OPENING KICK

► No. 5/6 Oklahoma begins its 126th season of varsity football, and fourth under head coach **Lincoln Riley**, when it hosts Missouri State on Saturday at 6 p.m. CT at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The game will be televised on a pay-per-view basis by FOX Sports Oklahoma with **Chad McKee**, former OU co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach **Chuck Long** and **C.T. Steckel** announcing.

► Oklahoma is 96-23-6 all-time in season openers and 78-15-4 in home openers at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, which opened in 1923. OU has won 14 straight home openers (last such loss was a 17-10 defeat vs. TCU in 2005).

► OU head coach **Lincoln Riley** turned 37 on Sept. 5. He is the fifth-youngest FBS head coach.

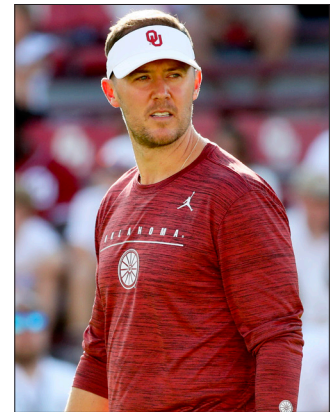
► OU is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and has done so twice (2006-08 and 2015-19). Its current streak of five straight outright league championships is the longest among Power Five programs since Alabama won five in a row from 1971 to '75 (Clemson is also riding a five-game outright streak [ACC]). The last time the Sooners won at least six consecutive conference championships was 1972-80 under head coaches **Chuck Fairbanks** (1972) and **Barry Switzer**. The last current Power Five program to win six straight outright conference titles is Oklahoma (12 in a row from 1948 to '59).

► This marks the 21st straight season the Sooners have been ranked in the preseason AP poll. They have been ranked seventh or better in 16 of the last 20 preseason polls. OU has also ended each of the last five seasons ranked in the AP top seven (first time since 2000-04 under head coach **Bob Stoops**).

► Oklahoma is the only FBS program to rack up 17 seasons of double-digit wins since 2000. OU also leads all FBS programs with its 40 all-time 10-plus-win seasons, and with its 26 campaigns of at least 11 victories.

► OU is coming off a third straight 12-2 season in which it won its fifth consecutive Big 12 championship and made its third College Football Playoff appearance in a row (fourth in five years). The Sooners, who finished No. 6 and No. 7 in the final coaches' and AP polls, respectively, produced consensus All-America wide receiver **CeeDee Lamb** and Heisman Trophy runner-up **Jalen Hurts** (quarterback).

► FCS and Missouri Valley Football Conference member Missouri State went 1-10 last season before hiring former Louisville, Arkansas, Western Kentucky and Atlanta Falcons head coach **Bobby Petrino** in January. Petrino is in his 15th year as a collegiate head coach (119-56 record; .680).



Lincoln Riley has won three Big 12 titles and made three College Football Playoffs in his three years as OU head coach.

SETTING THE STANDARD

Oklahoma is averaging a staggering 7.8 yards per play since **Lincoln Riley** arrived in Norman in 2015, almost a full yard more than the program with the next-highest total. Here are the top 10 programs in the category over the last five years:

KEY STORYLINES

► Oklahoma has won more Big 12 championships over the last 21 years (13) than it has lost home games. OU is 119-10 (.922) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season, with all 129 of those games sellouts. It is the best home winning percentage among Power Five schools over the last 21 seasons (Ohio State is next at .892). OU has outscored its opponents by an average of 43-17 in those games. No school has won more than two Big 12 titles since the Sooners won their first in 2000.

► **Lincoln Riley** owns the OU records for wins by a head coach in a debut season (12; previous record was 10 by **Barry Switzer** and **Chuck Fairbanks**), first two seasons (24; previous record was 21 by Switzer) and first three seasons (36; previous record was 32 by Switzer). Switzer holds the record for wins in the first four seasons of an OU career with 41 (1973-76).

