OPENING KICK

► In a matchup of the Big 12's two most successful programs, Oklahoma (1-2, 0-2) meets No. 22/22 Texas (2-1, 1-1) for the 116th time on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT. The AT&T Red River Showdown, played in Dallas for the 92nd straight year, will be televised by FOX with **Gus Johnson**, **Joel Klatt** and **Jenny Taft** announcing. OU is the designated home team.

► Oklahoma has won 13 Big 12 titles in the first 24 years of the league, with no other program during that span winning more than three. All 13 of OU's Big 12 titles have come in the last 20 years, with no other program winning more than two during the span. Texas ranks second with three Big 12 titles (last one in 2009; OU has won seven since then).

► This year's OU-Texas game marks the first since 2009 in which the Longhorns are ranked higher than the Sooners in the AP poll. This is the first year since 2005 that OU is unranked in the AP poll the week of the Red River Showdown.

► Texas is the only Big 12 program with a winning record against the Sooners. Oklahoma trails 62-48-5 in the series but owns a 27-20-3 advantage since 1971. In the Big 12 era, OU is 15-10 against the Longhorns and has won eight of the last 11 meetings and 14 of the last 21. The only other period Oklahoma won at least eight Red River matchups in an 11-or-fewer-game span was in the 1940s and '50s when **Bud Wilkinson's** Sooners won nine out of 10 meetings from 1948-57.

► Dating back to the start of the 2012 season, the Sooners are 40-8 (.833) in regular season games away from home. OU has scored at least 30 points in 41 of those 48 contests.

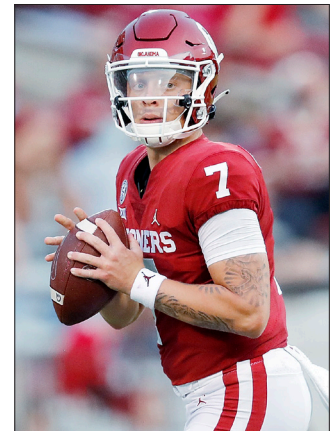
► OU has scored at least 28 points in a school-record 55 consecutive games. The next longest streak nationally since at least 1980 is 31 by UCF (2017-19). The next longest active streak is 17 games by Ohio State.

► Since 2000, Oklahoma has lost its game immediately prior to the Red River contest just three times, but beat the Longhorns on all three occasions (28-21 in 2007, 31-26 in 2014 and 29-24 in 2017).

► This marks the first time since Sept. 25, 2016, that OU is not ranked in the AP Top 25. The Sooners had appeared in 64 straight AP polls prior to this week, which was the third longest streak nationally (Alabama has a streak of 201 consecutive appearances and Clemson has a streak of 90) and the sixth longest in program history.

KEY STORYLINES

► **Lincoln Riley** is looking to become just the second head coach in Oklahoma history to win at least four of his first five games against Texas. **Bob Stoops** went 4-1 in his first five games vs. the Longhorns (1999-03).



Spencer Rattler is looking to join **Justin Fuente** (1996) and **Sam Bradford** (2007) as the only OU quarterbacks to beat Texas as a freshman starter (like Rattler, Fuente and Bradford were redshirt freshmen those seasons). Rattler is tied for second nationally with his 10 touchdown passes and ranks eighth with his 325.7 passing yards per game.

RECENT RULE

Going back to (and including) the 2000 meeting, Oklahoma has outscored Texas by 162 points in games played at the Cotton Bowl. The Sooners have a 13-7 record in those games, and also beat the Longhorns 39-27 in the 2018 Big 12 Championship in Arlington, Texas. OU has won eight of the last 11 overall matchups and 14 of the last 21.

► Redshirt freshman **Spencer Rattler** is slated to become Oklahoma's sixth freshman quarterback to start vs. Texas. The previous five QBs (also redshirt freshmen) went 2-2-1 as in their first Red River contests. The others were **Tink Collins** in 1989 (OU lost 28-24), **Eric Moore** in 1995 (tied 24-24), **Justin Fuente** in 1996 (OU won 30-27 in overtime), **Rhett Bomar** in 2005 (OU lost 45-12) and **Sam Bradford** in 2007 (OU won 28-21).

