OPENING KICK

► Former longtime conference rivals Oklahoma (2-0, No. 6 in both polls) and Nebraska (1-2) meet in Lincoln, Neb., for the first time since 2009 when they tee it up Saturday at 11 a.m. CT at Memorial Stadium. The game will be televised by FOX with **Gus Johnson**, **Joel Klatt** and **Jenny Taft** announcing.

► Oklahoma (930) and Nebraska (909) rank fourth and eighth in all-time wins among FBS programs. During the post-World War II era (1946-2021), OU ranks first nationally with its 686 victories while NU ranks sixth (600).

► The Sooners lead all FBS programs with their 50 conference titles (have won six of the last seven Big 12 titles and 14 total), while the Huskers rank second with 46 league championships. Remarkably, Oklahoma or Nebraska (or both) won or shared Big Seven/Big Eight titles in 44 of the conferences' 48 years (1948-95) and combined for nine Big 12 championships (seven by OU) before Nebraska departed the league in 2011.

► As an Oklahoma assistant coach from 1999-2011, current Sooners head coach **Brent Venables** contributed to OU's 6-2 record against Nebraska. Included were two Big 12 Championship games, which the Sooners won 21-7 in 2006 and 23-20 in 2010. OU went 1-2 in Lincoln during the span, losing 20-10 in 2001 (OU was ranked No. 2 and NU No. 3) and 10-3 in 2009, and posting a 31-24 victory in 2005. Venables was Oklahoma's co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 1999-2003 and was associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2004-11.

► The Sooners have won 28 of their last 32 true road games and have scored at least 30 points in 36 of their last 37 true road contests. The program with the next most 30-point performances in its last 37 true road games is Ohio State (28; see chart on page 3).

► Oklahoma has been ranked in each of the last 29 AP Top 25 polls and in 113 of the last 117 going back to the start of the 2015 season. It has been ranked in the top 10 in 81 of those 117 polls. Nebraska has made two AP Top 25 appearances since the start of the 2016 season (the Huskers were No. 24 in the 2019 preseason poll and No. 25 the following week).

► The Sooners are coming off a 33-3 home win over Kent State on Saturday, a game in which OU didn't score until its final possession of the first half. Beginning with that drive, OU outgained the Golden Flashes 352 yards to 156.



Marvin Mims Jr. ranks sixth nationally in average punt return yards (19.3), ninth in receiving yards per game (122.0), 13th in yards per reception (24.4) and 13th in all-purpose yards per game (150.5).

Marvin Mims Jr. registered a career-high 203 all-purpose yards, seventh most nationally this season. He caught seven passes for a career-high 163 yards and two touchdowns.

► Nebraska lost 45-42 at home to Georgia Southern on Saturday, a game in which neither team ever led by more than seven points. The Huskers put up 578 yards of offense but surrendered 642 (409 through the air). The game marked the last in the NU head coaching tenure of **Scott Frost**, who was replaced by interim head coach **Mickey Joseph** on Sunday.

KEY STORYLINES

► Saturday's contest will be just the second in the storied Oklahoma-Nebraska series since the 2010 Big 12 Championship Game (OU won 23-16 last September in Norman). The 2010 Big 12 title game contest represented the final game for the Huskers as members of the Big 12. They joined the Big Ten Conference starting with the 2011 season, snapping a 90-year streak in which OU and NU were in the same league (started in 1921).

► Oklahoma and Nebraska played in 70 consecutive seasons (1928-1997). The string was broken in 1998 when the two rotated off each other's schedule as part of the Big 12's South and North Division scheduling.

► Including this year, 63 of the 73 OU-Nebraska games since the first AP poll in 1936 have featured at least one ranked team. In fact, either the Sooners or Huskers (or both) have been ranked in the AP poll in 46 of the last 47 matchups (neither were in OU's 31-24 win in 2005 in Lincoln). Counting this matchup, at least one team has been ranked in the AP top 10 in 51 of the 73 head-to-head meetings during the poll era, including 35 of the last 39 matchups. The series has featured a top-10 showdown 18 times, and a top-5 battle on eight occasions. Amazingly, at least one team was ranked in the top 5 in 18 of 19 games from 1970-87.

► OU ranks 10th nationally by allowing just 8.0 points per game. The Sooners have allowed just one touchdown, marking the first time since 2013 they have permitted only one TD over any two-game span (34-0 win vs. UL-Monroe and 16-7 win vs. West Virginia).

► Despite ranking second to last nationally in average time of possession this season (22:34), the Sooners have outgained UTEP and Kent State by a combined 311 yards (922-611). OU has run 30 fewer plays than its opponents, but is averaging 7.4 yards per play and is tied for ninth nationally by allowing just 3.9 yards per play.

► Since the start of the 2015 season, OU leads the country with its 5.5 yards per rush and ranks fifth nationally (second in Power 5) with its 236 rushing touchdowns. This season, the Sooners are averaging 5.3 yards per carry and have rushed for five TDs. They have rushed 74 times (five of those have been sacks) and attempted 51 passes.

► Oklahoma is one of 12 teams (one of just five in the Power 5 leagues) that hasn't committed a turnover this season. It is +4 in turnover margin (two interceptions and two fumble recoveries). OU's seven-game streak of registering at least one interception is the second-longest nationally and longest among Power 5 programs.

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER KENT STATE

► No. 7/7 Oklahoma trailed 3-0 late in the first half but drove 76 yards to score a touchdown with 18 seconds remaining in the second quarter and outscored Kent State 26-0 in the second half to post a 33-3 home win Saturday night. The Golden Flashes were picked by MAC head coaches to win the league's east division title.

► Kent State's three points were the fewest allowed by Oklahoma against an FBS opponent since a 41-3 win at Kansas in 2017. The Sooners recorded 14 tackles for loss Saturday (their most since 2019) and three sacks.

► Quarterback **Dillon Gabriel** was highly efficient, completing 75% of his pass attempts (21 of 28) for 296 yards and three touchdowns without an interception. His TD passes covered 36, 18 and 58 yards.