► OU redshirt freshman quarterback **Spencer Rattler** is scheduled to make his first collegiate start Saturday. The consensus No. 1 national quarterback in the class of 2019, Rattler appeared in three games last season, completing 7 of 11 passes for 81 yards and a touchdown without an interception. He also ran three times for 23 yards. The 2018 Elite 11 MVP was the No. 9 overall national recruit by 247Sports, No. 13 by Rivals and No. 29 by ESPN. He threw for an Arizona state record 11,083 yards in his career (116 passing touchdowns) while running for over 1,000 yards (14 TDs). Rattler will be OU's fourth starting QB in four seasons (**Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** won the Heisman Trophy while **Jalen Hurts** was Heisman runner-up).

► Oklahoma has ranked in the top seven nationally in total offense each of Riley's five years calling plays and in the top three each of the last four seasons (7th in 2015 [530.2 ypg]; 2nd in 2016 [554.8]; 1st in 2017 [579.6]; 1st in 2018 [570.3]; and 3rd in 2019 [537.6]). On paper, posting similar numbers in 2020 might appear difficult, as the Sooners return just 12.9% of their total offense from last season, 6.9% of their passing yards, 20.4% of their rushing yards and 43.7% of their receiving yards.

► OU is 9-3 against programs currently in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), but has played only five such games since the start of the 1952 season. In those five contests, the Sooners beat Indiana State 49-0 in 1999 (**Bob Stoops'** first game as OU head coach), Chattanooga 57-2 in 2008, Idaho State 64-0 in 2009, Florida A&M 69-13 in 2012 and South Dakota 70-14 last year. That's a combined total of 309-29. OU is 3-2 against Drake (games played between 1920 and '26) and 1-1 versus William & Mary (games played in 1942 and '51).

WELCOME BACK

► Oklahoma returns 15 players (not including specialists) who started at least eight games last year (seven on offense and eight on defense). Thirteen of those 15 started at least 10 games (six on offense and seven on defense). OU also welcomes back kicker **Gabe Brkic**, punter **Reeves Mundschau**, long snapper **Kasey Kelleher** and primary kick returner **Tre Brown**.

► The seven returning offensive starters (at least eight starts) are redshirt junior offensive linemen **Adrian Ealy** (12 starts), **Marquis Hayes** (13 starts), **Creed Humphrey** (14 starts; 26 career) and **Tyrese Robinson** (14 starts), redshirt senior offensive lineman **Erik Swenson** (eight starts), redshirt junior tight end/H-back **Jeremiah Hall** (11 starts; 12 career) and redshirt junior wide receiver **Charleston Rambo** (14 starts).

► The eight returning defensive players (at least eight starts) are redshirt sophomore outside linebacker **Nik Bonitto** (8 starts), senior cornerback **Tre Brown** (14 starts; 22 career), junior safety **Pat Fields** (14 starts), junior defensive end **Ronnie Perkins** (13 starts; 20 career), junior defensive back **Brendan Radley-Hiles** (13 starts; 24 career), senior defensive lineman **LaRon Stokes** (10 starts), junior safety **Delarrin Turner-Yell** (13 starts) and junior linebacker **DaShaun White** (14 starts).

HUMPHREY, BRKIC NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

► Redshirt junior center **Creed Humphrey** and redshirt sophomore kicker **Gabe Brkic** each landed multiple preseason All-America honors.

► Humphrey, from Shawnee, Okla., earned preseason first-team All-America honors from the Associated Press, Sporting News and the Walter Camp Foundation. The 2019 consensus second-team All-American and first-team All-Big 12 pick was the Big 12 Co-Offensive Lineman of the Year and a finalist for the Rimington Trophy for the nation's top center after registering 98 knockdowns and not allowing a sack in his 864 plays. He has made 25 starts over the last two years, including in all 14 games in 2019. Humphrey anchored the middle of OU's O-line unit that won the Joe Moore Award in 2018 and was a semifinalist last season.

► Brkic, who hails from Chardon, Ohio, and was the only placekicker nationally who made all of his field goal and extra point tries in 2019 (69 for 69 combined), is a preseason first-team All-American by Sporting News and a second-team selection by the AP. A 2019 Lou Groza Award semifinalist and a second-team All-Big 12 pick, Brkic took over kicking duties prior to the Sooners' fourth game of the season and went 17 for 17 on field goal attempts and 52 for 52 on PATs to earn freshman All-America honors from the FWA and The Athletic, and first-team All-America honors from CBS Sports. His 103 kicking points were the most by an FBS player without a miss since at least 1996.

