OPENING KICK

► No. 8/8 Oklahoma (6-1, 3-1 Big 12) plays its fifth of seven home games this season when it hosts Kansas State (3-4, 1-3) on Saturday at 2:30 p.m. CT as part of homecoming weekend. The game will be televised nationally by FOX with **Gus Johnson**, **Joel Klatt** and **Jenny Taft** announcing.

► OU (11) and K-State (two) have combined for 13 Big 12 championships in the league's first 22 years (they shared the 2012 crown).

► Oklahoma's 75 all-time wins against Kansas State are tied for its second most among all opponents (87 vs. Oklahoma State; also 75 vs. Iowa State and Kansas). OU has won nine of the last 11 matchups vs. K-State and 12 of the last 15.

► OU has won 28 of its last 30 games against Big 12 opponents dating back to the 2015 season. Its only two losses during that span came at the hands of Iowa State on Oct. 7 last year (38-31 in Norman) and Texas three Saturdays ago (48-45 in Dallas). Seventeen of those 28 victories have been by at least 15 points, and eight by at least 30 points.

► OU has been ranked in the AP's top 10 in 29 of the last 31 polls. The only times it wasn't during that stretch were two weeks ago (fell from No. 7 to No. 11) and after last year's loss to Iowa State (dropped from No. 3 to No. 12).

► Oklahoma is 25-5-2 overall and 8-1 at home as the No. 8 team in the AP poll. The Sooners' only home loss as the No. 8 team came in 2012 when No. 5 Notre Dame won 30-13 in Norman. Current OU outside linebackers coach **Bob Diaco** was the Fighting Irish's defensive coordinator in that contest. Against unranked opponents, the Sooners are 15-0-1 (6-0 at home) as the AP's No. 8 squad.

► The Sooners have won more Big 12 championships over the last 19 years (11) than they have lost home games. OU is 110-10 (.917) at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season, with all 120 of those games sellouts.

► Oklahoma is coming off a 52-27 win at TCU, an outcome that extended its true road game winning streak to a nation-leading 18 contests. **Kyler Murray** threw for four touchdowns while **Kennedy Brooks** (168, 1 TD) and **Trey Sermon** (110, 2 TDs) each ran for more than 100 yards. OU outgained the Horned Frogs by 261 yards, and TCU's 275 yards and 12 first downs were the Sooners' fewest allowed in 10 games. The 25-point loss for TCU tied as its worst since 2004.

► Kansas State outscored Oklahoma State 28-6 after halftime in a 31-12 home win in its last game two weeks ago. The Wildcats racked up 291 rushing yards and held a 37:52-22:08 time-of-possession advantage. Running back **Alex Barnes** rushed 34 times for 181 yards (5.3 average) and four touchdowns while also catching three passes for 51 yards.

FIVE KEY STORYLINES

► Oklahoma owns a 75-19-4 (.786) all-time record and a 12-5 (.706) Big 12-era mark against Kansas State, the highest winning percentages by a Wildcats' opponent among current Big 12 programs. In fact, no other current Big 12 program



Sophomore linebacker **Kenneth Murray** leads the Big 12 and ranks 10th nationally with his 12.1 tackles per game. He has registered double-digit tackles in each of the last five contests, and has 66 stops over the last four games (16.5 average). Senior linebacker **Curtis Bolton** is tied for second in the Big 12 and 11th nationally with 11.6 tackles per outing, and is averaging 14.8 over the last four contests.

has a winning record against K-State since the league began in 1996.

▶ The road team has won six of the last seven meetings in the OU-Kansas State series. The lone time the home team won in the last seven years was in 2016 when the Sooners posted a 38-17 victory.

▶ In Big 12 play, Oklahoma leads the conference with its 548.5 yards of offense per game, which is 51.0 more yards per outing than the team with the second-best average (Texas Tech; 497.5). Making OU's offensive performance more impressive is the fact the Sooners have already faced the league's top three teams in total defense (Iowa State 346.2, Texas 362.2 and TCU 363.5). Saturday's game will feature the Big 12's top two rushing offenses in league action, with OU averaging 220.5 yards per game and Kansas State 202.0. The Sooners' 5.9 yards per rush is a full yard more than the team with the next best average (K-State; 4.9).

▶ Oklahoma ranks 128th out of 130 FBS teams with just 60.6 offensive plays per game, but it ranks seventh nationally with its 526.3 yards per contest. That's because the Sooners lead the nation with a staggering 8.7 yards per play, a figure that would set an FBS single-season record (the current record is 8.58 by Hawaii in 2006). The OU single-season record of 8.3 yards per play was set last year, and the program's second-best figure is 7.6 in 1971. Alabama ranks second this year with its 8.3 yards per play, while Memphis and Mississippi are tied for third at 7.7. OU also leads the nation by gaining at least 10 yards on 31.8 percent of its plays (135 of 424). Alabama ranks second at 29.6 percent.