► Saturday's game will feature the two most statistically productive quarterbacks in the Big 12. Rattler leads the league in passing offense (325.7 ypg; ranks ninth nationally) and passing efficiency rating (187.3; seventh nationally) while ranking second in total offense (331.0 ypg; 10th nationally). He also ranks sixth nationally with his 73.4 completion percentage (the OU single-season record is 70.9 by Baker Mayfield in 2016). Texas senior **Sam Ehlinger** leads the Big 12 in total offense (351.3 ypg; ranks sixth nationally) while ranking second in passing offense (308.0 ypg; 11th nationally) and passing efficiency rating (173.2; eighth nationally). Ehlinger leads the nation with 14 touchdown passes while Rattler is tied for second with 10. Rattler did not play the second half of the season opener against Missouri State, while Ehlinger only played one series after halftime in UT's opener against UTEP.

► The last time Oklahoma started a season 1-2 was 2016. That team was victorious in its final nine games to finish 10-2, won Big 12 and Sugar Bowl titles and earned a final No. 5 AP ranking. It was Stoops' final year at the Sooners' helm.

► This year's Oklahoma squad is looking to become the fifth in program history to win a conference title with two league losses. The four occasions it happened were in 1976 (5-2 in Big Eight; shared with Colorado and Oklahoma State) and 2002, 2007 and 2010 (6-2 in Big 12; won Big 12 Championship games). No OU team has ever won a conference title after a 0-2 league start and no Sooners squad has ever won a conference championship with three league losses.

RECAPPING SATURDAY'S IOWA STATE GAME

► Oklahoma suffered consecutive regular season losses for the first time since 1999 in a 37-30 defeat at Iowa State on Saturday. The Sooners led 17-6, fell behind 23-20 and went back up 30-23 in the fourth quarter before the Cyclones scored the contest's final 14 points.

► The loss snapped OU's 24-game winning streak in Ames (it hadn't lost there since Nov. 3, 1960) and resulted in the program's first 0-2 conference start since 1998 when it began with a 0-4 Big 12 mark.

► Quarterback **Spencer Rattler** was 25 for 36 for 300 yards, two touchdowns and one interception, and scored the first rushing TD of his career on a five-yard plunge in the first quarter. His touchdown throws went to tight end/H-back **Jeremiah Hall** on plays of four and three yards. The second one put the Sooners up 30-23 with 8:17 remaining in the fourth quarter and came just four plays after **Isaiah Thomas** registered a strip sack on ISU quarterback **Brock Purdy** that OU's **Josh Ellison** recovered.

► Sophomore tight end/H-back **Austin Stogner** caught a career-high-tying five passes for the second straight week for a team-high 74 yards while redshirt junior receiver **Charleston Rambo** had four receptions for 61 yards. Hall's career-high five catches totaled 37 yards.

► Linebackers **DaShaun White** and **Brian Asamoah** led the team with seven tackles each. White had 2.0 of the team's four tackles for loss.

► Redshirt sophomore kicker **Gabe Brkic** missed a kick for the first time of his career, a 54-yard field goal attempt at the end of the first half. He converted attempts of 18, 33 and 51 yards, and is now 20 for 21 in his career. His 51-yarder in the fourth quarter tied the game at 23 with 12:48 to go and was OU's longest since 2017.

► Redshirt sophomore receiver **Drake Stoops** and junior defensive lineman **Perrion Winfrey** made their first career starts. Redshirt senior receiver **Obi Obialo** saw his first action of the season after transferring from Marshall.

LAST YEAR VS. TEXAS

► **CeeDee Lamb** made a career-high 10 catches for 171 yards and a career-high-tying three touchdowns and No. 6/5 Oklahoma tied a school record with nine sacks in a 34-27 victory over No. 11/11 Texas in the Cotton Bowl on Oct. 12, 2019. It marked OU's eighth win over the Longhorns in the last 11 meetings and 14th in the last 21.

► The Sooners' defense also recorded 15 tackles for loss, their second most ever against Texas. Eight OU players registered a sack, 14 recorded at least half a tackle for loss and 23 players were credited with at least one tackle.

► OU outgained Texas 511-310 in total yards (7.7 yards per play to 4.2).

► **Jalen Hurts** (Big 12 Co-Newcomer of the Week) carried the ball 17 times for 131 yards (the most rushing yards by an OU quarterback vs. Texas and a Cotton Bowl Stadium collegiate record by a QB) and a 3-yard fourth-quarter touchdown. He was 16 for 28 through the air for 235 yards, three TDs and an interception.