LEAGUE-HIGH SIX SOONERS RECEIVE PRESEASON BIG 12 HONORS

► A conference-high six Sooners received Big 12 preseason honors and five were named to the 2020 Preseason All-Big 12 Football Team that was selected by media who cover the league.

► Redshirt junior wide receiver **Charleston Rambo**, redshirt junior offensive linemen **Creed Humphrey** and **Adrian Ealy**, junior defensive end **Ronnie Perkins** and redshirt sophomore placekicker **Gabe Brkic** were among the 29 players to earn preseason all-league recognition by position. Redshirt freshman quarterback **Spencer Rattler** was selected as the Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year.

► Oklahoma's six overall player selections were the most in the league while OU and Texas tied for the most honorees on the preseason team with five. OU's four offensive players were also more than any other school (Oklahoma State had three).

CAIN, MURRAY MAKE OU COACHING DEBUTS

► Saturday's game will mark the first as Oklahoma assistant coaches for outside linebackers and defensive ends coach **Jamar Cain** and running backs coach **DeMarco Murray**. The pair was hired in January.

► Cain arrived in Norman from Arizona State where he served the 2019 season as defensive line coach. He held the same title at Fresno State during the 2017-18 seasons and spent the 2014-16 campaigns at FCS powerhouse North Dakota State coaching the defensive ends. NDSU went 40-5 during his tenure and captured the 2014 and 2015 FCS National Championships.

► Murray, who starred at running back for the Sooners from the 2007 through 2010 seasons and is OU's career leader in all-purpose yards and touchdowns, is in his second season as a collegiate coach. He served as running backs coach at Arizona in 2019. Murray enjoyed a decorated seven-year NFL career with the Dallas Cowboys, Philadelphia Eagles and Tennessee Titans (he was the 2014 NFL Offensive Player of the Year with Dallas) before serving a one-year stint as a TV analyst in the broadcast booth with FOX Sports.

YEAR TWO OF "SPEED D"

► Hired in January 2019, coordinator and safeties coach **Alex Grinch**, who was a 2019 Broyles Award semifinalist, oversaw major improvement on the defensive side of the ball last season.

► Oklahoma ranked 17th nationally in opponent third-down conversion percentage (32.2; in 2018 [before Grinch's arrival] it ranked 119th at 46.4), 17th in tackles for loss per game (7.4; in 2018 ranked 79th at 5.6), 32nd in rushing defense (134.1 ypg; in 2018 ranked 59th at 159.8), 34th in sacks per game (2.6; in 2018 ranked 49th at 2.1), 38th in total defense (356.4 ypg; in 2018 ranked 114th at 453.8), 58th in passing defense (222.4 ypg; in 2018 ranked 130th at 294.0) and 64th in scoring defense (27.3 ppg; in 2018 ranked 101st at 33.3).

► In Big 12 play, OU led the league in total defense (330.6 ypg) and passing defense (190.4 ypg), and ranked second in rushing defense (140.1 ypg), pass defense efficiency (125.7 rating) and third- and fourth-down conversion percentage (33.3 each).

► OU forced a punt on its opponent's first possession in 12 of 14 games.

► The Sooners allowed more than 6.0 yards per play just twice in their 14 games last season. In the 41 games from 2016-18, OU allowed at least 6.0 yards per play 20 times.

► Seven of OU's top 10 tacklers last season were freshmen or sophomores. Three then-sophomore defenders (S **Pat Fields**, S **Delarrin Turner-Yell** and LB **DaShaun White**) started every game, and two others (DE **Ronnie Perkins** and DB **Brendan Radley-Hiles**) each started 13. Two then-redshirt freshmen (OLB **Nik Bonitto** [eight] and DL **Jalen Redmond** [three]) and two true freshmen (CB **Jaden Davis** and OLB **David Ugwoegbu**) each started at least one.

YOUNG RUNNING BACKS ROOM

► Oklahoma, which has produced a Big 12-leading six individual 1,000-yard-rushing seasons by running backs over the past five years (the next most in the conference during that span is three) and has led the Big 12 in rushing offense in all three of **Lincoln Riley's** campaigns as head coach, will divide its carries this season among a largely inexperienced group.

► OU returns just 20.4% of its rushing yards and only 18.4% of its rushing touchdowns from last season.