▶ Through seven games this season, quarterback **Kyler Murray** has a better passing efficiency rating (224.9), more total touchdowns (30), more yards per pass attempt (12.4), more yards per completion (17.2) and more rushing yards per game (61.1) than **Baker Mayfield**, **Sam Bradford** and **Jason White** did through seven games the years they won their Heisman Trophies while at OU (see chart on the bottom of page 3 of these notes).

RECAPPING THE WIN AGAINST TCU

▶ No. 9/10 Oklahoma registered its nation-leading 18th straight true road win by handling TCU 52-27 in Fort Worth on Saturday. The Sooners almost doubled up the Horned Frogs in yards, outgaining them 536-275. TCU's yardage total was the third lowest by an OU opponent in the 21-game **Lincoln Riley** era.

▶ OU took a 28-7 lead with 8:25 left in the second quarter, only to watch TCU score 17 straight points to end the half and cut the margin to 28-24. The Sooners owned the second half, outscoring the Frogs 24-3 and holding them to 4.3 yards per play. On the game, TCU completed just 40 percent of its pass attempts (10 for 25) for 163 yards.

▶ **Kennedy Brooks** ran for a career-high 168 yards on 18 carries (9.3 average) and a touchdown, registering the highest total by an OU freshman since **Samaje Perine** rushed for an FBS-record 427 yards against Kansas late in the 2014 season. Brooks, who was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on Monday, had 192 yards on the year entering the day. Sophomore **Trey Sermon** added 110 yards and two TDs on 17 carries (6.5 average) as the Sooners registered a 323-112 advantage in rushing yards (6.9 per carry to 3.7).

▶ **Kyler Murray** was 19 for 24 through the air for 213 yards and four TDs without an interception (208.7 rating), marking the sixth straight game he has thrown for at least three scores and the third in a row he has thrown for at least four TDs. He was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week for the fourth time, tying an OU single-season record.

▶ **CeeDee Lamb** caught five passes for 91 yards and a score, giving him at least one TD grab in six straight games. **Lee Morris** added two TD receptions on his two catches, and fullback **Carson Meier** recorded his second-career TD snag.

▶ **Kenneth Murray** led the Sooners with 11 tackles (two for loss and one sack), while **Curtis Bolton** and Kahlil Haughton added six each. **Parnell Motley** recorded his third interception of the season to set up OU's final score late in the game.

▶ OU extended its streak of regular season wins following a loss to 39 games. The last time the Sooners lost back-to-back regular season games was in 1999, **Bob Stoops'** first year as head coach.

LAST YEAR VS. THE WILDCATS

▶ Oklahoma scored touchdowns on its final two possessions, including the game-winner with seven seconds remaining, to post a 42-35 win at Kansas State on Oct. 21, 2017. The Sooners trailed 21-7 in the second quarter and 21-10 at halftime. OU's 14-point deficit was the largest overcome in a victory since trailing 17-0 at Tennessee in 2015 in an eventual 31-24 double-overtime win.

▶ **Baker Mayfield** was 32 for 41 passing for a then-season-high 410 yards and two touchdowns, and ran for a season-high 69 yards and a career-high-tying two scores. Mayfield's 479 yards of total offense wound up as his fourth-highest career total and the eighth-highest total in school history.

▶ Down 21-20 entering the fourth quarter, Mayfield engineered touchdown drives of (in order) 93, 74 and 76 yards.

▶ Sophomore running back **Rodney Anderson** saw his most action to that point of the season and responded in a positive manner, rushing 19 times for a then-career-high 147 yards, including the game-winning 22-yard score on OU's final play. He also reeled in four passes for 30 yards, including a five-yard catch-and-dive with 5:16 remaining that put OU up 35-28.

▶ Of Anderson's 194 all-purpose yards, 178 came after halftime.

▶ All of sophomore receiver **Marquise Brown's** career-high six receptions came in the second half. He finished with a game-high 126 receiving yards, and his 66-yard catch-and-run set up OU's next-to-last touchdown.

▶ After giving up 316 yards in the first half (9.6 yards per play), the Sooners allowed just 96 yards in the second (4.2 per play). The Wildcats rushed for 256 yards on 24 carries in the first half (10.7 average) but just 12 yards on 18 carries after halftime (0.7 average).

▶ The win was OU's seventh without a loss at K-State since the start of the 2000 season (each by at least 7 points).

YARDS-PER-PLAY LEADERS

Oklahoma led the nation with its 8.3 yards per play last year (the previous single-season school record was 7.6 in 1971). That was the second-highest figure in FBS history. Through seven games this year, the Sooners are operating at an even more efficient clip, averaging a nation-leading 8.7 yards per play, which would set a single-season FBS record.

