OPENING KICK

► No. 4/4 Oklahoma goes for its 10th straight win when it hosts Western Carolina on Saturday at 6 p.m. CT at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium in Norman. The game will be televised on a pay-per-view basis by Bally Sports Oklahoma with **Chad McKee**, former OU co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach **Chuck Long** and **Lesley McCaslin** announcing.

► Saturday's game will mark the first between OU and Western Carolina.

► OU opens the season with four home games for the first time since 2004. That year the Sooners hosted Bowling Green (won 40-24), Houston (won 63-13), Oregon (won 31-17) and Texas Tech (won 28-13). The Sooners were ranked No. 2 in the AP poll in all four contests.

► Oklahoma is scheduled to play nine games to start the season before its bye week. That's OU's longest stretch at the beginning of a season without a bye since 1995 when it played 10 games without a week off.

► Sooners head coach **Lincoln Riley** turned 38 on Sunday. He was the youngest FBS head coach (33) at the time of his hiring in 2017 and is the seventh-youngest today.

► In its first game under head coach **Kerwin Bell**, Western Carolina fell 31-28 at home to Eastern Kentucky on Saturday. Quarterback **Rogan Wells**, who played under Bell at Valdosta State, completed 24 of 44 pass attempts for 275 yards and a touchdown while rushing eight times for 67 yards and a score. The Catamounts' 56-yard game-tying field goal attempt as time expired fell short of the crossbar. Bell was a four-year starting quarterback at Florida (1984-87) who went on to a 13-year pro career.

KEY STORYLINES

► Oklahoma has won three more Big 12 championships over the last 22 years (14) than it has lost home games. OU is 124-11 (.919) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season. It is the best home winning percentage among Power Five schools over the last 23 seasons (Ohio State is next at .894). OU has outscored its opponents by an average of 43-17 in those games.

► The Sooners are 10-3 against programs currently in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), but have played only six such games since the start of the 1952 season. In those six contests, the Sooners beat Indiana State 49-0 in 1999 (**Bob Stoops'** first game as OU head coach), Chattanooga 57-2 in 2008, Idaho State 64-0 in 2009, Florida



Redshirt junior kicker **Gabe Brkic** tied an NCAA FBS record on Saturday with three field goal makes from at least 50 yards (51, career-long 56 and 55 yards). No Sooner had ever made more than one 50-plus-yard field goal in a game. Brkic's eight career field goals of at least 50 yards are twice as many as the Sooners with the next most (Tony DiRienzo and Uwe von Schamann had four each), and his seven such boots since the start of the 2020 season lead the nation.

A&M 69-13 in 2012, South Dakota 70-14 in 2019 and Missouri State 48-0 last year. That's a combined total of 357-29. OU is 3-2 against Drake (games played between 1920 and '26) and 1-1 versus William & Mary (games played in 1942 and '51).

► OU is 23-2 (.920) in home games under **Lincoln Riley** and has outscored opponents by an average of 44.7 points to 27.8. The 44.7 offensive points per game are the most nationally at home during the period (starting with the 2017 season).

► Oklahoma enters this weekend a winner of its last nine games, which is tied with Texas A&M for the second-longest winning streak in the country. Only Alabama (15) has a longer current streak. Just one other Power Five program (Iowa at seven) has a winning streak longer than five games. OU has registered winning streaks of at least seven games in each of the past six seasons.

► Riley owns the OU records for wins by a head coach in a debut season (12; previous record was 10 by **Barry Switzer** and **Chuck Fairbanks**), first two seasons (24; previous record was 21 by Switzer), first three seasons (36; previous record was 32 by Switzer) and first four seasons (45; previous record was 43 by **Bob Stoops**). He needs 11 wins this season to set the outright record for most victories in the first five years of an OU coaching career (Stoops holds that standard with 55 [1999-03]).

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER TULANE

► In the 1,300th game in school history, No. 2/3 Oklahoma outscored Tulane 23-0 in the second quarter and withstood a late Green Wave rally in a 40-35 victory in Norman. The game was originally scheduled to be played in New Orleans but was moved on Monday of game week after Hurricane Ida moved across Louisiana.

► The Sooners trailed 7-0 and 14-7 before outscoring Tulane 30-0 the rest of the first half to lead 37-14 at intermission. The Green Wave chipped away in the second half and pulled to within five at the 2:18 mark of the fourth quarter, but after Tulane recovered an onside kick, OU came up with a fourth-down stop to help seal the victory.

► Quarterback **Spencer Rattler** completed 30 of 39 passes for 304 yards and a touchdown and ran for a one-yard score. His 311 yards of total offense were most in the Big 12 on the week.

► Receiver **Marvin Mims** caught five passes for a game-high 117 yards while freshman **Mario Williams**, in his first career game, hauled in six passes for 37 yards, including a six-yard touchdown.