► Senior **Rhamondre Stevenson** is OU's leading returning rusher. He ran 64 times for 515 yards and six TDs in his debut season last year, and his 8.0 yards per rush led the nation among players with at least 50 carries.

► Junior **T.J. Pledger** carried 10 times for 65 yards and a score while redshirt freshman **Marcus Major** ran 10 times for 28 yards in his three contests.

THE OKLAHOMA 500

Since Lincoln Riley arrived at OU ahead of the 2015 season, the Sooners have registered 500-plus yards of offense in an incredible 72.1% of their games (49 of 68). The program with the next highest percentage of 500-yard performances during the period is Texas Tech (54.1%). Only seven programs have a rate of at least 45%:

► Freshman **Seth McGowan** is a consensus four-star recruit who was rated as the nation's No. 13 running back by Rivals and No. 16 by 247Sports and ESPN. He rushed for more than 3,700 yards and 45 touchdowns at Mesquite (Texas) High School.

NO. 1 ON BOTH SIDES OF THE BALL

► The 2019 season marked the first in the 24-year history of the Big 12 the Sooners led the conference in both total offense (526.9 ypg; next most was 462.8) and total defense (330.6 ypg; next fewest was 357.6) in league play. The only other team to do it was co-national champion Nebraska in 1997.

"AIR RAID" A MISNOMER

► Fans and media have often referred to Oklahoma's offense under **Lincoln Riley** as the "Air Raid." The label is not exactly accurate, however, as the Sooners have rushed more than they've thrown in each of the five years since Riley arrived in Norman, and that's counting plays in which the quarterback was sacked as pass plays (officially they are recorded as rushes). OU's rushing play percentage was 52.6 in 2015, 57.7 in 2016, 53.1 in 2017, 54.7 in 2018 and 57.3% last season.

RILEY'S FAST START

► The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Lincoln Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4 and 36-6, he also holds the OU record for most wins by a head coach in his first two and first three seasons (**Barry Switzer** held the records of 21 and 32). No one in the last 125 years has won more games in their first three seasons as a college head coach (Penn's George Woodruff from 1892 to '94).

► Riley is one of just four FBS head coach since at least 1996 to win three conference titles in his first three years as a head coach. Marshall's Bob Pruett [1997-99], Miami's Larry Coker [2001-03] and Oregon's Chip Kelly [2009-11] also accomplished the feat.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY

► Oklahoma owns the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley still calls plays as head coach.

► Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in scoring (44.6 ppg; next most is 41.6), total offense (554.9; next most is 516.4), yards per play (7.8), touchdowns from scrimmage (382), pass efficiency rating (189.0; next best is 168.1) and yards per pass attempt (10.7), second in completion percentage (69.1), third in passing offense (321.9) and ninth in rushing offense (233.0).

► In 68 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 49 times, including in 39 of the last 51 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 24 occasions and gone over 700 yards seven times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 60 of 68 games since Riley's arrival, at least 40 points 44 times, at least 50 points 25 times and at least 60 points eight times.

► The Sooners have registered at least 700 yards of offense 13 times in their history, and seven of those occasions have come since the start of the 2015 season: 854 at Texas Tech in 2016, 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017, 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015, 733 vs. South Dakota in 2019, 710 at Kansas in 2015, 702 vs. Kansas State in 2018 and 702 vs. Oklahoma State in 2018.

RECAPPING 2019: ANOTHER BIG 12 TITLE AND CFP APPEARANCE

► The 2019 season was **Lincoln Riley's** third as Oklahoma head coach, and he made it three-for-three as far as Big 12 titles (the Sooners' fifth straight) and College Football Playoff appearances (their fourth in five years). Also for the third consecutive year, OU went 12-2 overall and 8-1 in league play. The Sooners knocked off No. 7 Baylor 30-23 in overtime in the Big 12 Championship game and earned the No. 4 seed in the CFP, losing to eventual national champion LSU in the Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl.

► Quarterback **Jalen Hurts** was OU's fifth Heisman Trophy finalist in the last four years and finished second in voting while earning second-team All-America honors from Sporting News. Wide receiver **CeeDee Lamb** was a consensus first-team All-American, while center **Creed Humphrey** was a consensus second-team pick. Linebacker **Kenneth Murray** was an AFCA second-team All-American, while kicker **Gabe Brkic**, who made all 17 of his field goal attempts and all 52 of his PATs, was named a first-team All-American as a kicker by CBS Sports and a freshman All-American by The Athletic and FWAA.