ANOTHER OU HEISMAN HOPEFUL

► After a competitive quarterback battle during preseason camp between redshirt junior **Kyler Murray** and redshirt sophomore **Austin Kendall**, head coach **Lincoln Riley** announced Aug. 22 that Murray had won the job. Through seven games, the decision has proved fruitful, with Murray ranking second nationally in yards per pass attempt (12.4), yards per completion (17.2), passing efficiency rating (224.9) and points responsible for per game (25.7), third in passing touchdowns per game (3.6), fourth in completion percentage (.711) and fifth in total offense per game (343.6 yards; didn't play in second half vs. Florida Atlantic, OU only ran 40 plays vs. Army). He is the only player averaging at least 250.0 passing yards (282.4) and at least 50.0 rushing yards (61.1) per game.

► Murray has thrown at least two touchdown passes in every game this year, and at least three in each of the last six outings. He has 14 TD passes over the last three games.

► In Big 12 play, Murray owns healthy statistical leads in total offense at 390.5 yards per game (next most is 306.5 by Baylor's Charlie Brewer), passing yards at 326.5 per contest (next most is 309.3 by Texas Tech's Alan Bowman) and passing efficiency rating with his 239.8 mark (next best is 166.0 by West Virginia's Will Grier).

► A 5-10, 195-pounder from Allen, Texas, Murray is looking to become OU's fourth Heisman Trophy finalist in the last three years (**Baker Mayfield** in 2016 and '17 and **Dede Westbrook** in 2016), and its second straight winner (Mayfield). He has accounted for 30 touchdowns (25 passing, five rushing) and just four turnovers. He ranks second the team with 428 rushing yards (6.5 per carry) and is tied for the lead with five rushing TDs.

► Murray was the backup last season to Mayfield, who won OU's sixth Heisman Trophy as the Sooners claimed their third straight Big 12 title and made the College Football Playoff for the second time in three years.

► No school has ever produced back-to-back Heisman Trophy winners who were quarterbacks.

► Only seven times since the start of the Big 12 Conference in 1996 has a Sooner thrown for at least 300 yards and rushed for at least 65 in a game, and Murray has done it on three occasions this year. He passed for 306 yards and ran for 69 against UCLA, threw for a then-career-high 348 and rushed for 77 at Iowa State, and went for 304 and 92 against Texas. For his effort against UCLA, Murray was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week, Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week and the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback of the Week.

► In OU's 66-33 win over Baylor three games ago, Murray finished 17 for 21 for 432 yards, six touchdowns and no interceptions while adding 45 rushing yards and a score. His 348.0 passing efficiency rating set school and Big 12 records (as did his 20.6 yards per pass attempt and 25.4 yards per completion), and was the highest in the FBS since at least 1996.

► Through seven games, Murray has been considerably more efficient as a passer this season than Mayfield was the last two seasons when he twice set the FBS record in the category. Murray's 224.9 rating is 26 points better than Mayfield's existing record of 198.9 set last year, and 29 points better than Mayfield's 2016 mark of 196.4.

► Murray started his collegiate career at Texas A&M, where he played in eight games and made three starts in 2015. He was a consensus five-star recruit out of Allen High School and was named 2014 national high school player of the year by *Parade*, *Gatorade*, *MaxPreps* and *USA Today*. Murray went 43-0 as a high school starter and earned state titles each of his last three years.

► Also a baseball standout, Murray played center field for **Skip Johnson's** OU team and was a first-round pick (No. 9 overall) by the Oakland A's in June's Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. He was the only Big 12 player picked in the first round of the 2018 draft and he signed in mid-June. Murray hit .296 with 10 home runs, 13 doubles, 47 RBIs and 10 stolen bases in 51 games (50 starts) in 2018. He finished the year with a slash line of .296/.398/.556.

HOORAY FOR "HOLLYWOOD"

► **Marquise Brown**, who hails from Hollywood, Fla., was one of the country's most explosive receivers last year, and 2018 is no different. Brown ranks ninth nationally in receiving yards per game (102.3) this season, and among players averaging at least 5.0 receptions per game he leads the nation with his 18.8 yards per catch. He is also tied for eighth

MURRAY: BY AIR AND BY LAND

Kyler Murray is one of only six QBs who average at least 200 passing yards and 50 rushing yards per game this season (and is the only one to average at least 250 and 50). He leads the group in passing yards per game (282.4), passings TDs (25) and total TDs (30).

nationally with his 1.0 receiving touchdowns per game (seven TDs in seven games).