► Lamb's touchdowns covered 1 yard (fourth-down play in first quarter), 51 yards (third quarter; beat five defenders) and 27 yards (fourth quarter; broke two tackles). He made 10 of OU's 16 receptions on the day and moved into sole possession of third place on OU's career receiving TDs list with 28. He was named Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week and Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week.

► **Kennedy Brooks** joined Hurts by surpassing the 100-yard rushing mark with 105 yards on 10 carries.

► Safety **Delarrin Turner-Yell** recorded a career-high 10 tackles and a tackle for loss. Linebacker **Kenneth Murray** (Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week) had five solo tackles, a sack and two TFLs. Defensive lineman **Neville Gallimore** registered a team-high two sacks (four total tackles).

YEAR TWO OF "SPEED D"

► Hired in January 2019, coordinator and safeties coach **Alex Grinch**, who was a 2019 Broyles Award semifinalist, oversaw major improvement on the defensive side of the ball last season.

► Oklahoma ranked 17th nationally in opponent third-down conversion percentage (32.2; in 2018 [before Grinch's arrival] it ranked 119th at 46.4), 17th in tackles for loss per game (7.4; in 2018 ranked 79th at 5.6), 32nd in rushing defense (134.1 ypg; in 2018 ranked 59th at 159.8), 34th in sacks per game (2.6; in 2018 ranked 49th at 2.1), 38th in total defense (356.4 ypg; in 2018 ranked 114th at 453.8), 58th in passing defense (222.4 ypg; in 2018 ranked 130th at 294.0) and 64th in scoring defense (27.3 ppg; in 2018 ranked 101st at 33.3).

► In Big 12 play, OU led the league in total defense (330.6 ypg) and passing defense (190.4 ypg), and ranked second in rushing defense (140.1 ypg), pass defense efficiency (125.7 rating) and third- and fourth-down conversion percentage (33.3 each).

► OU forced a punt on its opponent's first possession in 12 of 14 games.

► The Sooners allowed more than 6.0 yards per play just twice in their 14 games last season. In the 41 games from 2016-18, OU allowed at least 6.0 yards per play 20 times.

► Seven of OU's top 10 tacklers last season were freshmen or sophomores. Three then-sophomore defenders (S **Pat Fields**, S **Delarrin Turner-Yell** and LB **DaShaun White**) started every game, and two others (DE **Ronnie Perkins** and DB **Brendan Radley-Hiles**) each started 13.

► So far this season, Oklahoma ranks sixth nationally in opponent third-down conversion percentage (25.0), eighth in rushing defense (81.7 ypg; leads Big 12), 14th in total defense (314.0 ypg), 20th in opponent pass completion percentage (56.9) and 31st in passing defense (232.3 ypg).

SNAKE IN THE GRASS

► Redshirt freshman **Spencer Rattler**, the consensus No. 1 quarterback in the 2019 recruiting class, threw for a state-record 11,083 yards (116 passing touchdowns) and ran for over 1,000 yards (14 TDs) in his career at Pinnacle High School in Phoenix, Ariz. The 2018 Elite 11 MVP was the No. 9 overall national recruit by 247Sports, No. 13 by Rivals and No. 29 by ESPN.

► Rattler appeared in three Oklahoma games last season, completing 7 of 11 passes for 81 yards and a touchdown without an interception. He also ran three times for 23 yards.

► Rattler is OU's fourth starting QB in four seasons. **Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** won the Heisman Trophy in 2017 and 2018, respectively, while **Jalen Hurts** was the 2019 Heisman runner-up.

► So far this season, Rattler is tied for second nationally in touchdown passes (10) and ranks sixth in completion percentage (73.4) and yards per pass attempt (10.4), seventh in passing efficiency rating (187.3), eighth in passing offense (325.7 ypg) and ninth in total offense (331.0 ypg).

► In his starting debut in the season opener against Missouri State, Rattler completed 14 of 17 passes for 290 yards and four touchdowns (no interceptions) in only one half of work. He followed with 30-for-41 effort for 387 yards and four more TDs (three interceptions) against Kansas State, and a 25-for-36 performance for 300 yards and two TDs (one interception) at Iowa State. In the first half of play, he has completed 83.0% of his passes (44 of 53) for 672 yards and eight TDs.

YOUNG RUNNING BACKS ROOM

► Oklahoma, which has produced a Big 12-high six individual 1,000-yard-rushing seasons by running backs over the past five years (the next most in the league during that span is three) and has led the Big 12 in rushing offense in all three of **Lincoln Riley's** campaigns as head coach, is dividing its carries in 2020 among a largely inexperienced group.

