooners' last true road loss came more than three years ago (37-33 at TCU on Oct. 4, 2014). During the 16-game streak, the Sooners have outscored opponents 784-436 (49-27 average) and have outgained them 9,267 yards to 6,611 (587-413 average). Seven of the 16 wins have come against top-25 teams.

► OU has also won a record 14 straight Big 12 road games, breaking the previous league mark of 13 consecutive road wins by Texas from 2003 to 2006. Since Lincoln Riley's arrival in Norman prior to the 2015 season, the Sooners are 14-0 in true road games (12-0 in true Big 12 road contests).

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

► OU's performance in the Big 12 Conference this millennium has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won 10 Big 12 titles in the last 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 11 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

► OU is 124-27 (.821) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 21 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 103-48) and 38 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 86-65).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (641) than any other program. Only Boise State owns a better winning percentage (.772; played 449 fewer games) during that span than OU (.766).

► OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 35,179 points (in 1,261 games).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 38. In addition, OU's 24 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach Bob Stoops arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (203) and points scored (9,600).

► Only Ohio State (105) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101). OU's 406 weeks in the AP's top five are most of any school (Alabama next with 382 and Ohio State third with 363). The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.

► Only Ohio State (608) has more all-time top-10 AP poll appearances than OU (573).

► Only Alabama (10) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

► In eight games as a Sooner (two starts), quarterback **Kyler Murray** has completed 27 of his 32 pass attempts for 568 yards and five touchdowns with no interceptions, good for a 285.0 passing efficiency rating. For perspective, **Baker Mayfield's** FBS single-season efficiency rating last year was 198.9.

► Oklahoma committed just 13 turnovers last year (six interceptions and seven fumbles lost), or less than one per game. That marked the second-lowest total in OU history (11 in 2008). It had no turnovers Saturday vs. Florida Atlantic.

► Since the start of the 2017 season, OU is averaging 27.7 points in the first half. It has scored at least 20 first-half points in 13 of 15 games, and at least 28 points in nine of those contests.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- ▶ Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- ▶ In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- ▶ The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- ▶ In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- ▶ Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).
- ▶ In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

- ▶ The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- ▶ The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- ▶ The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.
- ▶ Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- ▶ All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- ▶ The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.
- ▶ A significantly larger and more more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

**SECOND SEASON AS HEAD COACH • SET OU RECORD FOR WINS IN A DEBUT SEASON (12) IN 2017
DIRECTED SOONERS TO 2017 BIG 12 TITLE AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF NO. 2 SEED
WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH**

After presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley did in his first year at the helm was lead the Sooners to their 11th Big 12 title, a No. 2 seed in the College Football Playoff and a No. 3 final ranking in the AP and coaches polls.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. The previous record for wins by a first-year OU head coach was 10 by Chuck Fairbanks in 1967 and Barry Switzer in 1973. The next highest figure is eight.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing a balanced — and explosive — OU offense the last three seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in passing efficiency rating (187.7; next closest mark is 163.7), completion percentage (69.4), points per game (44.2) and total offense (555.5), and ranks sixth in passing offense (330.1; fifth in Power 5) and 18th in rushing offense (225.4; ninth in Power 5). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 34-6 (.850) record since Riley arrived in Norman (25-2 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Alabama (41-3), Clemson (40-4) and Ohio State (35-5) having better records during that span.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have been abundant under Riley's tutelage. Quarterback Baker Mayfield became OU's sixth Heisman Trophy winner in 2017 after finishing third in 2016 voting and fourth in 2015. Mayfield also won the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award, and was named AP Player of the Year. All-America wide receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Four Sooners earned first-team All-America honors in 2017: Mayfield, Andrews, left tackle Orlando Brown and defensive end/linebacker Ogbonnia Okoronkwo. Running back Joe Mixon finished second nationally and set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

Already overseeing Mayfield's record-setting career, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

NORMAN – Oklahoma registered its largest margin of victory in a season opener since 2008 by beating Florida Atlantic by 49 points. The Sooners, who led 42-0 at halftime, and 56-0, outgained the AP's 30th-ranked team 650 yards to 324 (10.5 yards per play to 4.4).

Kyler Murray was 9-for-11 through the air for 209 yards and two touchdowns for a gaudy 301.4 passing efficiency rating. He also ran for 23 yards on four carries before exiting the game for good late in the second quarter. Murray's TD throws both went for 65 yards, the first to then-walk-on receiver Lee Morris and the second to Marquise Brown.

Running back Rodney Anderson led a potent ground charge that finished with 316 yards on 39 carries (8.1 average). Anderson carried just five times but amassed 100 yards and scored on jaunts of 30 and 65 yards.

OU's defense didn't allow a point until 55 seconds were left in the third quarter. The first-half shutout was the Sooners' first since 2015. On special teams, Morris registered OU's first blocked punt since 2013 in the first quarter. Curtis Bolton fell on the ball in the end zone for the program's first TD on a blocked punt since 2002.