► Brown ranks first nationally this season with his seven catches of at least 40 yards, his five receptions of at least 50 yards, his three grabs of at least 60 yards and his two catches of at least 70 yards. His long receiving plays this season have gone for 77 yards (TD), 75 yards (TD), 65 yards (TD), 58 yards (TD), 50 yards (TD), 48 yards and 40 yards (TD).

► Since the start of the 2017 season, Brown leads the nation with his 12 catches of at least 50 yards. The next highest total among active players is eight. The 12 grabs for Brown have gone for 87, 84, 77, 77, 75, 66, 65, 58, 56, 52, 50 and 50 yards. Nine of those 12 receptions have resulted in a TD.

► Brown has started his OU career with 95 catches for 1,811 yards (19.1 average) and 16 TDs. His 1,811 receiving yards are 138 more than the Sooner with the second most yards in the first 20 games of a career (**Dede Westbrook** tallied 1,673 in his first 20 games in 2015 and '16 as a junior and senior). Brown's 14 receiving TDs are tied for the second most in school history through 20 games (**Ryan Broyles** had 16).

SILENCE OF THE LAMB

► While **Marquise Brown** has turned heads with his home-run-play ability, sophomore **CeeDee Lamb** has quietly put together one of the best two-year starts to a career by an OU receiver. The 6-2, 189-pounder from Richmond, Texas, has started 19 of his 21 games and has amassed 76 receptions for 1,322 yards (17.4 average) and 14 touchdowns.

► A freshman All-American by ESPN last year when he caught 46 passes for 807 yards and seven touchdowns in 14 contests (13 starts), Lamb is on pace to demolish those numbers this season. Through seven games, he has 30 catches for 514 yards and seven TDs. He has four career 100-yard receiving games, including two this year. The highlight of this season was a seven-catch, 146-yard performance against UCLA in OU's second game.

► Lamb is tied for third in OU history with his 14 receiving touchdowns in the first 21 games of a career (**Ryan Broyles** had 16 and **Dede Westbrook** had 15).

OU's 1-2 LINEBACKING PUNCH

► No duo in the country averages more tackles per game than Oklahoma sophomore **Kenneth Murray** and redshirt senior **Curtis Bolton**. Both linebackers, Murray ranks 10th nationally (first in the Big 12) with his 12.1 tackles per outing, while Bolton is tied for 11th nationally (second in Big 12) with 11.6.

► Over the last four games, Murray has an astounding 66 tackles (16.5 average) while Bolton has 59 (14.8).

► Murray has 85 tackles on the year, which is seven more than his total last season (78) when he started all 14 games, earned freshman All-America honors from the Football Writers Association of America and *USA Today*, and was co-Big 12 Defensive Freshman of the Year. What makes Murray's 2018 tackle total even more impressive is the fact that he registered zero stops in the season opener against Florida Atlantic. Over the last six games, he is averaging 14.2 tackles. Included was a 28-tackle effort against Army which, the most by an FBS player since at least 2000 (when the NCAA began tracking the record).

► Amazingly, Bolton's 81 tackles are 65 more than he had in his career (16) entering the year. Playing primarily on special teams and battling injuries prior to this season, his six career starts have all come in 2018.

HERE'S THE KICKER

► Senior kicker/punter **Austin Seibert** ranks second in OU career scoring with 424 points and needs 26 points to tie kicker **Michael Hunnicutt** (2011-14) for the school record of 450. He is in fifth place in all-time Big 12 scoring and needs nine points to tie Oklahoma State kicker Ben Grogan (2013-16) for fourth place. Seibert needs 27 points to tie the Big 12 career scoring record of 451, held by Baylor's Aaron Jones (2010-13) and TCU's Jaden Oberkrom (2012-15).

► In Saturday's win at TCU, Seibert was 7 for 7 on PATs, extending his streak of makes to 138 dating back to 2016. He broke the school record of 134 straight conversions that was held by **Uwe von Schamann** (1976-78).

► With his 424 points, Seibert ranks 15th in FBS history among kickers. He needs nine points to move into the top 10. The record is 494 points by Arizona State's Zane Gonzalez (2013-16).

► Seibert ranks first at OU and second in the Big 12 in career extra points made (268), and needs six to tie the conference record of 274 held by Baylor's Jones.

► For the third straight season, Seibert is handling OU's placekicking, punting and kickoff duties. He is one of just three players nationally this season to lead his team in each (San Jose State's Bryce Crawford and Rice's Jack Fox).

► Seibert also ranks second at OU in career field goals made (52) and PAT percentage (.985; 268-272), fourth in career field goal percentage (.765; 52-68) and fifth in career punting average (41.9).