► OU returned just 20.4% of its rushing yards and only 18.4% of its rushing touchdowns from last season.

► Senior **Rhamondre Stevenson** is OU's leading returning rusher, but has yet to play this season. He ran 64 times for 515 yards and six TDs in his debut season last year, and his 8.0 yards per rush led the nation among players with at least 50 carries.

► Junior **T.J. Pledger** carried 10 times for 65 yards and a score last season while redshirt freshman **Marcus Major**

ran 10 times for 28 yards in his three contests. Pledger missed this year's opener against Missouri State before starting against Kansas State and Iowa State (88 yards on 24 carries combined). Major ran 11 times for 31 yards against Missouri State but has not had a carry since.

► Freshman **Seth McGowan** is a consensus four-star recruit who was rated as the nation's No. 13 running back by Rivals and No. 16 by 247Sports and ESPN after rushing for more than 3,700 yards and 45 touchdowns at Mesquite Poteet High School in Texas. He's led OU in rushing in all three games this season (61 vs. Missouri State, 73 vs. Kansas State and 47 at Iowa State [tied with Pledger]) and has a team-high three rushing TDs.

FOOT NOTE

► During **Lincoln Riley's** three-plus-year head coaching career, Oklahoma ranks second nationally with its 86.6% success rate on field goal attempts (58 for 67). The Sooners trail only Florida, which has converted 91.8% of its tries (56 for 61) since the start of the 2017 season. TCU is the next best Big 12 school in the category during the span (81.4%; 57 of 70).

► During the same period, the Sooners rank third nationally in PAT conversion percentage among teams with at least 150 attempts, converting 258 of 259 tries (99.6%). Only Georgia (181 for 181) and Utah State (170 for 170) have higher success rates.

HUMPHREY, BRKIC NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

► Redshirt junior center **Creed Humphrey** and redshirt sophomore kicker **Gabe Brkic** each landed multiple preseason All-America honors.

► Humphrey, from Shawnee, Okla., earned preseason first-team All-America honors from the Associated Press, Sporting News and the Walter Camp Foundation. The 2019 consensus second-team All-American and first-team All-Big 12 pick was the Big 12 Co-Offensive Lineman of the Year and a finalist for the Rimington Trophy for the nation's top center after registering 98 knockdowns and not allowing a sack in his 864 plays. He has made 25 starts over the last two years, including in all 14 games in 2019. Humphrey anchored the middle of OU's O-line unit that won the Joe Moore Award in 2018 and was a semifinalist last season.

► Brkic, who hails from Chardon, Ohio, and was the only placekicker nationally who made all of his field goal and extra point tries in 2019 (69 for 69 combined), is a preseason first-team All-American by Sporting News and a second-team selection by the AP. A 2019 Lou Groza Award semifinalist and a second-team All-Big 12 pick, Brkic took over kicking duties prior to the Sooners' fourth game of the season and went 17 for 17 on field goal attempts and 52 for 52 on PATs to earn freshman All-America honors from the FWAA and The Athletic, and first-team All-America honors from CBS Sports. His 103 kicking points were the most by an FBS player without a miss since at least 1996.

LEAGUE-HIGH SIX SOONERS RECEIVE PRESEASON BIG 12 HONORS

► A conference-high six Sooners received Big 12 preseason honors and five were named to the 2020 Preseason All-Big 12 Football Team that was selected by media who cover the league.

► Redshirt junior wide receiver **Charleston Rambo**, redshirt junior offensive linemen **Creed Humphrey** and **Adrian Ealy**, junior defensive end **Ronnie Perkins** and redshirt sophomore placekicker **Gabe Brkic** were among the 29 players to earn preseason all-league recognition by position. Redshirt freshman quarterback **Spencer Rattler** was selected as the Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year.

► Oklahoma's six overall player selections were the most in the league while OU and Texas tied for the most honorees on the preseason team with five. OU's four offensive players were also more than any other school (Oklahoma State had three).

YOU'RE IN GOOD HANDS WITH SYLVIE

► Redshirt senior defensive back **Chanse Sylvie** became the sixth Sooner to ever be named to the 2020 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, the organizations announced Sept. 23. He is one of 11 FBS recipients of the honor, which is presented to players for their extraordinary commitment to making a lasting impact off the field and for their contributions to the community and world at large.