► Running back **Kennedy Brooks** rushed 14 times for 87 yards (6.2 average) and a TD in his first contest since the 2019 season. In his OU debut, Tennessee transfer running back **Eric Gray** started and had nine carries for 27 yards.

► Safety **Delarrin Turner-Yell** recorded a game-high and career-high-tying 10 tackles. He paced an OU defense that forced and recovered three Tulane fumbles. The three recoveries came in the first half and matched OU's total from all of last season.

► Kicker **Gabe Brkic** tied an FBS record with his three field goal makes of at least 50 yards (51, 56 and 55) and was named Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week. No Sooner had ever made more than one 50-plus-yard field goal in a game. Brkic also made a 26-yarder and finished the day 4-for-5, tying a school record for makes in a game (11th time in school history and third time by Brkic). His 56-yarder to end the first half tied as the third-longest in school history and was the longest since 1977. His 51- and 56-yarders stand as the longest made field goals in a season opener in school history.

► For just the second game in the **Lincoln Riley** era (other was 2018 vs. Kansas), the Sooners did not punt.

NOTING THE NEWBIES

► Sixteen players and 14 first-year Sooners made their first appearance in an OU uniform Saturday. The 14 newcomers were seniors **Robert Congel** (OL) and **Michael Woods II** (WR), juniors **Isaiah Coe** (DL) and **Eric Gray** (RB), sophomore **Key Lawrence** (DB) and freshmen **Billy Bowman** (DB), **Ethan Downs** (DE), **Kelvin Gilliam** (DL), **Latrell McCutchin** (CB), **Jordan Mukes** (S), **Clayton Smith** (OLB), **Danny Stutsman** (LB), **Caleb Williams** (QB) and **Mario Williams** (WR). The two non-newcomers were redshirt juniors **Justin Harrington** (DB) and **Jaden Knowles** (RB).

FIRST-TIMERS

► Eight players made their first OU starts on Saturday vs. Tulane. They were senior **Chris Murray** (OL; started 24 games at UCLA), senior **Michael Woods II** (WR; started 29 games at Arkansas), redshirt junior transfer **Robert Congel** (OL; started 13 games at Arizona), junior transfer **Eric Gray** (RB; started five games at Tennessee), redshirt sophomore **Jaden Haselwood** (WR), sophomores **Reggie Grimes** (DE) and **Anton Harrison** (OL) and freshman **Billy Bowman** (DB).

WELCOME BACK

► This season Oklahoma returned 17 players (not including specialists) who started at least five of the team's 11 games last year (seven on offense and 10 on defense). Thirteen of those 17 started at least eight games (six on offense and seven on defense). That does not include running back **Kennedy Brooks** (10 starts in 2019), who opted to sit out last season. OU also welcomes back kicker **Gabe Brkic**, punter **Reeves Mundschau**, long snapper **Kasey Kelleher**, holder **Spencer Jones** and primary punt returner **Marvin Mims**.

► The seven returning offensive starters (at least five starts last year) are tight end/H-back **Jeremiah Hall** (10 starts in 2020; 22 career), redshirt senior offensive linemen **Marquis Hayes** (11 starts; 24 career), **Tyrese Robinson** (11 starts; 25 career) and **Erik Swenson** (11 starts; 19 career), quarterback **Spencer Rattler** (11 starts), redshirt junior wide receiver **Drake Stoops** (6 starts) and junior receiver **Theo Wease** (11 starts).

► The 10 returning defensive players (at least five starts last year) are redshirt junior linebacker **Brian Asamoah** (9 starts in 2020), redshirt junior outside linebacker **Nik Bonitto** (10 starts; 18 career), junior cornerback **Jaden Davis** (6 starts; 7 career), senior safety **Pat Fields** (10 starts; 24 career), super senior defensive linemen **LaRon Stokes** (5 starts; 15 career), redshirt senior defensive lineman **Isaiah Thomas** (11 starts), senior safety **Delarrin Turner-Yell** (8 starts; 21 career), redshirt sophomore cornerback **Woodi Washington** (5 starts), senior linebacker **DaShaun White** (10 starts; 24 career) and senior defensive lineman **Perrion Winfrey** (8 starts).

A NEW BALANCE

► More so than any year in recent program history, the 2020 Sooners displayed offensive and defensive balance. Oklahoma was one of just three Power Five programs (CFP qualifiers Clemson and Notre Dame were the others) to rank in the top 30 nationally in both total offense (11th; 494.7 ypg) and total defense (29th; 350.6 ypg).

► While OU's offense may have been a tick less productive last year than in most of the previous five, the Sooners still ranked sixth nationally in scoring (43.0 ppg), seventh in touchdowns from scrimmage (57), ninth in yards per pass attempt (9.6), 10th in passing efficiency rating (172.1), 11th in total offense (494.7 ypg) and first downs (274), 13th in red zone offense percentage (91.5) and 14th in passing offense (315.0 ypg). OU led the Big 12 in each of those categories except red zone offense percentage (ranked second). And in the eight games (all wins) going back to the Oct. 10 game vs. Texas, the Sooners ranked second among Power Five teams with their 45.0 points per game.