ISN'T THAT SPECIAL

► Special teams have been a major positive for the Sooners through seven games. Among teams with at least 2.0 kick-off returns per game this season, OU ranks eighth nationally with its 26.1 average. That's thanks largely to sophomore cornerback **Tre Brown**, who ranks sixth in the country with his 28.9-yard average. He has compiled 289 yards on 10 returns, including an 86-yarder in the first quarter vs. UCLA that set up the tying touchdown after OU fell behind 7-0.

► Among teams that average at least 1.2 punt returns per game, OU ranks 18th nationally with its 13.7 yards per return. Sophomore receiver **CeeDee Lamb** is averaging 11.9 yards on his eight returns, thanks largely to a 66-yard runback vs.

UCLA. Junior receiver **Lee Morris** has one return for 28 yards.

► Last year, OU ranked 98th nationally in kick return average (19.3 yards) and 97th in punt return average (5.6).

► Opponents have only returned five punts this season and they have gone for a combined 23 yards (14th fewest in nation). OU also registered its first blocked punt since 2013 in the opener against Florida Atlantic, and it resulted in its first blocked punt TD since 2002. Morris registered the block and **Curtis Bolton** fell on the ball in the end zone.

► Senior kicker/punter **Austin Seibert** is 45 for 45 on PATs this season after going 81 for 81 last year. His streak of 138 makes going back to 2016 is the third longest in the nation and an OU school record. Forty-six of his 53 kickoffs this season have resulted in touchbacks (his 86.8 percent rate is fourth best in the country). He had a streak of 32 touchbacks snapped at TCU last weekend following a 15-yard post-touchdown celebration penalty that was enforced on the kickoff (he still kicked the ball to the 1-yard line).

TRUE ROAD WARRIORS

► By the time Oklahoma's next road game arrives, the Sooners' last true road loss will have occurred 1,491 days ago. The last time OU lost a true road game was Oct. 4, 2014, when No. 4 OU dropped a 37-33 decision at No. 25 TCU. Eleven AP Top 25 teams lost that week, including four of the top six.

► Since 1980, OU's 18-game true road winning streak is tied for the third longest nationally, with only Miami (Fla.) (1984-88) and Ohio State (2012-16) holding longer streaks at 20 wins.

► During the 18-game streak, the Sooners have outscored opponents 873-490 (49-27 average) and have outgained them 10,322 yards to 7,360 (573-409 average). OU has scored at least 31 points in all 18 games and at least 41 points in 14 of them. Seven of the wins have come against top-25 teams.

► The Sooners have outgained their opponent in 17 of the 18 road wins. West Virginia in 2016 is the only home team to outgain OU during the stretch (579-485), but was still doubled up 56-28 on the scoreboard.

► Thirteen of the 18 victories have been by double digits, seven by at least 25 points and five by at least 35 points.

RILEY'S FAST START

► The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, **Lincoln Riley** became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. The previous record for wins by a first-year OU head coach was 10 by **Chuck Fairbanks** in 1967 and **Barry Switzer** in 1973. Switzer holds the Sooners' record for most wins in his first two seasons as head coach (21 in 1973-74). Riley, who turned 35 on Sept. 5, needs three more wins in 2018 to tie the mark. He was the second-youngest FBS head coach entering this season.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY

► Oklahoma has a legitimate claim as the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley called plays as the program's offensive coordinator and continues to as head coach.

► Since the start of the 2015 season, OU ranks first nationally in passing efficiency rating (191.2; next closest is 159.7), completion percentage (69.6), points per game (44.9), total offense (551.1), touchdowns from scrimmage (268) and yards per pass attempt (10.7), and is sixth in passing offense (325.8) and 15th in rushing offense (225.3).

► In 47 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 34 times, including in 24 of the last 31 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 16 occasions and gone over 700 yards four times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 41 of 47 games since Riley's arrival, at least 40 points 31 times, at least 50 points 18 times and at least 60 points seven times.

► Four of OU's top five single-game total offense figures since 2000, and six of the top nine have come since the start of the 2015 season; 1. 854 at Texas Tech in 2016; 2. 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017; 3. 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015; 5. 710 at Kansas in 2015; 7. 684 vs. Iowa State in 2015; 9. 676 vs. UTEP in 2017).

► The Sooners have posted a 40-7 (.851) record since Riley's OU debut (28-3 in Big 12 play). That mark is fourth best in the country since the start of 2015. Only Alabama (48-3), Clemson (46-4) and Ohio State (41-6) have better records during that span.

GOING FOR BIG 12 FOUR-PEAT

► If Oklahoma wins the 2018 Big 12 title, it will mark the program's fourth straight league crown. The last time the Sooners won four consecutive conference championships was 1984-87 under head coach **Barry Switzer**.

► Oklahoma is the only program to win three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► The last Power Five program to win four straight outright league titles was Florida from 1993 through 1996.