► Since this past spring, Sylvie has taken on a prominent role in advocating for police reform. He developed a plan of action that received the attention of media, local authorities and politicians. He met with Oklahoma state representatives, the Norman Police Department and City of Norman officials. The 2018 OU graduate with a political science degree who is pursuing his master's in global affairs also established the OneMindset Foundation in his hometown of Shreveport, La., with the purpose of empowering the betterment of the community. In addition, he was selected by the mayor of Shreveport to serve on the city's young adult action committee.

► Other Oklahoma football players named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team are **Jacob Gutierrez** (2006), **Nic Harris** (2007), **Gerald McCoy** (2008), **Quinton Carter** (2010) and **Caleb Kelly** (2018).

"AIR RAID" A MISNOMER

► Fans and media have often referred to Oklahoma's offense under **Lincoln Riley** as the "Air Raid." The label is not exactly accurate, however, as the Sooners have rushed more than they've thrown in each of the five years since Riley arrived in Norman, and that's counting plays in which the quarterback was sacked as pass plays (officially they are recorded as rushes). OU's rushing play percentage was 52.6 in 2015, 57.7 in 2016, 53.1 in 2017, 54.7 in 2018 and 57.3 last season. This season has been different so far, with the Sooners running only 43.5 percent of the time.

RILEY AMONG LEGENDS

OU is the only program nationally that can boast four coaches who each registered at least 100 career wins (Bennie Owen, 122; Bud Wilkinson, 145; Barry Switzer, 157; Bob Stoops, 190). With 37 wins, current head coach Lincoln Riley is more than a third of the way to 100 victories after just 45 games.

NO. 1 ON BOTH SIDES OF THE BALL

► The 2019 season marked the first in the 24-year history of the Big 12 the Sooners led the conference in both total offense (526.9 ypg; next most was 462.8) and total defense (330.6 ypg; next fewest was 357.6) in league play. The only other team to do it was co-national champion Nebraska in 1997.

RILEY'S FAST START

► The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Lincoln Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4 and 36-6, he also holds the OU record for most wins by a head coach in his first two and first three seasons (Barry Switzer held the records of 21 and 32). No one in the last 125 years won more games in their first three seasons as a college head coach (Penn's George Woodruff was the last from 1892 to '94).

► Riley is one of just four FBS head coach since at least 1996 to win three conference titles in his first three years as a head coach. Marshall's Bob Pruett [1997-99], Miami's Larry Coker [2001-03] and Oregon's Chip Kelly [2009-11] also accomplished the feat.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY

► Oklahoma owns the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was Lincoln Riley's first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley still calls plays as head coach.

► Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in scoring (44.4 ppg; next most is 41.3), total offense (553.1; next most is 516.2), yards per play (7.8; next most is 6.9), touchdowns from scrimmage (396), pass efficiency rating (188.8; next best is 169.3) and yards per pass attempt (10.7), second in completion percentage (69.4), third in passing offense (324.8) and 10th in rushing offense (228.3).

► In 71 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 51 times (next most is 41), including in 41 of the last 54 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 25 occasions and gone over 700 yards seven times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 63 of 71 games since Riley's arrival, at least 40 points 45 times, at least 50 points 25 times and at least 60 points eight times.

► The Sooners have registered at least 700 yards of offense 13 times in their history, and seven of those occasions have come since the start of the 2015 season: 854 at Texas Tech in 2016, 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017, 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015, 733 vs. South Dakota in 2019, 710 at Kansas in 2015, 702 vs. Kansas State in 2018 and 702 vs. Oklahoma State in 2018.

HEISMAN U

► Quarterbacks Baker Mayfield and Kyler Murray became Oklahoma's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and '18, respectively, moving the Sooners into a tie with Notre Dame and Ohio State for the most Heisman winners. Other OU winners were QB Sam Bradford in 2008, QB Jason White in 2003, RB Billy Sims in 1978, RB Steve Owens in 1969 and RB Billy Vessels in 1952.

► Quarterback Jalen Hurts was the 2019 Heisman Trophy runner-up and became Oklahoma's 11th Heisman finalist, most of any school (finalists were first named in 1982). Miami (Fla.) ranks second with nine finalists, Alabama ranks third with eight and Florida ranks fourth with seven.

► Oklahoma boasts 10 Heisman finalists in the last 20 years (since 2000), which is four more than the program with the next most during that span (Alabama has six).