► Under the direction of second-year coordinator **Alex Grinch**, the OU defense ranked in the top 10 nationally in a bevy of categories last season, including third in interceptions (16), fourth in opponent third-down conversion percentage (27.9), seventh in sacks per game (3.4), ninth in pass defense efficiency (112.9 rating) and ninth in rushing defense (105.1 ypg). It also ranked 28th in scoring defense (21.7 ppg).

SEVEN NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

► Seven Sooners have earned preseason All-America honors from at least one organization or media outlet. They are outside linebacker **Nik Bonitto**, kicker **Gabe Brkic**, running back **Kennedy Brooks**, wide receiver **Marvin Mims**, quarterback **Spencer Rattler** and defensive linemen **Jalen Redmond** and **Perrion Winfrey**.

► Bonitto, a redshirt junior, has earned preseason first-team All-America honors from the AP, Sporting News, Walter Camp Foundation, CBS Sports, ESPN, PFF and USA Today. A 2020 first-team PFF and second-team AP All-American, he started all 10 of his games last season and logged 32 tackles (18 solo), 10.5 tackles for loss (for 56 yards), 8.0 sacks (for 44 yards) and a team-high 10 QB hurries. He was credited by PFF with the nation's top pressure rate (25.7%; the next highest nationally was 22.3%) and ranked first nationally per PFF among 257 edge rushers in pass-rush grade (93.5) and pass-rush win rate (28.5%).

► Also a redshirt junior, Brkic is a preseason second-team All-American by CBS Sports after assembling one of the best two-year kicking stretches in OU history. The 2020 first-team All-Big 12 selection was also a first-team All-American by CBS Sports as a redshirt freshman in 2019. He has made 41 of 48 career field goal attempts, and his 85.4% conversion rate ranks No. 1 in school annals. He is also 106 for 106 on career PAT attempts. In 2020, Brkic registered eight multi-field goal games to rank second in school single-season history. He connected on four field goals from at least 50 yards.

► Brooks is back in 2021 after opting to sit out in 2020. The redshirt junior was named to PFF's second-team All-America squad after turning in 1,000-yard rushing seasons in 2018 and '19. His 8.9 yards per rush in 2018, when he ran for 12 TDs, remain the most by a 1,000-yard rusher in Big 12 history.

► Mims is a preseason second-team All-American by Sporting News, the Walter Camp Foundation and PFF. He shined

RILEY THIRD FASTEST TO 46 WINS

At 46-8, Lincoln Riley is one of just six Sooners head coaches to reach 46 wins. Only College Football Hall of Famers Barry Switzer and Bud Wilkinson reached 46 victories at OU in fewer games.

THE OKLAHOMA 500

Since Lincoln Riley arrived at OU ahead of the 2015 season, the Sooners have registered 500-plus yards of offense in an incredible 68% of their games (54 of 80). The program with the next highest percentage of 500-yard performances during the period is Ohio State (55%). Only eight programs have a rate of at least 45%:

last year when he became the first wide receiver in OU history to earn FWAA Freshman All-America status. A 2020 second-team All-Big 12 selection by the league's head coaches and media, he played in all 11 games (made one start) and led the Sooners with 610 yards and nine touchdowns on 37 receptions (16.5 average). His nine TD catches tied for the Big 12 lead and established an OU freshman record, and four of his nine scores covered at least 45 yards (45, 50, 58 and 61). Mims doubled as OU's primary punt returner, ranking eighth nationally with his 12.5 yards per return (162 yards on 13 attempts).

► Named the 2020 national freshman of the year by CBS Sports, Rattler is a preseason first-team All-American according to the AP, Sporting News, CBS Sports, ESPN, USA Today and PFF. He started all 11 games last season and became just the second OU quarterback to earn FWAA Freshman All-America honors (**Sam Bradford** was the other) after completing 67.5% of his passes for 3,031 yards and 28 touchdowns against seven interceptions. His 92.5 passing grade by PFF was third best nationally and he ranked as the group's No. 13 player regardless of position. Rattler led the nation's freshmen in passing TDs, passing offense (275.5 ypg) and total offense (290.1 ypg) and was named Most Outstanding Player of the Big 12 Championship Game.

► Winfrey, a senior and preseason second-team All-American by The Athletic, was a 2020 second-team All-Big 12 selection by the league's head coaches. He played in all 11 games and made starts in eight of the last nine contests, finishing with 19 tackles (nine solo), 6.0 tackles for loss and three pass breakups. He was rated the No. 1 junior college recruit in the country in the 2020 class by 247Sports and ESPN.

► A preseason second-team All-American by PFF, Redmond opted to sit out the 2020 season after leading OU in 2019 with 6.5 sacks and ranking third with 11.0 tackles for loss. The redshirt sophomore was a five-star recruit by 247Sports out of high school.