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

► OU's performance in the Big 12 Conference this millennium has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won 11 Big 12 titles in the last 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 11 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

► OU is 127-28 (.819) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 26 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 107-48) and 39 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 87-68).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (646) than any other program. Only Boise State owns a better winning percentage (.771; played 449 fewer games) during that span than OU (.766).

► OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 35,456 points (in 1,267 games).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 38. In addition, OU's 24 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (208) and points scored (9,877).

► Only Ohio State (106) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (102). OU's 408 weeks in the AP's top five are most of any school (Alabama next with 390 and Ohio State third with 370). The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.

► Only Ohio State (615) has more all-time top-10 AP poll appearances than OU (580).

► Only Alabama (10) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

SCOUTING KANSAS STATE

► Kansas enters Saturday's game 3-4 overall and 1-3 in Big 12 play. The Wildcats are coming off an open week after picking up a 31-12 win over Oklahoma State two weeks ago. Prior to that win, KSU had lost its first three Big 12 games (35-6 at West Virginia, 19-14 vs. Texas and 37-34 at Baylor).

► K-State ranks last in the Big 12 in scoring offense (23.3 ppg) and passing offense (164.7 ypg), ninth in total offense (356.3 ypg) and third in rushing offense (191.6 ypg). On the other side of the ball, it ranks fifth in scoring defense (25.0 ppg) and passing defense (233.1 ypg), seventh in total defense (406.1 ypg) and ninth in rushing defense (173.0 ypg).

► Quarterback **Skylar Thompson** has completed 55.3 percent of his passes for 880 yards and five touchdowns against three interceptions, and has rushed 73 times for 305 yards (4.2 per carry) and three TDs. Running back **Alex Barnes** leads the Big 12 by averaging 112.6 rushing yards per game, totaling 788 yards and nine scores on 138 carries (5.7 average). **Isaiah Zuber** leads the Wildcats with 478 receiving yards and three touchdowns on 39 catches (12.3 average), and **Dalton Schoen** has 291 yards and two scores on 16 receptions (18.2 average).

► The K-State defense has 10 takeaways, including eight interceptions, and has recorded 11 sacks. Opponents, meanwhile, have five interceptions, six fumble recoveries and 23 sacks. The Wildcats are led by cornerback **Duke Shelley's** three interceptions and nine pass breakups, and defensive end **Reggie Walker's** 5.5 sacks and 7.5 tackles for loss.

► Kansas State is under the direction of **Bill Snyder**, who is in the 10th year of his second stint as head coach of the Wildcats. He has led KSU to 76 victories and eight straight bowl games in that span. In his 27th overall year as K-State's head coach, he owns a 213-114-1 record.

EXTRA POINTS

► Thirty-six of Oklahoma's 44 offensive touchdown drives (82 percent) have taken less than three minutes of game clock. That excludes the overtime TD drive vs. Army that took two plays.

► OU opponents have run 533 plays this season to the Sooners' 424. That's an average of 15.6 more per game. Despite that, OU has outgained its foes by 882 yards on the year (8.7 yards per play to 5.3).

► Oklahoma has scored at least 30 points in 29 of its last 31 games (29 and 28 in the other two). It has won 28 of those 31 contests. OU's 28-3 record since Oct. 1, 2016, is the nation's third best (Alabama is 30-2 and Clemson 29-3).

► In Big 12 play, the Sooners lead the league in rushing defense (113.2 yards per game) and rank second in yards per carry allowed (3.4). On the season, OU is tied for third in the league in yards per play allowed (5.3).

► **Kyler Murray** was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week three times for games played in the month of September. He became the first player since Texas running back Ricky Williams in 1998 to earn three such honors in the first five weeks of a season.

► OU has scored at least 50 points 18 times since the start of the 2015 season, most in the nation.

► Since the start of the 2017 season, Oklahoma is averaging 26.5 points in the first half. It has scored at least 20 first-half points in 18 of 21 games, and at least 28 points in 11 of those contests.

► OU committed just 13 turnovers last year (six interceptions and seven fumbles lost), or less than one per game. That marked the second-lowest total in school history (11 in 2008). The Sooners have six total turnovers in seven games this season. Their 19 turnovers since the start of the 2017 campaign are tied for sixth fewest nationally.