► OU is the first program to ever produce five Heisman finalists in a four-year period (Hurts, Murray in 2018 [won], Mayfield in 2017 [won] and Mayfield [finished third] and receiver Dede Westbrook [finished fourth] in 2016). With Mayfield's and Murray's wins, Oklahoma is the only program to produce different quarterback winners in consecutive seasons.

► OU is tied for the most Heisman runners-up, as well (six). OU's second-place Heisman finishers were Kurt Burris (1954), Greg Pruitt (1972), Sims (1979), Josh Heupel (2000), Adrian Peterson (2004) and Hurts (2019).

► Oklahoma has produced four Heisman Trophy winners in the last 17 years. Only three other programs have produced four winners ever.

► An Oklahoma quarterback has finished in the top four of Heisman voting in each of Lincoln Riley's five years with the Sooners (Mayfield fourth in 2015, third in 2016 and first in 2017; Murray first in 2018; Hurts second in 2019).

FOUR NFL DRAFTEES; TWO IN FIRST ROUND

► Oklahoma had four players picked in the 2020 NFL Draft, and for the second straight year produced a pair of first-round selections. Wide receiver CeeDee Lamb (17th overall pick; Dallas) was the first Big 12 player selected, while linebacker Kenneth Murray (No. 23 overall pick; Los Angeles Chargers) was the first Big 12 defensive player chosen. The duo was joined in the draft by quarterback Jalen Hurts (second round; Philadelphia) and defensive lineman Neville Gallimore (third round; Dallas). Since 2000, 99 Sooners have been selected, which is 29 more than the next-closest Big 12 program during that span (Texas, 70) and 48 more than the second-closest (TCU, 51).

RILEY SECURES ANOTHER TOP-10 RECRUITING CLASS

OU's 23-member 2020 recruiting class ranked No. 10 nationally by ESPN, giving the Sooners a fourth consecutive top-10 group. Eighteen signees ranked at least a four-star prospect on a five-star scale by 247Sports, ESPN or Rivals, while the other five earned consensus three-star designation.

The class is comprised of 12 offensive players and 11 defensive players. Ten signees enrolled at OU for the spring semester: defensive linemen **Josh Ellison** and **Perrion Winfrey** (both junior college products), cornerback **D.J. Graham**, safety **Bryson Washington**, linebacker **Shane Whitter**, tight end/H-back **Mikey Henderson**, running back **Seth McGowan**, wide receiver **Marvin Mims** and offensive linemen **Noah Nelson** and **Andrew Raym**.

OU TRIO ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT

The National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame announced the 2021 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in June and former Oklahoma standouts **Bob Stoops**, **Josh Heupel** and **Roy Williams** earned spots among the seven coaches and 78 players listed from the Football Bowl Subdivision. The announcement of the class will be made in early 2021 and the class will be officially inducted on Dec. 7, 2021, in New York City.

OU's leader in all-time wins, Stoops coached the Sooners to a 190-48 (.798) record from 1999-2016 and captured 10 Big 12 championships and the 2000 national title.

Heupel was the quarterback on OU's 2000 national championship team. He was a consensus All-American and Heisman Trophy runner-up that season.

Safety Roy Williams also starred on the 2000 squad. In 2001 he won the Nagurski Award (nation's best defensive player) and Thorpe Award (best defensive back), the same year he was a unanimous All-American.

► Undrafted free agent cornerback **Parnell Motley**, who finished his collegiate career ranked fifth in OU history with 33 pass breakups, made the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' 53-man roster.

OKLAHOMA'S BIG 12 FIVE-PEAT

► Oklahoma's 2019 Big 12 title marked the program's fifth straight league crown. The last time OU won at least five consecutive conference championships was 1972-80 under head coaches **Chuck Fairbanks** (1972) and **Barry Switzer**.

► OU is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► OU's and Clemson's current streaks of five straight outright league championships are the longest among Power Five programs since Alabama won five in a row from 1971 to '75. The last current Power Five program to win six straight outright conference titles is Oklahoma (12 in a row from 1948 to '59).

BIG 12'S BELL COW

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 13 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each). All 13 of the Sooners' titles have come since the start of the 2000 campaign, with no other program during that span winning more than two. OU is 140-31 (.819) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 24 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 116-55) and 44 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 96-75).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (665) than any other program (next most is 621 by Ohio State).

► Oklahoma is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 36,496 points (in 1,291 games).