► Receiver **Marvin Mims Jr.** turned in his top career performance with a career-high-tying seven receptions for a career-high 163 yards and two touchdowns. His scores covered 36 and 58 yards, giving him five career games with two TDs. Mims also registered a career-high 203 all-purpose yards (the seventh-highest total in the FBS this season). His 41-yard punt return was a career long and was OU's longest since the 2019 season.

► Senior running back **Eric Gray** paced all rushers with 71 yards on 10 carries, which included a 44-yard run that was his longest as a Sooner. Redshirt junior **Marcus Major** carried five times for 38 yards and a 16-yard score. He has three rushing TDs on the season.

► For the first time since 2018, three Sooners registered double-digit tackles in a game. Linebacker **Danny Stutsman** (12) and safety **Billy Bowman** (11) set career highs in tackles for the second straight game, while safety **Justin Broiles** tied a career high with 11 stops in his first start of the season. Broiles added a tackle for loss.

► Stutsman recorded 4.0 tackles for loss, OU's most in three seasons, including a sack, while Bowman was credited with a forced fumble and recovery on the same play.

THE OU-NEBRASKA SERIES

Oklahoma owns a 46-38-3 series lead against Nebraska. OU posted a 6-4 record when both programs were in the Big 12 and a 20-17 mark when they were in the Big Eight. The Sooners have won six of the last seven meetings and seven of the last nine. Here's every result from the last 51 years (OU leads 21-16):

► Junior defensive end **Reggie Grimes** had 2.5 TFLs for the second straight game and 1.5 sacks. He ranks third nationally with his 4.0 sacks on the year (had 3.0 entering the season).

► Redshirt junior defensive back **Justin Harrington** logged his first career interception and returned it 22 yards.

LAST YEAR VS. THE HUSKERS

► No. 3/3 Oklahoma was held to its lowest point total since the 2016 season opener vs. Houston (a 33-23 defeat) but still downed Nebraska 23-16 in Norman for its fifth win in its last six meetings with the Huskers when the teams met on Sept. 18, 2021. It was the programs' first matchup since the 2010 Big 12 Championship Game.

► OU's defense registered 10 tackles for loss and five sacks and held a Nebraska squad that was averaging 513.7 yards per game over its first three contests to 384. The Sooners limited the Huskers to 95 rushing yards (2.5 per carry) and held quarterback Adrian Martinez to 34 yards on 17 carries. Martinez entered the game averaging 85.3 rushing yards per contest on the year.

► After Nebraska scored a touchdown with eight seconds left in the third quarter to trim the Sooners' lead to 14-9, defensive lineman **Isaiah Coe** blocked the PAT attempt and safety **Pat Fields** returned it 100 yards for a 16-9 advantage. It was OU's first blocked PAT returned for two points since the 2014 season.

► Outside linebacker **Nik Bonitto** led the Sooners with 3.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks, while defensive lineman **Jalen Redmond** finished with 2.0 TFLs and 1.5 sacks. Linebacker **DaShaun White** logged a career-high 10 tackles to lead the Sooners and cornerback **D.J. Graham** made a dazzling one-handed, fourth-quarter interception deep in OU territory to preserve a 23-9 advantage.

► Running backs **Eric Gray** (84 yards) and **Kennedy Brooks** (75 yards) combined for 159 rushing yards on 29 carries (5.5 per carry).

► OU's 23 points were its fewest in a win since beating TCU 20-17 in 2013 in Norman.

► The Sooners improved to 46-38-3 against Nebraska and to 24-16 in the series in Norman. The game was played during the 50th-anniversary season of the 1971 "Game of the Century" that saw the No. 1-ranked Huskers beat the No. 2-ranked Sooners 35-31 on Owen Field on Thanksgiving Day.

ROAD WARRIORS

► Oklahoma has won 28 of its last 32 true road games, with the only losses during that stretch coming in 2019 at Kansas State (48-41), 2020 at Iowa State (37-30) and 2021 at Baylor (27-14) and Oklahoma State (37-33).

► The 2019 defeat at K-State snapped OU's 22-game true road winning streak (it hadn't lost since Oct 4, 2014, at TCU), which was the second longest such streak nationally since at least the end of World War II.

► During the 22-game streak, OU outscored opponents 1,076-626 (49-28 average) and outgained them by 3,621 yards (583-419 average).

► The Sooners have outgained their opponent in 26 of their last 32 true road games.

► OU has scored at least 30 points in 36 of its last 37 true road games (school-record 35-game streak was stopped last season at Baylor).

NOTING THE NEWBIES

► Twenty-seven players (24 of them first-year Sooners) have made their first appearance in an OU uniform this season. The 24 newcomers who have seen the field this year are redshirt seniors **Jeffery Johnson** (DL), **C.J. Coldon** (DB), **Jonah Laulu** (DL) and **Daniel Parker** (TE), senior **Trey Morrison** (DB), redshirt juniors **Davis Beville** (QB), **Dillon Gabriel** (QB) and **McKade Mettauer** (OL), redshirt sophomores **LV Bunkley-Shelton** (WR), **Tyler Guyton** (OL) and **J.J. Hester** (WR), sophomore **Tawee Walker** (RB) and freshmen **Jovantae Barnes** (RB), **Gavin Freeman** (WR), **Jayden Gibson** (WR), **Gracen Halton** (DL), **Kaden Helms** (TE), **Jaren Kanak** (LB), **Jason Llewellyn** (TE), **Peter Schuh** (DB), **Jacob Sexton** (OL), **Jake Taylor** (OL), **R Mason Thomas** (DL) and **Gentry Williams** (DB).

FIRST-TIME STARTERS

► Nine players have made their first OU starts this season. Against UTEP, they were redshirt senior transfer **Jeffery Johnson** (DL; started 44 games at Tulane), redshirt senior **Jordan Kelley** (DL), redshirt junior transfers **Dillon Gabriel** (QB; started 25 games at UCF) and **McKade Mettauer** (OL; started 28 games at Cal), redshirt sophomore transfer **Tyler Guyton** (OL; started one game at TCU as an H-back) and sophomores **Ethan Downs** (DE) and **Danny Stutsman** (LB). Versus Kent State they were redshirt junior **Isaiah Coe** (DL) and sophomore **Jalil Farooq** (WR).