► Redshirt junior receiver **Lee Morris** has 12 career catches and eight have gone for touchdowns. Six of his 10 receptions this year, including each of the last three, have resulted in a score.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).
- In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

- The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.
- A significantly larger and more more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

**SECOND SEASON AS HEAD COACH • SET OU RECORD FOR WINS IN A DEBUT SEASON (12) IN 2017
DIRECTED SOONERS TO 2017 BIG 12 TITLE AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF NO. 2 SEED
WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH**

After presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley did in his first year at the helm was lead the Sooners to their 11th Big 12 title, a No. 2 seed in the College Football Playoff and a No. 3 final ranking in the AP and coaches polls.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. The previous record for wins by a first-year OU head coach was 10 by Chuck Fairbanks in 1967 and Barry Switzer in 1973. The next highest figure is eight.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing a balanced — and explosive — OU offense the last three seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in passing efficiency rating (191.2; next closest is 159.7), completion percentage (69.6), points per game (44.9), total offense (551.1), touchdowns from scrimmage (268) and yards per pass attempt (10.7), and is sixth in passing offense (325.8) and 15th in rushing offense (225.3). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 40-7 (.851) record since Riley's arrival (28-3 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Alabama (48-3), Clemson (46-4) and Ohio State (41-6) having better records during that span.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have been abundant under Riley's tutelage. Quarterback Baker Mayfield became OU's sixth Heisman Trophy winner in 2017 after finishing third in 2016 voting and fourth in 2015. Mayfield also won the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award, and was named AP Player of the Year. All-America wide receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Four Sooners earned first-team All-America honors in 2017: Mayfield, Andrews, left tackle Orlando Brown and defensive end/linebacker Ogbonnia Okoronkwo. Running back Joe Mixon finished second nationally and set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

Already overseeing Mayfield's record-setting career, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

NORMAN – Oklahoma registered its largest margin of victory in a season opener since 2008 by beating Florida Atlantic by 49 points. The Sooners, who led 42-0 at halftime, and 56-0, outgained the AP's 30th-ranked team 650 yards to 324 (10.5 yards per play to 4.4).

Kyler Murray was 9-for-11 through the air for 209 yards and two touchdowns for a gaudy 301.4 passing efficiency rating. He also ran for 23 yards on four carries before exiting the game for good late in the second quarter. Murray's TD throws both went for 65 yards, the first to then-walk-on receiver Lee Morris and the second to Marquise Brown.

Running back Rodney Anderson led a potent ground charge that finished with 316 yards on 39 carries (8.1 average). Anderson carried just five times but amassed 100 yards and scored on jaunts of 30 and 65 yards.

OU's defense didn't allow a point until 55 seconds were left in the third quarter. The first-half shutout was the Sooners' first since 2015. On special teams, Morris registered OU's first blocked punt since 2013 in the first quarter. Curtis Bolton fell on the ball in the end zone for the program's first TD on a blocked punt since 2002.

NORMAN – The Sooners registered their 31st consecutive victory over an unranked non-conference opponent by easily handling UCLA. OU, which led 21-7 at halftime and 42-7 in the fourth quarter, outgained the Bruins 485 yards to 383.

Quarterback Kyler Murray was 19-for-33 passing for 306 yards and three TDs, and rushed 10 times for 69 yards and a pair of scores. It marked the first time since OU's 2014 game at Iowa State (Trevor Knight, 146) that a quarterback led the team in rushing yards.

Receiver CeeDee Lamb finished with seven catches for 146 yards (one shy of his career high) and a 35-yard score. He also returned two punts for 63 yards, including a career-long 66 yarder. Marquise Brown hauled in four passes for 88 yards, one of them a 58-yard catch-and-run for a TD.

Oklahoma's defense registered six sacks and 12 tackles for loss. Defensive end/linebacker Mark Jackson Jr. recorded a career-high 10 tackles and a TFL, and linebacker Kenneth Murray finished with nine tackles and 2.5 TFLs.

The Sooners also got an 85-yard kickoff return from Tre Brown, the longest non-scoring play/return by OU in the 95-year history of Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.

AMES, Iowa — Kyler Murray threw for a career-high 348 yards and three touchdowns in his first career road start, and Marquise Brown caught nine passes for 191 yards and a score as Oklahoma registered a 37-27 win at Iowa State. It was the Sooners' nation-leading 17th consecutive true road win and their Big 12-record 15th straight league road victory. The Sooners, who never trailed, won for the 24th straight time in Ames. Murray completed 21 of his 29 pass attempts and averaged 12.0 yards per pass attempt and 16.6 yards per completion. His 77 rushing yards came on 15 carries (5.1 average).

Brown registered 189 of his 191 receiving yards before halftime, setting the school record for receiving yards in a half. Included in his total was a 75-yard first-quarter bomb from Murray that resulted in OU's first touchdown of the day and a 10-0 lead. Running back Trey Sermon, who got the start in place of injured Rodney Anderson, carried 13 times for 74 yards (5.7 average) and notched a 22-yard TD run.

Austin Seibert was exceptional on special teams, making all three of his field goal attempts (21, 31 and 42 yards), averaging 48.5 yards on his two punts (long of 53) and registering touchbacks on all eight of his kickoffs.