► OU leads all FBS programs with 49 all-time conference championships. The rest of the top five includes Nebraska (46), Michigan (42), Ohio State (38) and USC (37). The Sooners' 13 league titles since 2000 are the most among Power Five programs (Ohio State ranks second with 10).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 40 (including a nation-leading 17 since 2000). In addition, OU's 26 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (227) and points scored (10,893).

► Only Alabama (122) and Ohio State (105) have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101).

► The Sooners have made 421 all-time appearances in the AP poll's top five, more than any other program (Alabama is next with 416 and Ohio State third with 388). That means OU has been in the top five in 36 percent of all AP polls (1,173 total polls), which started in 1936. OU has made 26 AP top-5 appearances since the start of 2017.

► Only Ohio State (642) has more all-time top-10 AP poll appearances than OU (607).

► Only Alabama (10) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

► Oklahoma has won five of its last six meetings vs. Texas as the designated home team (that includes the 2018 Big 12 Championship game).

► First-year OU running backs coach **DeMarco Murray** played in four Red River Showdowns (2007-10), accounting for 670 all-purpose yards (254 rushing yards [three touchdowns], 203 receiving yards and 220 kickoff return yards). He was particularly effective in OU's two wins, rushing 17 times for 128 yards and a TD as a freshman in a 28-21 victory and rushing 25 times for 115 yards and two scores as a senior in a 28-20 triumph.

► Junior linebacker **DaShaun White** is tied for fourth in the Big 12 with his 2.5 sacks.

► Sooners freshman **Marvin Mims** has a team-high-tying three touchdown catches and registered those over the first two contests. He became the program's first player since redshirt freshman receiver **Ryan Broyles** in 2008 to register three TD receptions in his first two career games (Broyles is OU's career records holder for receptions, receiving yards and receiving TDs). Mims, who attended Lone Star High School in Frisco, Texas, is the state's high school record holder for receiving yards in a career (5,485) and in a season (2,629 on 117 receptions and 32 touchdowns last year). He has 11 catches for 144 yards this season.

► Oklahoma has absolutely dominated the first quarter this season, outscoring Missouri State (31-0), Kansas State (7-0) and Iowa State (10-3) by a combined 48-3 margin. The Sooners have limited the three opponents to 125 total yards on 40 plays (3.1 average) in the opening 15 minutes. OU holds a 79-20 first-half scoring advantage and has given up just 348 yards on 75 plays (4.6 average) in the opening half of play.

► Every Oklahoma freshman class since 1999 has won at least two Big 12 championships. Baylor's 2011, 2012 and 2013 freshman classes are the only other ones that have won two Big 12 titles (BU won league crowns in 2013 and '14).

► OU has ranked in the top seven nationally in total offense each of **Lincoln Riley's** five years calling plays and in the top three each of the last four seasons (7th in 2015 [530.2 ypg]; 2nd in 2016 [554.8]; 1st in 2017 [579.6]; 1st in 2018 [570.3]; and 3rd in 2019 [537.6]).

► OU is the only program that has produced at least four NFL Draft picks each of the last 13 years.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- ▶ Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- ▶ In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- ▶ The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- ▶ In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- ▶ Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With this year's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity has dropped to 80,126.
- ▶ In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

- ▶ The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- ▶ The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- ▶ The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.
- ▶ Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- ▶ All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- ▶ The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.
- ▶ A significantly larger and more more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

LINCOLN RILEY

FOURTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH • 37-8 RECORD (.822) • 2018 CO-BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR OWNS OU RECORDS FOR WINS IN DEBUT SEASON (12), FIRST TWO (24) & THREE (36) SEASONS DIRECTED SOONERS TO BIG 12 TITLES AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF BERTHS IN 2017, '18 & '19 WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH

After presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley has done in his first three years at the helm is lead the Sooners to their 11th, 12th and 13th Big 12 titles and to three College Football Playoff berths. He was also named the 2018 Co-Big 12 Coach of the Year.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4 and 36-6, he also holds the OU record for most wins by a head coach in his first two and first three seasons (Barry Switzer held the records of 21 and 32). No one has won more games in their first three seasons as a college head coach since Penn's George Woodruff from 1892 to '94.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing an explosive — and balanced — OU offense the last five seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in scoring (44.4 ppg; next most is 41.3), total offense (553.1; next most is 516.2), yards per play (7.8), touchdowns from scrimmage (396), pass efficiency rating (188.8; next best is 169.3) and yards per pass attempt (10.7), second in completion percentage (69.4), third in passing offense (324.8) and ninth in rushing offense (228.3). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 59-12 (.831) record since his arrival (41-7 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Clemson (72-5), Alabama (68-6) and Ohio State (61-7) owning better records.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have poured in under Riley, highlighted by quarterbacks Baker Mayfield and Kyler Murray becoming OU's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and 2018. QB Jalen Hurts was the 2019 Heisman runner-up. Mayfield also won the Maxwell, Davey O'Brien, Manning and Walter Camp Player of the Year Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft. Murray also won the O'Brien and Manning Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft. Receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Eight Sooners have earned first-team All-America honors the last three years. Running back Joe Mixon set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