LEAGUE-HIGH 10 SOONERS RECEIVE PRESEASON BIG 12 HONORS

► A conference-high 10 Sooners received Big 12 preseason honors and nine were named to the 2020 Preseason All-Big 12 Football Team that was selected by media who cover the league.

► Redshirt sophomore quarterback **Spencer Rattler**, redshirt senior H-back **Jeremiah Hall**, sophomore receiver **Marvin Mims**, redshirt senior offensive lineman **Marquis Hayes**, junior offensive lineman **Wanya Morris**, redshirt senior defensive lineman **Isaiah Thomas**, senior defensive lineman **Perrion Winfrey**, redshirt junior outside linebacker **Nik Bonitto** and redshirt junior placekicker **Gabe Brkic** were among the 29 players to earn preseason all-conference recognition by position. Rattler was selected as the Preseason Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year while junior running back and Tennessee transfer **Eric Gray** was picked as Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year.

► Oklahoma's six offensive players (including Brkic) were also more than any other school (Iowa State was next with five while no other team had more than two) and the Sooners' three defensive selections were tied with Iowa State for the most.

FINLEY RETURNS TO OU STAFF

► Saturday's Tulane game marked the first as full-time Oklahoma assistant coach for associate head coach for offense/tight ends and H-backs **Joe Jon Finley**. The former OU and NFL tight end, who served the 2012 and 2013 seasons as a Sooners offensive graduate assistant under former head coach **Bob Stoops**, was hired in January. He replaced Shane Beamer, who is now the head coach at South Carolina.

► Finley served as passing game coordinator and tight ends coach at Ole Miss in 2020, helping the Rebels to one of the best offensive seasons in program history. Ole Miss ranked No. 3 nationally in total offense (555.5 ypg), No. 5 in pass efficiency rating (178.7), No. 7 in passing offense (344.9 ypg), No. 10 in yards per play (7.0) and No. 14 in scoring offense (39.2 ppg). Finley also coached tight ends at Texas A&M in 2019 and at Missouri from 2016-18.

► He finished his OU playing career with 62 catches, 775 receiving yards and 10 receiving touchdowns in 50 games and won Big 12 titles in 2004, '06 and '07. He spent parts of five seasons in the NFL with San Francisco (2008-10), Detroit (2010-11) and Carolina (2012).

YEAR THREE OF "SPEED D"

► Hired in January 2019, coordinator and safeties coach **Alex Grinch**, who was a 2019 Broyles Award semifinalist, has overseen major improvement on the defensive side of the ball in his two seasons in Norman.

► Oklahoma ranked third nationally last season in interceptions (16), fourth in opponent third-down conversion percentage (27.9), sixth in sacks per game (3.6), ninth in rushing defense (105.1 ypg) and passing defense efficiency rating (112.9), 16th in tackles for loss per game (7.5) and 29th in total defense (350.6 ypg) and scoring defense (21.7 ppg).

► Grinch's unit was particularly stingy down the stretch in 2020. After Nov. 1 (five games), OU led the nation in interceptions per game (2.2) and ranked second in sacks per game (4.0) and passing defense efficiency rating (94.5), fourth in opponent third-down conversion percentage (25.0), sixth in scoring defense (15.4 ppg), eighth in passing yards per attempt (5.4), ninth in opponent passing completion percentage (51.4), 14th in rushing yards per game (112.2) and 18th in rushing yards per carry (3.4).

► Oklahoma's 1.45 interceptions per game last season were its second most in the last 17 years (1.53 in 2015).

A BALANCED APPROACH

Since the start of the 2018 season, Oklahoma has recorded eight games of at least 300 passing yards and at least 300 rushing yards. The next highest total nationally is four. Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas are the only other Big 12 programs to do it once, and only two other Power Five programs (Clemson and Ohio State) have done it twice.

► OU has allowed opponents to score on their opening drive of a game just four times in its 25 contests under Grinch (Oklahoma State and LSU touchdowns in 2019; Iowa State field goal [first meeting] and Texas Tech touchdown last year). Eighteen of the 25 opponent opening drives have lasted five plays or less.

► Over the last two seasons, Oklahoma has allowed only three opponent wide receivers to register at least 100 receiving yards in a game (Kansas' Stephon Robinson and LSU's Justin Jefferson in 2019; Iowa State's Xavier Hutchinson last season in the Big 12 Championship).

QBU CONTINUES

► Oklahoma's top two signal callers, redshirt sophomore **Spencer Rattler** (2019) and freshman **Caleb Williams** (2021), were each regarded as the consensus No. 1 quarterbacks in their recruiting classes and were named Elite 11 MVPs.