NORMAN — Sophomore linebacker Kenneth Murray made a school-record 28 tackles (previous record was 24), the most in the FBS since at least 2000, and Kyler Murray threw for three touchdowns and ran for another as No. 5/5 Oklahoma downed Army West Point 28-21 in overtime.

The Black Knights ran 87 plays to Oklahoma's 40, and held a 44:41 to 15:19 advantage in time of possession. OU's possession time total was the lowest by a Big 12 team in the 23-year history of the league, and was the lowest by an FBS team in victory since at least 1996.

Trey Sermon paced the Sooners with 119 yards on 18 carries (6.6 average) while Kyler Murray added 71 yards on seven rushes (10.1 average). CeeDee Lamb caught two touchdown passes, including a 10-yarder that represented the game's only overtime score. OU averaged 8.9 yards per play on the evening while Army averaged 4.4.

With the game tied at 21 and with Army driving late in the fourth quarter, OU's Kenneth Mann registered his first career interception. Austin Seibert missed a 33-yard field goal attempt as time expired before the Sooners prevailed in the extra session.

Linebacker Curtis Bolton finished with 23 tackles, third most in OU history.

NORMAN – Quarterback Kyle Murray tied the school record for touchdowns accounted for in a game with seven as No. 6/5 Oklahoma (5-0, 2-0) downed Baylor (3-2, 1-1) by a 66-33 count in Norman. Murray, who also set the school and Big 12 single-game record for passing efficiency rating (348.0); the previous OU record was 303.3) was 17 for 21 for 432 yards and six touchdowns, while rushing 10 times for 45 yards and a score.

OU's 66 points were tied for its second most against a Big 12 team. The Sooners racked up 607 yards and averaged 11.24 yards per play (tied for third highest in school history).

Marquise Brown (132 yards, 2 TDs), CeeDee Lamb (101 yards, 1 TD) and Lee Morris (61 yards, 2 TDs) led OU's receivers, while Kennedy Brooks ran for team and career highs of 107 yards on eight carries (13.4 average) and two scores.

One week after registering 28 tackles against Army, Kenneth Murray posted a team-high 17 against the Bears, and was followed by Curtis Bolton (16) and Kahlil Haughton (11). Freshman defensive end Ronnie Perkins had 2.0 sacks and three quarterback hurries.

DALLAS – Oklahoma scored 21 straight fourth-quarter points to tie the game at 45 with 2:38 remaining, but Texas' Cameron Dicker kicked a 40-yard field goal with nine seconds left to give the Longhorns a 48-45 win in the highest-scoring Red River Showdown ever. The loss was just the Sooners' second in the last 29 games against Big 12 opponents.

Texas led 24-17 at halftime and took a 45-24 lead with 56 seconds left in the third quarter. OU quarterback Kyle Murray hit Lee Morris for a 19-yard touchdown with 8:28 to go in the fourth, and then ran for a 67-yard score three minutes later. Trey Sermon's 7-yard TD run tied the game before Texas drove 52 yards to set up the game-winning field goal.

Murray finished with 304 passing yards and a game-high 92 rushing yards. He was 19 for 26 through the air with four TDs and an interception, and lost his first fumble of the year in the third quarter.

Marquise Brown caught nine passes for 131 yards and two TDs, including a 77-yarder which was OU's longest-ever pass play against Texas. CeeDee Lamb caught six passes for 75 yards and a score. OU outgained Texas 532 yards to 501 (9.2 yards per play to 6.7).

FORT WORTH, Texas — Oklahoma outgained TCU 536 yards to 275 and produced a pair of 100-yard rushers in a 52-27 road win. The victory extended OU's true-road-game winning streak to a nation-leading 18 contests.

The Sooners' 52 points were tied for their most ever against TCU (also two years ago in Fort Worth) and the game marked the fourth straight in the series that OU scored at least 38 points. The Horned Frogs' 275 yards were the third fewest by an OU opponent in the 21-game Lincoln Riley era.

Kennedy Brooks ran for a career-high 168 yards on 18 carries (9.3 average) and a touchdown, and Trey Sermon added 110 yards and two TDs on 17 carries (6.5 average) as the Sooners registered a 323-112 advantage in rushing yards. Tyler Murray was 19 for 24 through the air for 213 yards and four TDs without an interception, marking the sixth straight game he has thrown for at least three scores.

CeeDee Lamb caught five passes for 91 yards and a score, while Lee Morris added two TD receptions on his two catches. Carson Meier recorded his second-career TD grab.

The Horned Frogs completed just 40 percent of their pass attempts (10 for 25) and averaged 3.7 yards per rush (long of 16). Kenneth Murray led the Sooners with 11 tackles (two for loss and one sack), and Parnell Motley recorded his third interception of the season to set up OU's final score late in the game.