In addition to overseeing Mayfield's and Murray's record-setting careers, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

NORMAN — Oklahoma outgained FCS foe Missouri State by 473 yards (608-135) and posted its first shutout since 2015 in a 48-0 season-opening win.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Spencer Rattler was stellar in his first career start, completing 14 of 17 passes for 290 yards and four touchdowns without an interception in just one half of work. He helped stake the Sooners to a 31-0 first-quarter lead and to a 41-0 halftime advantage, and was named Big 12 Rookie of the Week.

Rattler's 303.3 passing efficiency rating set OU and Big 12 freshman records, and he set school frosh standards for yards per completion (23.7) and yards per pass attempt (17.1). He became the second OU freshman QB in his starting debut (Sam Bradford) with two TD passes of at least 50 yards (58 to freshman Marvin Mims and 53 to redshirt junior Charleston Rambo). Mims finished with 80 receiving yards and 68 punt return yards, good for 148 all-purpose yards, second most by an OU freshman in a career debut. Fellow true freshman Seth McGowan paced the Sooners with 61 rushing yards on 11 carries and tallied a 1-yard TD run and a 37-yard TD reception.

Oklahoma started the game with seven straight three-and-outs on defense and seven straight scores on offense. It held MSU to seven first downs and forced nine punts. Junior safety Delarrin Turner-Yell registered his first career interception in the third quarter and returned it 42 yards.

Redshirt senior kicker Stephen Johnson, who played in place of preseason All-American Gabe Brkic, was named Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week after making both of his field goal attempts (42 and 22 yards) and all five of his PAT tries.

NORMAN — Oklahoma outgained Kansas State by 117 yards (517-400), had 28 first downs to the Wildcats' 10 and held KSU to a 2-for-11 performance on third downs, but was outscored 17-0 in the fourth quarter in a 38-35 home loss.

The Sooners held leads of 28-7 and 35-14, but four turnovers and a fourth quarter that included a blocked punt, two more punts and an interception spelled doom for OU. K-State became the first program since 2013 and '14 to post wins in consecutive seasons over the Sooners.

Quarterback Spencer Rattler completed 30 of 41 passes on the day for a career-high 387 yards and four touchdowns against three interceptions. He became only the fourth OU quarterback to throw at least eight TD passes in his first two career starts, joining Josh Heupel in 1999 (eight), Sam Bradford in 2007 (eight) and Landry Jones in 2009 (nine).

Rattler threw touchdown passes to freshman Marvin Mims (11 and 9 yards), redshirt sophomore Drake Stoops (32 yards; first of his career) and Jeremiah Hall (21 yards) to give OU a 28-7 with 6:35 to go in the third quarter. The Sooners pushed their lead to 35-14 when freshman Seth McGowan registered a 5-yard TD run with 2:46 to go in the third. But the Wildcats scored the game's final 24 points, knocking the score with 8:17 left and taking the lead on a 50-yard field goal with 4:32 remaining.

AMES, Iowa — Oklahoma dropped consecutive regular season games for the first time since 1999 and lost at Iowa State for the first time since 1960 with a 37-30 defeat.

OU led 17-6 before falling behind 23-20 in the third quarter. It tied the score at 23 on a career-long 51-yard field goal by Gabe Brkic, and took a 30-23 lead on a Spencer Rattler pass to Jeremiah Hall with 8:17 remaining, which came four plays after an OU strip sack. But ISU scored the final 14 points on runs of 2 and 8 yards by Brock Purdy and Breece Hall.

Rattler completed 25 of 36 passes for 300 yards and two touchdowns (one interception), both of which went to Jeremiah Hall for scores of 4 and 3 yards. He also registered a rushing touchdown on a leaping 5-yard play in the first quarter.

Brkic converted 3 of 4 field goal tries on the night, his first attempts of the season.