► The Sooners led the nation in 2019 in yards per play (8.0) and plays per game of at least 20 yards (7.7), and ranked third in total offense (537.6 ypg), fourth in yards per pass attempt (10.9) and passing efficiency rating (187.0), fifth in yards per rush (6.0) and third-down conversion percentage (49.7), sixth in scoring offense (42.1 ppg) and first downs (348), seventh in rushing touchdowns (38), completion percentage (.688) and touchdowns per game (5.4) and passing TDs (36). OU paced the Big 12 in all of those categories.

► Oklahoma's defense made a huge jump under first-year coordinator **Alex Grinch**, vaulting from 114th in yards

A BALANCED APPROACH

Since the start of the 2018 season, Oklahoma has recorded eight games of at least 300 passing yards and at least 300 rushing yards. The next highest total nationally is three. Oklahoma State and TCU are the only other Big 12 programs to do it once, and only two other Power Five programs (Clemson and Ohio State) have done it twice.

RILEY AMONG LEGENDS

OU is the only program nationally that can boast four coaches who each registered at least 100 career wins (Bennie Owen, 122; Bud Wilkinson, 145; Barry Switzer, 157; Bob Stoops, 190). With 36 wins, current head coach Lincoln Riley is more than a third of the way to 100 victories after just 42 games, and owns the best winning percentage of the quintet.

allowed per game in 2018 (453.8) to 38th in 2019 (356.4). The Sooners ranked 17th in opponent third-down conversion percentage (32.2), which was a significant improvement from their 119 national rank in the category in 2018 (46.4). Similarly, OU jumped from 79th in tackles for loss per game in 2018 (5.6) to 17th last season (7.4).

► In a stat that speaks to their success on both sides of the ball, the Sooners ran just 60 more plays than their opponents in 2019 (only 4.3 more per game) but outgained them by 2,537 yards, or 1.44 miles.

Here are some additional 2019 accomplishments:

► Hurts was named Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year and in June was named Big 12 Male Athlete of the Year, while defensive lineman **LaRon Stokes** was named Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year. Humphrey earned OU's fourth straight Big 12 Offensive Lineman of the Year award, sharing the honor with West Virginia's Colton McKivitz.

► The Sooners made their 21st consecutive bowl appearance, by far the longest streak in school history. The previous record was eight straight (1975-82).

► In addition to finishing as Heisman Trophy runner-up, Hurts was a finalist for the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award and Senior CLASS Award.

► The Sooners led the league with 11 first- and second-team All-Big 12 selections. First-team picks were Humphrey, Hurts, Lamb and Murray, while second-team honorees were Brkic, running back **Kennedy Brooks**, offensive lineman **Adrian Ealy**, defensive linemen **Neville Gallimore** and **Ronnie Perkins**, H-back **Jeremiah Hall** and cornerback **Parnell Motley**.

► Eighteen Sooners were named to the Academic All-Big 12 Team, including quarterback/holder **Connor McGinnis** and wide receiver **Devin Staton**, who were among the seven league players with a 4.0 GPA.

► Grinch was a semifinalist for the Frank Broyles Award (presented to the nation's best assistant coach).

► Oklahoma allowed more than 6.0 yards per play twice in its 14 games last season. In the 41 games from 2016-18, OU allowed at least 6.0 yards per play 20 times.

► At No. 12 Baylor in November, Oklahoma posted its biggest comeback victory in program history. It fell behind 28-3 against the previously unbeaten Bears and trailed 31-10 at halftime before prevailing 34-31. OU became the first team to ever beat a CFP-ranked foe when trailing by 25 or more points (teams had been 0-162).

► Hurts led the nation in yards per pass attempt (11.3; FBS record is 11.6) and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (191.2; fourth best in school history), yards per completion (16.3), points responsible for per game (22.9) and touchdowns accounted for (53), and third in total offense (367.8 ypg).

HEISMAN U

► Quarterbacks **Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** became Oklahoma's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and '18, respectively, moving the Sooners into a tie with Notre Dame and Ohio State for the most Heisman winners. Other OU winners were QB **Sam Bradford** in 2008, QB **Jason White** in 2003, RB **Billy Sims** in 1978, RB **Steve Owens** in 1969 and RB **Billy Vessels** in 1952.