DEFENSE OFF TO A STRONG START

► Oklahoma leads all Power 5 teams this season with its 23 tackles for loss, 11.5 TFLs per game and total of 111 yards on TFLs (the Sooners are tied with James Madison in TFLs and second only to Middle Tennessee's TFL yardage [115]). The Sooners are also tied for third nationally by averaging 4.5 sacks per game.

► OU defense 10th nationally in scoring defense (8.0 ppg), 14th in yards per play allowed (3.9), 34th in rushing defense (96.0 ypg) and 46th in total defense (305.5 ypg). Oklahoma's 33-3 win over Kent State represented the fewest points allowed by the Sooners against an FBS opponent since 2017 (41-3 win at Kansas).

GAMES WITH 14+ TACKLES FOR LOSS SINCE 2000

Oklahoma has registered at least 10 tackles for loss in a game 34 times since the start of the 2005 season. On eight occasions, the Sooners logged 14 or more TFLs, as they did against Kent State on Sept. 10.

► Oklahoma has allowed only one touchdown through two games this season. It is the first time since the 2013 season the Sooners have allowed only one TD over any two-game span (34-0 win vs. UL-Monroe and 16-7 win vs. West Virginia).

► The defense has been led by a pair of standout sophomores in linebacker **Danny Stutsman** (21 tackles) and safety **Billy Bowman** (20 tackles), who rank first and second in the Big 12 in total tackles, and junior defensive end **Reggie Grimes**, who leads the Big 12 by avergaing 2.0 sacks and 4.5 tackles for loss per game.

► Bowman has set career highs in tackles each of the last two weeks (nine vs. UTEP and 11 vs. Kent State). On Saturday against the Golden Flashes, he forced and recovered a fumble on the same play. It was his second career forced fumble and first recovery.

► Stutsman has also established career highs in tackles in each of the first two games of the season, logging nine stops against UTEP and 12 (4.0 TFLs) against Kent State. The last Sooner to register four TFLs in a game was **Ronnie Perkins**, at Baylor in 2019.

► Grimes has been a menace in opposing backfields this season. Five of his seven tackles through two games have been for lost yardage and four have been sacks. His 5.0 TFLs have cost opponents 34 lost yards while his 4.0 sacks have totaled 31 yards. Grimes is tied for fourth nationally and first in the Big 12 in TFLs and TFLs per game, and ranks second nationally (first in the Big 12) in TFL yardage. He leads the Big 12 and ranks third nationally in sacks and second in sack yardage.

► The Sooners have registered an interception in each of their first two games this season and in seven consecutive contests, dating back to last season. That streak ranks second nationally only to Georgia State, which has an interception in 10 straight games. Freshman DB **Gentry Williams** picked off a pass in the end zone in the fourth quarter of the season opener against UTEP and redshirt senior DB **Justin Harrington** notched his first career interception in the fourth quarter against Kent State.

NOTING THE OFFENSE

► Oklahoma ranks 15th nationally by averaging 7.4 yards per play and is 38th in scoring offense (39.0 points per game) and 44th in total offense (461.0 yards per game), despite ranking only 104th in total plays (125 plays, 62.5 per game) and next to last in time of possession (22:34 per game).

► The Sooners have scored on all eight of their red zone opportunities this season (six touchdowns and two field goals).

► Quarterback **Dillon Gabriel** ranks eighth nationally (second in the Big 12) with his 190.1 passing efficiency rating. He also ranks among the top quarterbacks nationally in yards per pass attempt (10.37; ninth), passing yards per completion (14.7; 19th), completion percentage (70.6; 22nd), points responsible for per game (18.0; 22nd), passing touchdowns (5; 22nd), passing yards per game (264.5; 31st), total passing yards (529; 34th) and total offense (269.5 yards per game; 38th). He was named Big 12 Co-Newcomer of the Week after his performance against Kent State.

► Oklahoma has scored touchdowns on 10 offensive possessions this season, and only three of those TD drives have taken longer than two minutes of game clock. The other drives took 2:13, 2:40 and 4:01 of clock time. OU's 10 touchdown drives this season have averaged six plays, 74.1 yards and 99.5 seconds of game clock.

► In each of their first two games, the Sooners have outscored (by at least 30 points) and outgained (by at least 135 total yards) their opponents despite trailing the total time of possession by at least 12 minutes. In its 45-13 season-opening win over UTEP, Oklahoma outgained the Miners 495 to 316, but only possessed the ball for 21:27 (to UTEP's 38:33). In its 33-3 victory over Kent State, OU gained 430 total yards to the Golden Flashes' 295 yards and held the ball for only 23:41 to KSU's 36:19 possession time.

► Against UTEP, Oklahoma operated quickly and efficiently in the first quarter, scoring touchdowns on its first three possessions to race to a 21-0 lead in the first 8:17 of the game. In the Kent State game, the Sooners scored all 31 of their offensive points in just shy of a quarter (14:35, spanning the last 1:10 of the second quarter until 1:35 remaining in the third). OU put together four TD drives and a field goal in 6:15 total possession time.

BALANCED OFFENSE NOTHING NEW

► Oklahoma totaled 259 rushing yards and 233 passing yards in its season-opening win over UTEP. It was the 47th time in 94 games since the start of the 2015 season the Sooners have gained at least 200 rushing yards and 200 passing yards in a game (50% of its games over the last seven-plus seasons). It was also the 36th time in the same span that OU has rushed for at least 250 yards.

► Running a balanced offense has also been common for first-year offensive coordinator **Leff Lebby**. In his three previous years as an offensive coordinator at Ole Miss (2020-21) and UCF (2019), Lebby's offenses totaled at least 200 passing yards and 200 rushing yards 15 times in 36 games.