► A consensus 2021 preseason All-American and the Big 12 Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, Rattler was OU's fourth starting quarterback in four seasons (**Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** won the 2017 and '18 Heisman Trophy while **Jalen Hurts** was 2019 runner-up). Rattler was named national freshman of the year by CBS Sports last season after completing 67.5% of his passes for 3,031 yards (275.5 per game) and 28 touchdowns vs. seven interceptions. He also rushed for 160 yards and six TDs. His 92.5 passing grade by PFF ranked third nationally behind BYU's Zach Wilson and Heisman finalist Mac Jones of Alabama.

► Over OU's last seven games last year (all wins), Rattler threw 15 TD passes and only two interceptions.

► Rattler led the nation's freshmen in passing touchdowns, passing offense and total offense (290.1 ypg). Among all players who played at least six games, he ranked eighth in passing TDs, ninth in yards per pass attempt (9.6), 10th in pass efficiency rating (172.6), 14th in completion percentage, 15th in passing offense and 16th in yards per completion (14.2).

► Williams, a 2021 OU mid-year enrollee, was ranked as the nation's No. 1 overall player in the 2021 recruiting class by SI All-American, No. 5 by Rivals, No. 7 by 247Sports and No. 16 by ESPN.

► Williams' high school team did not play a 2020 fall season due to the pandemic, but he was a two-time All-Washington Catholic Athletic Conference selection and the 2019 MVP as a junior. That year he threw for 1,770 yards and 19 touchdowns as a junior while rushing for 838 yards and 18 scores.

OU FOOT NOTES

► During **Lincoln Riley's** four-plus-year head coaching career, Oklahoma ranks fifth nationally with its 84.0% success rate on field goal attempts (79 for 94). Kansas State is the next best Big 12 school in the category during the span, ranking 17th at 80.0%.

► During the same period, the Sooners rank third nationally in PAT conversion percentage among teams with at least 150 attempts, converting 305 of 306 tries (99.7%). Only Georgia (214 for 214) and Virginia Tech (174 of 174) have a higher success rate.

► Redshirt sophomore kicker **Gabe Brkic**, who is a 2020 first-team All-Big 12 selection (coaches and AP) and a Lou Groza Award semifinalist, is 41 for 48 (.854) on career field goal attempts and has made all 106 of his PAT tries. The OU career record for field goal percentage is .833 (75 for 90) by **Michael Hunnicutt** (2011-14). Brkic ranked third nationally last season by averaging 2.0 field goal makes per game.

► Brkic's seven field goal makes (on nine attempts) from at least 50 yards since the start of the 2020 season are the most nationally. LSU's Cade York ranks second with six makes (on seven tries) while no other player has made more than four.

"AIR RAID" A MISNOMER

► Fans and media have often referred to Oklahoma's offense under **Lincoln Riley** as the "Air Raid." The label is not exactly accurate, however, as the Sooners have rushed more than they've thrown in each of the six years since Riley arrived in Norman, and that's counting plays in which the quarterback was sacked as pass plays (officially they are recorded as rushes). OU's rushing play percentage was 52.6 in 2015, 57.7 in 2016, 53.1 in 2017, 54.7 in 2018, 57.3 in 2019 and 50.6 last year.

► Since Riley arrived in Norman, OU leads the country with 12 individual running back seasons of 6.0 or more yards per carry (min. 50 carries per season).

RILEY'S FAST START

► The FBS's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, **Lincoln Riley** became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4, 36-6 and 45-8, he also holds the OU record for most wins by a head coach in his first two, three and four seasons (**Barry Switzer** held the records of 21 and 32, and **Bob Stoops** held the record of 43).

► Riley is the only person to ever win an outright FBS conference title in each of his first four seasons as a collegiate head coach.

► No one in the previous 125 years won more games in their first three seasons as a college head coach than Riley

RILEY SECURES ANOTHER TOP RECRUITING CLASS

Oklahoma head coach Lincoln Riley assembled a 16-member 2021 recruiting class, with all signees inking during the December period. The class ranked No. 11 nationally by 247Sports and No. 13 by ESPN and Rivals. It was the consensus No. 1 class in the Big 12 and rated as fourth- and fifth-best nationally by Rivals and 247Sports, respectively, in terms of average ranking per player.

Of the 16 signees, three were ranked as five-star prospects on a five-star scale by 247Sports, ESPN or Rivals, while 12 earned four-star designation from at least one of those outlets.

Fifteen of the 16 signees were high schoolers and the other was a junior college product. The signees hail from seven states as well as Washington, D.C. Nine were classified as defensive players, six were offensive players and one — Billy Bowman — was labeled an "athlete," as he played extensively on both sides of the ball.

The state of Texas produced the most OU signees with six, while Oklahoma, Florida and Virginia each produced two. The Sooners also signed one player each from Illinois, Maryland, Oregon and Washington, D.C.

Ten of the Sooners' signees enrolled at OU for the spring semester and participated in team activities. They are defensive back Bowman, defensive lineman Isaiah Coe (junior college product), defensive end Ethan Downs, receiver Cody Jackson, cornerback Latrell McCutchin, safety Jordan Mukes, defensive end/outside linebacker Nathan Rawlins-Kibonge, outside linebacker Clayton Smith (five-star by Rivals), quarterback Caleb Williams (consensus No. 1 QB nationally and five-star by 247Sports and Rivals) and receiver Mario Williams (five-star by Rivals).