► Quarterback **Jalen Hurts** was the 2019 Heisman Trophy runner-up and became Oklahoma's 11th Heisman finalist, most of any school (finalists were first named in 1982). Miami (Fla.) ranks second with nine finalists, Alabama ranks third with eight and Florida ranks fourth with seven.

► Oklahoma boasts 10 Heisman finalists in the last 20 years (since 2000), which is four more than the program with the next most during that span (Alabama has six).

► OU is the first program to ever produce five Heisman finalists in a four-year period (Hurts, Murray in 2018 [won], Mayfield in 2017 [won] and Mayfield [finished third] and receiver **Dede Westbrook** [finished fourth] in 2016). With Mayfield's and Murray's wins, Oklahoma is the only program to produce different quarterback winners in consecutive seasons.

► OU is tied for the most Heisman runners-up, as well (six). OU's second-place Heisman finishers were **Kurt Burris** (1954), **Greg Pruitt** (1972), **Sims** (1979), **Josh Heupel** (2000), **Adrian Peterson** (2004) and Hurts (2019).

► Oklahoma has produced four Heisman Trophy winners in the last 17 years. Only three other programs have produced four winners ever.

► An Oklahoma quarterback has finished in the top four of Heisman voting in each of **Lincoln Riley's** five years with the Sooners (Mayfield fourth in 2015, third in 2016 and first in 2017; Murray first in 2018; Hurst second in 2019).

RILEY SECURES ANOTHER TOP-10 RECRUITING CLASS

OU's 23-member 2020 recruiting class ranked No. 10 nationally by ESPN, giving the Sooners a fourth consecutive top-10 group. Eighteen signees ranked at least a four-star prospect on a five-star scale by 247Sports, ESPN or Rivals, while the other five earned consensus three-star designation.

The class is comprised of 12 offensive players and 11 defensive players. Ten signees enrolled at OU for the spring semester: defensive linemen **Josh Ellison** and **Perrion Winfrey** (both junior college products), cornerback **D.J. Graham**, safety **Bryson Washington**, linebacker **Shane Whitter**, tight end/H-back **Mikey Henderson**, running back **Seth McGowan**, wide receiver **Marvin Mims** and offensive linemen **Noah Nelson** and **Andrew Raym**.

OU TRIO ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT

The National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame announced the 2021 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in June and former Oklahoma standouts **Bob Stoops**, **Josh Heupel** and **Roy Williams** earned spots among the seven coaches and 78 players listed from the Football Bowl Subdivision. The announcement of the class will be made in early 2021 and the class will be officially inducted on Dec. 7, 2021, in New York City.

OU's leader in all-time wins, Stoops coached the Sooners to a 190-48 (.798) record from 1999-2016 and captured 10 Big 12 championships and the 2000 national title.

Heupel was the quarterback on OU's 2000 national championship team. He was a consensus All-American and Heisman Trophy runner-up that season.

Safety Roy Williams also starred on the 2000 squad. In 2001 he won the Nagurski Award (nation's best defensive player) and Thorpe Award (best defensive back), the same year he was a unanimous All-American.

FOUR NFL DRAFTEES; TWO IN FIRST ROUND

► Oklahoma had four players picked in the 2020 NFL Draft, and for the second straight year produced a pair of first-round selections. Wide receiver **CeeDee Lamb** (17th overall pick; Dallas) was the first Big 12 player selected, while linebacker **Kenneth Murray** (No. 23 overall pick; Los Angeles Chargers) was the first Big 12 defensive player chosen. The duo was joined in the draft by quarterback **Jalen Hurts** (second round; Philadelphia) and defensive lineman **Neville Gallimore** (third round; Dallas). Since 2000, 99 Sooners have been selected, which is 29 more than the next-closest Big 12 program during that span (Texas, 70) and 48 more than the second-closest (TCU, 51).

► Undrafted free agent cornerback **Parnell Motley**, who finished his collegiate career ranked fifth in OU history with 33 pass breakups, made the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' 53-man roster on Sept. 5.