MARVELOUS MARVIN

► Junior wide receiver **Marvin Mims Jr.** has made 14 career receptions of at least 40 yards (registered a 42-yard catch in the season opener against UTEP and a 58-yard TD reception against Kent State). **CeeDee Lamb** (2017-19) holds the school record with 24 receptions of 40 or more yards.

► Through two games this season, Mims ranks sixth nationally and third in the Big 12 by averaging 19.3 yards per

punt return (58 yards on three returns). He ranks 10th nationally (second in Big 12) in receiving yards (244), ninth nationally (second in Big 12) in receiving yards per game (122.0) and 13th nationally (second in Big 12) with his 24.4 yards per catch.

► Mims led the Sooners in receiving yards each of his first two seasons. He has made 79 receptions for 1,559 yards and 16 touchdowns and rushed four times for 31 yards in 26 games (13 starts). He has also returned 26 punts for 289 yards (11.1 average) and three kickoffs for 70 yards (23.3 average). He has five career games with two TD receptions, including last week vs. Kent State.

► Mims registered 32 receptions for 705 yards and five TDs as a sophomore last season. As a freshman in 2020, he led the team with 610 yards and nine touchdowns on 37 receptions. His nine TD catches tied for most in the Big 12, matched the Big 12 record for a true freshman and established a new OU freshman record. He also became the first Oklahoma wide receiver to earn FWAA Freshman All-America honors, and was a second-team All-Big 12 selection by the league's coaches and media.

► Mims set the Texas high school state record for receiving yards in a career (5,485) and in a season (2,629 to go along with 32 touchdowns on 117 catches as a senior). He played at Lone Star High School in the city of Frisco.

TURK'S KEY LEG

► Ray Guy Award semifinalist **Michael Turk** did things last season that no other punter in program history had. In his first year at OU, Turk set a single-season record by averaging 51.2 yards per punt, smashing the previous record of 47.8 yards by **Jack Jacobs** in 1940. In fact, entering 2021, the NCAA single-season record for punting average (min. 30 punts) was 51.0 by Texas A&M's Braden Mann in 2018. Turk surpassed that figure in 2021, but at 51.17 yards per punt he finished just behind San Diego State's Matt Araiza, who averaged 51.19 yards per punt on the year.

► Twenty of Turk's 35 punts in 2021 (57.1%) went at least 50 yards, and eight went at least 60. His 85-yarder vs. Texas was the FBS' second longest of the season and tied for the fourth longest over the last 10 years, and tied for the third longest in Oklahoma history.

► Turk holds five of the top 14 single-game punting averages (min. three punts) in OU annals, including the best and third-best marks (59.7 vs. TCU and 58.0 vs. Texas).

► Turk transferred to Oklahoma from Arizona State in August 2021 and promptly earned the starting job. No other punter played for the Sooners last season.

► The 2019 and '20 first-team All-Pac-12 selection averaged 46.2 yards per punt over the last two seasons at ASU and totaled 28 boots that went at least 50 yards. In 2019, he set the FBS single-game record by averaging 63.0 yards (on five punts) vs. Kent State in the season opener.

► Combining his time at ASU and OU, Turk is averaging 45.7 yards per punt (8,629 yards on 189 punts). The FBS career record (min. 150 punts) is 46.3 yards by West Virginia's Todd Sauerbrun (1991-94).

VENABLES NAMED OU'S 23RD HEAD COACH

► A former 13-year Oklahoma assistant coach who won a national championship with the Sooners and two more with Clemson during an ultra-successful 10-year stint as defensive coordinator, **Brent Venables** was named OU's 23rd head football coach Dec. 5. The 51-year-old Venables served as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at OU from 1999-2003 and as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2004-11 under former head coach **Bob Stoops**. Venables has coached in eight national championship games between his time at OU and Clemson, winning titles with the Sooners in 2000 and Tigers in 2016 and 2018.

► In 26 years as a full-time assistant coach, Venables' teams posted 26 winning seasons, won 13 conference titles, went to 30 bowl games (includes four College Football Playoff National Championship games) and won at least 10 games 21 times.

► Over the last 10 seasons at Clemson (excluding the 2021 Cheez-It Bowl, in which Venables did not coach), the Tigers ranked first nationally in sacks (445; next most is 392), tackles for loss (1,147) and opponent third-down conversion percentage (30.2%), second in opponent pass efficiency rating (111.1) and takeaways (244; tied), third in scoring defense (17.8 ppg) and opponent completion percentage (53.3), fourth in total defense (311.4 ypg) and pass defense (190.5 ypg), fifth in interceptions (148) and sixth in rushing defense (120.9 ypg). They won conference titles each year from 2015-20.

► From 1999-2011, Venables helped Oklahoma to the 2000 national championship, three other national championship game appearances (2003, '04 and '08) and seven Big 12 titles.

► Venables has received national accolades for his coaching and recruiting. He received the Frank Broyles Award in 2016 as the nation's top assistant coach after being named a finalist in 2015 and also in 2006 when the Sooners led the Big 12 in total defense and scoring defense. He was named FootballScoop's Defensive Coordinator of the Year in 2014 and Rivals.com's Recruiter of the Year in 2015.

VENABLES' TOP-10 2022 CLASS COMPRISED OF 21

Head coach Brent Venables' first Oklahoma recruiting class featured 21 scholarship players — 16 during the December signing period and five more in February. The class ranked No. 8 nationally by 247Sports, On3 and Rivals, and No. 9 by ESPN. OU's class ranked fifth best nationally by On3 in terms of average player ranking.

Of the 21 signees, 19 were ranked as four-star prospects on a five-star scale by 247Sports, ESPN, On3 or Rivals, while two others received three-star designation from at least one of those outlets.

All 21 signees were high schoolers and hail from eight states: six from Texas, four each from Oklahoma and Florida, two each from California and Nevada, and one each from Colorado, Kansas and Nebraska.

Nine members of the signing class are classified as offensive players and 12 as defensive players.