► Riley is the third-fastest OU head coach to reach 46 wins (54 games). Only College Football Hall of Famers Switzer (52 games) and **Bud Wilkinson** (53) did it faster.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY

► Oklahoma owns the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley still calls plays in his fourth year as head coach.

► Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in scoring (44.4 ppg; next most is 41.8), total offense (545.0; next most is 502.5), yards per play (7.7), TDs from scrimmage (443), pass efficiency rating (185.7; next best is 173.6), yards per pass attempt (10.5) and completion percentage. It ranks third in passing offense (320.9) and ninth in rushing offense (224.2). No other program during the span ranks in the top 15 in passing and rushing offense.

► In 80 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 54 times (next most is 46), including in 44 of the last 63 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 26 occasions and gone over 700 yards seven times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 70 of 80 games since Riley's arrival, at least 40 points 51 times, at least 50 points 29 times and at least 60 points 10 times.

► OU has registered at least 700 yards of offense 13 times in its history, and seven of those occasions have come since the start of the 2015 season: 854 at Texas Tech in 2016, 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017, 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015, 733 vs. South Dakota in 2019, 710 at Kansas in 2015, 702 vs. Kansas State in 2018 and 702 vs. Oklahoma State in 2018.

RECAPPING 2020: SIXTH STRAIGHT BIG 12 TITLE AND COTTON BOWL VICTORY

► For the first time in **Lincoln Riley's** four seasons as Oklahoma head coach, the Sooners did not qualify for the four-team College Football Playoff in 2020. After starting the year 1-2 with narrow losses to Kansas State and Iowa State, OU rebounded to win its final eight games, knock off eighth-ranked Iowa State 27-21 in the Big 12 Championship game and earn a No. 6 CFP ranking. Then, in the program's sixth straight New Year's Six bowl game, Riley's crew downed No. 10 Florida 55-20 in the Cotton Bowl to earn a final No. 6 ranking in the AP and coaches polls.

► The Cotton Bowl marked the Sooners' 22nd consecutive bowl appearance, by far the longest streak in school history (the previous record was eight from 1975-82 under **Barry Switzer**). Against the Gators, they set bowl game program records with 55 points and 684 total yards, while the 35-point victory margin matched an Oklahoma bowl game record. OU's 435 rushing yards were four shy of its bowl game standard, but it did set a Cotton Bowl record by averaging 10.9 yards per rush, doubling as the second-best average in school history.

► Outside linebacker **Nik Bonitto** earned first-team All-America honors from PFF and second-team honors from AP, while center **Creed Humphrey** (now starting for the Kansas City Chiefs) was a third-team AP All-American. Quarterback **Spencer Rattler** (redshirt) and receiver **Marvin Mims** (true) were both named to the FWAA Freshman All-America Team. Rattler joined former Sooner **Sam Bradford** as the only OU quarterbacks to secure the honor, while Mims became the first receiver in program history to earn the distinction.

► Oklahoma went 4-0 against AP Top 25 opponents on the season, marking the first time since 2002 it won every game vs. ranked AP foes.

► In the eight games (all wins) going back to and including the Oct. 10 game vs. Texas, the Sooners ranked second among Power Five teams with their 45.0 points per contest

► Humphrey was named Big 12 Offensive Lineman of the Year, marking his second straight honor and fifth consecutive by a Sooner (**Orlando Brown** in 2016 and '17 and **Dru Samia** in 2018). Humphrey finished his three-year playing career with 37 starts in his 39 games and with no sacks allowed.

► Nine Sooners earned first- or second-team All-Big 12 honors. First-team picks were Humphrey, H-back **Jeremiah Hall** and kicker **Gabe Brkic**, while second-team honorees were cornerback **Tre Brown**, offensive lineman **Adrian Ealy**, Mims, defensive end **Ronnie Perkins** and defensive linemen **Isaiah Thomas** and **Perrion Winfrey**.

► A program-record 29 Sooners were named to the Academic All-Big 12 Team, including linebacker **Bryan Mead**, quarterback **Tanner Schafer** and wide receiver **Devin Staton**, who were among the 13 league players with a 4.0 GPA.

► Oklahoma's 16 interceptions were its most in a season since registering 20 in 2015 (13 games) and were three more than it registered over the 2018 (six) and 2019 (seven) seasons combined. OU's 1.45 interceptions per game were its second most in the last 17 years (1.53 in 2015). And from the second quarter of the Dec. 5 game vs. Baylor through the first quarter of the Dec. 30 Cotton Bowl vs. Florida, the Sooners registered eight interceptions over an eight-quarter stretch (two vs. Baylor, three vs. Iowa State and three vs. Florida).