OKLAHOMA'S BIG 12 FIVE-PEAT

► Oklahoma's 2019 Big 12 title marked the program's fifth straight league crown. The last time the Sooners won at least five consecutive conference championships was 1972-80 under head coaches **Chuck Fairbanks** (1972) and **Barry Switzer**.

► OU is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► OU's and Clemson's current streaks of five straight outright league championships are the longest among Power Five programs since Alabama won five in a row from 1971 to '75.

BIG 12'S BELL COW

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 13 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each). All 13 of the Sooners' titles have come since the start of the 2000 campaign, with no other program during that span winning more than two. OU is 140-29 (.828) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 25 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 115-54) and 46 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 94-75).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (664) than any other program (next most is 621 by Ohio State).

► Oklahoma is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 36,383 points (in 1,288 games).

► OU leads all FBS programs with 49 all-time conference championships. The rest of the top five includes Nebraska (46), Michigan (42), Ohio State (38) and USC (37). The Sooners' 13 league titles since 2000 are the most among Power Five programs (Ohio State ranks second with 10).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 40. In addition, OU's 26 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (226) and points scored (10,780).

► Only Alabama (122) and Ohio State (105) have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101).

► The Sooners have made 419 all-time appearances in the AP poll's top five, more than any other program (Alabama is next with 412 and Ohio State third with 388). That means OU has been in the top five in 36 percent of all AP polls (1,169 total polls), which started in 1936. OU has made 24 AP top-5 appearances since the start of 2017.

► Only Ohio State (640) has more all-time top-10 AP poll appearances than OU (605).

► Only Alabama (10) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

► Every Oklahoma freshman class since 1999 has won at least two conference championships. Baylor's 2011, 2012 and 2013 freshman classes are the only other ones in the Big 12 that have won two conference titles (the Bears won league crowns in 2013 and '14).

► OU has been ranked in the AP's top 10 in 54 of the last 56 polls. The only times it wasn't during that stretch was following its 2017 loss to Iowa State (fell from third to 12th) and following its 2018 loss to Texas (seventh to 11th).

► The Sooners have won 52 straight games when leading after the third quarter. The last such loss came on Dec. 6, 2014, when they led Oklahoma State 28-14 entering the fourth quarter but lost 38-35 in overtime.

► Since Lincoln Riley joined the OU program as offensive coordinator before the 2015 season, the Sooners rank third nationally by averaging 321.9 passing yards per game and lead the country in passing efficiency rating (189.0; next best is 168.1) and yards per pass attempt. During the same five-year span, OU paces the nation with eight individual 1,00-yard rushing seasons (**Samaje Perine** in 2015, Perine and **Joe Mixon** in 2016, **Rodney Anderson** in 2017, **Kennedy Brooks** and **Kyler Murray** in 2018 and Brooks and **Jalen Hurts** in 2019).

► In 68 games since **Lincoln Riley** arrived in Norman in 2015, OU has punted more than its opponent just eight times. On five of those seven occasions it was just one more punt.