Ten of the Sooners' signees enrolled at OU for the spring semester and participated in team activities. They were receivers Nic Anderson and Jayden Gibson, running back Jovantae Barnes, quarterback Nick Evers, tight ends Kaden Helms and Jason Llewellyn, linebackers Jaren Kanak, Kip Lewis and Kobie McKinzie and defensive back Robert Spears-Jennings.

FORMER SOONERS ON STAFF

► First-year OU head coach **Brent Venables** has placed an emphasis on making alumni feel welcome around the program, and turned to several former Sooners to fill his first staff at Oklahoma.

► In addition to assistant coaches **Joe Jon Finley** (2004-07), **Brandon Hall** (1998-00), **Jeff Lebby** (2002-06) and **DeMarco Murray** (2007-10), several other former players hold staff positions as analysts, graduate assistants and as part of OU football's SOUL Mission program.

► Former linebackers **Lance Mitchell** (2002-04) and **Rufus Alexander** (2003-06) are defensive analysts while former offensive linemen **Jon Cooper** (2005-08) and **Phil Loadholt** (2007-08) serve as offensive analysts. Former quarterback **Tanner Schafer** (2016-21) and offensive lineman **Clayton Woods** (2018-19) are offensive graduate assistants.

► Former running back and receiver **Josh Norman** (1998-01) and linebackers **Caleb Kelly** (2016-21) and **Curtis Lofton** (2005-07) work with SOUL Mission (Serving Our Uncommon Legacy). SOUL Mission is dedicated to helping OU football student-athletes develop in all aspects of their lives. Five SOUL Mission pillars target every facet of off-the-field enhancement of OU's football student-athletes: civic engagement, life skills, career development/job placement, personal growth and former player development.

RECORD SPRING GAME CROWD

► Oklahoma's April 23 spring game drew a crowd of 75,360, setting a record for the event. The attendance figure was more than 20,000 higher than the previous OU spring game record and led the nation's 2022 spring games, according to 247Sports (Georgia was second at 68,002, Penn State third at 62,000, Ohio State fourth at 60,007 and Nebraska fifth at 54,357).

SEVEN 2022 NFL DRAFTEES

► Oklahoma had seven players picked in the 2022 NFL Draft, tied for its second most since the 2005 season. Its first four selections were defensive players, the first time for that feat since 1984. Outside linebacker **Nik Bonitto** was selected in the second round by the Denver Broncos. He was followed by linebacker **Brian Asamoah** in the third round (Minnesota Vikings), defensive lineman **Perrion Winfrey** in the fourth round (Cleveland Browns), safety **Delarrin Turner-Yell** in the fifth round (Denver), wide receiver **Michael Woods II** in the sixth round (Cleveland), defensive end **Isaiah Thomas** in the seventh round (Cleveland) and offensive lineman **Marquis Hayes** in the seventh round (Arizona Cardinals). Since 2000, 111 Sooners have been selected, which is 36 more than the next-closest Big 12 program during that span (Texas, 75).

STOOPS INDUCTED INTO COLLEGE HALL OF FAME, WILLIAMS ON DECK

► The owner of the most wins in Oklahoma football history and engineer of 10 Big 12 Conference titles and the 2000 national championship, **Bob Stoops** was inducted into the National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame on Dec. 7 in his first year of eligibility. Stoops posted a 190-48 (.798) record at Oklahoma and coached the Sooners to a school-record 18 consecutive bowl berths. He was the only coach in the BCS era to win the Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Rose Bowl, Sugar Bowl and the national championship, and accumulated more victories over the first 18 seasons of a head coaching career than anyone in the game's history.

► One of his star pupils, defensive back **Roy Williams** will join Stoops in the Hall when he is inducted Dec. 6, 2022. Williams, who helped OU to the 2000 national title as a redshirt sophomore, was a unanimous All-American in 2001 who won the Nagurski (nation's top defender) and Thorpe (top defensive back) awards. He was also named Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and finished seventh in Heisman Trophy voting, the highest finish of the year by a non-quarterback. He ended the year with 107 tackles, 14 tackles for loss, five interceptions, 22 pass breakups and three fumble recoveries.

OU'S BIG 12 DOMINATION

► Oklahoma's win over Iowa State in the 2020 Big 12 Championship resulted in the Sooners' sixth straight Big 12 title and 14th since 2000 (no other program has won more than two during the span). For perspective, the two Power Five programs with the next most conference titles this millennium are Ohio State (11 in Big Ten) and Oregon (eight in Pac-10/Pac-12).

► OU's 14 Big 12 titles are 11 more than the program with the next most. Baylor and Texas have each won three Big 12 championships and are followed by Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each). Colorado and Nebraska left the Big 12 after the 2010 season and Texas A&M departed after the 2011 campaign.

► Since 2010, OU has won eight Big 12 titles and is followed by Baylor (three) and Kansas State, Oklahoma State and TCU (one each).

► Since 2000, OU has won more Big 12 championships (14) than it has lost home games (11).

► Oklahoma is 54-8 (.871) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2015 season. Oklahoma State ranks second during that period (42-21; .667), West Virginia third (33-29; .532), TCU fourth (33-30; .524) and Texas fifth (32-30; .516).

► Oklahoma is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (2006-08 and 2015-20). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► At 11-1, the Sooners are the only program with a winning record in Big 12 Championship games. Texas (3-3) and Baylor (1-1) have the next best marks.

► Over the last seven years, OU has posted a 54-8 (.844) record in regular season Big 12 play. The next best mark during the stretch is 42-21 (.667) by Oklahoma State.

CFP APPEARANCES

Oklahoma has made four appearances in the eight-year history of the College Football Playoff, all in the last seven seasons. It is the only Big 12 program to qualify for the event.

The National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame announced the 2023 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame on June 6 and former University of Oklahoma standouts Rocky Calmus, Josh Heupel and Dewey Selmon earned spots among the 80 players listed on the College Hall of Fame from the Football Bowl Subdivision.