► OU dominated the first quarter, outscoring opponents 151-20. During its eight-game winning streak to end the year, it outscored foes 58-14 in the third quarter and allowed just 435 total yards (54.4 average) in the period.

FIVE 2021 NFL DRAFTEES

► Oklahoma had five players picked in the 2021 NFL Draft. Center **Creed Humphrey** was selected in the second round by the Kansas City Chiefs before defensive end **Ronnie Perkins** and running back **Rhamondre Stevenson** went to the New England Patriots in the third and fourth rounds, respectively. Cornerback **Tre Brown** was drafted in the fifth round by the Seattle Seahawks and defensive back **Tre Norwood** went to the Pittsburgh Steelers in the seventh round. Since 2000, 104 Sooners have been selected, which is 29 more than the next-closest Big 12 program during that span (Texas, 75) and 51 more than the second-closest (TCU, 53).

STOOPS TO BE INDUCTED INTO CFB HALL OF FAME IN DECEMBER

The owner of the most wins in Oklahoma football history and engineer of 10 Big 12 Conference titles and the 2000 national championship, former head coach **Bob Stoops** was named to the 2021 College Football Hall of Fame Class by the National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame in his first year of eligibility.

Stoops, former Florida A&M head coach Rudy Hubbard and 11 former players will be inducted into the College Hall of Fame during the 63rd NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 7 alongside the 2020 Hall of Fame Class (the 2020 event was canceled due to COVID-19). This year's group was named to the class from a national ballot of 78 players and seven coaches from the Football Bowl Subdivision and 99 players and 33 coaches from the divisional ranks.

Hired Dec. 1, 1998, Stoops posted a 190-48 (.798) record at OU and coached the Sooners to a school-record 18 consecutive bowl berths. He was the only coach in the BCS era to win the Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Rose Bowl, Sugar Bowl and the national championship, and accumulated more victories over his first 18 seasons than any coach in the game's history.

The Youngstown, Ohio, native guided the Sooners to the most wins of any Power Five program between 1999 to 2016 and led OU to double-digit victories in 14 of his 18 seasons (most nationally during the stretch) and to at least eight wins in each of his last 17 campaigns (good for the longest streak in the nation at the time of his retirement). Seven of his squads finished in the AP top five, including each of the last two, while three more finished No. 6.

HEISMAN U

► Quarterbacks **Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** became Oklahoma's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and '18, respectively, moving the Sooners into a tie with Notre Dame and Ohio State for the most Heisman winners. Other OU winners were QB **Sam Bradford** in 2008, QB **Jason White** in 2003, RB **Billy Sims** in 1978, RB **Steve Owens** in 1969 and RB **Billy Vessels** in 1952.

► Quarterback **Jalen Hurts** was the 2019 Heisman Trophy runner-up and became Oklahoma's 11th Heisman finalist, most of any school (finalists were first named in 1982). Alabama ranks second with 10 finalists, Miami (Fla.) ranks third with nine, Florida ranks fourth with eight and Ohio State ranks fifth with seven.

► OU boasts 10 Heisman finalists in the last 20 years (since 2000), which is two more than the school with the next most during that span (Alabama has six) and five more than the one with the third most (Stanford has five).

► Oklahoma is the first program to ever produce five Heisman finalists in a four-year period (Hurts in 2019 [runner-up], Murray in 2018 [won], Mayfield in 2017 [won] and Mayfield [finished third] and receiver **Dede Westbrook** [finished fourth] in 2016). With Mayfield's and Murray's wins, OU is the only program to produce different quarterback winners in consecutive seasons.

► OU is tied for the most Heisman runners-up, as well (six). OU's second-place Heisman finishers were **Kurt Burris** (1954), **Greg Pruitt** (1972), **Sims** (1979), **Josh Heupel** (2000), **Adrian Peterson** (2004) and Hurts (2019).

► Oklahoma has produced four Heisman Trophy winners in the last 18 years. Only three other programs have produced four winners ever.

► An Oklahoma quarterback finished in the top four of Heisman voting in each of **Lincoln Riley's** first five years with the Sooners (Mayfield fourth in 2015, third in 2016 and first in 2017; Murray first in 2018; Hurst second in 2019).

OU'S BIG 12 DOMINATION

► Oklahoma's win over Iowa State in the 2020 Big 12 Championship resulted in the Sooners' sixth straight Big 12 title and 14th since 2000 (no other program has won more than two during the span). For perspective, the two Power Five programs with the next most conference titles this millennium are Ohio State (11 in Big Ten) and Oregon (eight in Pac-10/Pac-12).

► OU's 14 Big 12 titles are 11 more than the program with the next most. Texas has won three Big 12 championships and is followed by Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

► Since 2010, OU has won eight Big 12 titles and is followed by Baylor (two) and Kansas State, Oklahoma State and TCU (one each).

► The Sooners have as many Big 12 titles the last six seasons (six) as they have lost games against Big 12 opponents (51-6 record; includes four Big 12 Championship games).