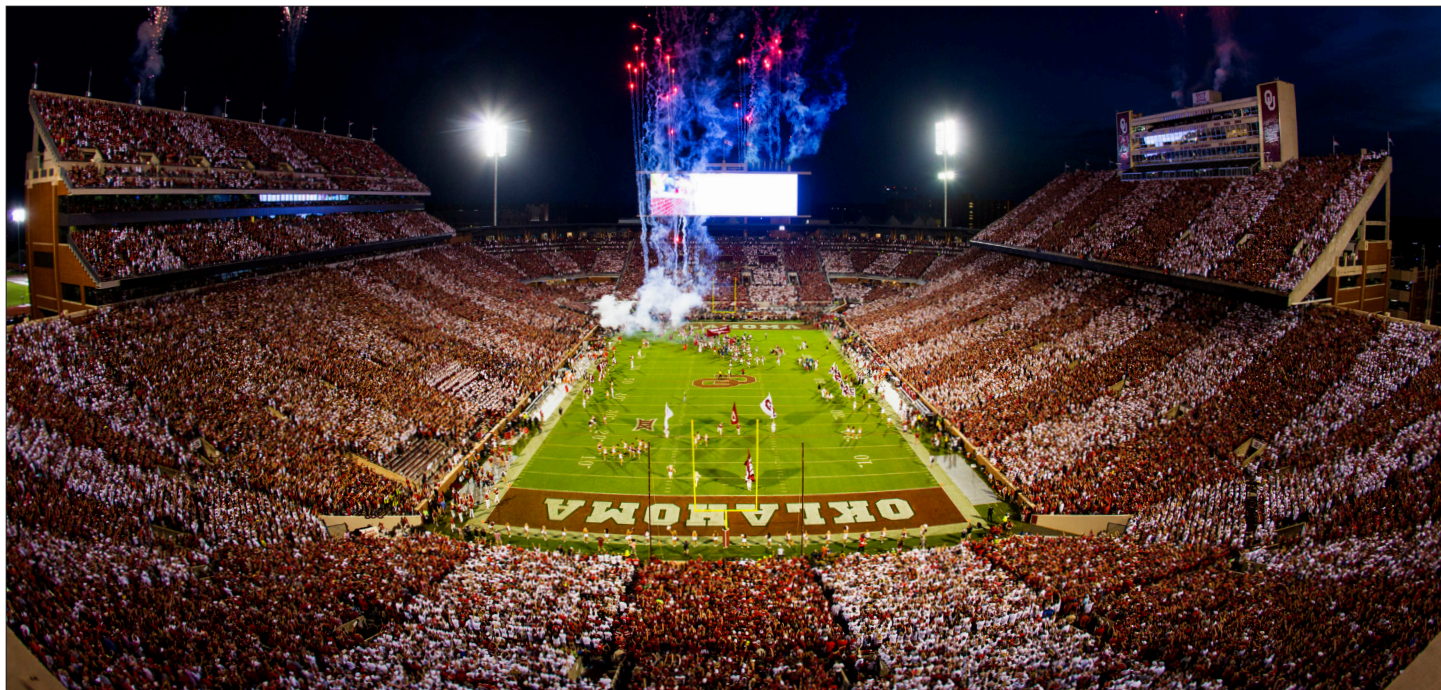
► The Sooners have won more Big 12 titles the last five seasons (five) than they have lost games against Big 12 opponents (44-4 record; includes three Big 12 Championship games).

► OU is the only program that has produced at least four NFL Draft picks each of the last 13 years.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

► Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.

► In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.

► The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).

► In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.

► Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With this year's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity has dropped to 80,126.

► In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

► The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.

► The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.

► The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.

► Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.

► All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.

► The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

► A significantly larger and more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

LINCOLN RILEY

FOURTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH • 36-6 RECORD (.857) • 2018 CO-BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR OWNS OU RECORDS FOR WINS IN DEBUT SEASON (12), FIRST TWO (24) & THREE (36) SEASONS DIRECTED SOONERS TO BIG 12 TITLES AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF BERTHS IN 2017, '18 & '19 WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH

After presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley has done in his first three years at the helm is lead the Sooners to their 11th, 12th and 13th Big 12 titles and to three College Football Playoff berths. He was also named the 2018 Co-Big 12 Coach of the Year.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4 and 36-6, he also holds the OU record for most wins by a head coach in his first two and first three seasons (Barry Switzer held the records of 21 and 32). No one has won more games in their first three seasons as a college head coach since Penn's George Woodruff from 1892 to '94.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing an explosive — and balanced — OU offense the last five seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in scoring (44.6 ppg; next most is 41.6), total offense (554.9; next most is 516.4), yards per play (7.8), touchdowns from scrimmage (382), pass efficiency rating (189.0; next best is 168.1) and yards per pass attempt (10.7), second in completion percentage (69.1), third in passing offense (321.9) and ninth in rushing offense (233.0). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 58-10 (.853) record since his arrival (41-5 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Clemson (69-5), Alabama (66-6) and Ohio State (61-7) having better records.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have poured in under Riley, highlighted by quarterbacks Baker Mayfield and Kyler Murray becoming OU's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and 2018. QB Jalen Hurts was the 2019 Heisman runner-up. Mayfield also won the Maxwell, Davey O'Brien, Manning and Walter Camp Player of the Year Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft. Murray also won the O'Brien and Manning Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft. Receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Eight Sooners have earned first-team All-America honors the last three years. Running back Joe Mixon set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offense scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

In addition to overseeing Mayfield's and Murray's record-setting careers, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.