One of the nation's top defenders during OU's return to prominence at the beginning of head coach Bob Stoops' tenure, Calmus defined his position. The linebacker earned AP Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and first-team All-America honors in 2000, won the Butkus Award as the nation's top linebacker as a senior in 2001 and was a finalist for the Nagurski and Bednarik Awards (given to the nation's best defender) and the Lombardi Award (country's top interior player).

The runner-up for the 2000 Heisman Trophy, Josh Heupel became Oklahoma's first consensus All-America quarterback and the first Sooners signal-caller to earn All-America honors since Jack Mildren in 1971. A junior college transfer, Heupel was one of Bob Stoops' first OU recruits and is largely credited with turning an offense that statistically ranked as one of the worst in the nation before his arrival into one of the country's most explosive.

One part of the famed and feared Selmon brothers defensive line trio for Oklahoma's vaunted defenses of the early and mid-1970s, Dewey Selmon starred at both defensive tackle and nose guard. In his four years on campus, the Sooners posted a 43-2-1 record, won four straight Big Eight championships and captured national titles his junior and senior seasons of 1974 and '75. In a 16-13 win over Texas in 1974, he registered 22 tackles, which still stands as the single-game school record by a defensive lineman.

HEISMAN U

► Quarterbacks **Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** became Oklahoma's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and '18, respectively, moving the Sooners into a tie with Notre Dame and Ohio State for the most Heisman winners. Other OU winners were QB **Sam Bradford** in 2008, QB **Jason White** in 2003, RB **Billy Sims** in 1978, RB **Steve Owens** in 1969 and RB **Billy Vessels** in 1952.

► Quarterback **Jalen Hurts** was the 2019 Heisman Trophy runner-up and became Oklahoma's 11th Heisman finalist, tied with Alabama for most of any school (finalists were first named in 1982). Miami (Fla.) ranks third with nine finalists, Florida ranks fourth with eight and Ohio State ranks fifth with seven.

► OU boasts a nation-leading 10 Heisman finalists in the last 21 years (since 2000). Alabama ranks second with nine while Ohio State and Stanford rank third with five each.

► Oklahoma is the only program to ever produce five Heisman finalists in a four-year period (Hurts in 2019 [runner-up], Murray in 2018 [won], Mayfield in 2017 [won] and Mayfield [finished third] and receiver **Dede Westbrook** [finished fourth] in 2016). With Mayfield's and Murray's wins, OU is the only program to produce different quarterback winners in consecutive seasons.

► OU is tied for the most Heisman runners-up, as well (six). OU's second-place Heisman finishers were **Kurt Burris** (1954), **Greg Pruitt** (1972), **Sims** (1979), **Josh Heupel** (2000), **Adrian Peterson** (2004) and Hurts (2019).

► Oklahoma has produced four Heisman Trophy winners in the last 19 years. Only four other programs have produced four winners ever (Notre Dame and Ohio State seven, USC six and Alabama four).

► An OU quarterback finished in the top four of Heisman voting in five consecutive years (Mayfield fourth in 2015, third in 2016 and first in 2017; Murray first in 2018; Hurts second in 2019).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (686) than any other program (next most is 648 by Alabama).

► OU has finished in the top 5 of the AP poll a nation-leading 33 times.

► OU leads all FBS programs with 50 all-time conference championships. The rest of the top five includes Nebraska (46), Michigan (43), Ohio State (39) and USC (37). The Sooners' 14 league titles since 2000 are the most among Power Five programs (Ohio State ranks second with 11).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which is tied with Alabama with 41 (OU has a nation-leading 18 10-win campaigns since 2000). In addition, OU's 27 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads the country with its 11,887 points scored, which is 535 points more than second-place Boise State (11,352) and 1,047 more than third-place Oregon (10,840).

► OU's 80 consensus All-Americans since 1950 are the most nationally (Alabama ranks second with 74 and Ohio State third with 72). Since 2000, the Sooners have produced 30 consensus All-Americans, second only to Alabama.

► OU is the only program that has produced at least four NFL Draft picks each of the last 15 years.

EXTRA POINTS

► The Sooners have outscored opponents 21-0 in the first quarter and 38-0 in the third quarter this season.

► Forty-seven of OU's 115 players (41%) are new to the program this season, while 60 players (52%) had never played in a game for the Sooners prior to the opener vs. UTEP. Of the 47 new players, 23 are on offense, 21 are on defense and three are special-teamers (one kicker, one punter and one long snapper).

► Oklahoma head coach **Brent Venables**, who is 51, is four years older than **Bud Wilkinson** was when he coached his final game for the Sooners in 1963.

► Oklahoma is 42-4 all-time as the No. 6-ranked team in the AP poll (14-1 on the road). The lone road loss was in 1963 at No. 10 Nebraska (21-6 final). The Sooners are 2-1 in Lincoln while ranked sixth in the AP poll, with victories in 1957 (32-7) and 1984 (17-7 over the No. 1 Cornhuskers). OU has won its last six road games as the AP's sixth-ranked team (the first of those was in 1969 at Wisconsin and the most recent was in 2021 at Kansas State).

► OU ranks 13th nationally (fifth among teams with at least four returns) with its 16.5 yards per punt return. **Marvin Mims Jr.** ranks sixth nationally with his 19.3 yards per return (58 yards on three returns).

► The Sooners returned exactly two pass attempts from last season, both from current redshirt freshman walk-on **Ralph Rucker**.

► Every OU freshman class from 1999-2019 has won at least one Big 12 championship and all but the 2011 freshman class have won at least two. The 2015, 2016 and 2017 freshman classes each won four Big 12 titles.

► Since 2000, OU is the only program in the country that has not had a losing record in any season.

► OU has won 79 straight games when holding opponents to 23 or fewer points. The last time OU held an opponent to 23 or fewer points and lost was in 2009 (fell 10-3 at Nebraska on Nov. 7).

► Since the start of the 2012 season, OU is 82-5 when scoring at least 35 points and 71-3 when scoring at least 40.