► OU is 146-31 (.825) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 26 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 120-57) and 46 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 100-78).

► Come Saturday, OU will have been Big 12 champ for 2,109 straight days.

► Oklahoma is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (2006-08 and 2015-20). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► At 11-1, the Sooners are the only program with a winning record in Big 12 Championship games. Texas has the next best mark at 3-3.

► Over the last six years (since **Lincoln Riley** came to Norman as offensive coordinator), OU has posted a 47-6 (.887) record in regular season Big 12 play. The next best mark during the stretch is 34-20 (.630) by Oklahoma State.

MORE CONFERENCE TITLE TIDBITS

► Oklahoma and Clemson are each riding streaks of six outright conference championships. The last current Power Five program to win at least six straight outright league titles was OU when it claimed 12 Big Six/Seven crowns in a row under legendary head coach **Bud Wilkinson** (1948-59).

► Every OU freshman class from 1999-2019 has won at least one Big 12 championship and all but the 2011 freshman class have won at least two. The 2015, 2016 and 2017 freshman classes each won four Big 12 titles.

► OU leads the nation with its 50 all-time conference titles. It is followed by Nebraska (46), Michigan (42), Ohio State (39) and USC (37).

► Last year's Oklahoma squad became the fifth in program history to win a conference title with two league losses. The other four occasions were in 1976 (5-2 in Big Eight; shared with Colorado and Oklahoma State) and 2002, 2007 and 2010 (6-2 in Big 12; won Big 12 Championship games). However, last year's team was OU's first to ever win a conference title after a 0-2 league start.

CFP APPEARANCES

Oklahoma has made four appearances in the seven-year history of the College Football Playoff, all in the last six seasons. It is the only Big 12 program to qualify for the event.

**FIFTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH • 46-8 RECORD (.852) • 2018 CO-BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR
 MOST OU WINS IN DEBUT SEASON (12), FIRST TWO (24), THREE (36) AND FOUR SEASONS (45)
 DIRECTED SOONERS TO FOUR BIG 12 TITLES AND THREE COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF BERTHS
 HAS PRODUCED TWO HEISMAN TROPHY WINNERS AND TWO NO. 1 OVERALL NFL DRAFT PICKS**

After presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley has done in his first four years is lead the Sooners to their 11th, 12th, 13th and 14th Big 12 titles and to four New Year's Six bowl berths (three College Football Playoffs). He was also named the 2018 Co-Big 12 Coach of the Year.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4, 36-6 and 45-8, he also holds the OU records for most wins by a head coach in his first two, three and four seasons (Barry Switzer held the records of 21 and 32; while Bob Stoops held the record of 43). And he is the only coach to ever win an outright FBS conference championship in each of his first four seasons as a collegiate head coach.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing an explosive — and balanced — OU offense the last six seasons.

Since the start of 2015, OU ranks first nationally in scoring (44.4 ppg; next most is 41.8), total offense (545.0; next most is 502.5), yards per play (7.7), touchdowns from scrimmage (443), pass efficiency rating (185.7; next best is 173.6), yards per pass attempt (10.5) and completion percentage (69.2), third in passing offense (320.9) and ninth in rushing offense (224.2). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 68-12 (.852) record since his arrival (47-6 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Alabama (80-6), Clemson (79-8) and Ohio State (69-8) having better records.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have poured in under Riley, highlighted by quarterbacks Baker Mayfield and Kyler Murray becoming OU's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and 2018. QB Jalen Hurts was the 2019 Heisman runner-up. Mayfield also won the Maxwell, Davey O'Brien, Manning and Walter Camp Player of the Year Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft. Murray also won the O'Brien and Manning Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft. Receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Eight Sooners have earned first-team All-America honors the last three years. Running back Joe Mixon set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley was the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual offensive school records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

In addition to overseeing Mayfield's and Murray's record-setting careers, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.



NORMAN – In the 1,300th game in school history, No. 2/3 Oklahoma outscored Tulane 23-0 in the second quarter and withstood a late Green Wave rally in a 40-35 home victory. The game was originally scheduled to be played in New Orleans but was moved after Hurricane Ida moved across Louisiana the Sunday before the contest.

Quarterback Spencer Rattler completed 30 of 39 passes for 304 yards and a touchdown and added a rushing score. Marvin Mims caught five passes for a game-high 117 yards while receiver Mario Williams, in his first career game, caught six balls for 37 yards, including a six-yard touchdown. Running back Kennedy Brooks rushed 14 times for 87 yards (6.2 average) and a TD in his first contest since the 2019 season.

Safety Delarrin Turner-Yell recorded a game-high 10 tackles and paced an OU defense that forced and recovered three Tulane fumbles.

Gabe Brkic tied an FBS record with his three field goal makes of at least 50 yards (51, 56 and 55). No Sooner had ever made more than one 50-plus-yard field goal in a game.