► The Sooners are tied for third with their four College Football Playoff appearances (2015, 2017, 2018 and 2019). They are the only Big 12 program to qualify for the CFP.

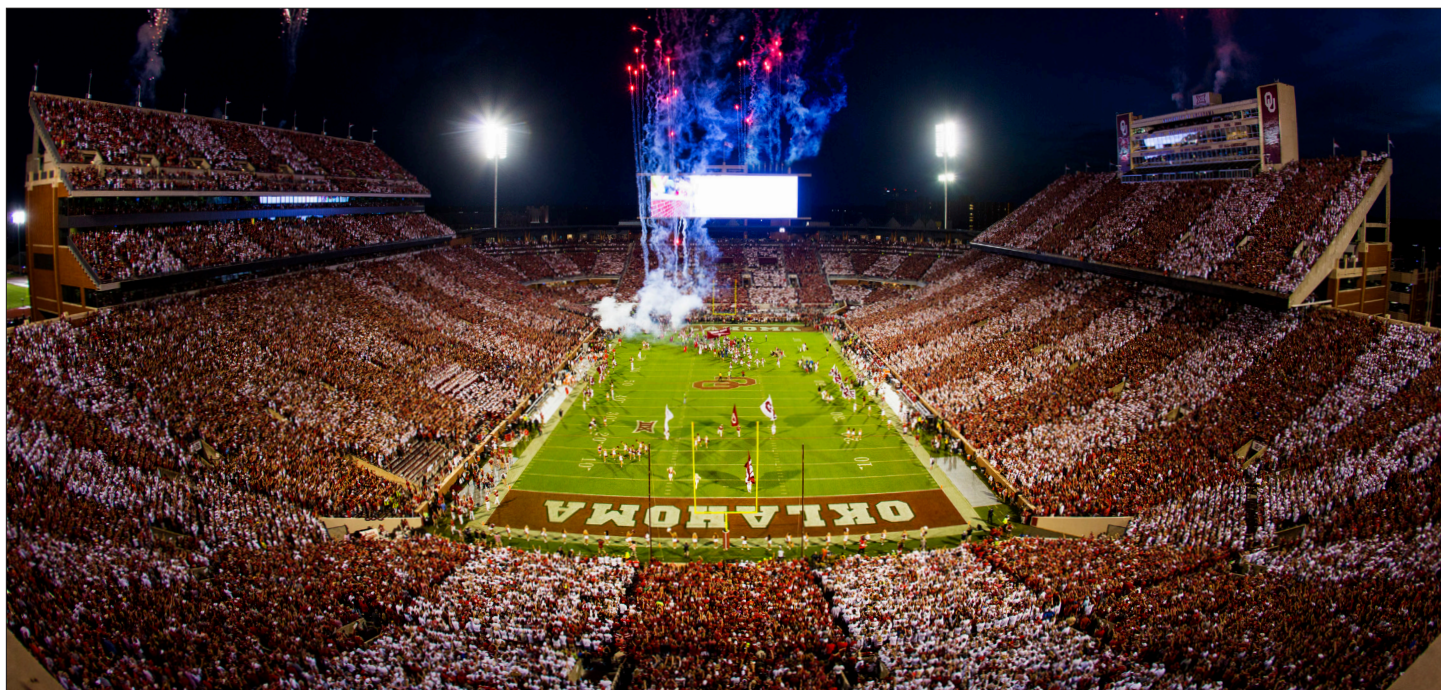

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and a 62-foot-by-38-foot video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals, is hosting football games for the 100th year this season. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With last year's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity dropped to 80,126.
- In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

- The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489. The addition of handrails and some seat and aisle widening in 2019 reduced capacity to 80,126.
- The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.
- A significantly larger and more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

BRENT VENABLES

NAMED OU'S 23RD HEAD COACH DEC. 5, 2021 • FORMER K-STATE/OKLAHOMA/CLEMSON ASSISTANT THREE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS (ONE WITH OKLAHOMA, TWO WITH CLEMSON) EIGHT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME APPEARANCES • COACHED IN 32 BOWL GAMES 13 CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS • THREE-TIME BROYLES AWARD FINALIST (2016 WINNER)

A former 13-year University of Oklahoma assistant coach who won a national championship with the Sooners and two more with Clemson University during an ultra-successful 10-year stint as defensive coordinator, Brent Venables was named OU's 23rd head football coach Dec. 5, 2021.

The 51-year-old Venables served as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Oklahoma from 1999-2003 and as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2004-11 under former head coach Bob Stoops. Venables has coached in eight national championship games between his time at OU and Clemson, winning titles with the Sooners in 2000 and Tigers in 2016 and 2018. In 26 years as a full-time assistant coach, Venables' teams posted 26 winning seasons, won 13 conference titles, went to 30 bowl games (includes four College Football Playoff National Championship games) and won at least 10 games 22 times.

Since joining Clemson prior to the 2012 season, Venables constructed one of the nation's top defenses. Over the last 10 years, the Tigers ranked first nationally in sacks (445; next most was 392), tackles for loss (1,159) and opponent third-down conversion percentage (30.2%), second in opponent pass efficiency rating (111.1) and takeaways (244; tied), third in scoring defense (17.8 ppg) and opponent completion percentage (53.3), fourth in total defense (311.4 ypg) and pass defense (190.5 ypg), fifth in interceptions (148) and sixth in rushing defense (120.9 ypg). They won conference titles each year from 2015-20.

Since 2000, Venables has coached eight national award winners and 18 consensus All-Americans. In that time, 57 defensive players under his guidance have been selected in the NFL Draft (12 first-rounders), including 15 linebackers, two of whom were first-round picks.

As a defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, Venables has produced winners of three Butkus Awards (OU's Rocky Calmus in 2001 and Teddy Lehman in 2003, and CU's Isaiah Simmons in 2019), two Nagurski Awards (OU's Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003), two Thorpe Awards (Williams in 2001 and Strait in 2003) and one Bednarik Award (Lehman in 2003). And in 2018, Clemson defensive tackle Christian Wilkins was the school's first winner of William V. Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman."

Venables has received national accolades for his coaching and recruiting. He received the Frank Broyles Award in 2016 as the nation's top assistant coach after being named a finalist in 2015. He was named FootballScoop's Defensive Coordinator of the Year in 2014 and Rivals.com's Recruiter of the Year in 2015.

Venables' defensive units have been remarkably consistent over the last decade. Each of the last eight Clemson defenses have ranked in the top 15 nationally in yards allowed and seven of the last eight have ranked in the top 20 in points allowed. Over the last eight years, his units have ranked first (in 2014), 10th, eighth, fourth, fifth, sixth, 15th and ninth (last season) in total defense. Additionally, his units ranked first or second in the ACC in total defense each of the last eight years (ranked first in six of those seasons).

Under Venables' tutelage this year, Clemson ranks second nationally in scoring defense (15.0 ppg) and red zone defense (62.1 conversion percentage), fourth in sacks (3.4 per game), eighth in rushing defense (98.8 ypg) and ninth in total defense (308.4 ypg).

Venables' 2020 Clemson defense tied for the national lead with 46 sacks, despite no player producing more than 4.5 sacks individually. His 2019 unit allowed fewer than 300 yards of total offense in each of its first 12 games of the season, the first defense nationally since at least 1996 to accomplish that feat. Clemson held 16 straight opponents to 20 or fewer points across the 2018-19 seasons, the best streak at the school since the 1937-40 seasons.

Clemson's 2018 squad led the nation in scoring defense (13.1 ppg) for the first time in school history and set a program record by recording 54 sacks.

Venables' Clemson defenses have ranked among the top 10 nationally in sacks each year since 2014 and ranked in the top 10 in tackles for loss from 2013-20. The units led the nation in TFLs every year from 2013-16. The Tigers also ranked among the top 50 nationally in takeaways in each of his 10 seasons.

From 1999-2011, Venables helped Oklahoma to the 2000 national championship, three other national championship game appearances (2003, '04 and '08) and seven Big 12 titles. He was a finalist for the Broyles Award in 2006 when OU led the Big 12 in total defense and scoring defense.

Oklahoma linebackers under Venables' direction earned three Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year accolades, five Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year accolades and six first-team All-America honors. Ten of his OU linebackers — and 31 defensive players overall — were taken in the 2000-12 NFL Drafts.

While Venables was at Oklahoma, the Sooners ranked among the top 16 nationally in total defense eight times (including each year from 2000-06) and among the top 20 in scoring defense eight times. OU led the Big 12 in scoring defense on four occasions (2000, '04, '06, '11) and topped the league in total defense three times (2003, '04, '06).

Prior to joining Stoops' first staff at Oklahoma, Venables coached linebackers at Kansas State (1996-98), holding the title of defensive running game coordinator in 1998, and served as a graduate assistant at K-State under Bill Snyder from 1993-95.

As a player at Kansas State (1991-92), Venables earned honorable mention All-Big Eight honors in 1992 after registering 124 tackles. He began his collegiate career at Garden City (Kan.) Community College (1989-90), where he earned All-America honors after recording 276 tackles.

A native of Salina, Kan., Venables received his bachelor's degree in political science from Kansas State in 1992. He and his wife Julie have four children: sons Jake and Tyler and daughters Laney and Addie.

NORMAN — Oklahoma made Brent Venables' first game as a head coach a memorable one as it raced to a 21-0 lead in the first 8:17 and beat UTEP 45-13. The Sooners outgained the Miners by 176 yards (492-316) and showcased a balanced offensive attack with 259 rushing yards and 233 passing yards. They allowed just 28 rushing yards on 31 carries.

In his OU debut, quarterback Dillon Gabriel completed 15 of 23 passes for 233 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed six times for 20 yards and scored on a 12-yard burst for the game's first points. Tight end Brayden Willis caught both TD passes (scoring from six and 28 yards) the second of which gave OU a 28-10 lead.

Eric Gray rushed a team-high 16 times for 102 yards, marking his sixth-career 100-yard game and first as a Sooner. Marcus Major ran seven times for 54 yards and scored from one and six yards in the third quarter. On his second-career play and first touch, freshman receiver Gavin Freeman scored on a 46-yard rushing play to give the Sooners a 21-0 lead.

Safety Billy Bowman and linebacker Danny Stutsman led OU with nine tackles apiece, career highs for both. Defensive end Reggie Grimes finished with a career-high 2.5 sacks and cornerback Gentry Williams recorded an interception in the end zone on UTEP's final possession. OU possessed the ball for just 21:27 out of 60 minutes.

NORMAN — No. 7/7 Oklahoma trailed 3-0 late in the first half but drove 76 yards to score a touchdown with 18 seconds remaining in the second quarter and outscored Kent State 26-0 after halftime to post a 33-3 home win. The Golden Flashes were picked by MAC head coaches to win the league's east division title.

Kent State's three points were the fewest Oklahoma allowed an FBS opponent since a 41-3 win at Kansas in 2017. The Sooners recorded 14 tackles for loss against the Golden Flashes (their most since 2019) and three sacks.

Dillon Gabriel completed 21 of 28 pass attempts for 296 yards and three touchdowns without an interception. His TD passes covered 36, 18 and 58 yards. The 36- and 58-yarders went to receiver Marvin Mims Jr., who tied a career high with seven catches for a career-high 163 yards. He also set a career high with 203 all-purpose yards with the help of a 41-yard punt return, OU's longest since 2019.

For the first time since 2018, three Sooners registered double-digit tackles in a game. Linebacker Danny Stutsman (12) and safety Billy Bowman (11) set career highs in tackles for the second straight game, while safety Justin Broiles tied a career high with 11 stops in his first start of the season. Stutsman recorded 4.0 tackles for loss, OU's most in three seasons, and added a sack, while Bowman was credited with a forced fumble and recovery on the same play.

Justin Harrington made his first career interception, David Ugwoegbu logged a safety and Reggie Grimes recorded 2.5 TFLs and 1.5 sacks.
